The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Sri Vasantha & Kushal Bodhankar of M/s. KKB Envirocare Consultants Pvt. Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

The proponent informed that the existing industry is involved in R&D activity which did not require EC. The proponent established the industry with CFE dt. 05.09.2006 from the APPCB and operating with latest CFO vide order dt. 09.06.2021 from the TSPCB.

Now, the proponent proposed expansion of the project and the total built up area is increasing from 19,605 Sq.m. to 25,839 Sq.m., though the R&D activity does not require EC, the proponent applied for EC as the total Built up area of the project exceeds 20,000 Sq.m. In this regard the SEAC noted that the proponent is not proposing industrial sheds rather proposed RCC buildings and hence the SEAC considered the proposal for EC.

The SEAC noted that total plot area is 39,133.10 Sq.m., out of which green area is 13,118 Sq.m. (33.52%).

It was informed that the total built up area of the project is 25,839 Sq.m. The project consists of Existing R&D Building (G+1 Floor); Security Block; Solvent Store; Chemical Store; Electrical Panel room; Proposed FDF Block, Process Safety Lab (G+1 Floor); Chemical Store; Hazardous Waste Storage Shed; ETP Area & Amphi Theater.

It is also noted that Parking area to be provided is 5,684.36 Sq.m., (22% against required 22%).

The SEAC noted that the total water requirement after expansion is 122.5 KLD and the quantity of effluent generated is 61 KLD. Out of which, HTDS effluent from R&D process is 1.5 KLD; LTDS effluent is 28.5 KLD. The effluent generated will be sent to JETL after pre-treatment and the sewage will be disposed to the common STP of IKP Knowledge park.

Canteen waste of 900 Kg/month will be disposed to local Piggery Farms and the domestic waste of 100 Kgs/month will be disposed of municipal waste disposal facility.

The SEAC noted that the nearest human habitation is Turkapally (V) located at a distance of 1.48 km; nearest water body is Malka Cheruvu at 0.23 km and nearest RF is Turkapally RF at 0.57 km from the boundary of the site.

The total cost of the project after expansion is Rs. 247.88 Crores. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 1.9 Crores and recurring cost: Rs. 0.7 Crores.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended for issue of EC.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Sri Hari Prasad of M/s. Rightsource Industrial Solutions Pvt. Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

Earlier, the SEIAA, TS issued EC vide order dt. 22.03.2021 for Bulk Drug & Drug Intermediates.

Now, the proponent informed that they acquired additional land adjacent to site and submitted land documents (Agreement of sale). Hence, it was requested to issue Amendment to EC with the following changes:

The SEAC observed that the proponent has submitted only agreement of sale but not the registered sale deed. In this regard, the proponent informed that they could not submit registered sale deed due to technical issue in Dharani portal.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC deferred the project for consideration after submission of registered sale deed by the proponent.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Sri L. Chandrashekar reddy of M/s. Space Enviro Solutions, Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

The proponent informed that the lease was granted (in-principle) on 09.10.2007 in favour of the proponent for a period of 20 years. It may be noted that the Mine Lease is granted before 09.09.2013.

The Proponent also submitted a copy of lr.dt. 12.08.2021 of ADMG, Vikarabad District informing that there is one existing quarry lease of Sri S. Ravi (56.68 Ha. lease granted before 09.09.2013) falling within 500m from the proposed quarry lease. The SEAC noted that the mine lease area is 1.00 Ha. which is less than 5.0 Ha. It is further noted that the total Cluster area is 57.68 Ha. and Net cluster is 1.00 Ha. which is less than 5.0 Ha. Hence, the project is considered under B2 Category as per provisions laid under EIA Notification, 2006 & its subsequent amendments and orders of the Hon'ble NGT. The proponent submitted a copy of Scrutinized/ Approved Mining Plan & EMP Report.

The nearest village to the proposed site is Gopyanaik Tanda which is existing at a distance of 1.09 km; nearest water body exists at 0.25 km (ESE); nearest RF i.e., Kulkacharla RF exists at 5.44 km (E) from the boundary of the site.

It is proposed to mine 2,520 m<sup>3</sup>/annum of Black Granite and the life of mine is reported as 15 years.

The total cost of the project is Rs. 50.0 Lakhs. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 6.05 lakhs and recurring cost: Rs. 3.99 Lakhs/annum.

The proponent submitted a copy of letter dt. 23.08.2021 of the ADMG: Vikarabad District furnishing the yearwise production details for the period from 2007-08 to 2021-22. The SEAC observed from the letter that the production quantity was carried out during 4 years only 2007-09 & 2012-14 and no mining operations were carried in the remaining period.

The proponent informed that they have planted 75 no. of Gulmohar plants near the mine lease area & approach road and submitted cash bill dt. 20.08.2021 of Laxmi Seeds Suppliers. It was informed that they could not undertake CSR activities as the mine was not in operation.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended the project for issue of EC.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Sri L. Chandrashekar reddy of M/s. Space Enviro Solutions, Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

Earlier, the SEAC in its meeting held on 08.04.2021 deferred the project to submit earlier production details certified by the Mining Department, EMP measures, Greenbelt development and CSR activities already implemented by the project proponent.

Accordingly, the proponent submitted a copy of letter dt. 24.04.2021 of the ADMG: Warangal Rural District furnishing the yearwise details of dispatches for last 5 years i.e., from 2016-17 to 2020-21. The SEAC observed from the letter that the mineral was dispatched during 2017-18 to 2020-21 and no mining operations were carried during 2016-2017.

The proponent informed that they have planted 460 no. of plants near the mine lease area and submitted a copy of certificate dt. 10.07.2021 issued by the Panchayat Secretary Venkatapur GP, Nekkonda (M), Warangal District. The proponent also submitted receipt dt. 13.04.2021 from the Gram Panchayat office of Venkatapuram for received metal amounting Rs. 40,000/- for road repair works, Bathukamma ground development; and also Rs. 8000/- as donation of mike set during Sriramanavami under CSR activities.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended the project for issue of EC.

During presentation the SEAC noted that the Proponent submitted Approved/Scrutinized Mining plan for the period from 2016-17 to 2020-21. It is observed that the plan period was up to march 2021 only and the proponent has not submitted latest Approved Mining Plan. Hence, the SEAC informed the proponent to submit latest Approved Mining Plan.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC deferred the project for consideration after submission of latest Approved Mining Plan by the proponent.

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The proponent informed that the lease was granted (in-principle) on 09.07.2007 in favour of the proponent for a period of 20 years. It may be noted that the Mine Lease is granted before 09.09.2013. The proponent submitted a copy of Scrutinized/ Approved Mining Plan & EMP Report.

During presentation the SEAC noted that the Proponent submitted Approved/Scrutinized Mining plan for the period from 2016-17 to 2020-21. It is observed that the plan period was up to march 2021 only and the proponent has not submitted latest Approved Mining Plan. Hence, the SEAC informed the proponent to submit latest Approved Mining Plan.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC deferred the project for consideration after submission of latest Approved Mining Plan by the proponent.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Sri L. Chandrasekhar Reddy of M/s. Space Enviro Solutions, Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

Earlier, the SEAC in its meeting held on 13.08.2021 informed the proponent to submit Structural Stability Certificate from a licensed Structural Engineer to ascertain adequacy of foundation.

Accordingly, the proponent submitted Structural Stability Certificate dt. 04.08.2021 issued by the Structural Engineer, Anagha Engineering Consultants. It was stated that the structure which is already under construction and the progress is designed for considering 2Basements + Stilt for parking + 12 upper floors for residential apartments as the scope of additional floors is taken into consideration before designing and execution.

Hence the structure which is under consideration can bear extra two more floors safely without any endager to the safety of the building as the same is considered before designing the structure.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended the project for issue of Amendment to EC.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Sri Laxmikanth Reddy of M/s. Vison Labs, Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

The project is proposed within 10 km radius of Himayat Sagar and Osman Sagar Lakes. But, Serilingampally (V) is not included in the list of 84 villages in the 10km catchment of above lakes as mentioned in the G.O.Ms. No: 111, MA, dt. 08.03.1996.

The project is proposed in a total plot area of 22,257.71 Sq.m., for construction of Multi Storied Residential Building with total built up area of 3,35,903.98 Sq.m (4B + G + 52 Floors).

The SEAC considered the request of the proponent. After detailed discussions, the proponent is directed to prepare EIA report as per the Standard Terms of Reference (TORs) issued by the MoEF&CC, GoI for “Townships and Area Development projects” submit EIA report along with NOC from Airports Authority of India to the SEAC for appraisal.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Smt. Lochana of M/s. Pridhvi Envirotech (P) Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

The SEAC noted that total plot area is 19,728.11 Sq.m., out of which green area is 2,966.26 Sq.m. (15.04%).

It was informed that the total built up area of the project is 95,618.79 Sq.m. The project consists of Residential Complex to accommodate 293 units. Maximum no. of floors proposed in the project are 2C + G + 7 Upper Floors.

It is also noted that Parking area to be provided is 29128.96 Sq.m., (43.8% against required 33%).

The total cost of the project is Rs. 125.0 Crores. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 125.0 Lakhs and recurring cost: Rs. 15.0 lakhs/annum.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended for issue of EC.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Smt. Lochana of M/s. Pridhvi Envirotech (P) Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

Earlier, the SEIAA, TS issued EC vide order dt. 09.10.2017 in the name of M/s. Hyderabad Securities and Enterprises Limited & M/s. Hari Sundar Tobacco Threshers Pvt. Ltd., for Residential cum Commercial construction Project.

It was informed that M/s. Boorugu Infra Projects Private Limited purchased property from M/s. Hari Sundar Tobacco Threshers Pvt. Ltd. and submitted a copy of Registered Sale deed executed on 26.08.2019. It was also informed that M/s. Hyderabad Securities and Enterprises Limited entered Development Agreement cum General Power of Attorney with M/s. Boorugu Infra Projects Private Limited executed on 15.02.2017 for Construction of proposed Commercial & Residential Apartment by investing its funds. It was informed that Sri Boorugu Ravi Kumar, MD, M/s. Boorugu Infra Projects Private Limited already possesses adjacent land/property to the existing project. The SEAC observed that old buildings are already existing in that site. It was informed that the existing old building will be demolished and proposed new building in expansion will be taken up. It was also informed that they proposed expansion of the project for which EC was obtained. It was informed that there are no changes in the configuration of the existing building except decrease in no. of floors and proposed additional new building. It was informed that the construction of buildings for which EC was obtained is under construction and not yet completed. Meanwhile, they proposed expansion of the project. The SEAC observed that the Certified Compliance Report on earlier EC conditions may not be require as the existing project is still under construction.

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During presentation, the proponent informed that they have obtained NOCs dt. 25.10.2016, 05.01.2017 & 28.07.2021 for height clearance from Airports Authority of India w.r.t. the proposed project and submitted a copies of the same. It is observed from the NOC dt. 25.10.2016 that the the permissible top elevation is 615.41 mts AMSL. It is observed from the NOC dt. 05.01.2017 that the site elevation is 538.0 mts AMSL and the permissible top elevation is restricted to 615.41 mts AMSL. It is observed from the NOC dt. 28.07.2021 (M/s. Pranava Constructions represented by Managing Partner of Sri. Boorugu Ravi Kumar) that the site elevation is 536.45 mts AMSL and the permissible top elevation is restricted to 595.46 mts AMSL. The SEAC noted that the height of the building is within the permissible top elevation restricted by the AAI. The proponent submitted the Risk Assessment report & Disaster Management Plan.

The SEAC noted that total plot area is 22,383.80 Sq.m., Net plot area is 21629.59 Sq.m., out of which green area is 2,172.01 Sq.m. (10.04%).

It was informed that the total built up area of the project is 1,72,608.66 Sq.m. The project consists of Residential Apartments to accommodate 235 units & Commercial Building. Maximum no. of floors proposed in the project for Residential are 3C + G + 23 Floors.

It is also noted that Parking area to be provided is 52,686.54 Sq.m., (against required 44,185.87 Sq.m., considering 33% of BUA for Residential and 44 % of BUA for Commerical).

The total cost of the project is Rs. 300.0 Crores. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 280.0 Lakhs during construction phase and Rs. 20.0 lakhs during occupation phase, recurring cost: Rs. 36.0 lakhs/annum during construction phase and Rs. 64.0 lakhs/annum during occupation phase, as per revised EMP budget during presentation.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended for issue of EC.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Smt. Lochana of M/s. Pridhvi Envirotech (P) Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

During presentation, the proponent informed that the unit was originally in the name of M/s. Roots Medicare Pvt. Ltd. and was established in the year 2005 and consented to manufacture drug intermediates. Later, the unit was taken over by M/s. Phanicare Pharmaceuticls Pvt. Ltd. in the year 2014. Subsequently, the unit was purchased by the current management in the year 2018. Presently, the unit is being operated with CFO order dt. 26.04.2019.

The proponent submitted self certified compliance of CFO conditions.

The SEAC noted the G.O.Ms. No. 95, dt. 21.09.2007; G.O.Ms. No. 64, dt. 25.07.2013 of the EFS&T Dept., GoAP & G.O.Ms. No. 24, dt.24.04.2019. of the EFS&T Dept., GoTS.

The SEAC examined the proposal as per the provisions laid under S.O.1223 (E), dt.27.03.2020, S.O.3636 (E), dt.15.10.2020 & S.O.2859 (E), dt.16.07.2021 and considered the project under B2 Category.

The SEAC noted the contents of the EMP report and noted the details of the project after Expansion as follows:

Total area is 2,740.89 Sq.m., out of which Green area is 1,160.15 Sq.m. (42%).

Nearest human habitation is Bollaram (V) @ 0.96 km; Nearest water body is Mallampet tank @ 1.31 km; Nearest RF is Kazipally RF @ 2.89 km from the industry.

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Project Cost for proposed expansion is Rs. 1.5 Crores. Budget for Environmental protection towards Capital Cost is Rs. 1.0 Crore and Recurring Cost is Rs. 36.2 Lakhs/annum Budget for CER is Rs.3.0 lakhs in first 5 years.

The SEAC noted that earlier, the SEIAA in its meeting held on 20.04.2021 rejected the proposal as the industry has not submitted the registered land documents for additional land for development of green belt.

Now, the proponent again uploaded proposal and requested to consider their proposal for EC. In this regard, the proponent informed the following:

- Earlier, their proposal was recommended by the SEAC for issue of EC but it was rejected by the SEIAA.
- They have taken additional land for lease for the development of green belt adjacent to their unit and that additional land will be used for green belt development only and no equipment or machinery will be installed in the leased premises and they have already submitted the registered lease documents.
- They approached the Hon'ble High court for the state of Telangana in this regard and they are permitted to file fresh application for EC with all relevant documents for consideration by SEIAA within four weeks from the date of application
- As per the High court order they have applied for EC for expansion of production capacity from current 6.18 TPM to 25.0 TPM under B2 category.

The SEAC noted the orders of the Hon'ble High Court and considered the proposal. It is observed from the documents submitted by the proponent w.r.t additional land for greenbelt development, that the proponent has submitted registered Deed of Lease but not submitted registered Sale Deed i.e., the proponent has not acquired additional land.

In view of the above and after detailed discussions, the SEAC informed the proponent to submit registered sale deed for additional land for development of greenbelt.

The representative of the project proponent attended on Video Call and Smt. Pallavi of M/s. Pridhvi Envirotech (P) Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

During presentation the proponent informed that earlier quarry lease was granted to M/. Sridevi Granites on 05.11.2003 and subsequently, the quarry lease was transferred to M/s. A.G Mines & Minerals on 24.11.2015 for un-expired period of lease upto 27.01.2024.

M/s. A.G Mines & Minerals applied for EC under violation on 12.04.2018 i.e., within the violation window. Subsequently, the lease was transferred from M/s. A.G Mines & Minerals to M/s.Pamho Mine Pvt. Ltd., by the DMG, Hyderabad vide proceedings dt. 05.01.2019 for un-expired period upto 27.01.2024.

Earlier, the proponent requested to raise ADS so as to update the details w.r.t. transfer of lease as it was applied under violation. But, the SEIAA observed that the proposal was applied under EC as per the procedure earlier, instead of applying under TOR in PARIVESH as it is a violation case. Hence, their earlier application under violation was returned and it was informed to apply under TOR.

Accordingly, the now M/s. Pamho Mines Pvt. Ltd., has submitted TOR application under violation. The SEAC considered the application as per OM dt.09.09.2019 under lateral entry.

The SEAC noted that the project is for Black Granite Mine with Mine Lease Area of 4.0 Ha. The proponent informed that the production capacity of the project is to mine 9,313.95 m3/annum of Black Granite. It was informed that mining operations were carried out without obtaining prior EC.

The proponent also submitted a copy of lr.dt. 05.12.2020 of ADMG, Mahabubabad District addressed to the proponent informing that there is one quarry of M/s. BNR Granite Industries (3.0 Ha. – lease granted before 09.09.2013) within 500m from the proposed quarry lease. It is further noted that the Mine lease area is 4.0 Ha. which is less than 5.0 Ha. The Total Cluster area is 7.0 Ha. & Net Cluster Area is 4.0 Ha. which is less than 5.0 Ha. The SEAC noted that the project is to be considered under B2 Category as per provisions laid under EIA Notification, 2006 & its subsequent amendments and orders of the Hon'ble NGT. But, as the project is under violation, the project becomes B1 Category, however without public hearing.

After detailed discussions, the Committee confirmed the project as a case of violation of the EIA Notification, 2006 and hence decided to consider the project in the terms of the provisions of the S.O.No.804 (E) dt.14.03.2017 and S.O.1030 (E), dt.08.03.2018 issued by the MoEF&CC, GoI. The SEAC recommended to issue Standard Terms of Reference (TOR) issued by the MoEF&CC, GoI along with the following Specific Terms of Reference for undertaking EIA and preparation of Environmental Management Plan (EMP).

**Specific Terms of Reference:**

- (i) The State Government/SPCB to take action against the project proponent under the provisions of section 19 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, and further no consent to operate to be issued till the project is granted EC (if Credible Action was not initiated).

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- (ii) The project proponent shall be required to submit a bank guarantee equivalent to the amount of remediation plan and natural and community resource augmentation plan with the SPCB prior to the grant of EC. The quantum shall be recommended by the SEAC and finalized by the regulatory authority. The bank guarantee shall be released after successful implementation of the EMP, followed by recommendations of the SEAC and approval of the regulatory authority.
- (iii) Assessment of ecological damage with respect to air, water, land and other environmental attributes. The collection and analysis of data shall be done by an environmental laboratory duly notified under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, or an environmental laboratory accredited by NABL, or a laboratory of a Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) institution working in the field of environment.
- (iv) Preparation of EMP comprising remediation plan and natural and community resource augmentation plan corresponding to the ecological damage assessed and economic benefits derived due to violation.
- (v) The remediation plan and the natural and community resource augmentation plan to be prepared as an independent chapter in the EIA report by the accredited consultants.
