Sir,

This has reference to your application No. MGL-SNP/CNG/30(B)/14-15 dated 15.11.2014 seeking prior CRZ Clearance on the above-mentioned subject.

- 2. The Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change has considered the application. It is noted that the proposal is for grant of CRZ Clearance for Establishment of a CNG Gas filling Station at CTS No. 1 (pt), Village Mankurd, Taluka Chembur, Mumbai, Maharashtra by M/s Mahanagar Gas Ltd. The proposal was considered by the EAC in its meeting held on 22^{nd} 24^{th} December, 2014. The proponent has informed that:
 - i. The project involves establishment of a CNG Gas filling Station at CTS No- 1(Pt), Village- Mankhurd, Taluka Chembur, Mumbai, Maharashtra.
 - ii. The total area of the proposed CNG station is 1500 sqm and the total built up area is 910.44 sqm. The proposed site falls under CRZ-II and situated on seaward side of existing road. FSI area is 0.71.
 - iii. The project comprises Basement, Ground, First and Second Floor with maximum height of 16m. It is facing the proposed 61 m wide DP road.
 - iv. The facilities are the storage cascade consisting cylinders having 2000 litters water capacity and will be charged with natural gas with pressure 250 bar.
 - v. The solid waste generated will be segregated at source into biodegradable and non biodegradable waste. The biodegradable and non biodegradable waste will be handed over to local municipal authorities.
 - vi. The water requirement during construction phase is approx 1.0 KLD and it will be sourced by tankers. The water requirement during operational phase is approx 0.5 KLD and will be sourced from Municipal Corp. of Greater Mumbai.
 - vii. The total cost of the project is Rs. 472 Lakhs.

viii. **Approvals:** The Maharashtra Coastal Zone Management Authority (MCZMA) has recommended the project vide letter No. CRZ 2011/CR-170/TC-4 dated 03.09.2014.

ix. Wildlife issues: There are no national Parks, wildlife sanctuary,

biosphere reserves found in the 10 km buffer zone.

x. There is no **court cases/violation** pending with the project proponent.

3. The proposal was considered by the Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC) and recommended in its 142nd EAC meeting held on 22nd - 24th December, 2014 for granting CRZ Clearance. The Project Proponent presented Emergency Preparedness Plan. The Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change hereby accords CRZ Clearance for the above-mentioned Establishment of a CNG Gas filling Station at CTS No. 1 (pt), Village - Mankurd, Taluka Chembur, Mumbai, Maharashtra by M/s Mahanagar Gas Ltd. under the provisions of the CRZ Notification, 2011 and amendments thereto and Circulars issued thereon and subject to the compliance of the following specific conditions, in addition to the general conditions mentioned below:

A. SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

- (i) "Consent for Establishment" for the present project, shall be obtained from State Pollution Control Board under Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974.
- (ii) The clearance shall not be deemed as clearance in respect of Fire and Safety, Project Proponent shall take necessary approvals as required in respect of Fire and Safety aspects from competent authority.
- (iii) Emergency preparedness plan shall be in place in accordance with OISD safety guidelines etc.
- (iv) All the conditions/recommendations stipulated by Maharashtra Coastal Zone Management Authority (MCZMA) vide letter No. CRZ 2011/CR-170/TC-4 dated 03.09.2014, shall be complied with.
- (v) The pipeline shall not be laid in mangrove area and there shall be no destruction of mangroves as committed.
- (vi) All the recommendation of Risk Assessment and Disaster Management Plan shall be complied with.
- (vii) There shall be no disposal of solid and liquid wastes in to the Coastal areas.
- (viii) There shall be no ground water drawal within CRZ area.

B. GENERAL CONDITIONS:

- (i) Adequate provision for infrastructure facilities including water supply, fuel and sanitation must be ensured for construction workers during the construction phase of the project to avoid any damage to the environment.
- (ii) Appropriate measures must be taken while undertaking digging activities to avoid any likely degradation of water quality.

- (iii) Adequate precautions shall be taken during transportation of the construction material and pipes so that it does not affect the environment adversely.
- (iv) The project proponent will set up separate environmental management cell for effective implementation of the stipulated environmental safeguards under the supervision of a Senior Executive.
- (v) Full support shall be extended to the officers of this Ministry/Regional Office at Nagpur by the project proponent during inspection of the project for monitoring purposes by furnishing full details and action plan including action taken reports in respect of mitigation measures and other environmental protection activities.
- (vi) Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change or any other competent authority may stipulate any additional conditions or modify the existing ones, if necessary in the interest of environment and the same shall be complied with.
- (vii) The Ministry reserves the right to revoke this clearance if any of the conditions stipulated are not complied with the satisfaction of the Ministry.
- (viii) In the event of a change in project profile or change in the implementation agency, a fresh reference shall be made to the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change.
- (ix) The project proponents shall inform the Regional Office as well as the Ministry, the date of financial closure and final approval of the project by the concerned authorities and the date of start of land development work.
- (x) A copy of the clearance letter shall be marked to concerned Panchayat/local NGO, if any, from whom any suggestion/representation has been made received while processing the proposal.
- (xi) A copy of the environmental clearance letter shall also be displayed on the website of the concerned State Pollution Control Board. The EC letter shall also be displayed at the Regional Office, District Industries centre and Collector's Office/ Tehsildar's office for 30 days.
- (xii) The funds earmarked for environmental protection measures shall be kept in separate account and shall not be diverted for other purpose. Year-wise expenditure shall be reported to this Ministry and its concerned Regional Office.
- 4. These stipulations would be enforced among others under the provisions of Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act 1974, the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Public Liability (Insurance) Act, 1991 and EIA Notification 2006, including the amendments and rules made thereafter.

- All other statutory clearances such as the approvals for storage of diesel from Chief Controller of Explosives, Fire Department, Civil Aviation Department, Forest Conservation Act, 1980 and Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 etc. shall be obtained, as applicable by project proponents from the respective competent authorities.
- The project proponent shall advertise in at least two local Newspapers widely circulated in the region, one of which shall be in the vernacular language informing that the project has been accorded CRZ Clearance and copies of clearance letters are available with the State Pollution Control Board and may also be seen on the website of the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change at http://www.envfor.nic.in. The advertisement should be made within Seven days from the date of receipt of the Clearance letter and a copy of the same should be forwarded to the Regional Office of this Ministry at Bhopal.
- This Clearance is subject to final order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of 7. India in the matter of Goa Foundation Vs. Union of India in Writ Petition (Civil) No.460 of 2004 as may be applicable to this project.
- Any appeal against this clearance shall lie with the National Green 8. Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.
- Status of compliance to the various stipulated environmental conditions and environmental safeguards will be uploaded by the project proponent in its website.
- 10. The project proponent shall also submit six monthly reports on the status of compliance of the stipulated Clearance conditions including results of monitored data (both in hard copies as well as by e-mail) to the respective Regional Office of MoEF&CC, the respective Zonal Office of CPCB and the SPCB.
- The environmental statement for each financial year ending 31st March in Form-V as is mandated to be submitted by the project proponent to the concerned State Pollution Control Board as prescribed under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986, as amended subsequently, shall also be put on the website of the company along with the status of compliance of conditions and shall also be sent to the respective Regional Offices of MoEF&CC by e-mail.
