The project proponent has submitted form-1, pre-feasibility report, letter from State Geologist regarding letter of intent dated 10.11.2020, copy of approved mining plan from State Geologist dated 05/11/2020, jamabandi & tatima, joint inspection report dated 06.06.2015, NOC from Gram Panchayat mangarh on dated 06/11/2020, 500 meter distance certificate from State Geologist dated 10.12.2020, affidavit regarding CER activities, base line environmental data of air quality, water quality and noise levels along with site photographs, list of flora and fauna from DFO Rajgarh Forest Division along with fast growing species.

The case was listed before the SEAC in its 83rd Meeting and decided to list the case in next meeting after compliance of the following observations:

1. The project proponent shall submit the drone video of site.
2. The project proponent shall mark the proposed mining are with permanent concrete boundary pillars along the boundary.
3. The project proponent shall submit revised KML file matching the revenue map/duly attested original tatima.

A complaint for non-issuance of Environment Clearance to Sh. Hem Singh was received in this office on dated 15.9.2021 by Sh. Amar Chand S/o Sh. Hira Nand, Village Belu Dhank, P.O. Pandohā, Tehsil-Karsog, District-Mandi, HP. The matter was examined by SEIAA Secretariat and a letter was written to State Geologist from the office of Member Secretary, HP SEIAA on dated 21.09.2021 and 01.11.2021 to examine the matter and submit their comments to this office so that the case of Sh. Hem Singh could be considered for grant of Environment Clearance.

A letter on dated 26.10.2021 was also received in this office from Sh. Hem Singh along with the copies of orders of Hon'ble High Court dated 21.09.2021 in CMP(M) No. 174 of 2021, informing that as per direction of Hon'ble High Court PP can undertake mining in his own land.

The SEAC in its 87th meeting recommended the case application for consideration of grant of environmental clearance by the SEIAA, subject to fulfillment of conditions annexed at Annexure-I with following additional conditions that:

1. The capital cost (@ Rs. 4.00 lacs per \leq ha.) under CER, shall be deposited in the form of Demand Draft to the office of Director (DEST), GOHP. The Director (DEST) shall device a plan for this purpose within one month for that area in consultation with project proponent.
2. The project proponent shall sensitize and create awareness among people working within the project area as well as its surrounding area on the ban of SUP in order to ensure the compliance of Notification published by MoEF&CC on 12/08/2021. A report, along with photographs, on the measures taken shall also be included in the six monthly compliance report being submitted by the project proponents.
3. The project proponent shall leave a buffer of 70 meters from pillar No. 8 and shall not undertake any mining activities from pillar No. 8 at coordinates 31°10'44" N & 76°42'60" E in order to not to interfere with active river channel.

The proposed project is Extraction of Sand, Stone & Bajri. Online proposal for granting EC was submitted on dated 23/12/2021 and accepted by the SEIAA secretariat on dated 21/06/2022 and forwarded to SEAC secretariat.

The SEAC in its 81st meeting recommended the issuance of Standard ToR issued by the MoEF&CC, Govt for preparing EIA/EMP report under Category-B1 with the following additional conditions:

1. The project proponent shall make provision for providing six plastic waste shredders, six plastic waste baling machines & compactors to the concerned ULBs/ PRIs through Department of Environment, Science & Technology, GoHP.
2. The project proponent shall provide 8 solar lights through Department of Environment, Science & Technology, GoHP.

TOR's was granted on dated 24.09.2021. The pp has submitted complete EIA/EMP report and requested to grant EC.

The case was listed before the SEAC in its 86th meeting and decided to list the case in next meeting after compliance of the following observations:

1. The SEAC observed that since there is active water channel in between the project location a clarification from Geological wing of Industry Department, Himachal Pradesh with respect to the compliance of Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining (January, 2020) published by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India is necessarily required. As to certify that whether the given mining lease permission is in consonance with these guidelines and strictly as per District Survey Report and copy of DSR shall be provided depicting the said mining lease area.
2. The project proponent to reduce the minable area to 60% of the proposed area as per Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining.
3. The project proponent shall submit the revised mining plan excluding the area of active river channel and mentioning proper buffer zone.
4. The project proponent shall resubmit the proposal as per the provisions of Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining (January, 2020) published by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India.

After submission of the compliances to the observations made by SEAC, the case was listed before the SEAC in its 87th meeting. The SEAC observed that the Mining Department has now clearly mentioned that the buffer zones have been left and the fact that the river is a seasonal rivulet and is not perennial. The mining plan has been approved as per District Survey Report.

The SEAC in its 87th meeting recommended the case application for consideration of grant of environmental clearance by the SEIAA, subject to fulfillment of conditions annexed at Annexure-I with following additional conditions that:

1. The capital cost (@ Rs. 4.00 lacs per \leq ha.) under CER, shall be deposited in the form of Demand Draft to the office of Director (DEST), GOHP. The Director (DEST) shall device a plan for this purpose within one month for that area in consultation with project proponent.
2. The project proponent shall sensitize and create awareness among people working within the project area as well as its surrounding area on the ban of SUP in order to ensure the compliance of Notification published by MoEF&CC on 12/08/2021. A report, along with photographs, on the measures taken shall also be included in the six monthly compliance report being submitted by the project proponents.

The SEIAA in its 60th meeting approved the grant of Environment Clearance in favour of the proposed project after considering the recommendations of SEAC in its 87th meeting.

The case was listed before the SEAC in its 86th Meeting and decided to list the case in next meeting after compliance of the following observations:

1. The project proponent shall submit detailed plantation plan with layout plan.
2. The project proponent shall submit clear and legible copy of EIA/EMP report.
3. The SEAC observed that keeping in view the project location a clarification from Geological wing of Industry Department, Himachal Pradesh with respect to the compliance of Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining (January, 2020) published by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India is necessarily required. As to certify that whether the given mining lease permission is in consonance with these guidelines and strictly as per District Survey Report and copy of DSR shall be provided depicting the said mining lease area.
4. The project proponent shall submit the revised mining plan mentioning proper buffer zone from the spring source as mentioned by the local communities in public hearing. The project proponent shall submit a spring revival plan as in anticipation of the impact of mining on ground water sources.
5. The project proponent shall resubmit the proposal as per the provisions of Enforcement & Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining (January, 2020) published by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India.

1. The capital cost (@ Rs. 4.00 lacs per \leq ha.) under CER, shall be deposited in the form of Demand Draft to the office of Director (DEST), GOHP. The Director (DEST) shall device a plan for this purpose within one month for that area in consultation with project proponent.
2. The project proponent shall sensitize and create awareness among people working within the project area as well as its surrounding area on the ban of SUP in order to ensure the compliance of Notification published by MoEF&CC on 12/08/2021. A report, along with photographs, on the measures taken shall also be included in the six monthly compliance report being submitted by the project proponents.
3. The project proponent shall not disturb the existing natural spring and shall protect it as per the revised mining plan and given buffer zone from the spring source as per requirement of local communities as raised during public hearing. The proposed project is construction of residential apartments consisting of 130 units along with hotel having 35 rooms, nursery school, shops, jogging tracks etc. The project site is on hill and comprises with few shrubs, trees and grasses. The project establishment will require preliminary leveling of site prior to construction. As proposed the maximum care will be taken to avoid removing or cutting major grown trees within the site during the construction activities & if any grown trees are obstructing the proposed design structures, a proper transplantation activity should be considered by employing a landscape contractor or nursery professional without damaging.

Online proposal for granting Environment Clearance was submitted on dated 20/11/2020 and accepted by the SEIAA secretariat on dated 01/12/2020 and forwarded to SEAC secretariat. The hard copy was submitted by the project proponent on dated 17/12/2020.

The case was listed before the SEAC in its 78th meeting, but the person present before the Committee was not an authorized person to present the case as per NABL certificate. Therefore, it was decided the case will only appraised by the Committee, if the approved consultant from the NABET/ NABL presents the case.

The pp has submitted the compliance to the observations made by SEAC.

The case was listed before the SEAC in its 79th meeting and SEAC decided that before recommendation of the case for grant of EC, following conditions shall be complied by the project proponent:

1. The project proponent shall submit a certificate from Municipal Corporation Shimla w.r.t. implication of Hon'ble NGT orders w.r.t. 2 ½ story restrictions.

2. The Committee shall also seek opinion of AG office in the instant case beside comments from TCP & MC separately.

The project proponent submitted the documents. The case was again listed before the SEAC in its 80th meeting.

The Committee observed that the opinion given by office of Ld. Advocate General does not anywhere indicate or refer to the Hon'ble NGT orders under question except for the question w.r.t. grant of registration, besides the fact that the orders needed clear explanations before considering the case for grant of environmental clearance. The Orders of Hon'ble NGT are very exhaustive and the department of Town and Country Planning/ MC Shimla need to have strong environmental beneficial basis to recommend the approval after the issuance of the detailed order by NGT rather than taking an excuse that the demanded fees/ security for grant of license fee etc. have been pre calculated or were not deposited within stipulate period and the fact that maps approved by MC Shimla vide letter dated 14-12-2016 prior to Hon'ble NGT orders was in fact not a final approval in any manner and it was subject to certain terms and conditions which doesn't seem to have been complied with, as no documentary proof was produced or placed on record by the project proponent. Hence, in the prevailing position it does not construe upon by the SEAC to consider the case for grant of EC without ensuring the consideration of environmental sustainability factors on priority. Moreover, the explanations given by various authorities doesn't seem adequate and sufficient in view of Hon'ble NGT order. Therefore, the SEAC felt it necessary and observe that it would not be out of context to recommend the matter to SEIAA to seek or refer the matter to office of registrar Hon'ble NGT for clear opinion in the matter in view of the fact that the proposed project is located within the MC Shimla limits.

Based on above observation after deliberating on the information submitted by the project proponent and considering the facts placed before the Committee, the SEAC decided that meanwhile the project proponent submits its compliance to following conditions the matter be simultaneously referred to SEIAA for necessary directions in view of above observations and thereafter to list the case in next meeting for appraisal:

1. The project proponent shall submit all the documents related to compliance to the stipulations/ terms and conditions imposed by MC Shimla.
2. The project proponent shall submit the copy of the land use change order issued by the competent authority for the project.
3. The project proponent shall submit revenue records with clear demarcation of road on latima and NOC of the competent authority for use of the road in future with clear vehicular load.
4. The project proponent shall submit NOC for availability of water issued by the competent authority i.e. Commissioner, MC, Shimla/ SJPN afresh.
5. The Committee will discuss the opinion of AG Office in its next meeting.
6. The project proponent shall submit the comprehensive muck management plan.
7. The project proponent shall submit the comprehensive drainage plan.
8. The project proponent shall submit assessment report on geo safety, earth safety of the project construction site.

The matter was considered in the 53rd meeting of the SEIAA, Expert Member (TCP & Housing & Building Sector) cum the Vice-Chairman SEAC was also specially invited to attend the meeting of SEIAA and explain the entire position with regard to the earlier conditional approval given by the MC Shimla on dated 14-12-2016. This approval of MC had laid down certain conditions which were very critical and approval of the Director TCP was required before the permission of the MC could become effective, these conditions were not complied with before the order of Hon'ble NGT passed on 16-11-2017 as mentioned by the SEAC in proceedings of 80th meeting. The Environmental Clearance was also pre requisite in 2016 and 2017 for this project and factually the project proponent did not apply for the same during or prior to the Hon'ble NGT order dated 16-11-2017 in the matter of Yogindra Mohan Sengupta Vs. Union of India & Others in OA No. 121 of 2014. The Hon'ble NGT has specifically ordered (Refer Para 112-111) and has given specific directions by restricting the construction of new buildings to 2 storeys plus attic floor and no relaxation is available for commercial, private builder and any such allied buildings. The matter needs to be examined whether any case which was not pending before the SEIAA can be considered for any relaxation under any of the relaxation provisions in the order of the Hon'ble NGT or not.

The SEIAA after deliberating on the information decided to ascertain the clarification from Department of TCP and Ld. AG on above.

Accordingly the matter was referred to the respective offices by SEIAA. As per opinion of Ld. Advocate General, Himachal Pradesh High Court vide letter dated 1-14/2018-44193 dated 27.11.2021, it has been clarified that

".....the Learned National Green Tribunal order restricting the number of storeys came towards the end of 2017. The order cannot be applied retrospectively. Apart from that SEAC is supposed to apply its mind independently on the environmental issues uninfluenced by any other consideration. The other aspects are required to be taken care by the authorities who have been assigned that job. My opinion is clear on all the aspects on which it was sought and I am not

obligated to render my opinion to SEAC. Every authority is supposed to act within its bounds and that equally applies to all including SEAC...."

And as per opinion of Director, TCP, Himachal Pradesh vide letter dated HIM/TP/APT/LIC-C.K. Baljee/2015/-4721, Dated: 08.10.2021, it was informed that:

"With reference to the captioned subject and your office letter under reference, it is apprised that the instant matter of Sh. C.K. Baljee, Chairman & Managing Director for project proposal "Resort & Mountain Homes at Bharari Village", Bharari-Kuffer link road, Shimla at Khasra no. 7 & 8 at village Bharari, Tehsil & District Shimla, has been duly considered and approved by the Competent Authorities i.e. Municipal Corporation, Shimla and Town and Country Planning Department as per opinion rendered by the Ld. Advocate General, Himachal Pradesh w.r.t. the implications of the order of the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal dated 16.11.2017 in the matter of OA No. 121/2014 titled as "Yogendra Mohan Sengupta Vs. Union of India and others."

The drawings of the residential project were considered and approved by the Municipal Corporation, Shimla on 14.12.2016 and forwarded to TCP Department for according final approval and issuance of License. After scrutinizing, the case was placed in the 13th meeting of the Committee constituted by the Government for scrutinizing and recommending the cases relating to Apartments/Colonies held on 17.04.2017 under the Chairmanship of Director (TCP) and case was approved by the Committee In-principle for issuance of License. (Copy of Proceedings enclosed at Annexure-A).

Also, it is pertinent to mention here that the case of the applicant was also placed before the 'High-powered Expert Committee', i.e. the 'Implementation Committee' and the 'Supervisory Committee', constituted in pursuance to the order para 112 (XVII) of the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal dated 16.11.2017. The instant case was placed in 13th Meeting of Implementation Committee held on 09.07.2019 and recommended to the Supervisor Committee. Subsequently, the case was considered and approved by the Supervisory Committee in its 5th Meeting held on 25.07.2019, keeping in view the clarifications issued by State Govt. on 01.02.2018 and 24.10.2019 and the subsequent opinion rendered by the Ld. Advocate General, Himachal Pradesh vide letter dated 16.05.2019. Copy of the proceedings of both the meetings of the 'High-powered Expert Committee' and the Opinion rendered by the Ld. Advocate General, Himachal Pradesh are enclosed herewith at Annexure-B & C respectively, for information and further necessary action, please."

On request application from the project proponent, the Committee listed the matter in its 82nd meeting and further asked the project proponent to submit the compliance through online portal for further necessary action in the matter. The pp submitted the compliance to SEIAA on dated 12.11.2021.

The case was again listed before the SEAC in its 83rd meeting. After deliberating on the information submitted by the project proponent and after detailed deliberation on clarification rendered by the TCP department and Ld. AG. The SEAC appraised the case application and decided to list the case in next meeting after compliance of the following observations:

1. The project proponent shall submit the details of proposed STP with capacity and treatment proposed.
2. The project proponent shall submit detailed muck management plan with contour plans.
3. The project proponent shall submit detailed energy equipment and energy saving plan using green energy concepts.
4. The project proponent shall submit solid waste management disposal plan with quantification.
5. The project proponent shall submit contingent plan for holding the waste water in case failure of STP.
6. The project proponent shall submit complete action plan under EMP and CER with budget estimate.

The case application was again listed before the SEAC in its 85th Meeting held on 19-20 July, 2022.

A letter/representation from Mr. Mudit Dixit 138, Ground floor, Woodstock Floors, Nirvana Country, Sector 50, Gurgaon, 122018 was received in this office on dated 18.12.2021 against granting unlawful clearance to proposal no. SIA/HP/MIS/184041/2020, HP SEIAA/2020-781 in relation to project located at khasra number 7 & 8 at village-Bharari, Tehsil-& District-Shimla, Himachal Pradesh. It was observed that the matter had been examined by HP SEIAA Secretariat and same was forwarded to Director, Town and Country Planning Department and the Commissioner, Municipal Commissioner in the month of January, 2022 for point wise comments in annotated form for taking further necessary action in the matter please, the reply was yet to be received. The SEAC also examined another similar representation submitted by Ms. Nidhi Trivedi and observed that the reply from TCP & MC Shimla has yet not been received and the same may be awaited.

The SEAC, after deliberating on the matter reserved its decisions on the application till the receipt of comments from the Director, Town and Country Planning Department and the Commissioner, Municipal Commissioner on the representation of Mr. Mudit Dixit as asked for by HPSEIAA.

The SEIAA after deliberating upon the matter decided that:

1. The Member Secretary, SEIAA shall convene a meeting with Director, Town and Country Planning Department and Commissioner, Municipal Corporation Shimla w.r.t.:
 - a) To furnish the comments on the representation of Mr. Mudit Dixit within 15 days.
 - b) To ascertain the position of the case considering the facts that its permission for maps was granted in year 2016 where as the project proponent has applied for grant of EC in the year 2020 viz-a-viz implication to Hon'ble NGT Order dated 16.11.2017

The authority was apprised that, as per the decision of the SEIAA in 58th a meeting under the chairmanship of the Director (DEST) has been convened on dated 23/8/2022. The minutes of the meeting were placed before the Authority.

Accordingly, the matter was listed before SEIAA in its 59th meeting; the Authority examined the report of the Committee as above and decided that:

1. The report may be placed before the SEAC for its appraisal and further recommendations in the matter as reserved in its 83rd & 85th meetings.

After submission of the compliances to the observations made by SEAC, the case was listed before the SEAC in its 87th meeting. The SEAC apprised the case for Environment Clearance as per EIA Notification 2006 provisions and observed that the project proponent has fulfilled all the requisite codal formalities/ measures for environment management. The SEAC noted the report/proceedings of the meeting held w.r.t. complaint of Mr. Mudit Dixit and others. The SEAC also perused the letter of Advocate General, Letters of TCP, MC so issued to project proponent and different authorities from time to time in the matter.

Keeping in view the reports observations etc. and letters, report of Committee, SEAC observed that:

- a) The project is clear from Environmental Management point and all necessary measures are taken care of through EMP and CER.
- b) The SEIAA may consider the application while considering the Hon'ble NGT Order dated 16.11.2017 in the matter of OA No. 121/2014 titled as "Yogendra Mohan Sengupta Vs. Union of India and others and subsequent Orders of Hon'ble High Court and letters, reports, observations and clarification of other concerned authorities and the project proponent as may be applicable to this project with following special conditions:
 - i. The project proponent shall not undertake any alteration in the scope of work area without prior approval from SEIAA. Any change in project design, building design, floor plan shall be got approved from SEIAA, Himachal Pradesh.
 - ii. The project proponent shall undertake a fresh detailed hydrological study of the project area in order to ascertain the suitable location for collecting the storm water and rain water, channelization of drainages and submit it to SEIAA in four months.
 - iii. The SJPN shall ensure the supply of water as per NOC for availability of water issued by the competent authority i.e. Commissioner, MC, Shimla/ SJPN without putting any pressure on existing water supply/ demand of local communities already residing in the vicinity, in case required the SJPN shall augment separate water supply line for the project.
 - iv. The project proponent shall meet out its 50 % requirement of water supply from rain water harvesting and treated waste water as per proposal.
 - v. The natural drain system should be maintained for ensuring unrestricted flow of water. No construction shall be allowed to obstruct the natural drainage through the site, on water bodies. Check dams, bio-swales, landscape, and other sustainable urban drainage systems (SUDS) are allowed for maintaining the drainage pattern and to harvest rain water. Buildings shall be designed to follow the natural topography as much as possible. Minimum cutting and filling should be done. The PP shall submit drainage, discharge map of the proposed construction project.
 - vi. The rainwater from the rooftop shall be collected in a rainwater harvesting tank proposed within the site. The harvested rain water shall be reused within the premises after necessary treatment for removal of suspended solids.
 - vii. The rain water harvesting storage capacity shall be rationalized w.r.t. potential and usage and the project proponent shall ensure that the rain water use shall be made for flushing gardening and other non-drinking purposes.
 - viii. The project proponent in order to maintain the cleanliness, housekeeping to avoid chocking of sewer line etc.
 - ix. In order to avoid traffic congestion due to tourist influx, the project proponent shall provide passage in the form of slip roads along the main connecting roads, detailed plan shall be submitted accordingly.
 - x. The project proponent shall ensure not to obstruct village path and roads, if any crossing through their premises.
 - xi. The project proponent shall ensure the disposal of non-recyclable non-biodegradable waste scientifically at its own level.

The SEIAAA in its 60th meeting approved that MS, SEIAA shall issue corrections/corrigendum as per the directions received from the MoEF&CC, GoI vide Office Memorandum vide No. IA3-19/95/2021-IA-III dated 17/1/2023.

ITEM No. 6. Transfer of EC.

6.1 Smt. Ranjit Kaur Proprietor M/s Tripti Stone Crusher, Mauza Deoli & Behali Tehsil Nalagarh District Solan Himachal Pradesh -174101

An application has been received from Smt. Ranjit Kaur Proprietor M/s Tripti Stone Crusher, Mauza Deoli & Behali Tehsil Nalagarh District Solan Himachal Pradesh -174101 vide proposal No SIA/HP/MIN/291740/2022 requesting to transfer Environment Clearance in her name, issued earlier vide letter no. HPSEIAA/2021/862-1730-37 dated 24.09.2021 in the name of Sh. Kripal Singh proprietor M/s Tripti Stone Crusher, Village Nayagram, P.O. Jhajra, Tehsil Nalagarh, District Solan, HP.

The SEIAA in its 60th meeting approved the transfer of EC in favour of the applicant.

6.2 M/s Trident Industries, Village Gadiyara, P.O. Jalari, Tehsil Nadaun, District Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh

An application has been received from M/s Trident Industries, Village Gadiyara, P.O. Jalari, Tehsil Nadaun, District Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh vide proposal No SIA/HP/MIN/293806/2022 requesting to transfer Environment Clearance in his name, issued earlier vide letter no. HPSEIAA/2015/385-513-521 Dated: 01.07.2021, issued in favor of Sh. Vijender Jain, S/o Sh. Sudershan Jain, Prop. M/s Deepika Stone Crusher, Village Seri P.O. & Tehsil Nadaun, Distt. Hamirpur H.P.

The SEIAA in its 60th meeting approved the transfer of EC in favour of the applicant.

The SEIAA decided that in future all such cases be examined by the Member Secretary (SEIAA) as per provision of EIA Notification 2006 and issue the necessary transfer letter. The cases be brought before SEIAA ex-post-facto.

ITEM No. 7. Discussions

7.1 Representation by Dr. Banta regarding Compliance of order dated 15.09.2022 passed by Hon'ble NGT, Principal Bench, New Delhi in MA No. 57/2022 in disposed OA no. 55 of 2020 titled as Dr. Pawan Kumar Banta Vs. Union of India & Ors.

A representation has been received from Dr. Banta. In this regard, in order to ascertain the facts w.r.t. allegations made by Dr. Pawan Kumar Banta received in this office, the case was listed in 59th meeting of HP SEIAA held on 28th September, 2022 at DEST office with following directions:-

.....the matter was placed before the SEAC in 86th meeting for decision. The Committee observed that as such as on date no action is pending before committee and there is no pendency at the level of SEAC. More over the SEAC has no jurisdiction over monitoring the change in feature of the project; the same is to be looked into by concerned authority i.e. SPCB or TCP OR MC. The Committee observed that the SEIAA may take necessary action as deem fit in the matter.

.....Therefore, the matter was listed before SEIAA in its 59th meeting; the Authority examined the matter as per the observations of the SEAC in its 86th meeting and in view of the Hon'ble NGT orders dated 14/9/2022. The SEIAA examined the matter and noted that the matter is sub judice before the Hon'ble High Court of Himachal Pradesh. The same has also been observed by the Hon'ble NGT orders dated 14/9/2022. It was also decided that the Member Secretary (SEIAA) will issue a show cause notice to M/s Nirvana Woods & Hotels Pvt. Ltd. to reply to the allegations made of non-compliance of the Terms & Conditions of Environment Clearance granted. The matter will be discussed further by the SEIAA after receiving the reply of M/s Nirvana Woods & Hotels Pvt. Ltd. to this show cause notice.

Then after, a notice was issued to M/s Nirvana Woods & Hotels Private Limited vide this office letter dated 06.11.2022. The reply of notice was received in this office vide their letter dated 08.12.2022.

Earlier a committee comprising of different officials from concerned Department's were constituted under the chairmanship of SDM (C), Rural, Shimla in order to ascertain the facts w.r.t. allegations received through email on dated 18.04.2022 from Sh. Anil Thakur, Kyari Gramin Kalyan Sabha, Shimla regarding illegal and unauthorized construction by M/s Nirvana Woods and Hotels Pvt. Limited in khasra number-2 of village Rirka which is a Nallah as per revenue record and the debris which is being thrown in to the Nallah by the project proponent is coming down and hitting the people including children and creating damage to the property of villagers.

Now, this office has received a report from SDM(Civil), Shimla, Rural vide letter dated SML-SDM-Reader-21/02 dated 04.01.2023, stating that:

..... the spot visit was fixed for 1st October, 2022 along with the members/representatives as per the term of of reference to the committee to give a clear cut blockage/encroachment on the Nallah in Khasra no. 2 of village Rirka Shimla. It is submitted that in this behalf the alleged project is under construction and the Nallah as reflected in the revenue records has been developed by concretization on both sides under their possession. There is no such blockage/encroachment on the face of it. The nallah has been developed according to the construction plan as put out by the project report the issue on representatives on spot for the overall safety of the structures. It is pertinent to mention here that as per the report of patwari the existing nallah is in running condition. The nallah has been preserved as such looking into the flow of water and concretization has been done on the edges.

.....During the course of deliberation on the spot regarding side cutting, dumping and preservation of strata was discussed and the project authorities were instructed to duly comply with the norms without fail to ensure that downstream no harm is caused in any manner during the seasonal fluctuating flow of water in the nallah. That remedial actions need to be taken during the construction period to ensure that no further damage is caused to life and property. The nallah measures around 3 mtr in width and the retaining wall has been brought

up for proper channelization of nallah. There is no visible blockage over the nallah. The construction is visibly a few meters beyond the retaining wall as can be seen in the photographs. The only caution which is required would be to ensure that the seasonal flow is properly maintained as it will fluctuate depending upon the season and also accounting for any untoward incident which may accompany like mudslide or debris flow.

The SEAC in its 88th meeting reviewed the report and observed that no violation is reported by the Committee.

The SEIAA in its 60th meeting deliberated upon the matter and decided that Member Secretary-cum-Director (DEST) may take appropriate action in the matter as deems fit in accordance with regulatory provisions.

7.2 Regarding issuance of standard TOR's to Sh. Om Prakash (SIA/HP/MIN/400230/2022, HPSEIAA/2022-998), R/o Vill. Ariyan Wala, P.O. Malakpur Bangran, Tehsil Bilaspur, District Yamuna Nagar, Haryana

A PUC has been received from Sh. Apoorv Devgan, IAS, Member Secretary, HPSPCB, Him Parivesh, Phase-III, New Shimla-171009, regarding conducting of Environment Public Hearing on the proposal submitted by Sh. Om Prakash, R/o Vill. Ariyan Wala, P.O. Malakpur Bangran, Tehsil Bilaspur, District Yamuna Nagar, Haryana for mining/extraction of Sand, Stone and Bajri located at Khasra No. 376/250/228, Measuring 03-91-12 Hectares (Private land, River Bed), falling Mauza/Mohal Bangran, Tehsil Paonta Sahib, District Sirmaur, Himachal Pradesh on 18.01.2023 as per the provisions of EIA, 2006.

As per the provision of circular issued by MoEF&CC vide OM No. 291 dated 06/05/2022 (the auto TOR has been issued to the PP online on predefined standard format.

The SEAC in its 88th meeting deliberated on the issuance of Standard TORs. The SEAC observed that standard TOR has been generated online as per the provision of OM No. 291 dated 06/05/2022 issued by MoEF&CC. The SEAC recommended that, if required, Standard TOR letter may also be issued from SEIAA in favour of the project proponents issued auto TOR.

The SEIAA in its 60th meeting approved to issue Standard TOR letter in favour of the project proponents issued auto TOR on parivesh portal online.

ITEM No. 8: Additional Discussions and Decisions

1. It is recommended that in case of auction land it is desirable that the due diligence is already done in order to ensure that sustainable plans are prepared for restoration and replenishment etc. before grant of Letter of Intent as per the requirement of provisions under MoEF&CC, GoI sand mining guidelines-2020.
2. In order to prepare the plan for spending the amount under CER following shall also be included:
 - a) The hoardings shall be placed in project affected area in Hindi & English language for sensitization of general public w.r.t. ban on Single Use Plastic and its ill effects.
 - b) The local level fair & festivals stall on SUP ban shall be placed wherever required.
 - c) The possibility of breaking supply chain of SUP shall also be explored at the local level.
 - d) The provision for supplying pattal & duna making machines may be continued wherever required.
3. In future, Gram Sabha NOC shall also be included in brief outline of the project categorically.
