The case was discussed in 526th SEIAA meeting dtd. 02.03.2019 and recorded that :-

1. *M/s. Indore Municipal Corporation is proposing to construct affordable housing project "Gulmarg Parisar" under Pradhan Mantri Awash Yojana at Village Kanadia and Taluka Sanyogitaganj District Indore, MP State. The project includes 1 BHK- P+ 8, 2 BHK – P+9, Shops, Community Hall etc.*
2. *The proposed project is building & construction Residential Project having total built up area 1,28,158.02 sq.m and total land area is 71,310.0 sq.m. The project comes under 8(a) category (B) of schedule of EIA Notification, 2006 because total construction is between 20,000 sq.m & 1,50,000 sq.m and plot area is less than 50 ha. **PP has not submitted approved T & CP layout.***
3. *It was observed that the distance of this project site from the Ralamandal Wildlife Sanctuary is <10 km for which PP has applied for NBWL Clearance vide proposal no. FP/MP/Others/3856/2019 dtd. 24/01/2019 and submitted the copy of the online acknowledgement.*
4. *The case was discussed in SEAC meetings 339th dtd. 29.01.19 and is recommended for grant of prior EC subject to special conditions.*
5. *After deliberation the case was discussed in detail and recorded that:-*
 - i. *Regarding land documents PP has submitted Collector District Indore order dtd. 01.05.18. As per the order the land area 7.131 ha land has been allotted to Municipal Corporation Indore for implementation of Pradhan Mantri Awash Yojana.*
 - ii. *The total water requirement is 955 KLD & fresh water requirement is 636 KLD. The source of water supply is Municipal Corporation, Indore. PP has submitted letter (dtd. 30.07.2018) from Municipal Corporation, Indore for water supply.*
 - iii. *The waste water generation is 764 KLD and PP has provided 02 numbers of Sewage Treatment Plant capacities of 900KLD (2x450 KLD). The available treated water is 688 KLD. Out of 688 KLD 319 KLD will be used for flushing, 57 KLD gardening, 35 KLD DG set cooling etc. The excess treated water (277 KLD)will be discharged into the municipal sewer line. **PP has not submitted NOC from Nagar Nigam Indore for disposal of extra treated waste water.***
 - iv. *The Municipal Solid Waste 3562 kg/day shall be generated. The generated biodegradable and non biodegradable waste will be collected separately and disposed of at the landfill site of Municipal Corporation. **PP has submitted letter (dtd. 01.08.2018) from Municipal Corporation, Indore for disposal of solid waste.***
 - v. *PP has proposed to provide fire pump house, external hydrant system, Internal hydrant system, hose reel, hose boxes, fire alarm system and fire extinguishers etc as per NBC 2005.*
 - vi. *PP has proposed to provide Open parking 308 ECS, Stilt parking – 334 ECS an area of parking for 400 ECS (1200 two wheelers)*
 - vii. *Total Power requirement for the project will be 2000 Kw and it will be sourced from State Electricity Board. DG sets will be used during power failure only. A DG set of about 3x75 KVA, 2x100 KVA and 1X 150 KVA will be used as emergency power backup. For energy conservation measures PP has proposed use of energy efficient lighting devices are planned such as Light Emitting Diodes (LEDs), CFLs, tube lights in place of incandescent bulbs etc.*
 - viii. *PP has proposed to provide roof top rain water harvesting system with 29 nos. of recharging pits at selected locations, which will catch the maximum run-off from the area.*
 - ix. *Total green area measures 8154.0-sq. m.(15%) Only native vegetation with a mix of evergreen and deciduous trees shall be utilized to maintain seasonal greenery Environment Management Plan inside the complex in addition to flowering and ornamental plants.*

After the detail discussion PP was asked to submit the following:-

- a) **Details of height of building, internal road width, front MOS and side / rear MOS as per approved layout of T & CP.**
- b) **NOC from concerned department for disposal of extra treated waste water.**
- c) **During presentation It is reported that there is an abundant mine pit within the premises of the project site, which is filled with water. PP should submit the landscape plan by showing preventive safety measures for the abundant mine pit.**
- d) **It was observed by the authority that the car parking of the project area is less as compare to built-up area. PP should submit the layout plan by increasing no. of car parking.**

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- e) *PP has not submitted the details of green belt development of the project. PP should submit the layout by showing two rows periphery plantation of the project area along the road side, parking area and other amenities area etc.*

In response to above PP has submitted the queries reply vide letter dated 23.09.19 after submission of reply, the case was considered in 574th SEIAA meeting dtd. 27.09.19 and recorded that:-

PP has submitted point wise above desired information in SEIAA vide letter dated 23.09.19 to consider prior EC. After discussion, it was decided to call PP clarification on above issues so that necessary decision for considering prior environmental clearance can be taken up by the authority. Copy to PP.

As per above PP was called for presentation and after clarification of the above queries it is recorded that:-

- a) As per the approval of Joint Director, T & CP Indore (**S. No. 2453/ NAGRANI/2018 dated 26.04.2019**) the total land area 9.500 ha is allocated for PMAY project at Village – Knadia Tehsil & District Indore(M.P.) The total built up area proposed by PP is 1,28,158.02 sq.m .The height of the building is 27 and maximum 30m front MOS 12.0m side/rear 7.5m.
- b) PP has submitted declaration (dtd. 29.01.20) regarding disposal of extra treated waste water and further PP stated that after completion the project services are proposed to be maintained by the society formed of the local residents, if in case society does not perform satisfactory, the operation and maintenance of these services will be done by Municipal Corporation, Indore in co-ordination with local residents of aforesaid township.
- c) PP has submitted the mine pit barricaded properly and also park area will be developed around the mine pit. The landscape plan by showing preventive safety measures for the abundant mine pit has also submitted by PP.
- d) PP has submitted revised lay out plan of car parking with total numbers of 1115 ECS (stilt-450 ECS and open- 665ECS) .
- e) The layout showing two rows periphery plantation of the project area along the road side, parking area and other amenities area etc.
- f) Under CER PP has proposed as follows:-

The submissions made by the PP were found to be satisfactory and acceptable hence it is decided to accept the recommendations of 339th SEAC meeting dtd. 29.01.19 with special conditions and accord Prior Environmental Clearance for Proposed Gulmarg Parisar (Affordable Housing Project), Khasra no.- 885/1/1, 885/1/4, 885/5, 885/6 Village- Kanadia Mandal Sanyogitaganj District Indore, MP. Total Plot Area- 71,310.0 sq.m.Total Built up area – 1,28,158.02 sq.m.by Mr. D. R. Lodhi, Superintendent Engineer (SE) Indore Municipal Corporation (PMAY) 107, 109, First Floor Palika Plaza Indore 452007 (M.P.), subject to following specific conditions imposed by SEIAA:-

1. The entire demand of water should be met through Municipal Corporation, Indore; there should be no extraction of ground water.
2. The inlet and outlet point of natural drain system should be maintained with adequate size of channel for ensuring unrestricted flow of water.
3. **Disposal of waste water.**
 - a. PP should ensure disposal of waste water arrangement should be done in such a manner that water supply sources are not impaired.
 - b. PP should ensure linkage with municipal sewer line for disposal of extra treated waste water.
 - c. PP should ensure to operation and maintenance of the two STP's, Lifts and other maintenance of services of apartments building which will be installed at site as declared.
4. **Solid Waste Management:**
 - a. Ensure linkage with Municipal Corporation for final disposal of MSW.
 - b. Adequate measures should be taken to prevent odour emanating from solid waste handling & processing.
5. PP should ensure building height, road width, front MOS and side / rear as per approved layout of T & CP.
6. **For firefighting:-**
 - a. PP should ensure distance of fire station approachable from the project site.
 - b. As per MPBVR, 2012 rule 42 (3) PP should submit necessary drawings and details to the Authority (Nagar Nigam, Indore) incorporating all the fire fighting measures recommended in National Building Code 2005.The occupancy permit shall be issued by Nagar Nigam only after ensuring that all fire fighting measures are physically in place.

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7. **For Rain Water Harvesting, and Storm water management:-**
- PP should ensure the rain water harvesting with 29 recharging pits and these pits should be connected laterally to consume the surplus runoff. In addition, PP should provide recharging trenches. The base of the trenches should be Kachha with pebbles.
 - The storm water from roof – top, paved surfaces and landscaped surfaces should be properly channelized to the rain water harvesting sumps through efficient storm water network as proposed. The budget should be included in EMP plan for storm water management.
8. PP should ensure to provide car parking total 1115 ECS ((450 ECS for Silt parking and 665 ECS for open parking).
9. **Green belt :-**
- PP should ensure plantation in an area of, 8154.0-sq. m.(15%) is dedicated for the landscaping purposes. Two rows periphery plantation of the project area along the road side, parking area and other amenities area etc.
 - As a green belt and landscaped area with regular maintenance and also explore the possibility to plant trees of indigenous local varieties like Neem, Peepal, Kadam, Karanj, Kachnaar, Saltree, Gulmohar etc.
 - The green belt of the adequate width and density preferably with local species along the periphery of the plot shall be raised if possible so as to provide protection against particulates and noise.
10. PP should ensure to construct properly barricades along with plantation around the reservoir mine pit area.
11. The project proponent shall comply with the provisions contained in this Ministry's OM vide F.No. 22-65/2017-IA.III dated 1St May 2018, as applicable, regarding Corporate Environment Responsibility for which budgetary allocation approx. 2.14 Cr has been made. PP should ensure to implement the CER activities in consultation with district administration.
12. PP should ensure to submit half yearly compliance report and CSR activity report with photographs of plantation in MP-SEIAA. If PP is failed to upload or submit two consecutive half yearly compliance reports of EC conditions to concerned authority (SEIAA and Regional Office, MoEF&CC,GoI, Bhopal) than prior environmental clearance issued to PP will automatically be treated as cancelled/ revoked as per OM No. 930/SEIAA/2019 dated 30.05.2019 issued by MPSEIAA.
2. **Case No:- 5753/2018** Prior Environmental Clearance for Bhatia **Limestone Mine** in an area of 7.859 ha. for production capacity 25000 TPA (Khasra No. 1089/1, 1089/4, 1112, 1113, 1110, 1108, 1109, 1104 & 1111) at village - Bhatia, Tehsil – Maihar, Dist. - Satna, MP by M/s KJS Cement India Limited, NH -7, Rewa Road, Rajnagar, Village - Amilia, Lakhwar, Maihar, District - Satna (MP) - 485771.
- (1) This is a project pertaining to mining of Limestone Mine in MLA of 7.859 Ha. The activity is mentioned at S.No. 1 (a) of the Schedule of EIA Notification 2006 as amended from time to time. The project is reported to be at a distance of more than 10 km from National Park /Sanctuary/Biosphere Reserve etc. thus it is not attracted by the general conditions and falls under category 'B-1" by virtue

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of its location and mining lease area. There is no forest boundary within 250 m. from ML area. The case was forwarded by SEIAA to SEAC for appraisal of EIA for environment clearance for the project. It was submitted that this is a proposed mine having valid lease period upto 04.11.2025 with production capacity 25000 TPA of limestone.

- (2) The lease was initially granted to Shri Ramlubhya Sehgal for the period of 20 years from 05.11.1975 to 04.11.1995. After that, lease was renewed for further 20 years upto 2015. In year 2010, lease was transfer to M/s KJS Cement Ltd. For balance period. But after enforcing the MMRD 2015, now the valid lease period of the proposed mine is 50 years and valid upto 04.11.2025. The lease area comes under own/govt./pvt. land over an area of 7.859 Ha. The Mining Plan with progressive mine closure plan has been approved by IBM, Jabalpur Vide Letter No.–MP/Satna/Limestone/MPLN/MOD-05/2015-16dated 04.11.15.
- (3) PP has produced an order of the Mineral Resources Deptt. GoMP dtd. 03.09.2015 in which after hearing the case, the State Govt. has established that action be taken according to the latest circular No. 19-5-2015/12/1 dtd. 12.03.2015, which states that “all mining leases granted before the commencement of the Mines & Minerals (Development & Regulation) Amendment Ordinance 2015 shall be deemed to have been granted for a period of fifty years”.
- (4) SEAC in its 416th SEAC meeting dtd 08.01.2020 has recommended the case with 41 special conditions for issuance of EC.
- (5) PP/Consultant made a presentation on all aspects of the project and all concerned issues were discussed in detail.
- (6) It was noted that the water requirement is 20.0 KLD (11.0 KLD for Dust Suppression + 5.0 KLD for Green Belt + 2.0 KLD for Domestic purpose + 2.0 KLD for drilling) which shall be met from the existing mine pit and settling tank for dust suppression & green belt. Hand pump water is used for drinking purpose.
- (7) The proposed plantation programme was examined and it was found that total 7820 saplings shall be covered under plantation.
- (1) It was also noted that the Public Hearing was carried out on 11.10.2019 at Mine Parisar village - Bhatia, Tehsil – Maihar, Dist. - Satna under Chairmanship of Upper Collector, Satna. The major comments of applicants during public hearing are water & air quality, employment of local people, plantation, safety of mine workers and improvement of socio-economic environment.

After detailed discussions and perusal of recommendations of 416th SEAC meeting dtd 08.01.2020, it was decided to accept the recommendation of SEAC for grant of prior EC to the project subject to the following specific conditions:

- I. Before commencing any mining activity fencing shall be carried out all around the lease area. Proper watch and ward arrangements should be made with installation of signage at 4 corners of lease area to avoid any untoward incident involving public and animals by the PP.
- II. Lease agreement shall be carried out before execution of mining operation.

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- III. Plantation programme as mentioned in EIA/EMP and presented during presentation in SEIAA & SEAC shall be followed in content and spirit.
- IV. PP will plant 2140 saplings of suitable fast growing tree species like Neem, Peepal, Bargad, Gulmohar, Ficus Venjamin (Pukar), Kachnar, Sissoo, Amla, Mango, Drumstick, Imli, Jamun, Ashok, Amaltas, Karanj, Saptparni etc. in first two years and 5680 plants in 3rd to CP year along the lease boundary in mine premises/ road side, transportation road/ in premises, along the water pit/in premises/ road side and in mine premises.
- V. The mining operation shall be restricted to above ground water table and in no case it should intersect the ground water table. In case of working below the ground water table, approval of the Central Ground Water Board shall be obtained.
- VI. No overcharging during blasting to avoid vibration.
- VII. No intermediate stacking is permitted at the mine site.
- VIII. No dump shall be stacked outside the lease area.
- IX. Regular air & water quality monitoring shall be carried out by PP from authorized laboratory in consultation with Regional Officer, MPPCB.
- X. PP shall ensure generation of employment opportunities nearby Village on priority bases.
- XI. Payments of wages to the workers shall be done in consonance with the provisions in the labour laws.
- XII. Proper infrastructure with shelter, drinking water, toilet and first-aid facilities shall be provided for the laborers. A provision should be made to construct a pakka rest shelter along with toilet and drinking water facility.
- XIII. PP should also carry out regular sprinkling in the mining lease area to arrest dust emission from mining activities affecting the nearby agriculture fields
- XIV. Mining shall be limited to the area as shown in surface plan and as per the approved mining scheme.
- XV. PP shall ensure the proper water supply arrangements for plantation especially in summer season.
- XVI. PP shall ensure proper implementation of plantation, dust suppression, construction of approach road and maintenance of existing pakka road as part of Environmental Management Plan. Additional budget provision shall be made as part of EMP.
- XVII. PP must ensure implementation of the following activities with separate total budget provision of Rs. 2.0 Lakhs under CER as committed:
 - A. To provide need based support for school building repairing, toilets, fresh water supply etc as per the recommendation of Gram Panchayat / Gram Sabha in following schools:
 - a) Bhatia Primary School
 - b) Barhia Primary School
 - c) Jura Primary School
 - d) Rigra Primary School

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The modification to the above activities can be made with the permission of the district administration and need based activity for the development of nearby villages shall be implemented by PP in consultation with the District Collector and Gram Panchayat.

- XVIII. PP should ensure to submit half yearly compliance report, Plantation and CER activity report along with photographs of all activities in MP-SEIAA. If PP is failed to upload or submit two consecutive half yearly compliance reports of EC conditions to concerned authority (SEIAA and Regional Office, MoEF&CC, Gol, Bhopal) than prior environmental clearance issued to PP will automatically be treated as cancelled/ revoked as per OM No. 930/SEIAA/2019 dated 30.05.2019 issued by MPSEIAA.

Hence, Prior Environmental Clearance is granted for Limestone Mine in an area of 7.859 ha. for production capacity 25000 TPA (Khasra No. 1089/1, 1089/4, 1112, 1113, 1110, 1108, 1109, 1104 & 1111) at village - Bhatia, Tehsil – Maihar, Dist. - Satna, MP by M/s KJS Cement India Limited, NH -7, Rewa Road, Rajnagar, Village - Amilia, Lakhwar, Maihar, District - Satna (MP) - 485771.

3. **Case No:- 5634/2018** Prior Environmental Clearance for **Manganese Ore Mine** (opencast manual/ mechanized method) in an area of 5.859 ha. for expansion in production capacity from 600 TPA to 6673 TPA (Khasra no.11/1, 11/3, 12, 15/1, 15/2) at Village - Ranpeth Damami, Tehsil - Sausar, Dist. - Chhindwara (MP) by M/s Rawell Mining Corporation, Rawell Building, Plot No. 18, New Ramdaspath, Nagpur, Maharashtra.
- (1) This is a project pertaining to mining of Manganese Ore Mine in MLA of 5.859 Ha. The activity is mentioned at S.No. 1 (a) of the Schedule of EIA Notification 2006 as amended from time to time. The project is reported to be at a distance of more than 10 km from National Park /Sanctuary/Biosphere Reserve etc. thus it is not attracted by the general conditions and falls under category 'B-1' by virtue of its location and mining lease area. There is no forest boundary within 250 m. from ML area. The case was forwarded by SEIAA to SEAC for appraisal of EIA for environment clearance for the project. It was submitted that this is a proposed mine having valid lease period upto 19.10.2059 with expansion production capacity of 600 TPA to 6673 TPA of manganese.
 - (2) The lease was initially granted to M/s Rawell Mining Corporation for the period of 20 years from 20.10.2009 to 19.10.2029 but after enforcing the MMRD 2015, now the valid lease period of the proposed mine is 50 years and valid upto 19.10.2059. The lease area comes under own and pvt. land over an area of 5.859 Ha. This is a case of existing mining lease. The Mining Plan with progressive mine closure plan has been approved by IBM, Jabalpur Vide Letter No. – MP/Chhindwara/Manganese/MPLN MOD-15/2016-17 dated 15.11.2016.
 - (3) PP has produced an order of the Mineral Resources Deptt. GoMP dtd. 03.09.2015 in which after hearing the case, the State Govt. has established that action be taken according to the latest circular No. 19-5-2015/12/1 dtd. 12.03.2015, which states that "all mining leases granted before the commencement of the Mines & Minerals (Development & Regulation) Amendment Ordinance 2015 shall be deemed to have been granted for a period of fifty years".

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- (4) SEAC in its 416th SEAC meeting dtd 08.01.2020 has recommended the case with 35 special conditions for issuance of EC.
- (5) PP/Consultant made a presentation on all aspects of the project and all concerned issues were discussed in detail.
- (6) It was noted that the water requirement is 29.0 KLD (22.0 KLD for Dust Suppression + 5.0 KLD for Green Belt + 2.0 KLD for Domestic purpose) which shall be met from the existing mine pit and settling tank.
- (7) The proposed plantation programme was examined and it was found that total 4570 saplings shall be covered under plantation.
- (8) Earlier prior Environmental Clearance was granted by MPSEIAA Case No. (287/2009) Letter No. 680/EPCO-SEIAA/11 dtd 04-11-11.
- (9) PP has now applied for Prior Environmental Clearance for expansion in production capacity from 600 TPA to 6673 TPA Manganese Ore.
- (10) PP has submitted compliance report of earlier prior EC certified by MoEF &CC Regional Office, Bhopal (vide letter no. 18 B – 14/2019/SEIAA/ (ENV)/ 906 dtd. 12.09.2019). As per the report, the implementation of environmental safeguards are found satisfactory and some compliance needs improvement which are in progress and has been advised to take care for conditions like environmental management, green belt development, OB and soil management also the submission and uploading of six monthly compliance reports as per stipulations. It is decided that PP should ensure the implementation of the observations of MOEF & CC RO, Bhopal report dtd 12.09.2019.
- (11) It was also noted that the Public Hearing was carried out on 28.12.2019 at Mine Parisar Village - Ranpeth Damami, Tehsil - Sausar, Dist. - Chhindwara under Chairmanship of Upper Collector, Chhindwara. The major comments of applicants during public hearing are; drinking water facility at village, medical health check up camps, safety items to labours & maintenance of road.

After detailed discussions and perusal of recommendations of 416th SEAC meeting dtd 08.01.2020, it was decided to accept the recommendation of SEAC for grant of prior EC to the project subject to the following specific conditions:

- I. Before commencing any mining activity fencing shall be carried out all around the lease area. Proper watch and ward arrangements should be made with installation of signage at 4 corners of lease area to avoid any untoward incident involving public and animals by the PP.
- II. Lease agreement shall be carried out before execution of mining operation.
- III. Plantation programme as mentioned in EIA/EMP and presented during presentation in SEIAA & SEAC shall be followed in content and spirit.
- IV. PP shall develop a green belt on non-minable area of southern side within ML area. Three rows of plantation shall be carried out in greenbelt area in first three year with proper watering arrangement.
- V. PP will plant 3770 saplings of suitable fast growing tree species like Neem, Peepal, Bargad, Kachnar, Sissoo, Amla, Mango, Orange, Drumstick, Imli,

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Jamun, Ashok, Amaltas, Karanj, Saptarni etc. in first three years and 800 plants in 4th year at non-minable area of southern side within ML area/approach road.

- VI. The mining operation shall be restricted to above ground water table and in no case it should intersect the ground water table. In case of working below the ground water table, approval of the Central Ground Water Board shall be obtained.
- VII. No intermediate stacking is permitted at the mine site.
- VIII. No dump shall be stacked outside the lease area.
- IX. Regular air & water quality monitoring shall be carried out by PP from authorized laboratory in consultation with Regional Officer, MP PCB.
- X. PP shall ensure generation of employment opportunities nearby Village on priority bases.
- XI. Payments of wages to the workers shall be done in consonance with the provisions in the labour laws.
- XII. Proper infrastructure with shelter, drinking water, toilet and first-aid facilities shall be provided for the laborers. A provision should be made to construct a pakka rest shelter along with toilet and drinking water facility.
- XIII. PP should also carry out regular sprinkling in the mining lease area to arrest dust emission from mining activities affecting the nearby agriculture fields
- XIV. Mining shall be limited to the area as shown in surface plan and as per the approved mining scheme.
- XV. PP shall ensure the proper water supply arrangements for plantation especially in summer season.
- XVI. PP shall ensure proper implementation of plantation, dust suppression, construction of approach road and maintenance of existing pakka road as part of Environmental Management Plan. Additional budget provision shall be made as part of EMP.
- XVII. PP must ensure implementation of the following activities with separate total budget provision of Rs. 6.50 Lakhs (3.0 lakh – CER & 3.50 lakh Public hearing issues) under Socio Economic Measures as committed:
 - a) **CER activities (Rs. 3.0 lakh):** To provide infrastructure support like play ground, furniture, boundary wall, toilets, solar power system etc to the village school at Ranpeth Dammi primary school.
 - b) **Public Hearing Issues (Rs. 3.50 lakh):** 02 hand pump shall be provided at village Kacchidhana, annual medical health check up camps for the people of the area, provision of safety shoes, belt, ear plugs, helmets etc, timely maintenance of village road.

The modification to the above activities can be made with the permission of the district administration and need based activity for the development of nearby villages shall be implemented by PP in consultation with the District Collector and Gram Panchayat.
