Following are the deliberations & decisions of the meeting:-

AGENDA ITEM NO.01.

Grant of Environment Clearance in favour of Shri Rakesh Kumar Choudhary S/O Shri Koula Ram, R.O 51/BD, Gandhi Nagar, Jammu, JK UT for proposed RBM (RIVER BED MINERAL) Mining project, Block No.21, over an area of 9.37ha at Ziarat Syed Rehmatullah Nazneenpora Upstream Nallah Rambiar District: - Shopian, Jammu & Kashmir under proposal No.SIA/JK/MIN/58161/2020.

BRIEF SUMMARY: This case pertains to grant of Environment Clearance under B1 category for proposed RBM (RIVER BED MINERAL) Mining project, Block No.21, over an area of 9.37ha. LOI has been issued on 18/07/2020, which was later extended on 15/04/2021 and is valid up to 31/08/2021. Mining plan has been approved on 03/10/2020. Terms of Reference were issued on 23-12-2020 and public hearing was conducted on 31-03-2021. The aforesaid case was processed in pursuance to G.O 76 JK-FST of 2020 dated 29/07/2021. As per summary of appraisal report, district survey report needs to be revised by including replenishment data etc., Status of NOC's in appraisal report shows that Dy. Commissioner, Shopian vide letter No.DCS/NOC/Camp/13-14 dated 10-04-2021 has intimated NOC's of stake holder departments. However, concerned Assistant Director, Fisheries Department while issuing the NOC has expressed grave concern on eventual disturbance of the endangered native and endemic fish in the Rambiar snow fed trout stream. Therefore, conditions laid down by Fisheries Dept, need to be adhered to in letter and spirit by the PP. Conditions laid down by Xen Irrigation for safeguarding nearby supply channel of Nazimpore Khul and Headworks of Salar Khul also need to be fully adhered to.

Further, the JKEAC has made following specific observations:

- a) The existence of the proposed mining block alongside the water course is a potential threat to the water course. The exact locations of the inlet of the water courses of Nazimpora and Salar kuhls is also not indicated. The consultant needs to elaborate as to how he intends to ensure safety of these water courses/ hydraulic inlet structures.
- b) Two HT Electric Transmission Towers are located inside the mining block, for which the PP shall have to obtain a specific NOC from the concerned stake holder dept. /PDD.
- c) The videos/still photographs failed to convey information with regard to physical settings of the mining block vis-a-vis irrigation works and Electric Transmission Towers.
- d) The NOC from Irrigation Dept. prohibits excavation 100m upstream and 100m downstream from Supply channels and off take points whereas the mining block lies adjacent to the irrigation works.
- e) Project cost has been underestimated by the consultant as it does not include cost of EMP, Closure plan, surveillance equipment, Env. Clearance processing fee/ PCCs Consent fee etc. and therefore needs to be revised.
- f) Although mining depth of 1m has been proposed in PFR, yet on page17 (PFR), it is still wrongly mentioned as 2.5m, which needs to be rectified by the consultant.
- g) Budget for surveillance equipment has not been provided and the Committee has accordingly recommended it as per budget proposed by the Consultant in similar projects.
- h) The index of EIA document does not match the details in the document. CER is indicated to have been discussed on page 110, but no details are there on page 110. Index also shows method of mining as Blasting, which need to be rectified.
- i) EMP is too meagre for the project and needs to be revised with appropriate budget as suggested in the remark's column of EMP table above.
- j) The compliance to specific ToR condition No.19 relating to photographs of display screen displaying the date of collection of data missing in EIA report. Besides, baseline data collection photographs of mining block 34 and 35 nearly 7.5 kms away, have been included in the EIA report, discrepancy of which need to be rectified.
- k) Revision of the mining plan with mine closure plan, revised mining depth, surface plan, area, targeted mineral production and replenishment and its denovo approval by the competent authority prior to grant of EC or as decided by JKEIAA.
- l) Mining depth be restricted to 1m in aggregate in view of non-availability of replenishment data in the DSRs formulated by the G&M Dept.
- m) Bulk density of 2.3 not agreed. Committee desired that in absence of actual measurements, a nominal bulk density of 2.0 be adopted.

Recommendations of JKEAC.

In view of the above deliberations / observations, the Expert Appraisal Committee recommended that the project be rejected in the present form. In the meantime, the project proponent be asked to submit the following documents for reconsideration of the case: -

1. A detailed techno-feasibility report powered with topographic maps, videos and photographs of the mining block and the irrigation works/ transmission towers etc.

suggesting mitigative measures under which mining activity in the designated block shall not affect the irrigation work and electric transmission towers.

2. A categorical and specific NOC from the Concerned Agency w.r.t the HT Electric transmission towers lying inside the mining block.
3. Revised the EIA/EMP/CER/PFR / Mining plan etc. as per deliberations recorded-here-in-above.
4. A categorical and specific NOC from the Irrigation Dept. to the effect that mining activity in the designated mining block will not affect the Irrigation facility

Decision of Authority.

After due deliberations on the observations made by JKEAC, the JKEIAA upheld recommendations of the Committee to reject the case in the present form. The JKEIAA also agree with other recommendation of JKEAC to give an opportunity to project proponent to resubmit the case after fulfilling recommendations of JKEAC along with additional documents asked for JKEAC for reconsideration as a fresh case.

Grant of Environment Clearance in favour of M/S Brinder Singh S/o Shri Keemat Lal R/O Near Chib Resort Raipur, Satwari, Jammu, JK UT under proposal for proposed RBM (River Bed Mineral) MINING Project, Block No.35, over an area of 9.81ha. at AB. Gaffar Bhat Sugun, Downstream Rambiarra Nallah District, Shopian, JK UT under proposal No. **SIA/JK/MIN/58148/2020.**

BRIEF SUMMARY: This case pertains to grant of Environment Clearance under B1 category for proposed RBM (River Bed Mineral) Mining Project, Block No.35, over an area of 9.81ha. LOI has been issued on 18/07/2020, which was later extended on 15/04/2021 and is valid up to 31/08/2021. Mining plan has been approved on 03/10/2020. Terms of Reference were issued on 08-12-2020 and public hearing was conducted on 31-03-2021. The aforesaid case was processed in pursuance to G.O 76JK-FST of 2020 dated 29/07/2021. As per summary of appraisal report, district survey report needs to be revised by including replenishment data etc., Status of NOC's in appraisal report shows that Dy. Commissioner, Shopian vide letter No.DCS/NOC/Camp/13-14 dated 10-04-2021 has intimated NOC's of stake holder departments. Out of 08 depts, 05 Department, i.e. Irrigation, Flood control, Fisheries, PCB and PHE Depts have issued conditional NOC's. In particular, Assistant Director, Fisheries Department has expressed grave concern on eventual disturbance of the endangered native and endemic fish in the Rambiarra snow fed trout stream. In conclusion, DC Shopian has opined those conditions imposed by PHE Department need to be adhered to in letter and spirit by the PP. also, Conditions laid down by Xen Irrigation for safeguarding nearby supply channel of Head works of Sugan Khul need to be fully adhered to.

Further, the JKEAC has made the following specific observations:

- a) The Dy. Commissioner concerned vide letter No. DMS/PA/21/1648-49 dated 01-07-2021 has reported that illegal mining has taken place in and around the block but has simultaneously absolved the Project proponent from any involvement in it. Therefore, the case was appraised under non-violation category.
- b) Project cost has been underestimated by the consultant as it does not include cost of EMP, Closure plan, surveillance equipment, Env. Clearance processing fee/ PCCs Consent fee etc. and therefore needs to be revised.

- c) The videos/still photographs failed to convey information with regard to physical settings of the mining block.
- d) Although mining depth of 1m has been proposed in PFR, yet on page16 (PFR), it is still wrongly mentioned as 2.5 m which needs to be rectified by the consultant.
- e) In table of contents of the EIA report, budget for surveillance equipment has been indicated but it has not been provided on page 110 and the Committee has accordingly recommended it as per budget proposed by the Consultant in similar projects.
- f) The index of EIA document shows method of mining as Drilling & Blasting which needs to be corrected.

6. Strict adherence to the terms and conditions of the NOCs of the stakeholder departments which need to be monitored by the enforcement agencies and concerned departments.
7. No JCBs/ Excavators/ Bulldozers to be used in mining and no water course to be disturbed while transporting minor minerals.
8. Revision of EIA report with compliance of specific ToR condition No.19, rectification of mistakes in EIA report and Pre-feasibility Report (PFR) and revision of Project cost, EMP and CER budget as detailed here-in-above, before grant of formal EC.
9. Maximum targeted mineral production of 117600MT.

10. Condition the geographical coordinates as per LOI are mentioned in the EC letter by JKEIAA
11. Validity of only three years from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA and JKPCB in view of non-availability of replenishment data.

Decision of Authority.

After due deliberations on observations of JKEAC, the JKEIAA upheld recommendations of the Committee to grant Environment clearance to the project subject to fulfillment of following conditions:

1. Full compliance of Standard and Specific Conditions as per Annexure B to the Minutes of JKEAC Meeting.
2. Revision of the mining plan with mine closure plan, revised mining depth, surface plan, targeted mineral production and replenishment and its denovo approval by the competent authority to be submitted within 3 months of issue of conditional E.C.
3. Mining depth not to exceed 1m below NSL in aggregate in view of non-availability of replenishment data in the DSRs formulated by the G&M Department.
4. Bulk density of 2 shall be adopted for calculation of quantity of mined material.
5. PP shall Submit photographs and videos as per instructions already conveyed before grant of formal EC.
6. Strict adherence to the terms and conditions of the NOCs of the stakeholder departments which need to be monitored by the enforcement agencies and concerned departments.
7. No JCBs/ Excavators/ Bulldozers to be used in mining and no water course to be disturbed while transporting minor minerals.
8. Revision of EIA report with compliance of specific ToR condition No.19, rectification of mistakes in EIA report and Pre-feasibility Report (PFR) and revision of Project cost, EMP and CER budget as detailed here-in-above, before grant of formal EC.
9. Maximum targeted mineral production shall be restricted to 117600MT.
10. EC is valid only three years from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA and JKPCB in view of non-availability of replenishment data.

Grant of Environment Clearance in favour of Shri Mangal Singh S/O Shri Om Prakash, R/O Saidgarh, Bishnah, Jammu, JK UT for RBM (River Bed Mineral), Block-31 over a revised area of 1.42ha. at Dharli Nallah Downstream Ujan Bridge at Village Choudhary Nar, Rajouri, JK UT under proposal No. SIA/JK/MIN/213928/2021/SIA/JK/MIN/61196/2021.

Brief Summary: This case pertains to grant of Environment Clearance under B1 category for RBM (River Bed Mineral), Block-31 over revised area of 1.42ha. LOI has been issued on 18/08/2020, which was later extended on 15/04/2021 and is valid up to 31/08/2021. Mining plan has been approved on 16/02/2021. Terms of Reference were issued on 14-05-2021 and public hearing was conducted on 31-03-2021. The area was reduced by the Geology & Mining Department on 18-06-2021. The aforesaid case was processed in pursuance to G.O 76JK-FST of 2020 dated 29/07/2021. As per summary of appraisal report, district survey report needs to be revised by including replenishment data etc., Status of NOC's in appraisal report shows Dy. Commissioner, Rajouri vide letter No. DCR/2021-22/Acct/80 dated 06/05/2021 has intimated NOC's of stake holder departments. The NOCs have been issued with conditions which are to be adhered to in letter and spirit.

Further, the JKEAC has made the following specific observations:

- a) The Dy. Commissioner concerned vide letter Dy. Commissioner vide his letter No. DCR/2020-21/Acct/325 has reported that illegal mining has taken place in and around the block but the project proponent is not involved in it. Therefore, the case was appraised under non-violation category.
- b) Project cost has been underestimated by the consultant as it does not include cost of EMP, Closure plan, surveillance equipment, Env. Clearance processing fee/ PCCs Consent fee etc. and therefore needs to be revised.
- c) EMP is meagre for the project and needs to be revised with appropriate budget as suggested in the remark's column of EMP table.
- d) Revision of the mining plan with revised mine closure plan, revised mining block area, revised mining depth, revised surface plan, revised targeted mineral production and replenishment and its denovo approval by the competent authority prior to grant of EC or as decided by JKEIAA.
- e) Mining depth be restricted to 1m in aggregate in view of non-availability of replenishment data in the DSRs formulated by the G&M Dept.
- f) Strict adherence to the terms and conditions of the NOCs of the stakeholder departments which need to be monitored by the enforcement agencies and concerned depts.
- g) No JCBs/ Excavators/ Bulldozers to be used in mining and no water course to be disturbed while transporting minor minerals.

10. EC is valid only three years from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA and JKPCB in view of non-availability of replenishment data.
