The 3rd meeting (1st sitting) of the State Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC), Assam was held on 1st December, 2023 from 10-00 AM onwards till 01.00 PM in the Conference Hall of the State Pollution Control Board, Assam, for detailed discussions and deliberations on the project proposals as per the agenda circulated to all concerned on 28 th of November, 2023.

At the very outset, the Chairman of the SEAC welcomed all the Hon'ble Members of the Committee and also the Required Qualified Persons (RQPs) who were specially invited to attend to the proceedings of the Committee so that each of them in the process of preparation of the Mining Plans could appreciate the issues and acquaint themselves with the latest guidelines of the GOI in the MoEF&CC. The Chairman addressed the RQPs and emphasized in preparation of scientific Mining Plans, their role in guiding the Project Proponents particularly in regular submission of mandatory Compliance Reports and also in taking up the CER (Corporate Environment Responsibility) activities as envisaged by the MoEF & CC in their letter 22-65/ 2017-IA.III dated 25.02.2021 in a holistic manner wherein they need to vigorously pursue with the project proponents for raising of Avenue Plantations, Plantations in

Institutions, Execution of works of Public Utility etc etc.

The Member Secretary, SEAC briefed the Hon'ble Members about the agenda for the meeting. The RQPs present in the meeting were also requested to feel free to have the clarifications, if any, on the points which may come up during the course of deliberations and discussions on the matters by the Hon'ble Members. He further requested the esteemed members for their thorough participation and deliberation to expedite the process of disposal of the cases for onward processing at the level of SEAC and also the SEIAA, as the case may deserve, for timely consideration and disposal.

As per the agenda, the august committee duly reviewed the Minutes of the Meetings (1st Sitting and 2nd Sitting) held on 10th November.

As per the agenda for the 1st Sitting, the august committee duly deliberated, discussed and made appraisal and furnished their opinion / views which were unanimously accepted as pointed out against each of the agenda items quoted hereunder:

 Proposal for EC of mining of Stone from "Govt. Permit Area of Na-Pani Sarthe Killing Gaon" proposed by Sri Bhupen Killing SEIAA. 3404/2023 (SIA/AS/MIN/419307/2023)

Resolution 3/1:

The Project Area as allotted is measuring 4.37 Ha with the recommended quantity of 50,000 cu.m Stone in 2 (two) years as per the approved Mining Plan @ (25,000 cum stone annually). The Mining Plan was prepared by the Required Qualified Person (RQP) Dr Abhijit Bora and the proposed mining area was visited by the RQP while the same was approved by the Director, Geology and Mining, Govt. of Assam on 29.11.2022. The quantum of stone to be extracted from the area annually is @ 25,000 cum. The DFO, Karbi Anglong East Division, Diphu had recommended the proposal for extraction on 14.02.2023.

Necessary documents submitted in support of the proposal is examined and appraised. Recommendation of the concerned DFO dated 14th February,2023 and the EDS submitted dated 15.06.2023 are considered. Due discussions and deliberations is held. The committee observed that mining in the nearby areas as proposed in the approved Mining Plan are noticed which need to be ascertained by the committee through on the spot verification to be assisted by the DFO, Karbi Anglong East Division, Diphu and also the RQP Dr Abhijit Bora. The Committee

felt it expedient to consider the case afresh in the next meeting on receipt of the report of the fact finding Team to be constituted for the proposes. The project proponent shall invariably be present at the proposed Mining Area on the appointed date of visit of the sub-committee.

Therefore, the matter is proposed to be listed in the next sitting for appraisal of the Committee.

2. Proposal for EC of mining of Sand Gravel and Stone from "Govt. Permit Area of Unniguri Sand and Stone Mahal" proposed by the DFO, Baksa DivisionSEIAA. 3561/2023 (SIA/AS/MIN/448840/2023)

Resolution 3/2:

The Project Area as allotted is measuring 4.98 Ha with the recommended quantity of 1,10,515cu.m Sand Gravel and Stone (33452.90 cu.m stone, 40216.41cu.m Gravel, 33,386.58 cum sand) of river bed Sand Gravel and Stone for 5 (five) years as per the approved Mining Plan @ (6690.58 cum stone, 8043.29 cum Gravel and 6677.32 cum sand annually). The Mining Plan was prepared by the Required Qualified Person (RQP) Shri Prabal Kumar Goswami and the proposed mining area was visited by the RQP while the same was approved by the Director, Geology and Mining, Govt of Assam on 28.07.2023. The quantum of sand gravel and stone to be extracted from the river bed, annually, are @ (6690.58 cum stone, 8043.29 cum Gravel and 6677.32 cum sand annually).

It was further seen that the requisite NOC is yet to be granted by the Water Resources Department regarding its objections, if any, in mining of the river bed bounded by the Geo-coordinates. It also came to light during the course of discussion, as has been pointed out by the Member Secretary, SEAC that for mining in river beds and its flood plans (excluding manual excavation) vide no-(PCBA/LGL-196/2023/NGT/8/2099 dated 20th November, 2023) the Consent to Establish / Consent to Operate (CTE / CTO) are essentially required to be obtained from the State PCB in terms of the guidelines circulated by the CPCB.

Necessary documents submitted in support of the proposal is examined and appraised. Recommendation of the concerned DFO dated 3rd August, 2023 is considered. Due discussion and deliberation is held and the committee recommended the project proposal approving extraction of 1,10, 515cu.m (Stone, Gravel and Sand) as indicated above annually from the proposed mining site within a period of 5 (five) years subject to the condition that (a) mining shall be confined and limited to the area falling within GPS coordinates (b) the active bank of the river is not disturbed / damaged because of mining operation and transportation of mining materials and (c)the proponent is permitted to extract the

approved quantity of river bed Stone, Gravel and Sand with maximum mining depth up to 2 (two) meters from the non-mined surface.

The proponent may be allowed to extract 1,10,515cu.m @ (6690.58 cum stone, 8043.29 cum Gravel and 6677.32 cum Sand, annually)from the proposed mining site and should strictly follow all other terms and conditions laid down in the approved mining plan.

This is subject to the fact that the project proponent submits the NOC / Certificate from the respective authorities on the above requirements for due grant of the EC by the SEIAA immediately.

In the condition of CTE/CTO the Project Proponent shall submit the copy of application submitted to PCB, Assam of the 1st instance.

Further, the Proponent shall have to undertake CER (Corporate Environment Responsibility) amounting to 2% of the total cost of the project by way of raising plantations (Roadside, Institutional), works of public utility as shall be decided by the concerned DFO involving local Institutions, Public, Organizations etc. Such activities need to be uploaded in PARIVESH Portal with the compliance reports to be submitted half yearly.

Accordingly, he shall also ensure marking the boundary of the mining site on the ground fixing permanent concrete pillars, painted yellow with the coordinates depicted there in on the pillars / posts, following the GPS coordinates mentioned in the approved mining plan.

 Proposal for EC of mining of Sand from "Govt. Permit Area of Barnadi River Sand Mahal No-2" proposed by the DFO, Baksa DivisionSEIAA. 3544/2023 (SIA/AS/MIN/439747/2023)

Resolution 3/3:

The Project Area as allotted is measuring 4.99Ha with the recommended quantity of 1,10,735cu.m of Sand @ (22,147 cu.m) of river bed Sand annually for 5 (five) years as per the approved Mining Plan. The Mining Plan was prepared by the Required Qualified Person (RQP) Shri Prabal Kumar Goswami and the proposed mining area was visited by the RQP while the same was approved by the Director, Geology and Mining, Govt of Assam on 17.07.2023. The quantum of sand to be extracted from the river bed, annually, 22,147 Cum. It was further seen that the requisite NOC is yet to be granted by the Water Resources Department regarding its objections, if any, in mining of the river bed bounded by the Geocoordinates. It further came to light during the course of discussion, as has been pointed out by the Member Secretary, SEAC that for mining in river beds its flood plans (excluding manual excavation) vide no-(PCBA/LGL-196/2023/NGT/8/2099 dated 20th November,2023) the Consent To Establish (CTE / CTO) are essentially required to be obtained from the State PCB Office in terms of the guidelines circulated by the CPCB.

In the condition of CTE/CTO the Project Proponent shall submit the copy of application submitted to PCB, Assam of the 1st instance.

Necessary documents submitted in support of the proposal is examined and appraised. Recommendation of the concerned DFO dated 3rd August, 2023 is considered. Due discussion and deliberation is held and the committee recommended the project proposal approving extraction of 1,10, 735cu.m of Sand (@ 22,147 cu.m) as indicated above, annually, from the proposed mining site within a period of 5 (five) years subject to the condition that (a) mining shall be confined and limited to the area falling within GPS coordinates (b) the active bank of the river is not disturbed / damaged because of mining operation and transportation of mining materials and (c)the proponent is permitted to extract the approved quantity of river bed Sand with maximum mining depth up to 2 (two) meters from the non-mined surface.

The proponent may be allowed to extract 1,10,735cu.m (@ 22,147 cu.m, annually from the proposed mining site and should strictly follow all other terms and conditions laid down in the approved mining plan.

The committee observed that nearby the proposed mining site of the approved Mining Plan existence of a Jack Wall constructed by the Namrup BVFCL (at a distance of 67.08 Mtrs) and also a Linear structure (48.41 Mtrs) are noticed.

The RQP present in the meeting was requested to clarify the status if mining activity in such sensitive locations could be permissible without posing threats to the nearby structures. It was unanimously decided to by the committee to reject the proposal in *limine*.

 Proposal for EC of mining of Dikhow River Stone Mining Permit Area, D(V)proposed by the DFO, Sivasagar Division SEIAA. 3515/2023 (SIA/AS/MIN/433774/2023)

Resolution 3/5:

The Project Area as allotted is measuring 3.60 Ha with the recommended quantity of 12,000 cu.m Stone for 1 (one) year from the Dikhow River Stone Permit Area, D (V). The proponent may be allowed to extract 12,000 cu.m. from the proposed mining site and should strictly follow all other terms and conditions laid down in the approved mining plan.

This is subject to the fact that the project proponent submits the NOC / Certificate from the respective authorities on the above requirements for due grant of the EC by the SEIAA immediately.

It was further seen that the requisite NOC is yet to be granted by the Water Resources Department regarding its objections, if any, in mining of the river bed bounded by the Geo-coordinates. Accordingly, he shall also ensure marking the boundary of the mining site on the ground fixing permanent concrete pillars, painted yellow with the coordinates depicted there in on the pillars / posts, following the GPS coordinates indicated in the approved Mining Plan.
