Recommendations of SEAC on 12.08.2025

Category: B2.

The project is for mining of Colour Granite in an area of 0.632 Ha. with a proposed production quantity of Expansion from 1,892 m³/annum to Colour Granite - 3,229 m³/annum with a condition that the total production during a scheme should be limited to the approved quantity as per Mining scheme/ plan.

The proposed project falls under Item No. 1(a) of the schedule of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments thereof - (i). Mining of minerals (\leq 250 ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).

The Authorized person of the project and their consultant M/s. SV Enviro Labs & Research Pvt Ltd., have attended the meeting and presented the proposal. The SEAC committee noted that:

- a. Now the project proponent applied for Re-appraisal of Environmental clearance issued by the DEIAA and also submitted Intimation ID No. DEIAA/AP/PKM/55/MIN/2017-191, dated:15/12/2017/517/2017/528066 issued by the SEIAA, A.P.
- b. The committee noted this is an existing mine lease and the DEIAA, Prakasam District issued Environmental clearance on 15.12.2017 to the subject mine for mining for Expansion from 1,892 m³/annum to Colour Granite -: 3,229 m³/annum. This order is valid for life of the mine or the expiry date of mine lease period issued by the Government of A.P i.e, whichever is earlier.
- c. The Department of Mines and Geology submitted DSR of Bapatla District. The same is reviewed in the SEAC meeting and observed that the mineral details mentioned at Page No 101 of DSR Report.
- d. The project proponent vide letter dt. 10.03.2024 submitted production and dispatch details issued by the Department of Mines and Geology, Bapatla District.
- e. The Committee noted that as per the cluster letter dt 05.02.2025 issued by the Department of Mines & Geology, there are 21 existing quarry leases within the radius of 500 mtrs area. The total cluster area is < 25 Ha.
- f. The department of mines and Geology vide order dt. 25.04.2023 issued work order upto 29.08.2024

- g. As per the approved mining plan dt. 15.10.2015, the total available mineral reserves are 21,058 m³. The Life of the mine is 8 years.
- h. This proposal was placed in 258th SEAC meeting and then, the Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, mining plan, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended to raise ADS for Valid work order and new mining plan.
- i. Accordingly, the PP submitted ADS reply and again, this proposal was placed in 270th SEAC meeting and noted that:
- The District Mines and Geology officer, Bapatla vide letter dt.11.06.2025 granted quarry lease in favour of M/S. Sai Stones, Mg. Ptr. Sri P. Suresh for a further period of 10 years with effect from 30.08.2024.
- As per the approved mining plan dt. 21.07.2025, the total available mineral reserves are 3,78,579 m³. The Life of the mine is 31 years.

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, mining plan, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended **SEIAA** for issue of **Expansion** Environmental Clearance for mining of from 1,892 m³/annum to **Colour Granite - 3,229** m³/annum over a period of mine is 30 years, covering an area of **0.632** hectares, in favour of M/s. Sai Stones at Sy. No. 103/P, Konidena Village, Ballikurva Mandal, Prakasam District, Andhra Pradesh. The recommendation is subject to the following additional conditions:

- 1. The project proponent shall comply with the proposals furnished in the Environmental management plan.
- 2. The project proponent shall develop greenbelt along approach roads & village Roads.
- 3. The project proponent shall maintain 7.5mt greenbelt in buffer zone and existing buffer zone plantation should not be disturbed.
- The proponent shall take dust suppression measures to meet the CPCB stipulated ambient air quality standards at any point of time.
- 5. The proponent shall carryout suppression of dust generated due to transport vehicles by continuous water spraying using tankers.
- 6. The vehicles carrying the mines material shall be covered with tarpaulin during vehicular movement.
- 7. The project proponent shall not use village road/ canal bund roads for mineral transportation purpose.
- 8. The project proponent shall restrict vehicles movement during the peak hours to avoid accidents.
- 9. The project proponent shall restrict the load of the transport

- vehicles not more than 21 tons to avoid road damages and dust nuisance to surroundings.

The project is for mining of Road Metal in an area of 0.607 Ha. with a proposed production quantity of Road Metal – 6,042 m³/annum with a condition that the total production during a scheme should be limited to the approved quantity as per Mining scheme/ plan.

The proposed project falls under Item No. 1(a) of the schedule of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments thereof - (i). Mining of minerals (\leq 250 ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).

The project proponent and their consultant M/s. Ecomen Mining Pvt Ltd., have attended the meeting and presented the proposal. The SEAC committee noted that:

- a. Now the project proponent applied for Re-appraisal of Environmental clearance issued by the DEIAA and also submitted Intimation ID No. 156/DEIAA/AP/GNT/17/751/2018/745472 issued by the SEIAA, A.P.
- b. The committee noted this is an existing mine lease and the DEIAA, SPSR Nellore District issued Environmental clearance on 03.01.2018 to the subject mine for mining for Road Metal – 6,042 m³/annum. This order is valid for a period of 15 years or the expiry date of mine lease period issued by the Government of A.P i.e, whichever is earlier.
- c. The Department of Mines and Geology submitted DSR of Nellore District. The same is reviewed in the SEAC meeting and observed that the mineral details mentioned at Page No 101 of

DSR Report.

- d. The project proponent vide letter dt. 26.05.2025 submitted production and dispatch details issued by the Department of Mines and Geology, Palnadu District.
- e. The Department of Mines and Geology vide letter dt. 19.12.2018 issued work order for 15 years.
- f. The Committee noted that as per the cluster letter dt 22.04.2025 issued by the Department of Mines & Geology, there are 12 existing quarry leases within the radius of 500 mtrs area. The total cluster area is < 25 Ha.
- g. As per the approved mining plan dt. 20.06.2017 the total available mineral reserves are 68,865 m³. The Life of the mine is 11 years

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, mining plan, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended **SEIAA** for issue of Environmental Clearance for mining of **Road Metal** – **6,042** m³/annum over a period of mine is 11 years, covering an area of 0.607 hectares, in favour of M/s. Lepakshi Stone Crusher at Sy No. 401/B, Kondakavur Village, Narsaraopet Mandal, Guntur District, Andhra Pradesh. The recommendation is subject to the following additional conditions:

- 1. The project proponent shall comply with the proposals furnished in the Environmental management plan.
- 2. The project proponent shall develop greenbelt along approach roads & village Roads.
- 3. The project proponent shall maintain 7.5mt greenbelt in buffer zone and existing buffer zone plantation should not be disturbed.
- The proponent shall take dust suppression measures to meet the CPCB stipulated ambient air quality standards at any point of time.
- 5. The proponent shall carryout suppression of dust generated due to transport vehicles by continuous water spraying using tankers.
- 6. The vehicles carrying the mines material shall be covered with tarpaulin during vehicular movement.

Recommendations of SEAC on 12.08.2025

Category: B2 at par with B1.

The project proposal is for mining De-Casting of Sand Quarrying in an area of 6.556 Ha with a proposed production quantity of De-Casting of Sand – 1,96,680 m³/annum with a condition that the total production during a scheme should be limited to the approved quantity as per approved Mining plan.

The proposed project falls under Item No. 1(a) of the schedule of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments thereof Mining of minerals (≤250 ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).

The District Mines and Geology Officer and their consultant M/s. SV Enviro Labs & Research Pvt ltd have attended the meeting and presented their proposal. The SEAC Committee noted that:

- a. The committee noted that proposed mine land is a patta land. The Government of Andhra Pradesh vide GoMS No.59 dt.01.10.2024 issued permission for de-casting of sand from patta lands.
- b. The Joint inspection was conducted on 26.12.2024 to the subject sand reach and report recommended for over an extent of 6.556 Ha and permitted to excavation of sand is 3 Mts thickness. Assessed the permitted sand quantity of 1,96,680 Cum.
- c. The Joint Collector & Addl District Magistrate, East Godavari District vide order dt. 10.01.2025 issued DLSC/Notice copy for obtaining statutory clearance to the subject mine.
- d. The Department of Mines and Geology submitted DSR of East Godavari District. The same is reviewed in the SEAC meeting and observed that the mineral details available at Page No 99 & 100 of DSR Report (Probable Sand mining reaches).
- e. As per the cluster letter dated: 06.03.2025 issued by the Mines Department, the subject mine falls in B2 at par with B1 category.
- f. As per the approved mining plan dt. 03.03.2025 the total available mineral reserves are 1,96,680 m3 (As per Join

- Inspection report only 3 m sand excavation is permitted) after mined quantity of extracted pit in the mine and the entire quantity is proposed to be excavated within the period of 1 year.
- g. Hon'ble NGT in its order dated 23.03.2023 in O.A. No. 152 of 2021 (SZ) directed SEIAA, Andhra Pradesh to verify all the Environmental Clearances granted for sand mining under 'B2' Category if permission has been granted for semi-mechanised or mechanised mining and re-examine the proposal either under 'B2' category (manual mining) or 'B1' Category (if semi mechanised or mechanised mining is sought) following the prescribed procedures.
- h. The present application is made for open cast semi mechanized of mining. Hence, it is considered under B2 at par with B1 category.
- i. The SEAC is made recommendation without any prejudice to the Hon'ble NGT/any other court orders. The applicant shall abide by the Hon'ble NGT / Other court orders, if any, in future also.
- j. The PP obtained Standard TOR dt. 21.04.2025 and public hearing held on 26.06.2025.
- k. The base line data was collected from Jan, 25 to March,2025 and the predominant wind direction is observed to be North to East. The maximum concentration of SPM(PM10) is observed to be 60.2 μg/m3. The incremental concentration is 2.67 μg/m3 and GLC of SPM will fall within the mine lease area.
- I. The lease holder informed that they have allocated Rs. 7.4 Lakhs as capital cost and Rs. 2.48 Lakhs as a recurring cost budget for the EMP. The project proponent volunteered to provide 1 Lakhs to **Prakkilanka Lankalu** village under Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) activity.

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, MoEF&CC Notifications & Oms and detailed deliberations, recommended **to issue** Environmental Clearance for the mining of De-Casting of Sand with the maximum production quantity of **De-Casting of Sand – 1,96,680 m³/annum** for **one-year** period, covering an area of 6.556 Ha with open cast semi mechanized method of mining with the following additional conditions:

- There shall be no change in the production quantities approved in Environment Clearance order.
- 2. All the conditions and guidelines issued by MoEF&CC, Govt of India in respect of sand mining shall be followed.

- 3. The directions issued by the Hon'ble NGT, Southern Zone, Chennai in the matter of O.A.No. 47 of 2016 (SZ) & 177 of 2016 (SZ), Order dated:14.12.2020 shall be scrupulously followed.
- 4. The standard environmental conditions for sand mining specified in the Sustainable Sand Mining Guidelines, issued by MoEF&CC, Govt of India, 2016 shall be followed.
- 5. The lease holder shall follow the procedures mentioned in Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining January, 2020.
- 6. The lease holder shall comply with the recommendation and suggestion made by the High-Power Committee as applicable.
- 7. The mining activities on river beds are allowed strictly as per the provisions of river / stream bed mining policy.
- 8. The ramp (i.e., approach road) shall be removed after sand mining is completed.
- 9. Under any circumstance under water sand mining shall not be carried out.
- The committee directed the lease holder that they shall not carryout river bed mining operation in monsoon period.
- 11. No sand mining shall be done during the rainy season.
- 12. The lease holder should demarcate boundary with geocoordinates or geo-fenced to ensure that sand extraction is going on only within the permitted area.
- 13. The functioning time of quarries/depots shall be 7.00 AM to 6.00 PM. No sand transporting and mining vehicles to be parked inside the quarry/depot site during night time.
- 14. The vehicles carrying the mined material shall be covered with tarpaulin during vehicular movement.
- 15. The transportation route should be selected in such a way that the movement of trucks/tippers/tractors from the villages having habitation should be avoided.
- 16. The lease holder to maintain electronic weighbridges at the appropriate location identified by the district mining officer, in order to ensure that all mined minerals from that particular mine are accounted for before the material is dispatched from the mine. The weighing bridge shall have the provision of CCTV camera and all dispatch from the mine shall be accounted.
- 17. The lease holder shall keep GPS tracking to the vehicle from source to destination.
- 18. The lease holder shall not obstruct the river flow, water transport and restoring the riparian rights and instream habitats.
- 19. The lease holder shall plant the plants all along the river

- bank/embankment to control the erosion of river bank.
- 20. The lease holder shall restrict vehicles movement during the peak hours to avoid accidents.
- 21. The project proponent shall restrict the load of the transport vehicles not more than 21 tons to avoid road damages and dust nuisance to surroundings
- 22. The project proponent shall comply with the commitments made during public hearing.
- 23. The PP shall complete the entire greenbelt development within the first year itself and ensure its maintenance throughout the lease period.

Decision of SEIAA:- Agreed with the recommendations of SEAC to issue Environmental Clearance.

The proposed project is for mining of Morrum/Gravel and Ordinary Earth in an area of 0.81 Ha. with a proposed production quantity of Morrum/Gravel and Ordinary Earth — 13,671 m³/annum with a condition that the total production during a scheme should be limited to the approved quantity as per Mining scheme/plan.

The proposed project falls under Item No. 1(a) of the schedule of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments thereof - (i). Mining of minerals (\leq 250 ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).

The project proponent and their consultant, M/s. Hubert Enviro Care Systems Pvt Ltd, Chennai., have attended the meeting and presented their proposal. The SEAC Committee noted that:

- a. The Department of Mines and Geology submitted DSR of East Godavari District. The same is reviewed in the SEAC meeting and observed that the mineral details available at Page No 63 of DSR Report.
- b. The Department of Mines and Geology issued letter of Intent (LOI) vide order dt. 23.04.2025 for a period of 05 years subject to submission of Approved Mining Plan, EC and CFE within a period upto 03 years from date of issue of LoI.
- c. As per the approved mining plan dt. 07.05.2025, the total available mineral reserves are 69401 m³. The proponent

- proposed to excavate Morrum/Gravel and Ordinary Earth 13,671 m³/annum. The Life of the mine is 5 years.
- d. The project proponent informed that they have allocated Rs. 4.5 Lakhs as capital cost and Rs. 4.0 Lakhs as a recurring cost budget for the EMP. The proponent volunteered to provide water treatment plant to Jegurupadu villages as a part of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) activity and shall maintain till the life of the mine.
- e. The Committee noted that as per the cluster letter dt 20.05.2025 issued by the Department of Mines & Geology, there are 02 existing quarry lease within the radius of 500 mtrs area. The total cluster area is < 5.0 Ha. But as per the KML file, there are two mines. Hence, the committee recommended to raise ADS for submission of ADS revised cluster to verify the applicability of Public Hearing.</p>
- f. This proposal was placed in 267th SEAC meeting and then the Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, mining plan, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended to raise ADS for submission of revised cluster letter duly mentioning the status of adjacent workings.
- g. Accordingly, the project proponent submitted ADS reply that and again placed in 270th SEAC meeting and committee noted that:
- The Committee noted that as per the cluster letter dt 30.07.2025 issued by the Department of Mines & Geology, there are 03 existing quarry leases within the radius of 500 mtrs area. The total applicable cluster area is 2.11 Ha which is < 5.0 Ha. Further, coastal paper mills illegal excavated and issued demand notice.

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, mining plan, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, **recommended SEIAA to issue** Environmental Clearance for the mining of **Morrum/Gravel and Ordinary Earth** – **13,671 m³/annum** over a period of 5 years, covering an area of **0.81** hectares, in favor of M/s. Ambica Minerals at Survey No.: 9-1/15, Jegurupadu Village, Kadiyam Mandal, East Godavari District, Andhra Pradesh. The recommendation is subject to the following additional conditions:

- 1. The project proponent shall comply with the proposals furnished in the Environmental management plan.
- 2. The project proponent shall develop greenbelt along approach roads & village Roads.
- 3. The project proponent shall maintain 7.5mt greenbelt in buffer

- zone and existing buffer zone plantation should not be disturbed.
- The proponent shall take dust suppression measures to meet the CPCB stipulated ambient air quality standards at any point of time.

Recommendations of SEAC on 12.08.2025

The representative of the project and their consultant M/s. HECS have attended the meeting and presented the proposal. The SEAC committee noted that:

- a. This proposal was placed in 246th & 266th SEAC meeting and then the project proponent and also their consultant have not attended the meeting, and the committee recommend to **defer** as the PP not attended the meeting.
- b. The SEIAA, A.P., vide order dt. 11.06.2020 issued Environmental Clearance to **Subject mine**, for mining of Road Metal & Building Stone 16,500 m³/annum and which is valid for 3.53 years or the expiry date of mine lease period.
- c. The Department of Mines and Geology vide order dt. 29.01.2021 issued work order for 10 years w.e.f 04.05.2019.
- d. The applicant applied for extension of validity of EC on 12.03.2024.
- e. As per the approved mining plan dt. 16.02.2024 the total mineral

reserves is 65581 m³ and Life of the mine is 13.11 years.

- f. The PP vide letter dt. 22.02.2024 uploaded half yearly uploaded halfort in the Parivesh Portal in their login.
- g. The PP vide Lr dated 16.05.2025 submitted the details of dispatch particulars and permits within limit only.

The committee noted that the Project Proponent (PP) has developed some plantation around mine leases area and not developed the greenbelt over the past 04 years in **approach roads to the mine**. Therefore, the committee recommended granting an Environmental Clearance (EC) extension for a limited period of 01 year. Additionally, the committee directed the PP to undertake greenbelt development around the mine lease area, along the approach roads, and in surrounding villages, in accordance with the conditions stipulated in the EC. Compliance with these requirements will be essential for consideration of any further extension of the EC.

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, MoEF&CC Notifications, & OMs, MoEF&CC OMs and detailed deliberations, **recommended to SEIAA to issue EC Extension** for mining of Road Metal & Building Stone 16,500 m³/annum for a period up to 31.08.2026 with a condition that conditions mentioned in the earlier EC remains same.

Decision of SEIAA:- Agreed with the recommendations of SEAC to issue Extension of Environmental Clearance validity up to 31.08.2026.

- b. The committee noted that proposed mine land is a patta land. The Government of Andhra Pradesh vide GoMS No.59 dt.01.10.2024 issued permission for de-casting of sand from patta lands.
- c. The Joint inspection was conducted on 21.05.2025 to the subject sand reach and report recommended for over an extent of **0.158** and permitted to excavation of sand is 1 to 2 Mts thickness.
- d. The Collector & District Magistrate, Annamayya District, vide order dt. 23.12.2024 issued DLSC.
- e. The District Mines and Geology office, Rayachoty, issued Notice copy for obtaining statutory clearance to the subject mine.

The proposed project is for mining of **Road Metal & Building Stone** in an area of **4.717 Ha.** with a proposed production quantity of 66725 Cum/Annum with a condition that the total production during a scheme should be limited to the approved quantity as per Mining scheme/plan.

The proposed project falls under Item No. 1(a) of the schedule of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments thereof - (i). Mining of minerals (≤250 ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).

The project proponent and their consultant, M/s. Pollucare Engineers India Private Limited have attended the meeting and presented their proposal. The SEAC Committee noted that:

- a. This proposal was placed in 252nd SEAC meeting and then, the project proponent and also their consultant have not attended the meeting and the committee recommend to defer for ADS seeking reasons for not attending the meeting and also to place this case only after the project proponent request the SEAC to place their proposal in the future SEAC meeting.
- b. The Department of Mines and Geology submitted DSR of Alluri Seetharamaraju District. The same is reviewed in the SEAC meeting and observed that the mineral details available at Page No 91 of DSR Report.

- d. The Committee noted that as per the cluster letter dt 30.07.2024 issued by the Department of Mines & Geology, there no existing quarry leases within the radius of 500 mtrs area. The total cluster area is < 5.0 Ha.</p>
- e. As per the approved mining plan dt. 21.06.2024 the total available mineral reserves are 668865**m**³. The proponent proposed to excavate 66725 Cum/Annum. The Life of the mine is 10 years.
- f. The committee on viewing KML file uploaded in the Parivesh Portal, observed that small portion of the proposed mine lease area is overlapping with Telangana State boundary.
- g. The PP submitted ENDORSEMENT letter dt.03.01.2025 issued by the Tahsildar, Yetapaka Mandal wherein it was stated that "as per the Google Earth/Google maps verification stated that lease boundary overlapping with Telangana State Boundary. However

- on verification of Revenue Records FLT/FMB sketches, the proposed quarry lease at sy. No. 45/1, 46/2 & 46/4 in Kannaigudem Village of Yetapaka Mandal, Alluri Sitharama Raju District (Erstwhile East Godavari District) i.e., to Andhra Pradesh State in our records".
- h. The committee observed old working pits in the mine lease area. Hence, committee recommended to raise ADS for submission of action taken report.
- i. This proposal was placed in 262nd SEAC meeting and the Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended **to raise ADS** for submission a clarification letter from the Department of Mines & Geology regarding the operations within the mine lease area. Additionally, the proponent is required to provide a detailed action taken report addressing any illegal activities.
- j. Accordingly, the PP submitted ADS reply and again, this proposal was placed in 262nd SEAC meeting and noted that:
- The PP vide letter dt 24.05.2025 submitted clarification letter issued by the DMGO, Paderu, Alluri Seetharama Raju District and wherein action taken report and earlier lease details were not mentioned clearly. Hence, committee recommended to raise ADS for submission a clarification letter from the Department of Mines & Geology regarding the operations within the mine lease area. Additionally, the proponent is required to provide a detailed action taken report addressing any illegal activities.
- k. This proposal was placed in 262nd SEAC meeting and the Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended **to raise ADS** for submission a clarification letter from the Department of Mines & Geology regarding the operations within the mine lease area. Additionally, the proponent is required to provide a detailed action taken report addressing any illegal activities.
- I. Accordingly, PP submitted ADS reply and again, this proposal was placed in 267th SEAC meeting and committee noted that:
- The PP vide letter dt. 26.06.2025 submitted clarification letter and wherein states that as per records of this office, earlier 02 renewal of quarry leases for stone & Metal area having in Sy.No.45 of Kannaigudem village, Bhadrachalam Mandal, Khammam District for a period of 20 years each and they were operated within the subject survey numer/within the e-auction proposed area of Sri P. Tirupathi Rao. Further informed that, as

per SEIAA objections of the workings noticed in the LoI area through which operated by Sri Banavath Laxmana and Sri Pokala Srinivasa rao, the both lease holders excavated area is worked pits upto ground level are waterlogged area condition is 16,738 Sqmt.(within the subject proposed area) and depth of the pit cannot be measures as the pits is water logged and also informed that, there no fresh workings and any existing pits in the LoI issued area of Sri Penuballi Tirupathi Rao for grant of quarry lease over an extent of 4.717 Ha in Sy.No. 45/1,46/2& 46/4 of Kannaigudem village, Yetapaka Mandal, Alluri Sitharamaraju District.

The Authorized person of the project and their consultant M/s. TEAM Labs and Consultants Private Limited., have attended the meeting and presented the proposal. The SEAC committee noted that:

- a. The Department of Mines and Geology issued letter of Intent (LOI) vide order dt. 04.04.2023for 20 years period and subject to submission of AMP, EC and CFE with in period of 3 years.
- b. The Department of Mines and Geology submitted DSR of Prakasam district. The same is reviewed in the SEAC meeting and observed that the subject mine details mentioned at Page No 113 of DSR Report.
- c. As per the approved mining plan dt. 12.01.2024, the total available mineral reserves are 27,71,550T. The Life of the mine is 92 years.
- d. The project proponent has obtained Standard TOR with public hearing letter on 05.07.2024 and public hearing was held on 10.01.2025.
- e. Details of the public hearing: There are no specific environmental issues raised during the public hearing.
- f. Response of the Management during PH: Sri Govinda Rao, Project Geologist: He assured that employment preference will be given to the local skilled & unskilled villagers to the suitable jobs as per norms, all the measures will be taken without air & water pollution, adopt the controlled blastings, adopt the latest technology in the mining operations to avoid groundwater & air pollution, every year 300 plants will be planted with the support of the locals, and employment to the youth will be provided based on the education. He assured that all the safety rules, employment, and plantation will be increased yearly as per norms, insurance facility will be provided to the quarry workers and CSR funds will be spent for the development of the village such as education, water facilities and any other village needs.
- g. The base line data was collected from March to May, 2024 and the predominant wind direction is observed to be West to East. The maximum concentration of SPM(PM10) is observed to be 52 µg/m3 at project site. The incremental concentration is 0.048 µg/m3 and GLC of SPM. The committee observed that the incremental value is to low and considered it is an abnormal value compared to the others. Therefore, the committee directed the project proponent to submit revised AAQ data and also directed to submit NABL-accredited laboratory analysis reports.
- h. This proposal was placed in 254th SEAC meeting and then, the Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, mining plan, MoEF&CC Notifications & Oms, EIA report, PH

- minutes and detailed deliberations, recommended to raise for submission of revised AAQ data and NABL-accredited laboratory analysis reports.
- i. Accordingly, the project proponent submitted ADS reply and again, this proposal is placed in 265th SEAC meeting and committee noted that:
- The project proponent collected 1 month base line data (07.03.205 to 06.04.2025) and the predominant wind direction is observed to be W to E. The maximum concentration of SPM(PM10) is observed to be 53 μg/m3. The incremental concentration is 0.65 μg/m3.
- The committee observed that the proposed Express Highway (Amaravathi to Bangalore) passes through the southern corner of the mine lease area. In response, the Project Proponent (PP) clarified that the LoI area issued by the Mines Department in 2023, prior to the proposal of the national highway. The recommendation is subject to the following additional conditions.

- 1. The proponent shall comply with the proposals furnished in the Environmental management plan and EIA report.
- 2. The project proponent shall develop greenbelt of 1km along approach roads & village Roadsides.
- 3. The project proponent shall maintain 7.5mt greenbelt in buffer zone and existing buffer zone plantation should not be disturbed.
- The proponent shall take dust suppression measures to meet the CPCB stipulated ambient air quality standards at any point of time.
- 5. The proponent shall carryout suppression of dust generated due to transport vehicles by continuous water spraying using tankers.
- 6. The vehicles carrying the mines material shall be covered with tarpaulin during vehicular movement.
- 7. The project proponent shall not use village road for mineral transportation purpose.
- 8. The project proponent shall restrict vehicles movement during the peak hours to avoid accidents.
- 9. The project proponent shall comply with the commitments made during public hearing.
- 10. The PP shall complete the entire greenbelt development within the first year itself and ensure its maintenance throughout the lease period.

Decision of SEIAA:- The Authority observed that the SEAC raised ADS for submission of comprehensive traffic study. However, the reply furnished by the proponent was not mentioned in the minutes of 269th SEAC meeting. Hence, decided to **refer the proposal to SEAC to furnish remarks on comprehensive traffic study**.
