	<p>The Committee noted that the issue was discussed earlier in the SEAC, A.P., meeting held on 24- 26 August 2018 and made certain recommendations on the procedure for processing of violation cases. The SEIAA, A.P., in its meeting held on 24-25 September 2018 decided to seek legal opinion on this matter and accordingly the SEIAA, A.P., addressed a letter to the advocate to seek the opinion on 10.10.2018. The Advocate sent the legal opinion vide letter dated 25.10.2018. The Committee noted that the legal opinion on this matter was discussed in the SEIAA, A.P., meeting held on 28.10.2018.</p> <p>The Committee after deliberations resolved to recommend that the proposed 6-Steps process (ANNEXURE – A) for dealing with the violation cases may be adopted for ease of appraisal of violation cases of Category ‘B’ mining projects for consideration of Terms of Reference (TOR) / Environmental Clearance (EC) as per MoEF&CC, GoI, New Delhi Notification No. 804 (E), dated 14th March 2017 and read with amendment vide notification No.1030 (E), dated 8th March 2018.</p> <p>However, it is to note that certain steps may get inter-changed in the order and /or converged in certain cases depending upon the Category of the case and specific issues /conditions of the case.</p> <p>Further the Committee recommends that the project proponent shall submit the information/details as per the Checklist (ANNEXURE – B) for this 6 – Steps process, for further appraisal.</p>

The Project Proponent shall give an undertaking by way of affidavit to comply with all the statutory requirements and judgment of Hon’ble Supreme Court dated the 2nd August 2017 in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 114 of 2014 in the matter of Common Cause versus Union of India and Ors., before grant of ToR / EC. The undertaking inter-alia include commitment of the PP not to repeat any such violation in future. In case of violation of above undertaking, the Terms of Reference / Environmental Clearance shall be liable to be terminated forthwith. 2. Step-2:

1. Category - B1 Projects: The SEAC, A.P., will appraise the mining project proposal and recommend for the appropriate TOR (Terms of Reference) with public hearing and additional Specific Terms of Reference (STR).
2. Category - B2 Projects: The SEAC, A.P., will appraise the mining project proposal and recommend for the Specific Terms of Reference (STR) without public hearing in addition to the EMP. **This is subject to clarification to be obtained from MoEF&CC, GoI, New Delhi.**

Step-3:

1. **Category -B1&B2 Projects:Assessment of ecological damage** with respect to air, water, land and other environmental attributes. The collection and analysis of data shall be done by an environmental laboratory duly notified under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 or an environmental laboratory accredited by NABL, or a laboratory of a Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) institution working in the field of environment.
2. Preparation of EMP comprising remediation plan and natural and community resource augmentation plan corresponding to the ecological damage assessed and economic benefits derived due to violation.
3. The remediation plan and the natural and community resource augmentation plan to be prepared as an independent chapter in the EIA report **by the accredited consultants.**
4. **Category -B1 Projects :** The project proponent shall submit the **final EIA report** along with the remediation plan and the natural and community resource augmentation plan.
5. **Category - B2 Projects :** The project proponent shall submit the **EMP report** along with the remediation plan and the natural and community resource augmentation plan.

Step-4:

1. The SEAC, A.P., will appraise the final EIA report/ EMP report and recommend the quantum of the Bank Guarantee for the compliance of the remediation plan and the natural and community resource augmentation plan. The same will be finalised by the regulatory authority - SEIAA, A.P.

Step-5:

1. The Project Proponent shall submit the Bank Guarantee to the amount of remediation plan and Natural and Community Resource Augmentation Plan with the State Pollution Control Board.

Step-6:

The SEAC,A.P., will recommend for the issue of Environmental Clearance (EC) / Terms of Reference (TOR) duly stipulating the conditions imposed by the MoEF&CC Office Memorandum dated 30.05.2018 in addition to other conditions in the EC/TOR., to the Project Proponents in violation cases.

The Sub-committee visited the site of the proposed mine lease on 21.09.2018.</p> <p>The sub committee noted that there another mine lease (7.83 Ha.) for which EC issued on 11.06.2018. The committee noticed that the path proposed for the mine lease area connectivity road will not be possible for any vehicle, and track formation because of its high steepness cannot be accepted.
