	<p>Recommendations of the SEAC on 23.06.2018.</p> <p>The representative of the project proponent and their consultant M/s.Global Enviro Labs, have attended the meeting and presented their case.</p> <p>The Committee noted that this is a new Quartzite (Silica sand) mine. Earlier the Asst. Director of Mines & Geology, Yerraguntla granted lease to Sri. Dodium Shaul Hameed on 16.01.2006 for a lease period of 20 years. Subsequently the Govt. of A.P., transferred the lease to Sri. Shaik Jamal Valli on 16.12.2018 for the lease period upto 21.05.2026.</p> <p>The Asst. Director of Mines & Geology, Yerraguntla vide letter dated 09.03.2018 stated that there are two quarry leases existed within 500m from this proposed mine. It is noted that these two leases (Sri.Sk.Mohammad Bakshi (Quartzite)-45.649 Ha.- lease granted on 28.08.2004 & M/s. Mangalore Minerals and Traders- 43.30 Ha.- lease granted on 08.04.2003). These two leases granted before 9th Sept 2013 and hence not come under cluster formation. Hence, the present proposal comes under category 'B2' project. The mining plan was approved on 02.02.2018 and it was reported that no production was achieved from 2006 to 2017.</p> <p>In the application it was reported that the mine lease land is a Government land for which they have not furnished any document on the status of land. In the mine lease area there is a temple and historic rocks.</p> <p><i>The Committee recommended that the following:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <i>i. A certificate from the Revenue Department on the status of mine lease land shall be included as a part of approved Mining Plan.</i> <i>ii. The legal opinion shall be obtained on this proposed Quartzite (Silica sand) mine lease for consideration of environmental clearance as the historic rocks identified by the Archeological Dept and a temple within the mine lease area.</i>

The committee recommended for issue of standard Terms of Reference (TOR) and accepted for exemption of public hearing due to less pollution load, adopting ZLD, only expansion and not new, no additional usage of resources of water, less fuel usage than previous one due to additional methane production, due to 25 to 30% water savings, condensation vapor recovery and other beneficial impacts to be implemented. The SEIAA, A.P., in its meeting held on 01.06.2018 and the Authority requested the SEAC, A.P., to examine their recommendations again, to mention the provisions of EIA Notification, 2006 for the said grounds for exemption of public hearing to this proposed project. <i>This proposal was re-appraised and the committee considered the exemption of public hearing as per Para No.7(ii) of EIA Notification 2006.</i> <i>The Member Secretary, APPCB has given a dissent note on using provision for exemption of Public hearing. As distillery is unit causing odour. The local community needs to be involved in the consultation process.</i> <i>The Committee after detailed discussions, reiterated the earlier recommendations for issue of standard Terms of Reference (TOR) with exemption of public hearing, for expansion of the Distillery unit : Rectified Spirit / ENA/Ethanol Fuel from 20 KLPD to 59 KLPD (Molasses based (or) Grain Based). But to have more clarification regarding the rules position in the exemption of the public consultancy, this is recommended that clarification shall be taken with more details on the rule position, with thorough verification and elaborate discussion on this point in the next meeting.</i></p>
