179.3.1. K.R.Puram Hobli, Bengaluru East Taluk, Bangalore Urban District by M/s. Manyata Promoters Pvt Ltd. (SEIAA 29 CON 2019)

M/s Manyata Promoters Private Limited (MPPL) have proposed for modification of proposed Mixed Development project "Manyata Tech Park & Township" increase in built up area of 8,99,239 Sq.m. ha. It is proposed to construct new facilities Block-P, Block –M3, Block N2, Block L4 and Block F1 of Sector-A (Commercial & IT Park) with the facilities of eight Buildings, 5 Star Hotel, 4 Star Hotel and Banquet Hall. Total water requirement is 4000 KLD and total capacity of STP is 3500 KLD. Car parking provided is 9955 No. Estimated cost of project is 2,114 Crores.

The proponent had obtained Environmental Clearance vide SEIAA letter No. 30:CON:2009, dated 10th June 2010 for expansion of commercial, residential & hotel on a plot area of 359.11 acres inclusive of proposed expansion of 59.11 acres. The total built up area is 35,01,009.60 Sqm inclusive of the proposed expansion of 27,40,217.6 sq. m. The proposed project under expansion consists of commercial complex/IT Park, Hotel Rooms of 300 Nos, Residential Township, Residential Plots and Group Housing.

PROPOSED MODIFICATION AND EXPANSION:

The following facilities were proposed in the proposed Modification and Expansion Project.

- 1) Two Office Block's (3B+G+10UF)
- 2) Banquet Hall (3B+G+4UF)
- 3) 5 Star Hotel (3B+G+12 UF) and
- 4) 3 Star Hotel (3B+G+12 UF)

There have been certain Design Changes in the layout such as 3 Star Hotel is changed to 4 Star Hotel, etc., these Design Changes have resulted in the increase in the Built-up area of the Project from 1,89,381 Sq.m (approved in TOR) to 1,97,647 Sq.m.

Additionally, as per the Managements current and future plans, MPPL now proposes to take up construction of additional Blocks in the Project with a total builtup area of **7,01,592 Sq.m**, which were not taken up earlier though EC was granted for the same.

The proposed construction/revision in the facilities is limited to **Sector A** in a Plot area of **145.94 Acres**. The details of the proposed modification and Expansion Project for a total Built up area of **8,99,239 Sq.m in Sector A** of the Project is as per the following details:

The development of the Residential Plots in **Sector B** is completed and built-up area of about 5,00,000 Sq.m is completed till date.

The proposals for development of Group Housing in **Sector C** and Residential Plots in **Sector D** is not envisaged now in view of the land acquisition issues and accordingly dropped.

The Existing Project of "Manyata Tech Park & Township" was inspected by the Deputy Director, MoEF&CC, Bangalore on 24.09.2018 and the Certified Compliance is issued for the Project vide letter dated 24.10.2018 and 13.12.2018.

The total built-up area is increasing from 23,01,009.60 Sq.m to 25,29,898.17 Sq.m in Sector A (Commercial & IT Park) within the complex.

MPPL have uploaded their Application in the PARIVESH Portal for issue of **Amendment to TOR** for the Modification and Expansion Project vide letter dated 29.11.2018 (Proposal No. IA/KA/NCP/63684/2017 dated 03.12.2019). **MoEF&CC** has informed vide EDS dated 23.01.2019 to submit the application to SEIAA/SEAC Karnataka since it is a category B Project and withdraw the Application from the MoEFCC Portal.

MPPL has uploaded Amendment to TOR Application in the Karnataka State portal of PARIVESH on 11.02.2019

The Existing Project of "Manyata Tech Park & Township" was inspected by the Deputy Director, MoEF&CC, Bangalore on 24.09.2018 and the Certified Compliance is issued for the Project vide letter dated 24.10.2018 and 13.12.2018.

The SEAC during the meeting held on 10.5.2019 have decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of standard ToRs along with additional ToRs. The Authority during the meeting held on 18.5.2019 decided to issue ToR as recommended

by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006. Accordingly the ToR was issued vide letter dated 27-5-2019. The proponent have submitted the EIA report vide letter dated 25-6-2019.

The committee during the meeting held on 11.7.2019 appraised the proposal. The Committee noted from the village survey map that there is a nala in the land of 19 Acres 24 guntas directly purchased by the proponent for which the proponent has stated that he has left 25 meters buffer zone on either side of the nala. The committee after discussion and deliberation decided to reconsider after submission of the following information.

- 1) Additional ToR points No.3, 4,7,9,11,12 to be reworked out and submitted.
- 2) Land use and land cover analysis of the project area using high resolution satellite image to be prepared and submitted.
- 3) The proponent to submit the details for additional RWH storage tanks capacity as agreed by him.

The committee during the meeting held on 8.8.2019 perused the replies submitted by the proponent vide letter dated:29-7-2019 and accepted the same. The committee after discussion and deliberation decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Environment clearance with the following conditions:

- 1. The proponent to conduct energy audit by an accredited agency before operation of the project in accordance with the Bureau of Energy Efficiency.
- 2. 15% of the parking space shall be reserved for electric vehicles with recharging facility.
- 3. The proponent shall identify suitable place(KIOSK) for collection and storage of E-Wastes generated within the premises and shall be disposed of regularly only with the KSPCB authorised E-waste recyclers.
- 4. The proponent shall adopt air cooled HVAC systems instead of water cooled HVAC systems in order to reuse the water saved and reduce the fresh water demand.
- 5. Triple line plumbing system to be implemented instead of dual line plumbing adopting sullage and sewage treatment separately.
- 6. Surface water runoff from paved areas to be stored and reused with suitable treatment systems.
- 7. Co sensors to be installed with suitable exhaust system for double and triple basements.

The Authority during the meeting held on 5.9.2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to get the following information for further consideration.

- 1) Report of compliance on the conditions of the earlier EC from the regional office of MoFF&CC.
- 2) Details of the developments undertaken with earlier EC and the proposed expansion.

- 3) Specific source of treated water for the construction with an undertaking/MoU with the prospective supplier of such treated water and with water quality analysis report to establish that such treated water is fit for construction purpose.
- 4) An action plan with activities proposed under CER in accordance with O.M F. No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 1st May 2018 issued by MoEF&CC, Government of India, allocation of funds against each of the activities and the time frame within which such activities will be completed. The funds so earmarked shall be in accordance with para 6 (II) and the activities shall be in accordance with para 6 (V) of the said O.M.

The Authority also decided to invite the proponent for furnishing additional information / clarifications.

The proponent was invited to the Authority meeting vide letter dated 15.10.2019.

The proponent appeared before the Authority during the meeting held on 19th October 2019 and explained the project in brief and requested for issue of Environmental Clearance. The Authority sought to know the sector-wise details such as total plot area, built up area, FAR, pollution control facilities, green belt, parks & open spaces, etc as per the Environmental Clearance granted earlier vis a vis the present proposal along with reasons for the changes if any. The Authority also sought to know the details of construction already undertaken in each sector, yet to be undertaken and proposed modification. The Authority directed the proponent to submit a detailed layout plan approved while issuing Environmental Clearance, conceptual plan as proposed now and a combined plan indicating the changes along with buildings that are proposed to be modified. The Authority directed the proponent to submit all such information and decided to consider the proposal after the receipt of information sought above.

The Authority perused the reply submitted by the proponent vide letter dated 29.11.2019.

The Authority after discussion decided to clear the proposal for issue of Environmental Clearance subject to submission of the following information:

- 1) Specific source of treated water for the construction with an undertaking/MoU with the prospective supplier of such treated water and with water quality analysis report to establish that such treated water is fit for construction purpose.
- 2) An action plan with activities proposed under CER in accordance with O.M F. No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 1st May 2018 issued by MoEF&CC, Government of India, allocation of funds against each of the activities and the time frame within which such activities will be completed. The funds so earmarked shall be in accordance with para 6 (II) and the activities shall be in accordance with para 6 (V) of the said O.M.

179.3.2. Proposed Building Stone Quarrying at Sy.No.159 of Heggotara Village, Chamarajanagara Taluk & district by Sri. Syed Farooq Ahamed (SEIAA 346 MIN 2019)

Sri. Syed Farooq Ahamad have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of building stone in 0.8093 Ha., Revenue land.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 23rd July 2019. The Committee noted that as per the records and statement of the proponent the lease area is located at a distance of 19.5 KM from BRT Tigre reserve, 2 KMs from Bedarapura deemed forest and 15.1 KM from Bisalawadi reserved forest and this village is not included in Kasturirangan report also. The committee noted that this is a fresh lease involving building stone mining in government land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue and Wildlife authorities.

The Committee further noted that as per the extended combined sketch prepared by the DMG there are five other leases including this lease and total area of these leases is 9 acres and this being less than the threshold limit of 5 Ha, the committee decided to categorise under B2 and proceeded with the appraisal accordingly. As per the quarry plan approved by DMG there is a level difference of 19 meters and taking this into consideration the committee opined that 55% of the proposed quantity of 1,04,169 cum or 2,70,840 tons including wastage can be mined safely and scientifically for a plan period of five years to a quarry pit depth of 12 meters. The proponent has stated that there is an existing cart track road to a length of 300 meters connecting the lease area to all weather road. As far as CER is concerned, the proponent has earmarked Rs.3.00 lakhs towards rejuvenation of Heggotara Kere which is at a distance of 1.85 KMs from the lease area. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance.

The Authority during the meeting held on 27th August 2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority observed that the notification uploaded in the online portal is in the name of Sri Syed Rafi instead of Sri. Syed Farooq Ahamed and the notified sketch is also in the name of Sri Syed Rafi with different GPS co-ordinates. So, Authority opined that the environment setting with respect to the distance from the wildlife sanctuary and other such details provided in the form 1 may not be correct. The Authority also noted that there were many leases in the Heggotara village for which Environmental Clearance were issued by the SEIAA earlier. A detailed list of leases in the village has to be provided from the DMG. The Authority therefore decided to get clarification in this regard from the proponent for further consideration.

The Authority perused the reply submitted by the proponent vide letter dated 02.12.2019.

The Authority after discussion decided to issue Environmental Clearance for extraction of 55% of the building stone proposed to be extracted as per approved quarry plan, subject to submission of the following information:-

- 1) Distance of the proposed project site from the boundary of nearest National Park/ Sanctuary/Bio sphere reserve/ migratory corridor of wild life animal and if it is located within 10 Km of the said National Park/ Sanctuary/Bio sphere reserve/ migratory corridor of wild life animal then a map duly authenticated by the Chief Wildlife Warden showing the boundary from such National Park/ Sanctuary/Bio sphere reserve/ migratory corridor of wild life animal vis a vis the project location and the recommendation or comments of the Chief Wildlife Warden thereon.
- 2) An action plan with activities proposed under CER in accordance with O.M F. No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 1st May 2018 issued by MoEF&CC, Government of India, allocation of funds against each of the activities and the time frame within which such activities will be completed. The funds so earmarked shall be in accordance with para 6 (II) and the activities shall be in accordance with para 6 (V) of the said O.M.

179.3.3. Proposed Building Stone Quarry Project at Sy.No.58 of Dinnehosahalli Village, Kolar Taluk, Kolar District (Q.L.No.906, Q.L.No.905, Q.L.No.907) (3-34 Acres) By M/s. Dinnehosahalli Cluster Association (SEIAA 550 MIN 2019)

M/s Dinnehosahalli Cluster Association have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of building stone in 3-34 acres, Government land at at Sy.No.58 of Dinnehosahalli Village, Kolar Taluk, Kolar District.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 25.09.2019. The Committee noted that earlier separate applications were made out under SEIAA 276 2019, SEIAA 294 MIN 2019 and SEIAA 301 MIN 2019 even though a cluster notification was issued for 7 quarry leases. Now the proponent has stated that a modified cluster notification involving 3 leases with a total extent of 3 Acres 34 guntas has been issued by DMG and consequent to this the proponent has stated that he has prepared combined EMP for the three leases and separate quarry plan for three leases involved in this cluster. According to which the QL No.906 which stands in the name of Sri. Murugesh is of total area of one acre out of which mining area is 23 guntas and level difference with the mining area is 9 meters and taking this into consideration the proposed quantity of 10,675 cum or 28,075 tons can be mined safely and scientifically. The QL No.907 stands in the name of Smt Vijayamma is of total area of 2 Acre out of which mining area is 1-09 Acres and level difference within the mining area is 11 meters and taking this into consideration the proposed quantity of 64,106 tons or 24,375 cum can be mined safely and scientifically. The QL No.905 stands in the name of Smt Vijayamma is of total area of 34 guntas out of which mining area is 23 guntas and level difference within the mining area is 2 meters and taking this into consideration the proposed quantity of 20,567 tons or 7,820 cum can be mined safely and scientifically.

As far as approach road is concerned the proponent has stated that there is a existing cart track road connecting lease area to all weather black topped road which is at a distance of 950 meters. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance.

The Authority during the meeting held on 6th November 2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority observed that the SEAC have pointed out that a cluster notification was issued for 7 leases and subsequently the cluster is modified with three leases. Reasons for such reduction and whether the total extent of 7 leases exceeds 5 Ha is not forthcoming. The Authority further noted that the status of the three leases in this cluster, is also not forthcoming in the proposal. The Authority therefore decided to consider the proposal after the receipt of the following information:

- 1. Details of 7 quarry leases that were included in Cluster Notification along with extent of lease area and due reasons for deleting four leases.
- 2. Present status of quarry leases included in this proposal along with latest audit report issued by the competent authority in the Department of Mines & Geology.
- 3. Legal status of Shri Murugesh, applicant to represent Dinnehosahalli Cluster Association along with copies of resolution and the authorization issued by Dinnehosahalli Cluster Association.

The Authority perused the reply submitted by the proponent vide letter dated 10.12.2019. The Authority noted that lease of one lease by name Ramakrishnappa is diseased and the other three lessees are not part of the cluster Association. The Authority further noted that the total extent of all the seven leases is 9-14 Acres and therefore do not exceed the threshold limit.

The Authority after discussion decided to issue Environmental Clearance for extraction of the building stone as per approved quarry plan, subject to submission of the following information:-

- 1) Distance of the proposed project site from the boundary of nearest National Park/ Sanctuary/Bio sphere reserve/ migratory corridor of wild life animal and if it is located within 10 Km of the said National Park/ Sanctuary/Bio sphere reserve/ migratory corridor of wild life animal then a map duly authenticated by the Chief Wildlife Warden showing the boundary from such National Park/ Sanctuary/Bio sphere reserve/ migratory corridor of wild life animal vis a vis the project location and the recommendation or comments of the Chief Wildlife Warden thereon.
- 2) An action plan with activities proposed under CER in accordance with O.M F. No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 1st May 2018 issued by MoEF&CC, Government of India, allocation of funds against each of the activities and the time frame within which such activities will be completed. The funds so earmarked shall be in accordance with para 6 (II) and the activities shall be in accordance with para 6 (V) of the said O.M.

179.3.4. Proposed Modification in manufacturing of Bulk Drugs & Intermediates Project at Plot No.23-B, KIADB Kolhar Industrial Area, Nizampur Hobli, Bidar Taluk, Bidar District by M/s. Chorus Labs Limited (SEIAA 16 IND (VIOL) 2018)

This is a project from M/s. Chorus Labs Limited seeking Environmental clearance for Modification in existing products and expansion of project with capacity by proposing new product mix of Bulk Drugs and intermediates on a total area of 14,038 Sqmt. 5 products are substituted in the existing 17 products.

The SEAC during the meeting held on 19.5.2018 appraised the proposal as per the Notification dated: 8-3-2018 issued by MoEF & CC and have decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of standard ToRs along with additional ToRs. The Authority during the meeting held on 1.6.2018 opined that it is a case of violation and therefore decided to issue ToR for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study with public consultation following the procedure laid down in the Notification No. S.O. 804 (E) dated 14th March 2017, Notification No S.O.1030 (E) dated 8th March 2018. Accordingly the ToR was issued vide letter dated 15-06-2018. The proponent have submitted the EIA report vide letter dated 16-9-2019.

The proposal was placed before the committee for appraisal during the meeting held on 26-9-2019. The proponent has stated that he will dispense with manufacturing of Ibuprofin with immediate effect. As per the records and analysis carried out, the

proponent has stated that no damages have been done for Air, Water and soil by operating his unit without valid EC. But, however with abundant responsibility he carried out retribution analysis according to which he has quantified retribution cost to Rs.16.89 lakhs. The committee after discussion and deliberation felt that Rs.20.00 lakhs towards the remediation charges can be levied on the proponent and based on this the committee decided to recommend the proposal for delisting the same from violation category and issue of EC.The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance.

The Authority during the meeting held on 06.11.2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC.

The Authority noted that during the Authority meeting held on 7th May 2016 the Authority had perused the details and opined that this industry is not only polluting the environment but also have violated the provisions of the E (P) Act. The Authority authorized the Member Secretary to examine each case on the basis of merit and gravity of the case. The Authority authorised the Member Secretary to issue direction under section 5 of EP act.

Accordingly, directions were issued to the proponent vide letter No. SEIAA 4 Misc 2016 dated 13.06.2016 to suspend all the production process and other related activity within industrial premises with immediate effect and to take measures required to contain the hazardous chemicals/wastes to prevent them from entering to environment.

Subsequently, the proponent vide letter dated 29.10.2018 requested to withdraw the directions issued under Section 5 of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986 and to permit them to undertake production activity.

The Authority during the meeting held on 15th November 2018 & 7th December 2018 perused the request made by the proponent. The Authority taking consideration of submission made by the project proponent as well as public interest, in-principle decided to withdraw the direction issued under section 5 of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the project authorities are allowed to manufacture products that were permitted prior to EIA Notification, 2006 with a condition that the KSPCB should ensure installation of required Environment protection facilities. Accordingly, the direction issued under Section 5 of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986 to suspend all the production process and other related activity within industrial premises was withdrawn vide order No. SEIAA 16 IND (VIOL) 2018, dated 26.12.2018.

The Authority further noted that as per the orders of Hon'ble NGT dated 10-07-2017, 23-08-2019 and 11-10-2019 in OA No.1038/2018, the Bidar industrial area has been identified as a Severely Polluted Industrial Area. The Authority also noted that the Central Pollution Control Board pursuant to the above mentioned orders of NGT and minutes of the meeting held under the chairmanship of the Joint Secretary, MoEF&CC on 3rd October 2019, have issued a mechanism with regard to consideration of the proposals to be established in critically/ severely polluted industrial areas. According to this mechanism at para B (ii), proposals located in CPA and SPAs are to be examined by Sectoral Expert Appraisal Committee. The Authority observed that however the said mechanisms do not reveal the operational guidelines with regard to ways and means of

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consideration of such proposals which are at different stages of appraisal especially with regard to the proposals that have been recommended by the concerned Expert Appraisal Committee and to be considered by the concerned regulatory Authority and which are at the stage of issue of Environmental Clearance.

The Authority after discussion, decided to address a letter to the Secretary, MoEF&CC, Government of India seeking the following clarification:

- 1. Keeping the provisions of "General Condition" under the EIA Notification, 2006 amended from time to time in mind whether the MoEF&CC endorses the procedure suggested in the mechanism communicated by CPCB vide letter No. CPCB/IPC-VII/CEPI/NGT/2019, dated 25.10.2019.
- 2. If so, whether all such proposals located within severely polluted industrial area that are at various stages of appraisal/issue of Environmental Clearance at the State Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC)/State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA), especially the projects/activities that have been recommended by the SEAC and are at under consideration of SEIAA or at the level of issuance of EC after approval by SEIAA are also to be forwarded to MoEF&CC for consideration by EAC as stipulated at para B(ii) of the mechanism circulated vide letter dated 25.10.2019 of the CPCB on as is where is basis.
- 3. Whether MoEF&CC intends to issue operational guidelines in this regard by imposing specific conditions and allow the projects/activities that have been recommended by SEAC and are being considered by SEIAA or at the stage of issuance of EC after the clearance by SEIAA.

The Authority also decided to consider this proposal after receipt of the clarification from the MoEF&CC.

The Authority noted that while clarification was being sought from the MOEF&CC the following orders/mechanism came to be issued.

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The SEAC during the meeting held on 19.5.2018 appraised the proposal as per the Notification dated: 8-3-2018 issued by MoEF & CC andhave decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of standard ToRs along with additional ToRs. The Authority during the meeting held on 1.6.2018 opined that it is a case of violation and therefore decided to issue ToR for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study with public consultation following the procedure laid down in the Notification No. S.O. 804 (E) dated 14th March 2017, Notification No S.O.1030 (E) dated 8th March 2018. Accordingly the ToR was issued vide letter dated 15-06-2018. The proponent have submitted the EIA report vide letter dated 11-9-2019.

The subject was placed before the Committee during the meeting held on 26-9-2019 for EIA presentation. The committee noted that as per the records and analysis carried out the proponent has stated that no damages have been done for Air, Water and soil by operating his unit without valid EC. But, however with abundant responsibility he carried out retribution analysis according to which he has quantified retribution cost to Rs.7,46,381/-. The committee also noticed that there is an averge 15% excess production over the permitted quantity and the value of this excess production comes to nearly 60.00 lakhs. For this the proponent has pleaded that the remediation cost should not be worked out on the value of excess production and also the unit was run under loss and also requested the committee to take into consideration the appreciation letter issued by the Forest Department for having carried out afforestation within the premises which they categorized it as a model to others. The committee after discussion and deliberation felt that Rs.25.00 lakhs towards the remediation charges can be levied on the proponent based on the above retribution analysis and also keeping in view the excess production made over and above the permitted quantity and hence the committee decided to recommend the proposal for delisting the same from violation category and issue of Environmental Clearance.

The Authority during the meeting held on 6th November 2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority observed that this proposal is located in Bidar industrial area which is identified as severely polluted and therefore the mechanism circulated vide CPCB letter dated 25.10.2019 would be applicable to this project also. The Authority therefore decided to consider this proposal after the receipt of the clarification sought from MoEF&CC as per the decision at Agenda point No. 177.4.1.

The Authority noted that while clarification was being sought from the MOEF&CC the following orders/mechanism came to be issued.

M/s. SN2 Asymmetrix Pvt. Ltd. have proposed for Expansion of Bulk Drugs & Intermediates Products Manufacturing Unit Project at Plot No.94 of KIADB Kolhar Industrial Area, Bidar Taluk & District Karnataka on a Plot area of 8093.71 Sqm. The Project cost is Rs. 4 Crores.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 2.6.2018. The Committee noted that M/s. SN2 Asymmetrix Pvt Ltd., is an existing industry and engaged in manufacture of bulk drugs and Active Pharmaceuticals Ingredients. The present proposal is for expansion. Since the industry was operating without E.C, it comes under violation category. The proponent has requested the committee to permit him to adopt the baseline studies made during Dec 2016 to Feb-2017 for the same project under the pretext that the baseline studies done for the same project holds good for three years for which the committee has accepted. The committee decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Standard ToRs and additional ToRs to conduct the EIA studies in accordance with the EIA Notification 2006 and relevant guidelines along with public hearing.

The Authority during the meeting held on 26.6.2018 decided to issue ToR as recommended by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in

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accordance with EIA Notification, 2006. Accordingly ToRs were issued vide letter dated 05-07-2018. The proponent has submitted the EIA report on 18-10-2019.

The proponent and Environment consultant attended the SEAC meeting held on 31-10-2019 to provide clarification/additional information. The SEAC noted that this proposal is for both Remediation on account of violation and also for expansion. Committee after discussion and deliberation decided that the project has to be got delisted under violation category before taking up their proposal for expansion. For which the proponent has agreed for the restriction of appraisal for the violation part and comeback after that for expansion. The proponent has also requested to permit him to utilize the data collected from Oct 2018 to Dec 2018 for which the committee agreed to permit him to utilize the data. The EMP should consists of suitable equipments to achieve ZLD.

The Committee also noted that as far as the remediation aspect is concerned the proponent has reiterated that no damage has been done due to his activity and he has also stated that he has earned about Rs 50lakhs from 2008 to 2016 and based on this he agreed to spare 15% of this cost i.e 7.5 Lakhs towards remediation measures. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance.

The Authority during the meeting held on 22nd November 2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to defer the subject for want of clarity on the issue pertaining to consideration of activities /projects in the severely and critically polluted areas in view of the discussions held under the Agenda Point No. 178.4.1.

Sri Indu Drugs India Pvt Ltd. have proposed for Bulk drug and Intermediates manufacturing unit at Plot No.78-B, Kolhar Industrial Area, Bidar, Karnataka on a Plot area of 7650 Sqmt. The Project cost is Rs. 3.5 Crores.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on held on 26-4-2019. The committee noted that, this industry has been established in 2010 and being run on the basis of CFE and CFO issued by KSPCB which were valid upto 2017. Since 2017 the unit is not operating till today. Earlier the EC was not obtained because the activity was of inorganic nature and it was not mandated to have EC. Now this application has been made out to add some organic products in addition to inorganic products for which the EC is mandatory. Hence, the committee decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Standard ToRs along with additional ToRs to conduct the EIA studies in accordance with the EIA Notification 2006 and relevant guidelines.

The Authority during the meeting held on 18.05.2019 decided to issue ToR as recommended by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006. Accordingly the ToR was issued vide letter dated 2,7,2019. The proponent have submitted the EIA report on 31-8-2019.

The proponent and Environment consultant attended the SEAC meeting held on 18-10-2019 to present the EIA report. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Environmental clearance.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority perused the following orders.

179.4.1. Proposed Hotel project at Sy. Nos 49, 50/1, 50/2, 50/3, 50/4B, 50/5, 50/6, 51/1, 51/2A, 51/2B, 51/3 & 51/6 Shivanahalli Village, Yelahanka Hobli, Bangalore North Tq,Bangalore By M/s Taj GVK Hotels and Resorts Ltd(SEIAA 119 CON 2019)

M/s Taj GVK Hotels and Resorts Ltd have proposed for construction of Hotel Project on a plot area of _ Sqm. The total built up area is 30,564.86 Sqm. The proposed project consists of of Basement, Ground and Fourteen Upper Floors with 253rooms. Total parking space proposed is for 384 No's of Cars. Total water consumption is 309 KLD (Fresh water + Recycled water). The total wastewater discharge is 279 KLD. It is proposed to construct Sewage Treatment Plant with a capacity of 300 KLD. The project cost is Rs. 140 Crores.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 12-9-2019. The committee noted as per the village survey map there is a lake on the western side of the project site for which the proponent has stated that he has left 30 meter buffer zone as mandated and in the village survey map there are nala originating from the tank bund for which the proponent has stated that this is irrigation nala network and entire area has been acquired by KIADB and allotted to the proponent through single window agency(KUM) and in which there is no mention of any kharab land. The proponent has stated that he has built two bridges for the entry and exit separately taking permission from the competent authorities and also he has stated that he has taken up the development of the tank by entering into an MOU with the lake development authority and in order to give uninterrupted access to the tank bund for general public he has agreed to shift the entrance and exit gate from the side of the road to the boundary of the site. The committee after discussion decided to reconsider after submission of the following information.

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1) The proponent has to give hindrance free access for the general public to the tank bund area and the details in this regard to be worked out and submitted with details.

The SEAC during the meeting held on 14th November 2019 perused the replies submitted by the proponent on 16-10-2019 and decided to recommend for issue of EC subject to condition that he will form all weather access road to the neibhouring land owner and public who have right of way on the tank bund.

The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Environmental Clearance with the following conditions:

- 1. The proponent to conduct energy audit by an accredited agency before operation of the project in accordance with the Bureau of Energy Efficiency.
- 2. 15% of the parking space shall be reserved for electric vehicles with recharging facility.
- 3. Only registered labours should be employed.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC.

The Authority after discussion decided to clear the proposal for issue of Environmental Clearance subject to submission of the following information:

- 1) Action taken in accordance with the suggestion given by SEAC with regard to the provision for access road and location of enrty/ exit gates duly marking on the layout plan.
- 2) Details of water bodies in and around the project site along with the buffer maintained in accordance with law duly marking on the project site.
- 3) Details of kharab land and plan for protection/conservation.
- 4) Land use of the project site as per the CDP
- 5) Source of water both in the construction and operation phase
- 6) Specific source of treated water for the construction with an undertaking/MoU with the prospective supplier of such treated water and with water quality analysis report to establish that such treated water is fit for construction purpose.
- 7) An action plan with activities proposed under CER in accordance with O.M F. No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 1st May 2018 issued by MoEF&CC, Government of India, allocation of funds against each of the activities and the time frame within which such activities will be completed. The funds so earmarked shall be in accordance with para 6 (II) and the activities shall be in accordance with para 6 (V) of the said O.M.
- 179.4.2. Smt. Sahana have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Murram on 3.60 Ha, Government Revenue Land at Sy.No.368/A of Halakundi Village, Ballari Taluk & District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 12th November 2019. The Committee noted that this is a proposal for Murram mining and as per the statement of the proponent that he intends to supply the same to ongoing road works but MOU from the end users is not forthcoming for which the proponent has stated that he will come back with all the details.

The proponent and consultant have reappeared before the committee on 14.11.2019 and they have submitted a letter from PWD contractor indicating his readiness to utilize the material generated from this lease area for the public works he has undertaken in the surrounding areas. The committee noted that this is a fresh lease involving Murram quarrying in Govt land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Dept. The lease has been notified on 22-03-2018.

The Committee further noted from the quarry plan there is a level difference of 25meters within the mining area and taking this into consideration the committee opined that 75% of the proposed proved quantity of 1267740tons or 792337cum can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 6meters for a lease period . Sri Anand have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Shahabad Stone (Cherty Lime Stone) on 0.4047 Ha, Patta Land at Sy.No.32/6 of Honagunta Village, Chittapur Taluk, Kalburgi District.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 12th November 2019. The Committee noted that this is a fresh lease involving Shahbad stone mining in Patta land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Dept. and land conversion order. The lease has been notified on 18-7-2019. The Committee noted from the quarry plan that there is no level difference within the mining area and taking this into consideration the committee opined that 65% of the proposed proved gross quantity of 26300cum can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 10meters for a lease period. As seen from the topo sheet the level difference between the lease area and dry weather flow of the Kagina river is 265meter from the lease area the quarry pit depth restricted to 10meter i.e above dry weather flow level of Kagina river

Sri Shrikanth G. Sulibhavi have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Ordinary Sand on 2.539 Ha, Patta Land at Sy.No.56(P) & 57(P) of Neeralgi Village, Badami Taluk, Bagalkote District.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 12th November 2019. The Committee noted that this is a fresh sand quarry lease in patta land. The proponent has

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stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Departments and land conversion order and the proposal has got vetted in District task force. Also he has stated that the quarry plan has also been got approved from the DMG. The average top level of the sand block is 538 meters and dry weather flow (bed level) of the malaprabha river is 526 meters which is at a distance of 850meters. The depth of mining is 6.0 meters including 0.5meter of top soil and the proponent has stated that he will take up mining subdividing the mining block into three sub blocks and taking up mining in each block every year. The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 13th November 2019. The Committee noted that the lands involved in this project are in others name and not in the name of the proponent for which the proponent has stated that he has obtained CFQ from the concerned owners of the land. The committee also noted that this is a fresh sand quarry lease in patta land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Departments and as far as land conversion is concerned proponent has stated that he has applied for land conversion and the process is under progress. The proposal has got vetted in District task force. Also he has stated that the quarry plan has also been got approved from the DMG.

Sri K.S. Venkateshappa have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Building Stone (M-Sand) on 1.861Ha, Government Gomala Land at Sy.No.47 of Bettahalli Village, Malur Taluk, Kolar District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 13th November 2019. The Committee noted that this is a proposal for old lease involving building stone mining in Govt. Land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Dept. The lease has been granted earlier on 06-11-2006 for a period of 5 Years i.e up to 2011. The proponent has stated that the lease period will automatically gets extended for 20 years i.e up to 2031 as per the amendment to KMMCR Rules.

The proponent has stated that he has carried out mining up to 2008-09 to 2010-11 and the same has been reflected in the audit report prepared by DMG. As seen from the quarry plan there is a level difference of 22meters within the mining area and taking this into consideration and also the fact that he has mined 4000tons the committee opined that the proposed proved quantity of 361505cum or 939913tons can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 20meters for a lease period.

As per the extended combined sketch prepared by DMG there are seven leases including this lease within 500 meter radius from this lease and all these leases were

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granted prior to 9.9.2013 and based on this proponent has requested to exempt these leases from cluster effect. The total area of this lease being less than the threshold limit of 5 Ha. committee decided to categorise this project under B2 and proceeded with the appraisal accordingly. He has also stated that his project does not fall within the 10 KM radius from the boundary of any Wildlife sanctuary/National Park. As far as approach road is concerned, the proponent has stated that, there is a existing cart track road to a length of 220meter connecting lease area to all weather black topped road.

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Sri R.S. Nagaraju have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Building Stone on 0-30 acres, Govt. Revenue Land at Sy.No.146 of Arepura Village, Gundlupet Taluk, Chamarajanagara District.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 13th November 2019. The Committee noted that this is a fresh lease involving building stone mining in Govt land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Dept., and the project has been got vetted by District task force. The lease has been notified on 20-12-2011. Further it is noticed that the lease area is about 1.687KM from the declared ESZ of Bandipura Tiger reserve the same as been certified by Wildlife Authorities.

As seen from the quarry plan there is a level difference of 2meters within the mining area and taking this into consideration the committee opined that 60% of the proposed proved quantity of 59366tons or 22833cum can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 6meters for a lease period. M/s. Amrutheshwara Enterprises have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Ordinary Sand on 2.326 Ha, Patta Land at Sy.Nos.110/1, 110/2 & 110/6 of Balutagi Village, Kushtagi Taluk, Koppal District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 13th November 2019. The Committee noted that the lands involved in this project are in others name and not in the name of the proponent for which the proponent has stated that he has obtained CFQ from the concerned owners of the land. The committee further noted that this is a fresh sand quarry lease in patta land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Departments and as far as land conversion is concerned proponent has stated that he has applied for land conversion and the process is under progress. The proposal has got vetted in District task force. Also he has stated that the quarry plan has also been got approved from the DMG.

The average top level of the sand block is 588 meters and dry weather flow (bed level) of the nearby Hirenadhi nala is 577 meters which is at a distance of 110meters. The depth of mining is 7.0 meters including 1meter of top soil and the proponent has stated that he will take up mining subdividing the mining block into five sub blocks and taking up mining in each block every year. Taking this into consideration the proposed quantity of 112588cum or 191400tons for lease period can be mined safely and scientifically.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 13th November 2019. The Committee noted that the lands involved in this project are in others name and not in the name of the proponent for which the proponent has stated that he has obtained CFQ from the concerned owners of the land. The committee noted that this is a fresh sand quarry lease in Patta land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Departments and land conversion order and the proposal has got vetted in District task force. Also he has stated that the quarry plan has also been got approved from the DMG.

The average top level of the sand block is 506 meters and dry weather flow (bed level) of the Chinnahagari river is 493 meters which is at a distance of 100meters. The depth of mining is 6.5 meters including 0.5meter of top soil and the proponent has stated that he will take up mining subdividing the mining block into five sub blocks and taking up mining in each block every year. The proponent and consultant attended the meeting held on 14.11.2019 and submitted the audit report certified by DMG wherein it is certified that the proponent has mined during 2010-11 to 2014-15 and further no mining activity has been carried out since till date. The committee also noted that this is a proposal for old lease involving building stone mining in Govt. Land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Dept.,. The lease has been granted earlier on 23.06.2010 for a period of 5 Years i.e up to 2015. The proponent has stated that the lease period will automatically gets extended for 20 years i.e up to 2030 as per the amendment MMRD ACT 2015.

As seen from the quarry plan there is a level difference of 16 meters within the mining area and taking this into consideration and also the fact that he has mined 2777tons the committee opined that the proposed proved quantity of 65773tons or 25297cum can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 6 meters for a lease period. As per the extended combined sketch prepared by DMG there are two leases including this lease within 500 meter radius from this lease and . The total area of these 2 leases is 2 Acres and is being less than the threshold limit of 5 Ha. committee decided to categorise this project under B2 and proceeded with the appraisal accordingly. The proponent has also stated that the project does not fall within the 10 KM radius from National park/Wildlife sanctuary.

As far as approach road is concerned, the proponent has stated that, there is a existing cart track road to a length of 930 mts connecting lease area to all weather black topped road. As per as CER is concerned the proponent has stated that he will earmark Rs 1.50 lakhs for rejuvenation of Bagali water pond at a distance of 2.5km from the lease area. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance with the following conditions:

Sri. H. Karibasappa have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Building Stone on 0.4047 Ha, Government Revenue Land at part of Sy.No.223/13(P), Bagali Village, Harapanahalli Taluk, Davangere Dist

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 10-7-2019. The committee noted that, this is a existing lease which was granted during the year 2010. The proponent has stated that he has carried out mining from 2010-2015 and discontinued mining from 2015 till this date. But the audit reports produced by the proponent for the year 2015-16 and 2016-17 do not bear any official signature for which the proponent has stated that he will come back after getting it certified by the DMG. In the absence of above, the committee opined that in the absence of audit reports it cannot be ascertained weather this proposal is in accordance with NGT order dated: 13-1-2015. Hence the committee after discussion decided to defer the proposal.

The proponent and consultant attended the meeting held on 14.11.2019 and submitted the audit report certified by DMG wherein it is certified that the proponent has mined during 2011-12 to 2014-15 and further no mining activity has been carried out since till date. The committee noted that this is a proposal for old lease involving building stone mining in Govt. Land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Dept.,. The lease has been granted earlier on 23.06.2010 for a period of 5 Years i.e up to 2015. The proponent has stated that the lease period will automatically gets extended for 20 years i.e up to 2030 as per the amendment MMRD ACT 2015.

As seen from the quarry plan there is a level difference of 14 meters within the mining area and taking this into consideration and also the fact that he has mined 1035tons the committee opined that the proposed proved quantity of 72652 tons or 29078 cum can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 8meters for a lease period. As per the extended combined sketch prepared by DMG there are two leases including this lease within 500 meter radius from this lease and . The total area of these 2 leases is 2 Acres and is being less than the threshold limit of 5 Ha. Committee

decided to categorise this project under B2 and proceeded with the appraisal accordingly. The proponent has also stated that the project does not fall within the 10 KM radius from National park/Wildlife sanctuary.

As far as approach road is concerned, the proponent has stated that, there is a existing cart track road to a length of 850 meters connecting lease area to all weather black topped road. As per as CER is concerned, the proponent has stated that he will earmark Rs 1.50 lakhs for rejuvenation of Bagali water pond at a distance of 2.7km rom the lease area. The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 14th November 2019. The Committee noted that this a fresh proposal involving ornamental stone mining in Patta land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest and Revenue Departments and Land conversion order. The lease has been Notified on 22.02.2019. As seen from the quarry plan there is a level difference of 1 meters and taking this into consideration the proposed gross quantity of 138632 cum can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 24 meters within the lease period. The proponent has stated that the recovery is 35% in the form of commercial blocks i.e., 48521cum and 65% waste, i.e., 90110cum which will be converted to building stone and same has been reflected in approved mining plan.

As per the combined sketch prepared by DMG there are 11 leases including this lease within the 500 meter radius from this lease. And out of 11 leases 7 leases were granted prior to 9.9.2013 and based on this the proponent claimed exemption for these 7 leases from cluster effect. The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 14th November 2019. The Committee noted that this is a fresh lease involving building stone mining in Govt. land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Dept., and the proposal got vetted by district task force. The lease has been notified on 18-9-2019. As seen from the quarry plan there is a level difference of 33 meters within the mining area and taking this into consideration the committee opined that the proposed proved quantity of 428775 tons or 164913 cum can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 15 meters for a lease period.

As per the combined sketch prepared by DMG there are 6 leases including this lease within the 500 meter radius from this lease. And out of 6 leases 2 leases for which EC granted prior to 15.01.2016 and based on this the proponent claimed exemption for these 2 leases from cluster effect. The total area of remaining 4 leases including this lease is 9Acres 20Guntas and is being less than the threshold limit of 5 Ha. committee decided to categorise this project under B2 and proceeded with the appraisal accordingly. The proponent has also stated that the project does not fall within the 10 KM radius from National park/Wildlife sanctuary. As far as approach road is concerned, the proponent has stated that, there is a existing cart track road to a length of 1.4KM connecting lease area to all weather black topped road. As far as CER is concerned the proponent has stated, that he will earmark Rs.12.5 lakhs to take up rejuvenation of Burranpur kere which is at a distance of 1.60 KM. from the lease area. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance with the following conditions:

Sri Syed Akbar Pasha have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Building Stone on 1.01 Ha, Government Revenue Land at Sy.No.169(P) of Madlapur Village, Manvi Taluk, Raichur District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 14th November 2019. The Committee noted that this is a fresh lease involving building stone mining in patta land. The proponent has stated that he has obtained NOCs from Forest, Revenue Dept., and also obtained land conversion order and the proposal got vetted by district task force. The lease has been notified on 18-09-2019. As seen from the quarry plan there is a level difference of 51 meters within the mining area and taking this into consideration the committee opined that the proposed proved quantity of 333158 tons or 128137 cum can be mined safely and scientifically to a quarry pit depth of 15 meters for a lease period.

As per the combined sketch prepared by DMG there are 6 leases including this lease within the 500 meter radius from this lease. And out of 6 leases 2 leases for which EC granted prior to 15.01.2016 and based on this the proponent claimed exemption for these 2 leases from cluster effect. The total area of remaining 4 leases including this lease is 9Acres 20Guntas and is being less than the threshold limit of 5 Ha. Committee decided to categorise this project under B2 and proceeded with the appraisal accordingly. The proponent has also stated that the project does not fall within the 10 KM radius from National park/Wildlife sanctuary. As far as approach road is concerned, the proponent has stated that, there is a existing cart track road to a length of 1.45KM connecting lease area to all weather black topped road. As far as CER is concerned the proponent has stated, that he will earmark Rs.9.00 lakhs to take up

rejuvenation of Manvi kere which is at a distance of 2.0 KM. from the lease area. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance with the following conditions:

- 1) Safe drinking water has to be provided at the quarry site.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC.

M/s. Horizon Mining have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Koluru Natural Sand on 3.358 Ha, Patta Land at Sy.No.99 of Koluru Village, Devadurga Taluk, Raichur District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 13th November 2019. The Committee noted that as per the combined sketch prepared by DMG there are three leases including this lease within the 500 meter radius from this lease. The total area of these three leases is more than the threshold limit of 5 Ha. committee decided to categorise this project under B1. During the appraisal the proponent has stated that he has started collecting data from Oct 2019 and requested the committee to utilize the

same for preparation of EIA report and also he has requested that there are two leases adjacent to each other and requested to permit him to utilize the data collected in case of one lease to other lease also committee after discussion and deliberation decided to permit him to adopt above data. The committee decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Standard ToRs and following additional ToRs to conduct the EIA studies in accordance with the EIA Notification 2006 and relevant guidelines along with public hearing.

- 1) Handling of overburden earth may be detailed and submitted.
- 2) Details of protection to quarry pit may be worked out and submitted.
- 3) Land use and land cover analysis using high resolution satellite data may be worked out and submitted.
- 4) Details of stockyard and approach road may be worked out and submitted.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to issue standard ToR along with additional ToR as recommended by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006.

179.5.2. Proposed Koluru Natural Sand Quary Project at Sy.Nos.100/2 & 100/3 of Koluru Village, Devadurga Taluk, Raichur District (9-17 Acres) by M/s. Horizon Mining (SEIAA 676 MIN 2019)

M/s. Horizon Mining have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Koluru Natural Sand on 3.814 Ha, Patta Land at Sy.Nos.100/2 & 100/3 of Koluru Village, Devadurga Taluk, Raichur District.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 12th November 2019. The Committee noted that as per the combined sketch prepared by DMG there are three leases including this lease within the 500 meter radius from this lease. The total area of these three leases is more than the threshold limit of 5 Ha. committee decided to categorise this project under B1. During the appraisal the proponent has stated that he has started collecting data from Oct 2019 and requested the committee to permit him to utilize the same for preparation of EIA report and also he has requested that there are two leases adjacent to each other and requested to permit him to utilize the data collected in case of one lease to other lease also committee after discussion and deliberation decided to permit him to adopt above data. The committee decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Standard ToRs and following additional ToRs to conduct the EIA studies in accordance with the EIA Notification 2006 and relevant guidelines along with public hearing.

- 1) Handling of overburden earth may be detailed and submitted.
- 2) Details of protection to quarry pit may be worked out and submitted.
- 3) Land use and land cover analysis using high resolution satellite data may be worked out and submitted.
- 4) Details of stockyard and approach road may be worked out and submitted.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to issue standard ToR along with additional ToR as recommended by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006.

179.5.3. Proposed "Appalapura Quartz Mine" over an extent of 0.64 Hectares at Sy.No.84, Appalapura Village, Sandur taluk, Bellary District by Sri. R. Balaramudu(SEIAA 374 MIN 2019)

Sri. R. Balaramudu have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Appalapura Quartz Mine on 0.64Ha, Government Revenue Land at Sy.No.84, Appalapura Village, Sandur taluk, Bellary District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 23rd July 2019. The Committee noted that this is a proposal involving mining of quartz in the Government land. As per the records the proponent has carried out the mining based on the CFO issued during the year 2013 and which is valid upto 2018 without obtaining EC as mandated in the NGT order dated:13-1-2015. In view of the above the committee felt this is a violation and also since the window period has also been expired, committee decided to recommend the proposal of closure and delist from pendency.

The Authority in the meeting held on 27.08.2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to close the file and delist from the pendency.

The proponent vide letter submitted on 19.9.2019 have requested the Authority to consider this proposal in accordance with the O.M. dated 9.9.2019 issued by the MoEF&CC with regard to violation cases. The proponent claims that they had application before DEIAA, Ballari prior to the window provided for consideration of violation cases and subsequently submitted the application before SEIAA .

The Authority during the meeting held on 19.10.2019, noted that the project proponent had submitted an application before the DEIAA, Ballari on 7.12.2016 which was subsequently transferred to this Authority vide letter No. //09/2016-17 dated: 04.02.2019. However, the said proposal was considered by this Authority through the application made by the proponent in Form-1 on 30.04.2019 and the same was appraised in File No. SEIAA 374 MIN 2019.

In view of the above observation the Authority opined that this proposal was received prior to the window period provided for consideration of proposal involving violation and therefore deserves to be considered under the provision of O.M. bearing F. No. 22-10/2019-1A.III, dated 9th September 2019. The Authority therefore decided to re-open the file after payment of the Processing Fee and forward the proposal to SEAC to re-consider under the provisions of Ministry's Notifications dated 14.03.2017 & 08.03.2018 and in terms of above mentioned O.M. dated 9th September 2019.

The Proponent and Environment Consultant attended the SEAC meeting held on 14-11-2019 to provide clarification/additional information. The Committee took note of the extract of the proceedings of SEIAA meeting held on 19.10.2019. The

committee after discussion decided to forward the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Standard ToRs to conduct the EIA studies as per the EIA notification 2006.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to issue standard ToR as recommended by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006.

179.5.4. Lokapur Limestone & Dolomite Mine over an extent of 4.86 Ha at Sy.No.94 of Lokapur Village, Mudhol Taluk, Bagalkot District (4.86 Ha) by Sri. Nagappa Rudrappa Sidnal (SEIAA 75 MIN 2018)

Sri. Nagappa Rudrappa Sidnal have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Limestone & Dolomite on 4.86 Ha, Patta land at Sy.No.94 of Lokapur Village, Mudhol Taluk, Bagalkot District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 19th January 2019. The Committee noted that the mining lease was issued during the year 2011 after obtaining EC from the Secretary to Govt., Forest Ecology and Environment Dept., The lease period as per MMDR Amendment Act 2015 is valid upto 5-6-2061. The mining quantity permitted was 25,000 TPA(20,000 TPA for Limestone and 5,000 TPA for Dolomite) The validity of the EC issued is co-terminus with mine lease. The proponent has stated that he is continuing with mining not exceeding the permitted quantity till this date.

As regards to the NGT order dated:13-1-2015 which mandates that all the mining leases should have EC clearance for which the proponent has stated this order pertains to minor minerals and not for the mining leases which are being operated based on the state EC. As regard to MoEF Notification dated: 15-1-2016 the proponent stated that this notification is mainly for the constitution of DEIAA for the purpose of issuing EC for minor minerals with lease area of less than 5 Ha and the proponent has also reiterated that he has not violated on this count also because this notification deals with the lease areas which were not covered under any type of EC. Further as regards the MoEF Notification dated:6-4-2018 which limits the validity of EC issued under MoEF Notification of 1994 to five years, the proponent has again reiterated that he has not committed any violation on this count also because this Notification is silent about the state EC issued earlier.

In the meantime the proponent has stated that he has made out an application for the enhanced quantity from 25,000 TPA to 1,00,000 TPA in the year 2016 but this proposal was closed due to lack of response from the proponent to give required vital information to proceed with the appraisal to issue ToRs. Now the proponent has made out this new application dated:7-12-2018 for the enhanced quantity of only limestone from 20,000 TPA to 1,00,000 TPA and not proposed to mine any Dolomite and he has not made out the application within the window period given till the end of Oct-2018 and this amounts to violation. Hence the committee decided to seek clarification from the authority.

The Authority during the meeting held on 25.01.2019 perused the proposal and took note of the request made by SEAC seeking clarification on whether or not the

project in question constitute violation of EIA Notification or not. The Authority observed that the lease in question is in existence since 2011 and continuing operation without Environmental Clearance either under EIA Notification 1994 or under EIA Notification 2006. Further the Authority noted that the proponent also not submitted application in accordance with the orders of Hon'ble NGT 13-01-2015 or window provided by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change from 6th April 2018 to 5th October 2018. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Common Cause vs Government of India and Goa Foundation vs Government of India held that undertaking mining activity without prior Environmental Clearance as mandated in the EIA Notification 2006 is unlawful. In view of the above this project proposal constitute violation of EIA Notification 2006.

The Authority after discussion decided to inform the SEAC accordingly.

The subject was placed before the SEAC meeting held on 10-4-2019. The committee has taken note of the advice given by the SEIAA stating that this being a continuously operating mines and for having failed to apply for EC to come under the ambit of 2006 EIA Notification within the window period mandated amounts to violation. The committee after discussion and deliberations opined that there is no remediation available for this violation because of the application not being made out within the window period. Hence decided to recommend the proposal for rejection.

The Authority during the meeting held on 04.05.2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. Further, the Authority noted that the proponent was supposed to make an application in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006 in terms of the orders of the Hon'ble NGT dated 13.01.2015 and obtained prior Environmental Clearance to proceed with the mining activities. Whereas the proponent have continued mining operations without the Environmental Clearance required under EIA Notification, 2006 in violation of the orders of the Hon'ble NGT. The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change issued Notification No.S.O.804(E) dated:14.03.2017 and S.O.1030(E), Dated:08.03.2018 providing opportunity of six months time for filing of application seeking Environmental Clearance under EIA Notification, 2006 for cases involving violation. The proponent have failed to make application to the competent authority during this period also. Further, the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Madras provided an additional time limit of 30 days from 14.03.2018 while passing an order in W.M.P Nos.3361 & 3362 of 2018 and W.M.P No.3721 of 2018. The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change issued an O.M. bearing F.No.Z-11013/22/2017-IA.II(M), Dated:16.03.2018 as per the above mentioned order of Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Madras. The proponent have failed to file application during this period also. However, the project proponent have submitted online application on 7.12.2018 and submitted the hard copy of the application to this Authority on 11.12.2018.

Since, the window period provided as per the Notification issued by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India and the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Madras is over hence this application cannot be accepted for appraisal and issue of Environmental Clearance under EIA Notification

2006 and therefore the Authority decided to reject the application. The Authority also decided to close the file and delist from the pendency.

The project proponent have submitted a letter on 11.10.2019 and have requested for consideration of the proposal under the provision of O.M dated 9th September 2019 issued by MoEF&CC. The project proponent claims that he has submitted application for Environmental Clearance I in the year 2016 i.e., prior to the window period provided for consideration of violation cases which was closed and then subsequently the proponent submitted the application in 2018 which is now decided to reject the application for the reasons of violation.

The Authority during the meeting held on 19.10.2019, noted that the project proponent had submitted an application before this authority on 28.04.2016 which was considered in File No. SEIAA 164 MIN 2016. The said file was closed for non-submission of the required information. The proponent subsequently submitted another application on 11.12.2018 which is dealt in File No. SEIAA 75 MIN 2018. The State Expert Appraisal Committee considered this proposal on 10.4.2019 and have recommended for rejection of the application on the grounds of violation.

In view of the above observation the Authority opined that this proposal was received prior to the window period provided for consideration of proposal involving violation and therefore deserves to be considered under the provisions of O.M. bearing F. No. 22-10/2019-1A.III, dated 9th September 2019. The Authority therefore decided to re-open the file after payment of the Processing Fee and forward the proposal to SEAC to re-consider under the provisions of Ministry's Notifications dated 14.03.2017 & 08.03.2018 and in terms of above mentioned O.M. dated 9th September 2019.

The Proponent and Environment Consultant attended SEAC meeting held on 14-11-2019 to provide clarification/additional information. Committee took note of the extract of the proceedings of 176th SEIAA meeting held on 19.10.2019. The committee after discussion decided to forward the proposal to SEIAA for issue of Standard ToRs and following additional ToRs category to conduct the EIA studies as per the EIA notification 2006.

1) During appraisal for issue of ToR it has come to the notice of the committee that the original applicant has deceased. In view of the above all the legal entanglements that may arise in the absence of the original applicant has to be sorted out and details to be submitted."

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to issue standard ToR along with additional ToR as recommended by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006.

179.3. Recommended for Closure:

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179.6.1. Proposed Building Stone (Basalt) Quarry Project at Sy.No.19/4 of Mustapur Village, Humnabad Taluk&Bidar District (1-00 Acre) By Sri Mohammed Rasool Sab (SEIAA 131 MIN 2019)

Sri Mohammed Rasool Sab have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Building Stone (Basalt) on 0.407 Ha, Patta Land at Sy.No.19/4 of Mustapur Village, Humnabad Taluk&Bidar District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 24-4-2019. The committee noted from the records 2 Acres of land out of total 3 Acres 13 guntas in Sy.No.19/4 has been converted from agriculture purpose to non agriculture purpose whereas the forest department NOC says that the NOC is for 3 Acres 13 guntas and NOC issued by Thasildar states that the NOC is for one acre only for which the proponent stated that he will come back with the proper documents. Hence the committee after discussion decided to defer the subject.

The Proponent and Environment Consultant once again invited for SEAC meeting held on 14-11-2019 to provide clarification/additional information. The proponent and consultant remained absent. The committee after discussion and deliberation opined that the appraisal process can not be taken forward in the absence of the vital information and hence decided to recommend for closure.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC.

The Authority after discussion decided to close the file and delist from the pendency.

179.6.2. Proposed "Building Stone Quarry" over an extent of 0-30 Acres under (Govt Gomala Land) in part of Sy.No.99, Akkanahalli village, Channarayapatna Taluk, Hassan District by Sri. Muniyappa Bhovi(SEIAA 342 MIN 2019)

Sri. Muniyappa Bhovi have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Building Stone on 0.303Ha, Government Gomala Land in part of Sy.No.99, Akkanahalli village, Channarayapatna Taluk, Hassan District.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held **on** 10-7-2019. The committee noted that this is a existing lease which was granted during the year 2005. The proponent has stated that he has carried out mining from 2005-2010 and discontinued mining from 2010 till this date. But the audit report prepared by the DMG has not been submitted to substantiate his claims that no mining activity has been carried out beyond 2010, for which the proponent has stated that he will come back after getting the same. In the absence of above the committee could not proceed with the appraisal because it cannot be ascertained weather this proposal is according to NGT order Dated: 13-1-2015.

The Proponent and Environment Consultant attended SEAC meeting held on 14-11-2019 to provide clarification/additional information. The proponent has submitted the details of mining from 2005 to 2010 and it is silent about the activities from 2010 to

till date. In the absence of the above details it is not possible to ascertain whether the proponent has violated any environment and MoEF Notifications. Hence the committee decided to recommend the proposal for closure.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC.

The Authority after discussion decided to close the file and delist from the pendency.

179.6.3. Proposed Building Stone (Basalt) Quarry Project at Sy.No.34/*/2 of Narayanapur Village, AuradTaluk, Bidar District (3-00 Acres)By M/s. Mahalaxmi Stone Crusher(SEIAA 161 MIN 2019)

M/s. Mahalaxmi Stone Crusher have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Building Stone (Basalt) on 1.2141 Ha, Patta Land at Sy.No.34/*/2 of Narayanapur Village, AuradTaluk, Bidar District.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on **14th November 2019**. The Committee has recommended to SEIAA for issue of EC and the extract of the proceedings of the Committee meeting is as below:

The proposal was placed before the committee for appraisal during the meeting held on 26-4-2019. The proponent remained absent without intimation. The Committee after discussion decided to provide one more opportunity to proponent with intimation that the proposal will be appraised based on merit, in case he remains absent again and deferred the subject.

The Proponent and Environment Consultant onece again invited for the 234th meeting held on 14-11-2019 to provide clarification/additional information. The proponent and consultant remained absent for the second time without intinmation. As per the records it is noticed that the NOC from the forest Dept. is not forthcoming. The committee after due deliberation and discussion opined that the appraisal process cannot be taken further and hence decided to recommend the proposal for closure.

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SFAC.

The Authority after discussion decided to close the file and delist from the pendency.

179.6.4. Proposed Building Stone Quarry Project at Sy.No.199 of Devarayasamudra Village, Mulabagal Taluk, Kolar District (11-0 Acres) By Sri T. Kumar (SEIAA 176 MIN 2019)

Sri T. Kumar have applied for Environmental clearance from SEIAA for quarrying of Building Stone on 11-0 Acres, Government Land at Sy.No.199 of Devarayasamudra Village, Mulabagal Taluk, Kolar District

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 13-6-2019. The proponent remained absent without intimation. The Committee after discussion decided to provide one more opportunity to proponent with intimation that the

proposal will be appraised based on merit, in case he remains absent again and deferred the subject.

The Proponent and Environment Consultant once again invited for SEAC meeting held on 14-11-2019 to provide clarification/additional information. The proponent and consultant remained absent for the second time without inntimation . As per the records it is noticed the absence of cluster sketch and also no mention of the activities since 2008 till date is not forthcoming. The committee after due deliberation and discussion opined that the appraisal process cannot be taken further and hence decided to recommend the proposal for closure. "

The Authority perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SFAC.

The Authority after discussion decided to close the file and delist from the pendency.

179.4. Miscellaneous:

179.7.1. Request for issue of Corrigendum to the EC issued for Proposed Residential & Commercial Building at Sy.No.119/1, 119/2D, 119/3D, 119/4B, 119/5B, 119/6B, 120/1, 120/2, 120/3B, 120/4B, 120/5B, 120/6B, 123/1, 123/2, 123/3, 125/5 and 126 of Pantharapalya Village, Kengeri Hobli, Bangalore South Taluk, Bangalore Urban District of M/s. Salarpuria Properties Pvt. Ltd. (SEIAA 21 CON 2015)

The project proponent had obtained Environmental Clearance vide letter No. SEIAA 21 CON 2015 dated 2.8.2016 for construction of Residential Apartment of 848 units, club house & Commercial Building in 4 Blocks on a total Plot area of 44009.22 Sq.mts and with total Built up area of 1,78,200 Sq.mts..

The proponent vide letter dated 15.10.2019 have requested for issue of corrigendum on the EC issued increasing the built up area from earlier 1,78,200 Sqm to 1,83,656.17 Sqm (increased by 5456.17 Sqm) considering parking area of ground floor of residential unit. The number of apartment has to be reduced to 824 units from the earlier 848 units. The proponent also submitted the approved plan and comparative statement.

The Authority perused the request made by the proponent. The Authority after discussion decided to issue corrigendum as requested by the proponent.

179.7.2. Request for issue of Corrigendum to the EC issued for Proposed Data Center Project at Plot Nos.142, 143, 144 & 145-P EPIP Industrial Area Situated in Sy.Nos.216 & 217 of Hoodi Village, K.R.Puram Hobli, Bengaluru East Taluk, Bangalore District of M/s. Darshita Projects Private Limited (SEIAA 136 CON 2017)

The project proponent had obtained Environmental Clearance vide letter No. SEIAA 136 CON 2017 dated 14.03.2018 for construction of Data Centre Project on a plot area of 14,169.32 Sqm. The total built up area is 31,987.63 Sqm. The proposed project consists of Data Centre Block with GF+5UF and MLCP Block with B+10 levels of parking.

The proponent vide letter dated 15.10.2019 have requested for issue of corrigendum on the EC issued increasing the built up area from earlier 31,987.63 Sqm to 32,994.01 Sq.mts by inclusion of GIS building. The number of car park has to be decreased from 503 to 231 numbers. The proponent also submitted the comparative statement and modified plan.

The Authority perused the request made by the proponent. The Authority after discussion decided to issue corrigendum as requested by the proponent.

179.7.3. Transfer of EC issued for Building Stone Quarrying at Sy.No's.47 & 48, Makenahalli Village, Nelamangala Taluk & Bangalore Rural District from Sri B. Ramaswamy, Sri Ranga Granites to Sri Vijay Seshagiri, Sri Ranga Granites.

Environmental Clearance has been issued by SEIAA vide letter No. SEIAA 113 MIN 2014, dated 1.10.2014 for quarrying of building on total quarry lease area of 4.02 Ha (10-00 ACres) in favour of Sri B. Ramaswamy, Sri Ranga Granites.

Sri Vijay Seshagiri, Sri Ranga Granites. vide letter dated 03.12.2019 had requested for transfer the said Environmental Clearance to their name as the quarry lease was transferred from proprietorship firm partnership. Copy of the Transfer of Quarry lease deed, Form T have also been submitted.

It is further stated that the area has been reduced from 10-00 Acres to 8-36 Acres after survey & demarcation. Hence Quarry plan has been modified for 8-36 Acres with the same production capacity. Therefore it is also requested for issue of revised Environmental Clearance with revised extent and land use pattern with same production capacity.

The Authority perused the request made by the project authorities. The Authority decided to transfer the Environment Clearances letter dated 1-10-2014 subject to sumision of the following new project Authorities should get the modified quarry plan approved from the Depatment of Mines and Geology in accordance with law and submitting a copy to this Authority for records.

- i) Quarrying Audit Report from the date of EC.
- ii) Compliance on the EC conditions.

iii) Copies of Statutory Clearances obtained as per the conditions of EC/Quarry Lease.

179.7.4. Transfer of EC issued by DEIAA, Tumkur for Building Stone Quarrying at Sy.No's.59(p), Hosahalli Village, Tumkur Taluk & District from M/s Prakash Granite to M/s N.S. Jelly Crushers.

Environmental Clearance has been issued by DEIAA, Tumkur vide letter No. DEIAA/TUM/BST/39/2016-17, dated 25.01.2018 for Building Stone Quarrying at Sy.No's.59(p), Hosahalli Village, Tumkur Taluk & District in favour of M/s Prakash Granite.

M/s N.S. Jelly Crusher on 26.11.2019 had requested to transfer the said Environmental Clearance to their favour, as the lease has been transferred from M/s Prakash Granite to M/s N.S. Jelly Crusher by the Deputy Director, Department of Mines and Geology, Tumkur. Copy of the Transfer of Quarry lease deed, Form T have also been submitted.

The Authority perused the request made by the M/s N.S. Jelly Crusher. The Authority decided to get the following information for further consideration.

- i) Quarrying Audit Report from the date of EC.
- ii) Compliance on the EC conditions.
- iii) Copies of Statutory Clearances obtained as per the conditions of EC/Quarry Lease.

The Authority also decided to adress a letter to DC Tumkur District for forwarding the concerned file of DEIAA to this Authority.

179.7.5. Amendment of EC condition specific condition No. 17 in respect of Environmental Clearance granted for eestablishment of Cashew Nut Shell Liquid Based Products at Plot No. IP-1 & IP-2, Mangalore Special Economic Zone Phase-I,Mangalore, Dakshina Kannada District of M/s. Cardolite Specialty Chemicals India Pvt. Ltd. (SEIAA 23 IND 2011)

The project proponent had obtained Environmental Clearance vide letter No. SEIAA 23 IND 2011, dated 12.04.2012 for Establishment of 30,000 MTPA capacity of Cashew Nut Shell Liquid Based Products (coating products: 25,000 MTPA & friction products: 5000 MTPA) at Plot No. IP-1 & IP-2, Mangalore Special Economic Zone Phase-I, Mangalore, Dakshina Kannada District;

The proponent vide letter dated 24.09.2019 have requested for amendment in the following EC conditions as the :

1. As per the Specific Condition No.17, the company shall install online monitoring system in the proposed plants with an arrangement to reflect the monitored data on the company's server, which can be accessed by the KSPCB on real time basis. The proponent submitted that the company

- shall comply with the guidelines for installing online monitoring issued by CPCB.
- 2. As per the Specific Condition No.21, the company shall install and operate continuous ambient air quality monitoring station within the premises as proposed in the environmental management plan. The proponent submitted that the company shall comply with the guidelines for installing CAAQMs issued by CPCB.

The Authority perused the request made by the proponent. The Authority after discussion decided to issue corrigendum as requested by the proponent.

179.7.6. Building Stone Quarry Project, Sy.No.101/2B of Arundi Village, Honnali Taluk, Davanagere District (1-0 Acre) (QL No.598) of Sri S S Raju- Request for transfer of EC in favour of M/s Shree Vijayalakshmi Chamundeshwari Stone Crusher and M-Sand (SEIAA 1144 MIN 2015)

Environmental Clearance has been issued by SEIAA vide letter No. SEIAA 1144 MIN 2015 for quarrying of building stone at Sy.No.101/2B of Arundi Village, Honnali Taluk, Davanagere District on a lease area of 1-00 Acre in favour of Sri S S Raju.

M/s Shree Vijayalakshmi Chamundeshwari Stone Crusher and M-Sand vide letter dated 11.11.2019 had requested to transfer the said Environmental Clearance to their favour, as the lease has been transferred from Sri S S Raju to M/s Shree Vijayalakshmi Chamundeshwari Stone Crusher and M-Sand by the Deputy Director, Department of Mines and Geology, Davanagere. The consent to transfer from Sri S S Raju and the copy of the Transfer of Quarry lease deed, Form T has also been submitted.

The Authority perused the request made by the M/s Shree Vijayalakshmi Chamundeshwari Stone Crusher and M-Sand. The Authority decided to tranfer the EC dated 17-02-2016 in favour of M/s Shree Vijayalakshmi Chamundeshwari Stone Crusher and M-Sand subject to sumission of the following information.

- i) Quarrying Audit Report from the date of EC.
- ii) Compliance on the EC conditions.
- iii) Copies of Statutory Clearances obtained as per the conditions of EC/Quarry Lease.

179.7.7. Proposed Project "Bulk drugs and Intermediates unit at Plot No.123 & 124, KIADB, Industrial Area, Raichur Growth Centre, Raichur Tq and Dist Chicksugur-584134 by M/s. J Y Pharma Pvt Ltd(SEIAA 04 IND 2019)

M/s. J Y Pharma Pvt Ltd have proposed Bulk drugs and Intermediates unit at Plot No.123 & 124, KIADB, Industrial Area, Raichur Growth Centre, Raichur Tq and Dist. on a Plot area of 3583 Sqmt. The Project cost is Rs. 4.5 Crores.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 27.3.2019. The Committee noted that the construction has already been taken up based on the CFE issued by KSPCB and CFE covers only inorganic products for which EC was not mandated. The

proponent stated that this application has been made out as he is proposing to manufacture synthetic organic products also. The Committee after discussion had decided to appraise the proposal as B1 and decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of standard ToRs with additional ToRs to conduct the EIA studies.

The Authority during the meeting held on 4.5.2019 decided to issue ToR as recommended by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006. Accordingly ToRs were issued on 28-5-2019. The proponent has submitted the EIA report on 26-6-2019.

The proponent and Environment consultant attended SEAC meeting held on 12-9-2019 to present the EIA Report. The committee after discussion decided to reconsider after submission of the following information

1) To explore and submit the alternative to Toulene.

The committee during the meeting held on 19.10.2019 perused the replies submitted by the proponent on 26-9-2019 and accepted the same. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance.

The Authority during the meeting held on 22.11.2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to clear the proposal for issue of Environmental Clearance subject to submission of the following information:

- 1) Copy of the latest CFO and the details of manufacturing of the inorganic chemicals manufactured so far.
- 2) An action plan with activities proposed under CER in accordance with O.M F. No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 1st May 2018 issued by MoEF&CC, Government of India, allocation of funds against each of the activities and the time frame within which such activities will be completed. The funds so earmarked shall be in accordance with para 6 (II) and the activities shall be in accordance with para 6 (V) of the said O.M.

Now the proponent vide letter dated 16.12.2019 have submitted the list of by-products which will be generated from the 27 number of products proposed and detailed in the EIA report. The proponent requested to issue the Environmental Clearance including the said byproducts in the proposed product list.

The Authority perused the request made by the proponent. The Authority after discussion decided to include by products in the proposed product list as requested by the proponent.

179.7.8. Proposed Modification and Expansion of Bulk drug & intermediates manufacturing unit at Plot No.57,58, 69, 70 KIADB Industrial Area, Raichur Growth Centre, Raichur Taluk & District, Chicksugur by M/s. Vibrant Pharmachem Pvt Ltd (SEIAA 06 IND 2019)

M/s. Vibrant Pharmachem Pvt Ltd have proposed for and Expansion of Bulk drug & intermediates manufacturing unit at Plot No.57,58, 69, 70 KIADB Industrial Area, Raichur Growth Centre, Raichur Taluk & District, Chicksugur Karnataka on a Plot area of 8094 Sqm. The Project cost is Rs. 17.96 Crores.

The subject was discussed in the SEAC meeting held on 27.3.2019. The Committee has decided to appraise the proposal as B1 and decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA for issue of standard ToRs along with additional ToRs to conduct the EIA studies. The Authority during the meeting held on 4.5.2019 decided to issue ToR as recommended by SEAC for conducting the Environment Impact Assessment study in accordance with EIA Notification, 2006. Accordingly the ToR was issued vide letter dated 28.05.2109. The proponent have submitted the EIA report on 09-10-2019.

The proposal was placed before the committee for EIA appraisal during the meeting held on 31-10-2019. The committee after discussion decided to recommend the proposal to SEIAA to issue Environment Clearance.

The Authority during the meeting held on 22nd November 2019 perused the proposal and took note of the recommendation of SEAC. The Authority after discussion decided to clear the proposal for issue of Environmental Clearance subject to submission of the following information:

- 1) Details of treatment facility with provisions for ATFD
- 2) An action plan with activities proposed under CER in accordance with O.M F. No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 1st May 2018 issued by MoEF&CC, Government of India, allocation of funds against each of the activities and the time frame within which such activities will be completed. The funds so earmarked shall be in accordance with para 6 (II) and the activities shall be in accordance with para 6 (V) of the said O.M.

Now the proponent vide letter dated 16.12.2019 have submitted the list of byproducts which will be generated from the 11 number of products proposed and detailed in the EIA report. The proponent requested to issue the Environmental Clearance including the said byproducts in the proposed product list.

The Authority perused the request made by the proponent. The Authority after discussion decided to include by products in the proposed product list as requested by the proponent.

179.7.9. Proposed Residential Apartment Project at Sy.Nos.31/2b, 34/1 & 35 of Ward No.53, Basavanapura, BBMP Khatha No.888/31/2b, 34/1 & 35 of Medahalli Village, Bidarahall Hobli, Bangalore East Taluk, Bangalore Urban District By M/s. Concorde Housing Corporation – Request for corrigendum to the Environmental Clearance (SEIAA 140 CON 2017)

The project proponent had obtained Environmental Clearance vide letter No. SEIAA 140 CON 2017, dated 22.02.2018 for construction of Residential Apartment Project on a plot area of 17,181.19 Sqm. The total built up area is 80,513.69 Sqm. The proposed project consists of 501No's of Residential units in 3 towers with Tower A

having 3 Basements + Ground Floor + 25 Upper Floor, Tower B having 3 Basements + Ground Floor + 27 Upper Floor and Tower C having 3 Basements + Ground Floor + 29 Upper Floor.

Environmental Clearance has been issued by SEIAA vide letter No. SEIAA 189 MIN 2019, dated 17.07.2019 for quarrying of building at Sy.No.43 of Chikkanagavalli Village, Chikkaballapura Taluk & District on total quarry lease area of 0-30 Acres in favour of Sri Srinivas.

Copy of the Form T has been submitted.

The Authority perused the request made by the project authorities. The Authority decided to transfer the EC dated 17-7-2019 in favour of M/s Veera Hanuman Stone Crusher subject to sumission of the following information.

179.7.13. Complaint against Project proponents of residential apartment M/s Arya Griha Pvt. Ltd. SEIAA 13 CON 2011)

Environmental Clearance has been issued vide letter No. SEIAA 13 CON 2011, dated 23rd September 2011 Construction of residential apartment project with 245 units called "Arya Hamsa" at Sy. No. 28/1 (P), Kothanur Village, Bangalore South Taluk, Bangalore.

A complaint has been received from Shri Shailesh Charati, Bengaluru against the project authorities of "Ary Hamsa", Residential Apartment of M/s Arya Gruha Pvt. Ltd alleging that the EC has been taken by integrating two separate and independent projects.

The Authority perused the representation made by Shri Shailesh Charati, Bengaluru and decided to communicate a copy to proponent seeking clarification in this regard.

179.7.14. Request made by of Shri Krishnamurthy for payment for assisting in maintenance of the books of accounts of the Authority for the year 2019-20.

Shri Krishnamurthy G. has submitted a letter dated 20.11.2019 requesting for rising his monthly renumeration from Rs.5000/- per month to Rs.7,500/- per month towards support services he is rendering to SEIAA for maintenance of the books of accounts for the year 2019-20.

The Authority perused the details submitted and observed that Shri Krishnamurty was assisting the Authority in maintaining books of accounts either to. Shri Krishmurty is also assisting in filing of TDS and GST returns also. The Authority also observed that no enhancement has been provided to Shri Krishnamurty, for the last three years. The Authority therefore decided to accord approval for enhancement of renumeration to Shri Krishnamurty, to Rs.7000/- per month from the existing Rs.5000/- per month with effect from 1-4-2019 for maintenance of the books of accounts for the year 2019-20.

179.7.15. Authorization Shri. H.K. Vasanth, Advocate to appear before the Hon'ble NGT (SZ) Chennai in respect of Appeal No. 10 of 2019 filed by M/s Rosvar Iron & Power Pvt. Ltd.

The Authority noted that the South Zone (SZ) Chennai bench of Hon'ble NGT have started working and the pending cases are being considered. The Authority also noted that the Govt. of Karnataka have ordered to discontinue the services of present advocate on record.

M/s Rosvar Iron & Power Pvt. Ltd. have filed Appeal No. 10 of 2019 wherein the SEIAA is made the 2nd Respondent. The case is being heard on 17th December 2019. Sri. H. K. Vasanth advocate of the Authority has been requested to attend the Hon'ble tribunal to defend the Autority in this case.

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The Authority observed that there is a need for an advocate on record in the Hon'ble NGT South Zone Chennai and therefore decided to avail services of Sri H K Vasanth as Advocate on record for defending the cases of the Authority before the Hon'ble NGT Chennai.
