

- 4. The project proponent, before start of mining operations, shall install CCTV cameras on the mining site covering all angles of mining site including entry & exit points. These cameras shall be theft and tamper proof. Where electricity/power is not available solar energy based cameras shall be installed with adequate battery backups. Date-wise video records w.r.t. CCTV camera shall be hosted & stored online and online portal link shall be shared with the office of Director-cum-Member Secretary, HPSEIAA through official e-mail: dbt-hp@nic.in.
- Other terms and conditions of Environmental Clearance letter shall remain same as imposed in earlier issued EC letter referred above.
- 6. The implementation of terms and conditions shall be sole responsibility of project proponent during the extended period of EC and after the project is commissioned or made functional.
- The project proponent shall submit video clips of previously mined area of the restoration works carried out
 with photographs of activities undertaken with expenditure details under CER/EMP within 15 days from the
 issuance of EC letter.
- 8. The project proponent shall submit revised EMP & CSR Plan with budgetary provisions (capital & recurring cost) for extended period of EC within 15 days from the issuance of the EC letter.

ITEM NO. 4: ADDITIONAL ITEMS

4.1 Approval of District Survey Report

It was submitted that a District Survey Report of district Kangra prepared by Geologist, Directorate of Industries, Shimla has been received in the office of SEIAA. A DO letter dated 16/12/2023 has also been written to Principal Secretary, Industries to the GoHP to get District Survey Reports' (DSRs) of all the Districts approved from HP SEIAA.

The Authority was apprised that, the SEIAA in its 63rd meeting held on 13/6/2023 deliberated upon the Office Memorandum issued by the MoEF&CC, GoI vide F. No. IA3-22/11/2023-IA.III (E-208230) dated 28th April, 2023 in view of the compliance of order dated 07.12.2022 passed by Hon'ble NGT in O.A.142 of 2022 in the matter of Jayant Kumar vs. MoEF&CC. As per the MoEF&CC directions, SEIAA is required to scrutinize and appraise the proposals based on the checklist provided below:

- 1. Completely filled up Form-2 as per Ministry's OM dated 15.12.2021
- 2. Pre-Feasibility Report (PFR) as per MoEF Guidelines dated 30.12.2010
- 3. Valid Mine Lease Document
- 4. Approved Mining Plan from the concerned Authmities
- 5. District Survey Report approved by SEIAA as per Ministry's Notification S.O 3611(E) dated 25.07.2018
- 6. Implementation of "Sustainable Sand Mining Management Guidelines, 2016" and "Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining, 2020" in case of sand mining proposals.
- Details of forest land involved in the mine lease area and availability of Stage-I/II Forest Clearance (FC) for diversion
 of forest land for non-forestry purpose.
- 8. Details of Eco Sensitive Zones (ESZ) and Eco Sensitive Areas (ESAs), National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuary, Coastal Zone, Water bodies and other ecological sensitive areas within/ in the vicinity of the mine lease area and if so details of NOC/ Clearances obtained.
- 9. If any Schedule-I species is present in the study area, proof of submission of Wildlife Conservation Plan to the Forest Department.
- 10. Cluster Certificate from State Mines and Geology Department.
- 11. Compliance of Hon'ble Supreme Court judgment dated 02.08.2017 passed in Common Cause vs Union of India Writ Petition (C) 114 of 2014.
- 12. Proposal of re-grassing the mining area and any other area which may have been disturbed due to their mining activities and restore the land to a condition which is fit for growth of fodder, flora, fauna etc. in compliance to the direction dated 8th January, 2020 of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Writ Petition(s) Civil No. 114/ 2014, Common Cause vs Union of India & Ors.

The District Survey Report of district Kangra was placed before SEIAA in its 67th meeting held on dated 28th December, 2023. The representative of Department of Industries did not appear before the SEIAA for making power point presentation despite telephonic messages. After detailed deliberation on DSR it was decided that:

- a) Forward the DSR Report to SEAC for technical scrutiny/appraisal through expert members of SEAC and representative/expert from Department of Industries (Geological Wing), Himachal Pradesh may make power point presentation before SEAC. The SEAC to submit its recommendations for further approval by SEIAA.
- b) A letter may be written by the State Government for preparation of District Survey Report on priority.



c) The Director (Industries) to apprise about the date of earlier DSRs by DEIAAs as to ascertain the position of validity of these DSRs up till 28th April, 2024.

4.2 Processing & disposal of proposals from PARIVESH portal

The Authority was apprised that there are few proposals which are shown on PARIVESH portal as pending proposals from long time, due to technical & other reasons. These proposals are required to be disposed off from the portal.

The matter was placed before SEIAA in its 67th meeting held on 28th December, 2023. The SEIAA decided that the Member Secretary (SEIAA) may process the application online and take necessary action accordingly.

4.3 DECISION OF HON'BLE HIGH COURT ORDER DATED 18/8/2023 IN THE MATTER OF CHANDER KAMAL BALJEES VS. STATE of HPSEIAA IN CWP No. 2807 of 2023

It is submitted that the matter was placed in 66th meeting SEIAA held on 17-11-2023 wherein it was decided that:

- The matter be referred to the State Government with background of the case and informing that the SEIAA has ordered to implement the orders of the Hon'ble High Court dated 18/08/2023 passed in the matter of CHANDER KAMAL BALJEES VS. STATE of HPSEIAA in CWP No. 2807 of 2023 to grant formal EC forthwith enabling petitioner to go ahead with project in question in terms of plan/drawing approved by MC, Shimla on 14/12/2016 and further the license granted by TCP Department on 8/6/2017.
- The Hon'ble High Court in its order directed the SEIAA based on the fact that since requisite approvals have already been granted by the other departments of the State Government such as TCP & MC Shimla before the orders of the Hon'ble NGT dated 16.11.2017 in the matter of OA No. 121/2014 and the fact that this is a case of deemed approval.
- Therefore withholding EC at this stage by the SEIAA is not justified. So, in that case, till other departments of the State Government review and cancel their approvals, there are no ground to assail this order further.



 Therefore, keeping in view the advise of Ld. AG recorded on copy of order the matter may be examined at the Government level whether or not the orders of the Hon'ble High Court dated 18/08/2023 passed in the matter of CHANDER KAMAL BALJEES VS. STATE of HPSEIAA in CWP No. 2807 of 2023 need to be assailed further by these departments or not.

In compliance to the decisions of the SEIAA matter was referred to the State Government i.e. the Chief Secretary to the GoHP vide letter No. SEIAA/Secretariat Main/2021-Vol-I 1845 dated 18/11/2023.

In response to this letter an advise has been received from the office of the Chief Secretary to the GoHP vide letter No. STE-E(2)-3/2023 dated 26/12/2023 reproducing the advice of Law Department of Himachal Pradesh with the request to take necessary action in the matter accordingly.

The matter was placed before SEIAA in its 67th meeting held on 28th December, 2023. The SEIAA decided that the matter may be dealt as per the advise of AD vide letter No. STE-E(2)-3/2023 dated 26/12/2023.

The Authority after discussions confirmed the minutes of 66th meeting of SEIAA held on 7-10-2023.

ITEM NO. 2:

DECISION OF HON'BLE HIGH COURT ORDER DATED 18/8/2023 IN THE MATTER OF CHANDER KAMAL BALJEES VS. STATE of HPSEIAA IN CWP No. 2807 of 2023

The Authority was apprised that Sh. C.K. Baljee, Chairman & Managing Director, H.No. 124, 3rd Main Defense Colony, Indira Nagar, Banglore, Karnataka vide online application No. SIA/HP/MIS/184041/2020 had submitted application for grant of Environment Clearance. The brief outline of the project is as under:

The 1st time proposal was listed & appraised by SEAC in its 78th meeting held on 8/4/21, thereafter it was again listed in 78th meeting of SEAC on dated 8th April, 2021 subsequently in 79th meeting of SEAC on dated 23rd June, 2021, in 80th meeting of SEAC on 9th July, 2021, 53rd meeting of SEIAA on 12th July, 2021, 82rd meeting of SEAC on 11th Oct, 2021, 83rd meeting of SEAC on 29th Nov, 2021, 85th meeting of SEAC during 19th & 20th , July 2022, in 58th meeting of SEIAA on 21st , July 2022, in 59th meeting of SEIAA on, 28th, September 2022, in 87th meeting of SEIAC on 28th December 2022 & finally in 60th meeting of SEIAA on dated 17th, February 2023.

The SEIAA in its 60th meeting decided that the Environment Clearance cannot be granted at this stage in view of prevailing orders of Hon'ble National Green Tribunal Order dated 16.11.2017 in the matter of OA No. 121/2014 titled as "Yogendra Mohan Sengupta Vs. Union of India and others. Accordingly the project proposal is disposed off.

Thereafter, the project proponent filed an appeal before the Hon'ble High Court, Himachal Pradesh against the decision of SEIAA taken on dated 17th, February 2023. The Hon'ble High Court on dated 18/08/2023 and passed an order in the matter in the matter of CHANDER KAMAL BALJEES VS. STATE of HPSEIAA in CWP No. 2807 of 2023. The operative part of the Hon'ble High Court order is as under:

....... Consequently, in view of above, detailed discussion made herein above and law taken into consideration, this court finds merit in the petition and same is allowed, Annexure P-24 i.e. Minutes of Meeting dated 17.2.2023, in so far as they relate to the petitioner are concerned, are quashed and set aside and respondent No. 1 is directed to grant formal Environmental Clearance ...

The matter was listed in 64th meeting of SEIAA held on dated 5th Sept., 2023 wherein the SEIAA decided that the Environment Clearance is granted in favour of the project proponent in consonance with the Hon'ble High Court Orders in the matter of CHANDER KAMAL BALJEES VS. STATE of HPSEIAA in CWP No. 2807 of 2023.

The applicant had applied for grant of Environment Clearance online vide application No SIA/HP/MIS/184041/2020 under Category 8(a): Building and construction project for construction of "Resorts & Mountain Homes at Bharari village", Bharari-Kuffar Link road, Shimla. The application was further rejected by SEIAA, Himachal Pradesh in its 60th meeting held on 17th February, 2023, in view of the Hon'ble NGT order dated 16.11.2017 in the matter of OA No. 121/2014. Accordingly, the application was also rejected on PARIVESH portal and matter was disposed off.

It is further apprised that on PARIVESH portal application No SIA/HP/MIS/184041/2020 stands disposed off and the Authority is not allowed to upload Environment Clearance letter. In order to resolve this issue a request letter was sent to the Secretary, MoEF&CC, Gol to:

- 1) Enable application No. SIA/HP/MIS/184041/2020 for issuance EC letter with EC identification number; OR
- 2) Issue necessary directions to SEIAA, Himachal Pradesh for taking further necessary action in the matter.

Copy of request letter is placed for kind reference. Further directions from MoEF&CC, Gol are awaited as yet.

Now afterwards, recently a communication vide letter No. 9-32/2023-Ravi Chauhan, Dy. AG, Office - 56561 dated 30/10/2023 has been received from the office of Lt. Dy. Advocate General, Himachal Pradesh enclosing the certified copies of the orders in the matter of CHANDER KAMAL BALJEES VS. STATE of HPSEIAA in CWP No. 2807 of 2023 for further necessary implementation of the orders. In one of the copy of orders earlier received on 7/10/2023 there are some remarks made to SEIAA for examining the matter further. The remarks are as under:

"...In this case SEIAA must standby its stand that present construction is in violation NGT orders & Environment conservation norms. Since that order is still in force pending adjudication before SC as well as in SDP-2041 such constructions is not feasible, hence appeal be preferred in this case..."

Accordingly, the matter was referred to the AD vide this office letter No. Env.S&T(E)5-83/2023-CWP No. 2807/2023 -1979-80 dated 19th October, 2023 to seek advice of the Law Department . Copy of the letter is at Annexure-I.

The AD vide letter No. STE-E(2)-3/2023 dated 10/11/2023 has advised as under:

"....The Administrative Department is not a party in CWP No. 2807 of 2023 and therefore there was no occasion to file a reply. The directions were given by the Court to respondent No. 1 i.e HP. State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA). Needless to say that this authority is independent of the Government, duly notified by the Govt. of India. We may as an AD facilitate to take an opinion from the Law Department. You are requested to intimate the view taken by the SEIAA regarding whether they wish to assail the order of the Hon'ble High Court dated 18-08-2023 passed in the SWP No. 2807 of 2023 or not?..."

Therefore, in the light of these comments, note the discussions are required to take further necessary action.

The SEIAA in its 66th meeting held on dated 17/11/2023; deliberated on following:

- a) Request letter forwarded to the Secretary, MoEF&CC, Gol regarding enabling application No. SIA/HP/MIS/184041/2020 for issuance EC letter with EC identification number.
- b) The advise of AD received vide letter No. STE-E(2)-3/2023 dated 10/11/2023.
- c) Communication from the office of Advocate General, Himachal Pradesh vide letter No. 9-32/2023-Ravi Chauhan, Dy. AG, Office - 56561 dated 30/10/2023 & written remarks of Ld. Advocate General, Himachal Pradesh in the matter.

The SEIAA after detailed discussion and deliberations decided that:

The matter be referred to the State Government with background of the case and informing that the SEIAA has ordered to implement the orders of the Hon'ble High Court dated 18/08/2023 passed in the matter of CHANDER KAMAL BALJEES VS. STATE of HPSEIAA in CWP No. 2807 of 2023 to grant formal EC forthwith enabling petitioner to go ahead with project in question in terms of plan/drawing approved by MC, Shimla on 14/12/2016 and further the license granted by TCP Department on 8/6/2017.
