## PART-II STATUS OF COMPLIANCE &

# PART-III DETAILED MONITORING REPORT

The project envisages the construction of concrete gravity dam of 66 meter height from foundation level from Ravi River near village Bajoli and surface power house near village-Holi in Chamba district for generation of 180 MW electricity. This is run of the river scheme. The length of HRT is 15.56 km. The length of reservoir is 2.42 km. FRL is 2018.25 meter and MDDL is 2012.00 meter. Live storage is 0.92 MCM. The total requirement of the land is 85.70 hectare out of which 75.23 hectare is forest land, 0.90 is horticulture land and 9.57 ha. is private land. In all there are 288 project affected families(PAF's) whose land will be acquired permanently and 2 PAF's who will lose land as well as house. The rehabilitation and resettlement of project affected persons will be implemented as per NRRP, 2007. The construction work is in initial phase. The construction has been started at few approach roads and concrete protection walls have been constructed on all the dumping sites towards the river bank to give the protection before starting muck dumping. The project will likely be commissioned in February, 2018.

The approval from MOEF for the diversion of forest land for the project under FC Act, 1980 has been accorded on 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2012. The PA has been asked to submit a copy of the Forest approval letter.

The PA has informed that the draft of R &R Plan has been prepared by the project authorities and submitted to DC, Chamba for approval. Final approval for R & R Plan is yet to be received from State Govt. of H.P.

(iv)	The following commitments made during the public hearing meeting should be fulfilled:-	Being complied

It is informed by PA that for appointment of doctors, advertisement was given in local newspapers in May, 2011 and again on dated 24<sup>th</sup> January, 2012 and intimation was given to local Employment Exchange but no suitable candidate has responded so far due to remote location of the project. It is however decided that until a regular doctor is appointed, regular medical check up of the workers will be done with the help of doctors from local dispensaries. It is further informed that the Company is providing assistance for training to locals who successfully passed ITI course. Work on existing Holi Nayaram road is yet to be started as the same has not been handed over by State Govt. to GMR.

The project authorities have assured to comply the condition related to environment flow to 20% of the average lean season flow of 90% dependable year for consequent leanest months. The compliance of this condition will be monitored by this office from time to time.

(VI) Biodiversity Conservation and Management plan as proposed in EMP should be implemented in totality. From the study area 272 flowering plant species were recorded which include 28 trees, 48 shrubs, 10 climbers and 186 herbs. However, listing of bryophytes/ pteridophytes has not been done. This may be done and submitted within 3 months.

It is informed by the PA that **Biodiversity Conservation and Management plan** will be implemented by the State Forest Deptt. However, the work is yet to be started. It is further informed that listing of bryophytes and pteridophytes has been completed and submitted to Ministry in January, 2011.

(vii) Fisheries Conservation and Management plan as proposed in EMP should be undertaken in consultation with Fisheries Department, Govt. of H.P. The upgradation of existing facilities of Fish Farm at Holi in Chamba distt. should also be done to meet the demand of fish seeds.

It is informed that the funds to the tune of Rs.153.75 lacs have been deposited by the PA to H.P Fisheries Deptt. to prepare **Fisheries Conservation and Management plan** and to implement it. The Fisheries Deptt. is yet to be provide the Plan to the PA. The PA has been asked to pursue the matter with the State Fisheries Deptt. to get the Plan finalized.

(viii) All the equipments which are likely to generate high noise levels are to be fully mollified(noise reduction measures).

The project authorities have assured to comply the condition in due course of time. The compliance of the condition will be monitored by this office from time to time.

(ix) Consolidation and compilation of muck should be carried out in muck dumping sites and the dumping sites should be above high flood level. The proposed plan envisages generation of total volume of muck as 21.64 lac cumec(including 40% swell factor). Out of which 9.32 lac of muck will be utilized as construction material for various project components and 12.32 lac cumec of muck will be disposed off at predesignated seven number of dumping sites.

It is gathered that total volume of muck is estimated as 21.64 lacs cum (including 40% swell factor). It will be handled in following manner:-

- About 25% of the muck from under ground works and 60% of the muck from surface works will be utilized—9.32 lacs cumec.
- Total quantity of muck requiring disposal will be 12.32 lacs cumec.
- There are total 7 dumping sites which have the capacity to the tune of 15.31 lacs cumec. These muck duping sites are identified under guidance and in consultation with SPCB with due regard to local environment in three rounds of presentation before SPCB and site visits of their officials. Out of total 7 dumping sites, 2 sites will be used for construction of facilities works later.
- Total area of these sites is 20.347 ha. as per the proposal submitted for diversion of case and complete area comes under forest land.
- All these sites will be rehabilitated as per SPCB/Govt. of H.P directives and some portion of this reclaimed land handed back to Govt. of H.P after construction of the project.
- All the muck disposal sites are located at least 5 meter above HFL wherever possible which is based on SPCB, Govt. of H.P guidelines and as directed by them during the presentations to this aspect.

(x) Greenbelt development is proposed around project area, reservoir periphery(12 hectare), road side(13.8 hectare) and other components. The average width of green belt around reservoir rim will be around 40 meter varying about 15 meter at places to 120 meters or as physiographic and land features allow. The allocated amount of Rs.9.28 lacs for green belt development should strictly be used for the purpose.

The project authorities have assured to comply the condition in due course of time. The compliance of the condition will be monitored by this office from time to time.

(xi) The environment clearance does not necessarily imply that forest clearance shall be granted to the project and the proposals for the forestry clearances shall be considered by respective authorities on their merits. The investment made in the project if any, based on environmental clearance so granted, shall be entirely at the cost and risk of the project proponent.

The PA has noted this and assured to comply.

The project construction work is just started. There are about 80 workers on different project site. To provide mess facility, drinking water and medical facilities to the workers is the responsibility of the contractor. The PA has been asked to submit the information about no. of workers engaged by different contractors, free fuel supplied or utilized and expenditure incurred from time to time.

There is no need to establish any fuel depot at site to provide fuel. It is confirmed by the PA that there is no complaint from any where for cutting of any tree for cooking the food by the workers.

The PA has assured to start engaging the workers on the construction sites only after thoroughly examining by health personnel and issuing work permits. The PA has been asked to forward the copies of such permits to this office for our record.

There are 7 identified dumping sites. The quantity of muck to be generated, the quantity of muck to be utilized, the quantity of muck to be dumped has been elaborated under condition no.(ix) of Specific Conditions above. As the main construction work has not been started yet, no muck is generated till date. However, the PA has already constructed concrete protection walls towards river bank side in advance so that the muck to be dumped in future will be fully stored and will not overflow in the river. It is further assured by the PA that the dumping sites will be levelled and consolidated simultaneously. However, the implementation of this condition will be monitored during the construction phase of the project.

The PA has accepted the responsibility of implementation of all the environment safeguards. However, the implementation of environmental safeguards will be monitored by this office from time to time.

(6) The total amount of Rs.15603.28 lacs kept in the budgetary provisions for implementation of environmental management plan should be strictly adhered and not to be diverted for any other purpose.

Being complied

The PA has already allocated funds to the tune of Rs.15603.28 for implementation of EMP's as per details given in condition no.(v) above. It has also been assured that the funds allocated for compliance of EMP's will be utilized for this purpose only and no funds will be diverted for any other purpose. However, the implementation of environmental safeguards will be monitored by this office from time to time.

(7) In case of any change in the scope of the project, the project would require fresh appraisal.

There is no change of scope in the project so far. However, the PA has assured that in case of change of scope, the project authority will move the case for fresh appraisal.

(8) The Ministry reserves the right to add additional safeguard measures subsequently, if found necessary and to take action including revoking of the clearance under the provisions of EPA, 1986 to ensure effective implementation of suggested safeguard measures in a time bound and satisfactory manner.

It is upto the Ministry to decide to add additional condition in the EC on the basis of compliance status of the project from time to time. However, there is no recommendation from the Regional Office so far for adding more condition.

(9) The clearance letter is valid for a period of 10 years from the date of issue of this letter for commencement of construction work.

The project authorities have already started the construction work at project site. Hence, the environment clearance validity is already complied.

(10) The clearance letter should be displayed in Zila Being complied Parishad office and concerned panchayat.

This condition has been duly complied by the Project authorities.
