The representative of the project proponent Sri P.Bungaiah Chowdary and Sri G.V. Reddy of M/s. Team Labs & Consultants, Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

The SEAC noted that total plot area is 30,323.5 Sq.m., Out of which green area is 3,198.3 Sq.m. (10.6%).

It was informed that the total built up area of the project is 35,796.5 Sq.m. The project consists of Residential villas Construction Project to accommodate total no. of 89 units. Maximum No. of floors proposed in the project are Residential villas with G + 2 Floors and Amenities G + 3 Floors.

It is also noted that adequate parking area is provided with 2 parking spaces each.

The total cost of the project is Rs. 96.0 Crores. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 119.88 Lakhs during construction phase and Rs. 2.42 lakhs during occupation phase, Recurring cost: Rs. 8.57 lakhs/annum during construction phase and Rs. 32.58 lakhs/annum during occupation phase.

The representative of the project proponent Sri A.Venkat Ramana and Smt. Lochana of M/s. Pridhvi Enviro Tech (P) Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

During presentation, the project proponent informed the following:

- The Asst. Director of Mines and Geology, Yadadri-Bhuvanagiri, had identified the mineral bearing area for auction proposed quarry lease for Rough Stone and Road metal over an extent of 3.0 Hectares in Sy. No. 336&337 of Pahilwanpur village, Valigonda Mandal, Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District, Telangana (TS) as per instructions of the Director of Mines & Geology, Hyderabad vide memo no 1576586/P/2022, Dated 14.06.2022 in the connection of orders issued by the state Government of Telangana vide G.O.Ms.No.26.Inds.,& Comm.,(Mines-1) dated:31.03.2022 for grant of leases minor minerals except ordinary sand reserved under 9-A through auction except otherwise providing by amending Rule 4, Rule7,Rule 12 and Rule13 of Telangana Minor mineral Concession Rule,1966 reserved under Rule 9-A though Auction.
- The Asst. The SEAC noted that the mine lease area is 3.0 Ha. Total cluster area and Net cluster area is 3.0 Ha which is less than 5.0 Ha. Thus, the project is considered under B2 Category as per the provisions laid under EIA Notification, 2006 & its subsequent amendments and orders of the Hon'ble NGT. The proponent submitted a copy of Scrutinized/ Approved Mining Plan & EMP Report.

The nearest village Madhava nagar (V) exists at a distance 801 m (N); nearest water body i.e Bundadhigani Cheruvu exists at a distance of 772 m (E) from the mine lease area.

It is proposed to mine 1,01,351.60 M<sup>3</sup>/Annum of Rough stone and Road Metal and life of mine is reported as 17 years.

The total cost of the project is Rs. 35.0 Lakhs. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 3.80 lakhs and recurring cost: Rs. 1.60 Lakhs/annum.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended for issue of EC.

The representative of the project proponent Sri G. Raju and Sri Chandrasekhar Reddy of M/s. Space Enviro Solutions, Hyderabad attended before the SEAC.

The project is proposed within 10 km radius of Himayat Sagar and Osman Sagar Lakes. But, **Puppalaguda** (V) is not included in the list of 84 villages in the 10km catchment of above lakes as mentioned in the G.O.Ms. No: 111, MA, dt. 08.03.1996.

The project is proposed in a total plot area of 14,568.80 Sq.m., for construction of Residential Apartments project with total built up area of 76,899.70 Sq.m and green area is 1,469.80 Sq.m;

During presentation, the SEAC observed that, a canal is adjacent to the project site. In this regard, the proponent submitted a copy of Lr. dt.25.03.2022 of the Superintending Engineer, I&CAD Dept., Irrigation circle, Hyderabad. It is observed from the document that the total extent of applicant's land is not affected in MFL of canal, but Ac 00-12 Gts is affected in its Buffer zone 9m

width. Therefore, the applicant's balance land to an extent of Ac 03-02 Gts is not affected in any waterbody/Nala/Channel and it is free from the waterbody as per the norms stipulated in G.O.Ms.No.168, dt.07.04.2012 of MA&UD Dept and G.O.Ms.No.7 MA & UD Dept. dt.05.01.2016. Accordingly, the proponent proposed the layout of the project.

The SEAC noted that the proponent started construction of the project without obtaining prior EC. It was informed that presently, foundation work is under construction. Hence, the SEAC confirmed the project as a case of violation of the EIA Notification, 2006 and the project has to be considered in the terms of the provisions of the S.O.No.804 (E) dt.14.03.2017; S.O.1030 (E), dt.08.03.2018; and O.M. dt: 07.07.2021 & O.M. dt: 28.01.2022 issued by the MoEF&CC, GoI w.r.t. SOP for identification and handling of violation cases under EIA Notification., 2006.

The proponent informed that they have already collected the baseline data from December 2022 to February 2023 and requested to consider the same for preparation of EIA report based on the Standard Terms of Reference for Townships and Area Development projects.

After detailed discussions, the proponent is directed to prepare EIA report considering baseline data from December 2022 to February 2023 as per the Standard Terms of Reference (TORs) issued by the MoEF&CC, GoI for "Townships and Area Development projects" along with the Specific Terms of Reference w.r.t. violation as per S.O.No.804 (E) dt.14.03.2017; S.O.1030 (E), dt.08.03.2018; OM dt.07.07.2021 & OM dt.28.01.2022 and submit final EIA report to the SEAC for appraisal.

The representative of the project proponent Sri G.Kondal Reddy and Sri Mohan Reddy of M/s. Rightsource Industrial Solutions Pvt. Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

The SEAC noted that the intial lease was granted on dt.07.03.2012 in favour of Mr. Gudipuri Laxmaiah for a period of 10 years i.e upto 06.03.2022. Then, the lease was transferred on 06.01.2018 in favour of proponent for a period upto 06.03.2022. Later, the lease renewal on 27.07.2022 for a period of 20 years. It may be noted that the Mine Lease is granted before 09.09.2013. Hence, cluster is not applicable to the project. The SEAC noted that the mine lease area is 0.92 Ha. which is less than 5.0 Ha. Thus, the project is considered under B2 Category as per the provisions laid under EIA Notification, 2006 & its subsequent amendments and orders of the Hon'ble NGT. The proponent submitted a copy of Scrutinized/ Approved Mining Plan & EMP Report.

The nearest village is Ramalinga banda (V) exists at a distance 0.58 Km (NW); nearest water body i.e water body exists at a distance of 0.69 km (SE); Nearest RF i.e. Indergonda RF exists at a distance of 5.3 km (NW) from the mine lease area.

It is proposed to mine 42,586 m<sup>3</sup>/annum of Building stone and Road metal and the life of mine is reported as 5 years.

Dispatch permits were issued during the period 2011-12 2022-23 (upto december 2022). It is observed from the dispatch permits were issued during the period 2012-13 to 2015-16 and 2018-19 to 2021-2022, 2022-2023 (upto december 2022) and nil during the period 2011-12, 2016-17 to 2017-18. It was also reported that mining operations were not carried out after lease expiry.

The proponent submitted a copy of Certificate dt.10.01.2023 issued by the Sarpanch of Grama Panchayath, Nelamarry Village, Munagala Mandal, Suryapet District stating that the proponent has donated Rs.1,05,000 /- for maintenance of RO water plant and C.C roads in the village.

The total cost of the project is Rs. 30.0 Lakhs. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 3.60 lakhs and recurring cost: Rs. 1.50 Lakhs/annum.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended for issue of EC.

The representative of the project proponent Harish Mohandas Kotai and Sri Y.B.S.Murthy of M/s. B.S.Envi-Tech Pvt Ltd., Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

The SEAC noted that total plot area is 37,485.70 Sq.m., out of which green area is 3,500.0 Sq.m. (12.4%).

It was informed that the total built up area of the project is 52,671.85 Sq.m. The project consists of Hospital building 400 beds. Maximum no. of floors proposed in the project are (2C +G + 7 Floors).

It is also noted that Parking area to be provided is 13,617 Sq.m., (36.32 % against required 33%).

During the presentation, the SEAC observed that the site is adjacent to waterbody and a nala passing through it. In this regard, the proponent submitted a copy of Lr. dt. 04.09.2020 from I&CAD Dept., of the EE, North Tanks Division, Hyderabad. It is observed from the document that out of total extent of applicant's land Ac 19-14.50 Gts, out of which Ac. 00-23.50 Gts is affected under FTL & Buffer of lingam cheruvu and affected under Nala and its buffer is Ac. 00-6.0 Gts and the balance land to an extent of Ac 18-25 Gts in Survey No. 95,96,97,98,99,100,101 & 102 of Suraraml Village, Quthubullapur Mandal, Medchal-Malkakgiri District. Accordingly, the project proponent proposed layout of the project.

The total cost of the project is Rs. 29.36 Crores. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 365.0 lakhs and recurring cost: Rs. 41.0 lakhs/annum.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC recommended for issue of EC.

The representative of the project proponent Sri Y. Venkat Reddy and Sri G.V. Reddy of M/s. Team Labs & Consultants, Hyderabad attended and made a presentation before the SEAC.

The SEAC noted the lease was granted on 24.07.2008 in favour of M/s. Venus Stone Crushers for a period of 15 years. Then, the lease was granted on 18.11.2008 in favour of A.M.R Projects Ltd., for a period i.e upto 23.07.2023. Later, the lease was transferred on 02.02.2009 in favour Sri. R. Jagadish for a period i.e upto 23.07.2023. Then, the lease was again transferred on 18.04.2012 in favour of Smt. K. Vasundhara Devi. Then, transfer of two lease areas (i.e 12.0 Acres in Block No. 26A & 27A, 8.0 Acres in Block No. 26B, 27B and Acre 4.90) were granted on 20.07.2017 in favour of the proponent. Amalgamation of two leases granted on 15.09.2017. Subsequently, inclusion of Mineral "Gravel/Morrum" as additional in the existing quarry lease was granted on 13.04.2022. Then, the renewal of lease was granted on 17.06.2022 for a period of 20 years. It may be noted that the Mine Lease was granted before 09.09.2013. The SEAC noted that the mine lease area is 10.07 Ha. which is more than 5.0 Ha. The project is considered under B1 Category as per the provisions laid under EIA Notification, 2006 & its subsequent amendments and orders of the Hon'ble NGT. The proponent submitted a copy of Scrutinized/ Approved Mining Plan.

The SEAC noted that earlier the SEIAA, TS issued TORs (Violation) on 30.05.2022 for preparation of EIA Report. Accordingly, the proponent undergone the process of public hearing on 26.07.2022 and submitted Final EIA Report along with minutes of public hearing and issues emerged during public hearing. The SEAC noted the contents of Final EIA report. The SEAC observed from the minutes of Public Hearing & representations that the issues emerged during public hearing are: Lot of pollution and no proper pollution control measures implemented. The project is considered under B1 Category as per the provisions laid under EIA Notification, 2006 & its subsequent amendments and orders of the Hon'ble NGT. The proponent submitted a copy of Scrutinized/ Approved Mining Plan.

The SEAC noted that earlier the SEIAA, TS issued TORs (Violation) on 30.05.2022 for preparation of EIA Report. Accordingly, the proponent undergone the process of public hearing on 26.07.2022 and submitted Final EIA Report along with minutes of public hearing and issues emerged during public hearing. The SEAC noted the contents of Final EIA report. The SEAC observed from the minutes of Public Hearing & representations that the issues emerged during public hearing are: Lot of pollution and no proper pollution control measures implemented. (implement dust suppression methods for air and dust pollution); problem due to moving vehicles ( Take appropriate speed control measures); Conduct medical camps; Provide local employment; Conduct skill development training programme; CSR funds should be spent on effected villages; Provide PPE kits to all workers; Develop greenbelt; The proponent informed: Implement all pollution control measures; Will Conduct health camps periodically; Employment will be given preference to local; Provide tarpaulin covers to the covers to trucks to avoid accidents; Greenbelt will be developed in an area of 0.05 Ha and avenue plantation along the connecting roads will be proposed; Adopt water sprinkling to control dust pollution; Will implement all pollution control measures as suggested by MoEF and TSPCB to ensure least negative impact; They have allocated Rs. 1.4 Lakhs under CER activities. Accordingly, the proponent uploaded the EIA Report on 22.02.2023.

The SEAC noted that the project is for Stone & Metal and Gravel/Morrum Quarry with Mine Lease Area of 5.038 Ha. or 12.45 Acres (6.0 Acres in A-Zone, Block No. 32A, 4.0 Acres in B-Zone, Block No. 32B and Acr 2.45 gts in Common Area) The proponent informed that the production capacity of the project is to mine 2,04,600 m<sup>3</sup>/annum of Stone & Metal and 90,156 m<sup>3</sup>/annum of Gravel/Morrum Mine. The life of mine for Stone & Metal is 17.93 years and for Gravel/Morrum Mine is 2.73 years.

Nearest human habitation is Pillaipalli @ 1.6 km; Nearest water body i.e., Seasonal Musi River exists at a distance of 2.5 km; Nearest RF i.e., Bacharam RF exists at 2.8 km from the boundary of the site.

The total cost of the project is Rs. 40.0 Lakhs. The proponent is proposing budget for Environmental protection towards capital cost: Rs. 6.63 lakhs and recurring cost: Rs. 3.02 Lakhs/annum.

Accordingly, the proponent undergone the process of public hearing on 26.07.2022 and submitted Final EIA Report along with minutes of public hearing and issues emerged during public hearing. The SEAC noted the contents of Final EIA report. The SEAC observed from the minutes of Public Hearing & representations that the issues emerged during public hearing are: Lot of pollution and no proper pollution control measures implemented. (implement dust suppression methods for air and dust pollution); problem due to moving vehicles ( Take appropriate speed control measures); Public hearing is not conducting properly; Conduct medical camps; Provide local employment; Conduct skill development training programme; CSR funds should be spent on effected villages; Provide PPE kits to all workers. The proponent informed: Implement all pollution control measures; PH is conducted as per S.O.1533, dt.14.09.2006; Will Conduct health camps periodically; Employment will be given preference to local; Provide tarpaulin covers to the covers to trucks to avoid accidents; Greenbelt will be developed in an area of 0.05 Ha and avenue plantation along the connecting roads will be proposed; Adopt water sprinkling to control dust pollution; Will implement all pollution control measures as suggested by MoEF and TSPCB to ensure least negative impact; They have allocated Rs. 2.2 Lakhs under CSR activities. The SEAC noted that these Blocks of mine lease area is located at a distance of 805.1 mts and remaining are continuous. The proponent informed that the production capacity of the project is to mine 10,76,850 m<sup>3</sup>/annum of Stone & Metal and 82,640 m<sup>3</sup>/annum of Gravel/Morrum Mine. The life of mine for Stone & Metal is 20.25 years and for Gravel/Morrum Mine is 5.79 years.

The proponent informed that State Government has initiated credible action against the proponent vide CC No. 75/2023 filed in the Hon'ble 1-Junior Civil Judge cum-XIV Additional Metropolitan Magistrate, Hayathnagar.

Accordingly, the proponent submitted Compliance of criteria mentioned for processing violation proposals w.r.t. mining projects. The SEAC examined the same and found that the level of damage for the present project is Low. Accordingly, the amount of Bank Guarantee to be submitted for Implementation of Remediation plan; Natural Resource Augmentation Plan; and Community Resource Augmentation Plan is worked out to be Rs. 15.12 Lakhs and the details are as following:

The SEAC considered the project as per the S.O.No.804 (E) dt.14.03.2017; S.O.1030 (E), dt.08.03.2018 & O.M. dt: 07.07.2021 & O.M. dt: 28.01.2022 issued by the MoEF&CC, GoI w.r.t. Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for identification and handling of violation cases under EIA Notification., 2006. The SEAC noted that as per SOP, the total Penalty (where operations have commenced without EC) is 1% of the total project cost incurred up to the date of filing of application along with EIA/EMP report PLUS 0.25 % of the total turnover during the period of violation. Further, the percentage rates, as above, shall be halved if the project proponent *suo-moto* reports such violations without such violations coming to the knowledge of the Government either on inquiry or complaint.

The SEAC noted that, a complaint was received from Save bandaravirala through mail dt.14.02.2023, which was forwarded by MS, SEIAA, TS, wherein it was stated the following:

- The villagers (Chinnaravirala, bandaravirala and Guvvaleti) are suffering with heavy dust and air pollution due to stone metal quarries, mines, stone crushers which were located in bandaravirala from last 15 years.
- This area been duped as mining area, they are facing heavy air, dust, PM10, PM2.5 pollution by these mines and stone crushers from the past 12 years which make their lives miserable and pathetic with this pollution.
- No proper information provided to them about Public Hearing.

Minutes of the SEAC Meeting held on 21.03.2023

- The EIA submitted by every mine were false as the AAQM readings are at dangerous levels as per the TSPCB reply.
- The Team Labs consultant have made false EIA.

The MoEF, Regional Office, Telangana vide letter dated 20.03.2023 has forwarded the above complaint to the Member Secretary, SEIAA, Telanga for taking necessary action.

The MoEF, New Delhi, vide letter 21.03.2023 has forwarded the complaint made by Sri P.L.N.Rao, Environmental Social Worker, wherein it was stated the following:

- The Public hearing was conducted quite against the Rules and regulations. He further stated that a case was filed before the Hon'ble NGT (Case No.330513000054-2023) with a prayer to cancel the proceedings, hence he requested not to accord Environmental Clearance till the case disposed.
- False information submitted in EIA report.
- Utter violation of Rules in Public Hearing process, not given opportunity to all participants to express their opinion.
- Notices were issued to TSPCB to cancel the P.H.
- Complaint made to the concerned authorities against the consultancy for giving falls EIA report.

The SEAC noted that O.A. No. 09 of 2022 is pending before the Hon'ble NGT Chennai against the Stone Crushers / Quarries / Hotmix plants located in the Abudullapurmet Mandal.

After detailed discussions, the SEAC informed the proponent to submit the following:

1. Response on the above complaints/representations (pointwise) received from the villagers.
2. Copy of document of the Initial lease granted to Sri M.A. Nayeem @ Ac.12-45 Gts. dt.02.050.2008.
3. Latest status of mining activity mentioning the Seigniorage charges paid by the proponent upto 21.02.2023 duly certified by Mining Department for calculation of penalty.
4. Status of OA.No.09 of 2022 before the Hon'ble NGT Chennai.
