- 2. That, he /they shall comply with the requirements of rule 14 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986; rules 4,5,7,9,10 and 11 of the Hazardous Wastes (Management and Handling), Rules 1989; rules 4,5,7,8,10,11,12,13,15,17 and 18 of the Manufacture, Storage and Import of Hazardous Chemical Rules, 1989; and the provisions of the Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991,whichever is applicable;

- 1 That, he/they shall not make any alteration, addition, deletion or modification in the plant without the prior clearance from the Board and shall also abide by the obligations under sections 22,23 and 31A of the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and further shall extend co-operation to the Board in performing its functions entrusted under sections 24,25 and 26 of the Act;
- 2 That, he /they shall comply with the requirements of rule 14 of the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986; rules 4,5,7,9,10 and 11 of the Hazardous Wastes (Management and Handling), Rules 1989; rules 4,5,7,8,10,11,12,13,15,17 and 18 of the Manufacture, Storage and Import of Hazardous Chemical Rules, 1989; and the provisions of the Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991,whichever is applicable;
- 3 That, he/they shall monitor his/their emission(s) and the ambient air quality from representative point regularly and shall maintain its quality in conformity with Board's standards and shall produce its proof, as and when asked for;
- 4 That, he/they shall submit application for consent again 30 days before the expiration of the period of consent.
- 5 That, the occupier shall submit stack emission report every year during the period of consent order.
- 6 That, the D.G set should be provided with an integral acoustic enclosure and the maximum permissible sound pressure level for new D.G set shall be 75dB(A) at 1 meter from the enclosure surface.
- 7 That, the minimum height of stack for exhaust emission to be provided with D.G set shall be 1.0 meter more than the height of the building where it is installed.
- 8 The bio-degradable waste shall be processed, treated and disposed off through compositing or bio-methanation within the premises as far as possible. The residual waste shall be given to the waste collectors or agency as directed by the local body.
- 9 That, the unit shall submit Environmental Statement by Sept. every year;
- 10 That, tree plantation shall be done in space available in the complex;

- 3. M/s Darbhanga Medical College Hospital, Laheriasarai, Darbhanga is hereby authorised for handling of bio-medical wastes as per the capacity given below:

 - (iii) Installed treatment and disposal capacity N.A Kg per day
 - (iv) Area or distance covered by CBMWTF N.A
 - (v) Quantity of bio-medical waste handled, treated or disposal : 954.66 Kg/day

- 4. This authorisation shall be in force for a period of five years from the date of issue or till the validity of Consent-to-Operate (granted) whichever is earlier.
- This Authorisation is subject to the conditions stated below and to such other conditions as may be specified in the rules for the time being in force the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

Terms and Conditions of authorization

- 1. The authorized shall comply with the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules made there under.
- 2. The authorization or its renewal shall be produced for inspection at the request of an officer authorised by the prescribed authority.
- 3. The person authorized shall not rent, lend, sell, transfer or otherwise transport the bio medical wastes without obtaining prior permission of the prescribed authority.
- 4. Any unauthorized change in personnel, equipment or working conditions as mentioned in the application by the person authorised shall constitute a breach of his authorisation.
- It is the duty of the authorised person to take prior permission of the prescribed authority to close down the facility and such other terms and conditions may be stipulated by the prescribed authority.
- 6. The occupier shall obtain Discharge Consent under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 from this Board.

- 7. It is the duty of occupier to take all necessary steps to ensure that bio-medical waste is handled without any adverse effect to human health and the environment and in accordance with these rules;
 - The Occupier shall strictly comply with the provisions of these rules and in no case they are expected to dispose of any waste on roadside or at any unauthorised place under any circumstances;
 - 9. Provision shall be made within the premises for a safe, ventilated and secured location for storage of segregated biomedical waste in coloured bags or containers in the manner as specified in Schedule- I, to ensure that there shall be no secondary handling, pilferage of recyclables or inadvertent scattering or spillage by animals and the bio-medical waste from such place or premises shall be directly transported in the manner as prescribed in these rules to the common bio-medical waste treatment facility or for the appropriate treatment and disposal, as the case may be, in the manner as prescribed in Schedule- I;
 - 10. The Occupier shall treat and dispose the bio-medical waste through Common Bio-medical Waste Treatment Facility of the area concerned i.e. (*M/s Medicare Environmental Management (P) Ltd. Industrial Area, Bela, Muzaffarpur*) for proper treatment and disposal of the bio-medical wastes;
 - 11. Pre-treatment of the laboratory waste, microbiological waste, blood samples and blood bags through disinfection or sterilisation on-site shall be ensured in the manner as prescribed by the World Health Organisation (WHO)or National AIDs Control Organisation (NACO) guidelines and then sent to the common bio-medical waste treatment facility for final disposal;
 - 12. Chlorinated plastic bags, gloves and blood bags shall be phased out by the 27th of March, 2018;
 - 13. Treated bio-medical waste shall not be given with municipal solid waste;
 - 14. Training to all health care workers and others, involved in handling of bio medical waste at the time of induction and thereafter at least once every year shall be provided and the details of training programmes conducted, number of personnel trained and number of personnel not undergone any training shall be provided in the Annual Report;
 - 15. All health care workers and others, involved in handling of bio-medical waste shall be immunised for protection against diseases including Hepatitis B and Tetanus that are likely to be transmitted by handling of bio-medical waste, in the manner as prescribed in the National Immunisation Policy or the guidelines of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare issued from time to time;
 - 16. Bar-Code System shall be established for bags or containers containing bio-medical waste to be sent out of the premises or place for any purpose.
 - 17. Segregation of liquid chemical waste shall be ensured at source and pre-treatment or neutralisation prior to mixing with other effluent generated from health care facilities shall also be ensured;
 - 18. Treatment and disposal of liquid waste in accordance with the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 (6 of 1974) shall be ensured;
 - 19. Occupational safety of all its health care workers and others involved in handling of bio- medical waste shall be ensured by providing appropriate and adequate personal protective equipments;
 - 20. Health check up at the time of induction and at least once in a year shall be conducted for all its health care workers and others involve in handling of bio- medical waste and records for the same shall be maintained;
 - 21. Bio-medical waste management register shall be maintained and updated on day to day basis and monthly record of the same shall be displayed on its website according to the bio-medical waste generated, treated and disposed in terms of category and colour coding as specified in Schedule I;
 - 22. Major accidents, if any including accidents caused by fire hazards, blasts during handling of biomedical waste, and the remedial action taken and the records relevant there to shall be reported, (including nil report) in Format I to the prescribed authority and also along with the annual report;
 - 23. The Annual Report in Form IV shall be submitted to the Prescribed Authority i.e. Bihar State Pollution Control Board on or before the 30th June of every year;
 - 24. Annual report shall also be made available on the web-site of the Unit and website of the Health Care Facility shall be made latest by the 27th of March, 2018;
 - 25. The prescribed authority shall be informed immediately in case the operator of a facility does not collect the bio-medical waste within the intended time or as per the agreed time;

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26. A system shall be established to review and monitor the activities related to bio-medical waste management, either through an existing committee or by forming a new committee and the Committee shall meet once in every six months and the record of the minutes of the meetings of this committee shall be submitted along with the annual report to the prescribed authority and the health care establishments having less than thirty beds shall designate qualified person to review and monitor the activities relating to bio-medical waste management within that establishment and submit the annual report

- 27. Adequate fire protection equipment (such as smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, sand buckets, fire alarm, water sprinklers *etc.*) at salient places within the premises even at bio-medical storage area in accordance with the fire safety regulation shall be installed. Required certificate from fire safety department shall be obtained by the occupier.
- 28. Proper management of mercury bearing waste in environmentally sound manner shall be ensured as per the guidelines notified for the purpose by CPCB
- 29. All records shall be maintained for a period of five years; Other Conditions:
- 30. The general domestic solid waste generated shall be segregated and stored in three separate streams namely bio-degradable, recyclable and other wastes in suitable green, white and black coloured bins respectively;
- 31. Sanitary Waste like diapers, sanitary pads, etc. to be wrapped securely in the pouches provided by the manufacturers or in a suitable wrapping material before placing the same in the bin meant for dry waste or non-recyclable waste;
- 32. The construction and demolition waste such as building materials debris, rubble waste resulting from construction, re-modeling, repair and demolition of any civil structure, when generated shall be stored in its own premises and shall be disposed off as per the Construction and Demolition Waste Management Rules, 2016;
- 33. The Horticulture Waste and Garden Waste should be stored in its own premises and disposed of as per the directions of local authority time to time;
- 34. No Solid Waste should be thrown, burnt, or buried on streets, open public spaces outside its premises or in the drain or water bodies;
- 35. Recyclable material shall be handed over to either the authorised waste pickers or the authorised recyclers;
- 36. The bio-degradable waste shall be processed, treated and disposed off through composting or bio-methanation within the premises as far as possible. The residual wastes shall be given to the waste collectors or agency as directed by the local body;
- 37. Carry bags made of recycled plastic or products made of recycled plastic shall not be used for storing, carrying, dispensing or packaging ready to eat or drink food stuff;
- 38. Plastic Carry bags, plastic sheet or like less than fifty microns in thickness shall not be used;
- 39. All steps should be taken to minimize the generation of plastic waste, segregate plastic wastes at source in accordance with the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 and handover segregated waste to Urban Local Body or Gram Panchayat or agencies appointed by them or registered waste pickers, registered recyclers or waste collection agencies;
- 40. The unit shall ensure that e-waste generated by them is channelized through collection centre or dealer of authorized producer or dismantler or recycler or through the designated take back service provider of the producer to authorized dismantler or recycler;
- 41. It shall be ensured that such end-of-life electrical and electronic equipment are not admixed with e-waste containing radioactive material as covered under the provisions of the Atomic Energy Act, 1962 (33 of 1962) and rules made there under;
- 42. They shall maintain records of e-waste generated by them in Form-2 of the e-Waste Management Rules, 2016 and make such records available for scrutiny by the State Pollution Control Board (*If the Health Care Facility is having a turnover of more than one crore or have more than twenty employees*);
- 43. They shall file annual returns in Form-3 of the e-Waste Management Rules, 2016 to the State Pollution Control Board on or before the 30th day of June following the financial year to which that return relates (*If the Health Care Facility is having a turnover of more than one crore or have more than twenty employees*);
- 44. The unit may store the e-waste for a period not exceeding one hundred and eighty days and shall maintain a record of collection, sale, transfer and storage of wastes and make these records available for inspection;

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- 45. The Unit shall ensure that used Lead Acid Batteries or components are not disposed of in any manner other than depositing with the dealer, manufacturer, importer, assembler, registered recycler, reconditioner, or at the designated collection centres. A record of which shall be maintained by the Unit
- 46. The construction and demolition waste to be kept within the premise or get the waste deposited at collection centre so made by the local body or hand over it to the authorised processing facilities of construction and demolition waste; and ensure that there is no littering or deposition of construction and demolition waste so as to prevent obstruction to the traffic or the public or drains.
- 47. User fee / Relevant charges for the collection, transportation, processing, and disposal of general solid waste, plastic waste, construction and demolition waste, *etc.* are to be paid as specified by the local bodies.
