Following are the deliberations & decisions of the meeting: -

**AGENDA ITEM NO. 01**

Grant of Environment Clearance in favour of Shri Karanveer Singh S/o Shri Surinder Singh R/o Lane No.3, Shaheed Udham Singh Nagar, Pathankot, Punjab for MINOR MINERAL (River Bed Material) Project at Block No. 5 (1/5), (Area-9.86 Ha.), Tawi River Downstream Railway Bridge, Kishanpur Manwal Village-Bathuna (Jammu Block), Tehsil & District Jammu, JK UT under proposal No.SIA/JK/MIN/56264/2019.

**Deliberations:**

The project has been discussed in the JKEAC Meeting. The consultant informed the Committee that he has recently taken over the project as new consultant for the PP and he is still studying the documents, therefore, he would not be able to present the case during this session and as such requested the case to be deferred.

In view of the request from the Consultant, the case has been deferred and the Committee recommended that the PP/consultant be asked to upload fresh documents on the portal duly signed and stamped by the PP and the new consultant.

**Decision:**

The JKEIAA agrees with the recommendations of the Committee for deferment of case. The Project proponent shall upload fresh documents on the portal duly signed and stamped by the Project Proponent and the Consultant for appraisal by JKEAC.

## **AGENDA ITEM NO:02**

Grant of Environment Clearance in favour of Shri Ranbir Singh S/o Shri Gulwant Singh R/o Near Govt School Sheikhpur Bagh SBS Nagar, Punjab for River Bed Material in Block No.21, Tawi Khad Downstream Matnani Bridge, Village-Nar Block Pouni, Tehsil & District-Reasi, JK UT over an area 3.53 Ha under proposal No. **SIA/JK/MIN/169344/2020**.

### **Deliberations:**

The project has been discussed in the JKEAC Meeting. The consultant has given a detailed presentation during which he informed the forum that the case in the past had been listed under agenda item No: 9 in the 15th JKEAC Meeting, during which the Committee had desired that the mining block be relocated to maintain a safe distance of 500 m from the bridge. The consultant presented letter No.DGM/DDMC/MP Jmu/114-15 dated 22/02/2021, wherein the Dy. Director (MS), G&M Dept. has recommended reduction of mining block size to maintain a safe distance of 500 m from the bridge proposing new geographical coordinates of the resized mining block with area only 1.88 Ha. Instead of 5.53 Ha originally approved in the mining plan. The Committee examined the letter and observed that the letter is an internal correspondence without any formal endorsement to the JKEIAA. Therefore, the Committee opined that the PP shall have to ensure that these changes are reflected in the mining plan with de-novo approval by the Competent Authority. The Committee also discussed other aspects of the project like mining depth, active water channel, replenishment studies, surface plan, minable reserves as well as haulage route and its maintenance.

The Committee observed that the consultant has missed to intimate the project cost both in the uploaded documents as well as in presentation. The Consultant assured that he would submit the details both to the JKEIAA as well as upload these on the portal. He also informed that the J&K Govt. had extended the Lol till 31/08/2021 vide G.O No.12-MNGof2021 date 15/04/2021. The Committee also observed that the uploaded documents show EMP at a recurring cost of ₹ 4.04 Lakh, while as the presentation reflects its revision to ₹ 9.25 Lakh capital with recurring budget of ₹ 5.96 Lakh and CER budget of ₹ 2.50 Lakh. Therefore, the Committee desired that he should revise the EMP details on the portal as well and submit revised version of the EMP to the JKEIAA office in hard copy prior to issuance of formal EC.

In view of the above deliberations, the Committee recommended the case for grant of Environment Clearance subject to: -

1. Prior submission of revised EMP in accordance with above cited deliberations, in hard copy as also on Parivesh portal.
2. Revision of mining plan in light of deliberations of the JKEAC and its de-novo approval by the competent authority prior to grant of EC or as decided by the JKEIAA.
3. Mining Depth of 1m in view of non-availability of replenishment data in the District Survey Report.
4. Maximum targeted RBM extraction of 33840 Metric Tons per Annum [(18800-10 % (buffer)-10% (Active water channel)] x 2.25 (Bulk density) x 1 (mining depth).
5. Mentioning of the revised geographical coordinates formally furnished by the Geology & Mining Department in the formal Environmental Clearance letter.

6. Prior submission of NOCs from all stake holder departments viz. I&FC dept., Fisheries Dept etc. as per checklist before grant of formal EC, and conditions whereof, if any, shall be binding upon the project proponent.
7. Standard and Specific conditions as mentioned in Annexure-B to these Minutes of the JKEAC Meeting.
8. Validity of Environmental Clearance for a period of three years only from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA and JKPCB in view of non-availability of replenishment data in the District Survey Report.

**Decision:**

The JKEIAA upheld recommendations of the Committee to grant E.C. subject to the general and specific condition recommended by JKEAC, besides submission of prior NOCs from stakeholder departments viz I&FC, Fisheries and Forests. The EC is further subject to fulfillment of following conditions based on recommendations of JKEAC as per above deliberations.

1. Prior submission of revised EMP in accordance with above cited deliberations, physically as well as on Parivesh portal.
2. Revision of mining plan in the light of deliberations of the JKEAC and its de-novo approval by the competent authority, restricting the mining Depth of 1m in view of non-availability of replenishment data in the District Survey Report and Maximum targeted RBM extraction of 33840 Metric Tons per Annum [(18800-10% (buffer)-10% (Active water channel)] x 2.25(Bulk density) x 1 (mining depth). The revised mining plan be submitted within 3 months of issuance of EC as approved in the minutes dated 15-05-2021.
3. Revision of geographical coordinates formally furnished by the Geology & Mining Department to be mentioned in the formal Environmental Clearance letter.
4. Prior submission of NOCs from all stake holder departments viz. I&FC dept., Fisheries Dept etc. as per checklist before grant of formal EC, conditions where of, if any, shall be binding upon the project proponent.
5. Validity of Environmental Clearance for a period of only three years from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA and JKPCB in view of non-availability of replenishment data in the District Survey Report.

**AGENDA ITEM NO:03**

Grant of Environment Clearance in favour of Shri NARESH SHARMA R/o- NANAK NAGAR, JAMMU JK UT for MINOR MINERAL (River Bed Material) Project at Block No. 3/1, (Area-9.28 Ha.), Basantar River Downstream Chak Dam, Samba Village- Painthi, Tehsil & District Samba, JK UT under proposal No.SIA/JK/MIN/62554/2019 & SIA/JK/MIN/59522/2019.

**Deliberations:**

The project has been discussed in the JKEAC Meeting. The Consultant has given a detailed presentation on the project during which she informed the Committee that the project had previously been represented by Overseas Min Tech Consultants, Jaipur and all the documents stand uploaded by that consultancy on the Parivesh Portal. However, the project proponent had recently hired ASERIES ENVIROTEK INDIA PVT. LTD. to rectify all mistakes of the past especially w.r.t baseline data collection and its analysis. The Committee was informed that necessary documents shall be uploaded on the portal and their hardcopies submitted in the office of JKEIAA. The Consultant informed that the case falls within the purview of Govt. order

No. 76-FST of 2020 and the documentation done upto whatever stage by previous PP has been used while seeking EC. The Committee observed that the test reports of baseline data uploaded on the portal are in the name of previous project proponent. The deliberations were made on various aspects of the project including Lol, its extension, project cost, mining depth, replenishment, haulage route, EIA/EMP, baseline data and haulage route maintenance. The haulage route was deliberated in detail and the consultant informed that it is 289 m in length. The Committee observed that the consultant had kept insufficient funds under haulage route maintenance and mentioned wrong species in the Green belt development and therefore, she was advised to rectify same and update the EIA/EMP report before formal EC is considered. Further, the Committee desired that the Green belt should be developed in close coordination with the local DFO and the Panchayat representatives. The KML/KMZ file was opened on the Google Earth Image and it was observed that the pillar coordinate-E of the mining block falls in a cropland. The consultant informed that the pillar coordinate-E has wrongly been mentioned in the Lol itself, for which the PP has already approached the G&M Dept. for rectification and that its rectification shall have no implication on the area extent of the mining block as the area within the riverbed only accounts to 9.28 Ha. This was confirmed by calculating the area of the mining block on the Google Image. The Public Hearing Report was also read out and the consultant assured that the concerns of the public shall be taken due care of.

In view of the above deliberations, the Committee recommended grant of Environmental Clearance to the project subject to: -

1. Rectification of pillar coordinate-E in the letter of Intent so that the cropland and area outside the river bed is excluded from the mining block.
2. Revised geographical coordinates after rectification of pillar coordinate-E are furnished by G&M Dept. for mentioning same in the formal EC letter to be issued by JKEIAA.
3. Prior submission of duly signed and stamped revised hardcopies of EIA/EMP and other documents including test reports of baseline data besides, uploading same on parivesh portal as per deliberations.
4. Mining depth of only 1 m in view of lack of replenishment data in the District Survey Report.
5. Maximum targeted RBM extraction of 133632 Metric Tons per Annum [(92800-10% (buffer) -10% (Active water channel)] x 1.8 (Bulk density) x 1 (mining depth).
6. Revision of mining plan after recalculating the targeted mineral production at 1m depth and its de-novo approval by the competent authority prior to grant of EC or as decided by the JKEIAA.
7. Prior submission of NOCs from all stake holder departments viz. I&FC dept., Fisheries Dept etc. as per checklist before grant of formal EC, conditions whereof, if any, shall be binding upon the project proponent.
8. Standard and Specific conditions as per Annexure-B to these Minutes of Meeting.
9. Validity of Environmental Clearance for a period of only two years from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA, JKPCB in accordance with Minutes of Meeting of JKEIAA issued vide No. JKEIAA/2016/02/II/631-33 dated 08/08/2020 during which time fresh Public Hearing shall be got conducted by the PP.

### **Decision:**

The JKEIAA upheld recommendations of the Committee to grant E.C. to the project subject to general and specific conditions recommended by JKEAC besides submission of prior NOCs from stakeholder departments.

The EC is further subject to fulfillment of following conditions based on recommendations of JKEAC per deliberations above.

1. Revision of mining plan and its de-novo approval by the competent authority, restricting the Mining depth to only 1m in view of lack of replenishment data in the District Survey Report and Maximum targeted RBM extraction of 133632Metric Tons per Annum [(92800-10% (buffer) -10% (Active water channel)) x 1.8(Bulk density) x 1(mining depth)]. The revised mining plan be submitted within 3 months of issuance of EC as approved in the minutes dated 15-05-2021.
2. Revised geographical coordinates after rectification of pillar coordinate-E and exclusion of cropland and active water channel to be furnished by G&M Dept. prior to issue of formal EC.
3. Prior submission of duly signed and stamped revised hardcopies of EIA/EMP and other documents including test reports of baseline data besides, uploading same on parivesh portal as per deliberations.
4. Validity of Environmental Clearance for a period of only two years from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA, JKPCB in accordance with Minutes of Meeting of JKEIAA issued vide No. JKEIAA/2016/02/II/631-33 dated 08/08/2020 during which time fresh Public Hearing shall be got conducted by the PP.

### **AGENDA ITEM NO:04**

Grant of Environment Clearance in favour of Shri Sushil Kumar S/o Shri Tarsem Lal R/O Flat no-B-13, Sector No.1, Dream Line Society, Trikuta Nagar, Jammu, JK UT for MINOR MINERAL (River Bed Material) Project at Block No. 38 (5/13), (Area-8.69 Ha.), Khathar walli Khad Upstream Manoh Khathar Bridge, Village-Manoa, Tehsil- Akhnoor, District-Jammu, JK UT Under proposal No.**SIA/JK/MIN/56340/2019**.

### **Deliberations:**

The project has been discussed in the JKEAC Meeting. The Consultant gave a detailed presentation on the project during which she informed the Committee that the project had previously been represented by Overseas Min Tech Consultants as a transfer case falling within the preview of G.ONo.76-FST of 2020 and all the documents stand uploaded by that consultancy on the parivesh portal. However, she informed that the project proponent had recently hired ASERIES ENVIROTEK INDIA PVT.LTD. to rectify all mistakes of the past especially w.r.t baseline data collection and its analysis by the previous consultant, in this case as well. The members were assured that necessary documents shall be uploaded on the portal and their hard copies submitted in the office of JKEIAA. The deliberations were made on various aspects of the project including Lol, its extension, project cost, mining depth, replenishment, EIA/EMP, baseline data and haulage route maintenance etc. The Committee observed that the consultant had kept in sufficient funds under haulage route maintenance and mentioned wrong species in the Green belt development and therefore, she was advised to rectify same and update the EIA/EMP report before formal EC is considered. Further, the Committee desired that the Green belt should be developed in close coordination with the local DFO and the

Panchayat representatives. The members pointed out that the ppt shows the project cost at ₹.62.41 Lakh while as uploaded documents on parivesh portal reveal the project cost to be ₹.28.88 Lakh only with bid cost alone being ₹ 38.38 Lakh which is a discrepancy and needs to be rectified giving full details of the total project cost. Likewise, the committee also pointed out that the EMP and CER budget in the documents uploaded on the portal show a recurring budget of just ₹ 4.85 Lakh and ₹ 1.44 Lakh respectively which is too insufficient for a project with area extent of 8.69 Ha. Also, the members observed that the test reports of the baseline data had not been uploaded on the parivesh portal. The consultant was asked to clarify but she assured to submit updated version of the documents. The Committee examined the mining block boundary provided by the consultant in KML format on the Google Earth platform and observed that part of the mining block was falling inside the territorial forest boundary. The Consultant was asked to clarify this and she presented copy of NOC issued by the DFO concerned vide No. DFO/J/2897 dated 30/09/2020 where in the DFO has described the status of the mining block as, 'Adjoining forest land' while as in the same letter with respect to another mining block, the status has explicitly been shown as, 'Non-Forest'. The Committee observed that the DFO concerned should have clearly mentioned the status w.r.t the said mining block as Non-Forest or otherwise if it be so and therefore, the committee desired further clarifications from the Forest Dept. on this count. In view of the importance of the matter which could invite provisions under Forest Conservation Act or directions from the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the Committee desired that the Member Secretary, JKEIAA needs to take up the matter with the PCCF, JK so that while issuing NOCs in the instant case as well as in future w.r.t similarly situated cases, the authorized officers should be asked to clearly mention the geographical coordinates of the forest boundary pillar w.r.t the nearest pillar coordinate of the mining block, clearly mentioning the distance between the two so that there is no ambiguity in the matter. The Public Hearing report was also deliberated in depth and the consultant assured that all public concerns shall be taken due care of.

In view of the above deliberations, the Committee recommended the case for rejection in the present form and desired that the consultant be asked to:-

1. Obtain a fresh NOC from the designated authorized officer of Forest Department clearly mentioning the geographical coordinates of the forest boundary pillar w.r.t the nearest pillar coordinate of the mining block, also mentioning the distance between the two so that there is no ambiguity in the matter.
2. Submit an updated copy of EIA/EMP report with test reports of the baseline data issued by the NABL recognized testing laboratory duly signed and sealed by the project proponent and the consultant before uploading same on [www.parivesh.nic](http://www.parivesh.nic) portal.
3. Recalculate the project cost after adding the bidding cost and all allied costs involved in the mining activity in the designated block.
4. Revise the EMP and CER budget to keep a sufficient provision of funds under various components like Green belt development, dust suppression and pollution control, pollution monitoring, haulage route maintenance etc. in addition to appropriate budgetary provisions under CER activities. The CSR activities should be clearly in accordance with CSR Policy rules issued by the Govt. of India.
5. Submit all the documents indicated herein above in hard copy duly signed and stamped by the consultant and the project proponent, jointly and scanned copy whereof is uploaded on [www.parivesh.nic](http://www.parivesh.nic) portal for further course of action in the matter.

**Decision:**

The JKEIAA upheld recommendations of Committee for rejection of the case in present form and agrees with recommendations (1 to 5) of JKEAC as deliberated above. The Member Secretary shall return the case and inform the PP to fulfill the above conditions to appraise the case again.

**AGENDA ITEM NO:05**

Grant of Environment Clearance in favour of Shri Amit Gupta S/o Shri Ashok Kumar Gupta R/o 21/06 Trikuta Nagar Jammu, JK UT for MINOR MINERAL (River Bed Material) Project at Block No. 3/3, (Area-9.55ha.), Basantar River Upstream NH1A Bridge, Samba Village- Pangwal, Tehsil & District Samba, JK UT under proposal No. **SIA/JK/MIN/58958/2019**.

**Deliberations:**

The project has been discussed in the JKEAC Meeting. The Consultant has given a detailed presentation on the project during which she informed the Committee that the project had previously been represented by Overseas Min Tech Consultants, Jaipur and all the documents stand uploaded by that consultancy on the parivesh portal. However, she informed that the project proponent had recently hired ASERIES ENVIROTEK INDIA PVT. LTD. to rectify all mistakes of the past especially w.r.t baseline data collection and its analysis by the previous consultant. The members were informed that necessary documents shall be uploaded on the portal and their hardcopies submitted in the office of JKEIAA in this case as well. The Consultant informed that the case falls within the preview of Govt. order No. 76-FST of 2020 and the documentation done up to whatever stage by previous PP has been used while seeking EC. The deliberations were made on various aspects of the project including Lol, its extension, project cost, mining depth, replenishment, haulage route, EIA/EMP, baseline data and haulage route maintenance. The haulage route was deliberated in detail and the consultant informed that it is 1.57 km in length. The Committee observed that not a single penny has been earmarked for haulage route maintenance in the EMP budget and therefore, she was advised to diligently update the EMP prior to formal grant of EC. The Committee also observed that the test reports of the baseline data of June, 2019 uploaded on the parivesh portal by the previous consultant are in the name of present project proponent viz. Amit Gupta and some Sanchit Gautam who did not figure as project proponents at that point of time and therefore, the new consultant needs to freshly collect the baseline data as per window of opportunity provided by the JKEIAA in similarly situated case under minutes of Meeting issued by JKEIAA vide No. JKEIAA/2016/02/V/935-39 dated 17/04/2021. The Committee also observed that the consultant had kept a very meager budget under EMP viz. a recurring budget of just ₹ 3.64 Lakh per annum which is too insufficient for a project with areal extent of 9.55 Ha. It was however, pointed out that the EMP budget mentioned in the Power Point presentation has been shown as ₹ 5.84 Lakh which is still too insufficient for rehabilitating the local environmental settings. Therefore, the Committee asked the representative of the project proponent and the consultant to revise the EMP with sufficient budget commensurate with project cost and the areal extent of the mining block. The Committee told the consultant that the EMP should be revised independent of the budget of ₹ 12.28 Lakh earmarked under CER. It was also observed that a meagre budget has been earmarked under CSR activities while as the project proponent is required to spent in accordance with CSR Policy rules. The Public Hearing Report was also read out and the consultant assured that the concerns of the public shall be taken due care of.

In view of the above deliberations, the Committee recommended grant of provisional Environmental Clearance to the project subject to:

1. Prior submission of duly signed and stamped revised hardcopies of EIA/EMP/CER and other documents besides, uploading same on [www.parivesh.nic.in](http://www.parivesh.nic.in) portal as per deliberations.
2. Mining depth of only 1m in view of lack of replenishment data in the District Survey Report.
3. Maximum targeted RBM extraction of 1,28,925 Metric Tons per Annum [(95500-10% (buffer) -15% (Active water channel)) x 1.8(Bulk density) x 1 (mining depth)].
4. Revision of mining plan after recalculating the targeted mineral production at 1m depth and after its de-novo approval by the competent authority prior to grant of EC or as decided by the JKEIAA.
5. Condition that the new consultant hired by project proponent collects fresh pre-monsoon/post-monsoon baseline data and gets it analysed from any NABL recognized testing laboratory other than an inhouse arrangement within time period as allowed by the JKEIAA as per its decision reflected in the Minutes of Meeting issued vide No. JKEIAA/2016/02/V/935-39 dated 17/04/2021 w.r.t a similarly situated case and revised updated EIA report be submitted as per updated ToRs mentioned in Annexure-A to these minutes of meeting, in supersession to ToR's previously granted for the project.
6. Standard and specific conditions as mentioned in Annexure-B to these Minutes of Meeting.
7. Condition that the geographical coordinates as per Lol are mentioned in the provisional EC letter.
8. Prior submission of NOCs from all stake holder departments viz. I&FC dept., Fisheries Dept etc. as per checklist before grant of formal EC, conditions whereof, if any, shall be binding upon the project proponent.
9. Validity of the EC shall be for a period of only two years from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA, JKPCB in accordance with Minutes of Meeting of JKEIAA issued vide No. JKEIAA/2016/02/II/631-33 dated 08/08/2020 during which time fresh Public Hearing shall be got conducted by the Project Proponent.
10. All documents to be provided in duplicate duly signed and stamped by PP and the new consultant are submitted in the JKEIAA office before uploading same on the parivesh portal.

**Decision:**

The JKEIAA upheld recommendations of the Committee to grant provisional E.C. to the project subject to standard and specific conditions recommended by JKEAC, besides submission of prior NOCs from stakeholder departments viz I&FC, Fisheries etc. The EC is further subject to fulfillment of following conditions based on recommendations of JKEAC as per above deliberations.

1. Revision of mining plan and de-novo approval by the competent authority revisiting the Mining depth to only 1m in view of lack of replenishment data in the District Survey Report and Maximum targeted RBM extraction of 1,28,925 Metric Tons per Annum [(95500-10% (buffer) -15% (Active water channel)) x 1.8(Bulk density) x 1 (mining depth)]. The revised mining plan be submitted within 3 months of issuance of EC as approved in the minutes dated 15-05-2021.



2. Prior submission of duly signed and stamped revised hardcopies of EIA/EMP/CER and other documents besides, uploading same on www.parivesh.nic.in portal as per deliberations.
3. The Authority further accepted the recommendation of JKEAC that the new consultant hired by project proponent collects fresh pre- monsoon/post-monsoon baseline data and gets it analysed from any NABL recognized testing laboratory other than an inhouse arrangement within time period as allowed by the JKEIAA as per its decision reflected in the Minutes of Meeting issued vide No. JKEIAA/2016/02/V/935-39 dated 17/04/2021 w.r.t a similarly situated case and revised updated EIA report be submitted as per updated ToRs, approved in JKEAC 40<sup>th</sup> meeting on 15-05-2021 in supersession to ToR's previously granted for the project.
4. Validity of the EC shall be for a period of only two years from the date of commencement of the mining operations duly certified by the District Mineral Officer concerned with intimation to the JKEIAA, JKPCB in accordance with Minutes of Meeting of JKEIAA issued vide No. JKEIAA/2016/02/II/631-33 dated 08/08/2020 during which time fresh Public Hearing shall be got conducted by the Project Proponent.
