REVISED GUIDELINES FOR PREPARATION OF SITE-SPECIFIC WILDLIFE CONSERVATION PLAN

INTRODUCTION- During course of establishment of various developmental projects or expansion of existing projects a condition to prepare Site Specific Wildlife Conservation Plan (SSWLCP) is imposed by Government of India/State Government. This condition is imposed as part of Forest Land diversion clearance or Environmental Clearance. Aim and objective of this condition is to safeguard flora and fauna of the project area as well as in the impact area of the project by taking measures to mitigate adverse impacts of the project. Impact area is considered as area covering 10 km radius of the project.

Guidelines for Preparation of Site-Specific Wildlife Conservation Plan-

Guidelines for preparation of SSWLCP have been issued from time to time by office of PCCF Wildlife and Chief Wildlife Warden. Presently guidelines issued in the year 2015 are in operation. Basing on feedback from various stakeholders' revision of these guidelines was under active consideration. To streamline the process further and to rationalize the time taken for its preparation the following guidelines shall be followed from the date of issue of these guidelines.

Revised Guidelines-

- 1. Project Impact Area shall continue to be an area of 10 km radius from the project. However, in case of overlapping of impact area of a new project with impact area of existing project then this can be increased on the sides of non-overlap. Normally, impact area of two projects shall not overlap. In case, it is unavoidable, it shall be categorically mentioned while sending the proposal to PCCF WL and CWLW. Activities suggested in the overlapping area should be decided carefully to avoid any duplication.
- 2. In case of impact area falling in more than one division, DFO of the division having maximum area shall be the nodal DFO and shall co-ordinate and compile the SSWLCP for various divisions as proposed by them.
- 3. Duration of the plan shall be for 10 years.
- 4. In case of Forest Land diversion cases as per Forest Conservation Act,1980 and rules, on receipt of proposal in Form-I, DFO concerned make a field visit to the area for assessing the condition of forest in the area, vulnerability of the forest area for erosion and status of presence of any Rare/Endangered/Unique species of flora and fauna. Based on such field visits, details are provided in Form-II by the DFO with his recommendations. It is stipulated that at the time of site inspection by the DFO, along with inspection of forest area to be diverted, impact area of the project (10 km radius of the project or as the case may be) shall also be inspected. Such inspection shall be aimed at assessing the presence of rare, endangered flora and fauna, movement patterns of mega fauna in the area. Impacts of the project on flora and fauna and mitigative measures which need to be put in place.

of linear projects animal passage plan shall be given due importance. Crossing various faunal species should be assessed properly and locations and types of

interventions required should be decided as per requirement jointly with UA and in consultation with RCCF and should be enclosed with joint signature of DFO and UA. These details shall be mentioned in the appropriate section of form-II(7xi) either in the form itself or as an annexure to the form. Recommendations of DFO shall also specifically mention his views about need of SSWLCP for the project.

- 5. Such details along with a copy of form no I & II shall be sent to PCCF WL and CWLW at the time of forwarding of the proposal. Concerned RCCF, based on his site inspection or otherwise, if has additional points or disagreement with observations of DFO, can communicate the same to PCCF WL and CWLW for his consideration. In case, no such communication is received from RCCF at the time of forwarding of the proposal by him then it will be presumed that RCCF agrees with the observations and recommendations of the DFO.
- 6. Based on the inputs received from DFO and RCCF (if any) and as per information available with him, PCCF WL and CWLW shall give his views to Government of Odisha in F, E & CC department for taking decision about necessity or otherwise of the SSWLCP for the project.
- 7. In case, the condition for preparation of SSWLCP is imposed by Government of India/State Government, then the concerned DFO on the basis of his recommendations at the time of forwarding the proposal shall prepare the SSWLCP. For this purpose, mitigative measures suggested earlier need to be detailed and their financial implications shall be worked out. The animal passage related structures with their exact locations and dimensions shall be mentioned in the plan and the same will be executed by the User Agency. No financial cost needs to be indicated or realized from User Agency (UA) for the purpose of such structures for animal passage. Other than infrastructural items and items to be provided in kind, all funds required for implementation of SSWLCP shall be deposited by UA in CAMPA funds as per rules.
- 8. Indicative format for preparation of SSWLCP is enclosed as ANNEXURE.
- 9. Maximum time allowed to DFO for preparation of such plan shall be two weeks (one additional week's time to nodal DFO is allowed in case impact area falls in more than one division). DFO will send a copy of such plan to PCCF WL and CWLW and a copy is to be marked to RCCF and UA.
- 10. PCCF WL and CWLW shall approve such plan within two weeks of its receipt. In case it is felt necessary a meeting with UA, DFO and RCCF can be called by PCCF WLL and CWLW to finalize the plan. A copy of approved plan shall be sent to all concerned.
- 11. In case of preparation of SSWLCP under conditions imposed by EC, same procedure *mutatis mutandis* shall be followed

As in this case DFO concerned shall not have the benefit of previous site inspection etc. therefore in such cases time allowed to DFO is four weeks instead of two weeks. In case of such projects where forest land diversion is not involved, funds cannot be deposited in CAMPA A/c. In such cases at the time of submission of SSWLCP, DFO will submit a proposal to deposit funds in the A/C of "The Wildlife Society of Odisha" or other such account. Accordingly, PCCF WL and CWLW will submit proposal to Government for permission to deposit such funds.

- 12. INDICATIVE FINACIAL LIMITS- Excluding the cost of underpass/overpass or other such structures related to passage of wild animals following will be the indicative financial limits for the prescriptions of such SSWLCP.
 - a) For projects with total cost of Rs. 1000 crore or more—up to 2% of the project cost
 - b) For projects with total cost of more than Rs 500 crores but less than Rs. 1000 crore —up to 3% of the project cost or Rs 20 crore whichever is less
 - c) For projects with total cost of more than Rs 100 crores but less than Rs.500 crores—up to 4% of the project cost or Rs 15 crore whichever is less
 - d) For projects up to Rs 100 crore- up to 5% of the total project cost or Rs 4 crore whichever is less.

These are indicative maximum limits and are exclusive of infrastructural interventions like underpass/overpass to be constructed by UA.

ANNEXURE- SUGGESTED STRUCTURE OF SSWLCP

<u>Chapter-I</u> Introduction- It shall cover brief description of the project, its cost, location (beat, section and range in addition to distt, block GP etc), Nature and extent of land required. Conditions imposed in Stage -I or EC regarding SSWLCP.

<u>Chapter-II-</u> Project and Impact Area- Description of project area and its impact area covering location, land use, human habitations, flora, fauna, forests, other habitats and movement patterns of the megafauna, Wildlife corridors, HWC details in the area. Other projects or their impact area in the impact area of the project proposed.

<u>Chapter-III</u>- Probable Impacts of the Project on Flora and Fauna- Under this likely impacts of project and ancillary activities on flora and fauna and on movement of mega fauna shall be discussed.

<u>Chapter IV</u>- Mitigation Measures Required- In this mitigation measures required need to be detailed to counter the adverse impacts of the project along with its financial implication.

<u>Chapter-IV A-</u> Animal Passage Plan- In case of linear projects and other projects affecting movement of wildlife species the details of structures and their locations should be mentioned as per prescriptions of "Eco Friendly Measures to Mitigate Impacts of Linear Infrastructure on Wildlife" issued by Government of India.

<u>Chapter V-</u> Financial Implications and Monitoring- Total financial implications of proposals given and cash flow statement for 10 years (year wise) need to be given here. Also monitoring and evaluation and interim review provisions shall be mentioned.

Chapter-VI- Maps and Annexures- A topo sheet map 1:50000 scale showing project

area, Impact area, location of underpass/overpass, movement of megafauna, location of nearby Protected Areas, Wildlife Corridors etc need to be enclosed. In case of overlap of impact area with other projects an additional map showing location of existing project and its impact area and location of new project and its impact area shall be enclosed. Copy of Stage-I clearance or/and Environmental Clearance shall be annexed.



Madam/Sir,

I am directed to refer to the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Act, 2021 which has been notified by the Central Government on 28.03.2021. Section 8B of the amended Act is reproduced below:

"provided that even after expiry or termination of lease and such rights, approvals, clearances, licenses and the like shall be transferred to, and vested; subject to the conditions provided under such laws; in the successful bidder of the mining lease selected through auction under the said Act. It has also been provided in the amendment Act that it shall be lawful for the new lessee to continue mining operations on the land till expiry or termination of mining lease granted to it, in which mining operations were being carried out by the previous lessee."

In light of the above provisions of the MMDR Amendment Act 2021, the matter related to the validity of the approvals granted under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 (FCA-1980) was examined in the Ministry, and with a view to align the provisions under the two Acts, it has been decided that transfer of approval under FCA-1980 in such mining leases may be considered subject to the following conditions:

i. Complete compliance of such terms and conditions as stipulated in the approval granted previously under the FCA-1980, and rules and guidelines framed thereunder in respect of the concerned mining lease has been made. The non-compliance of conditions, if any, stipulated in the approval granted to the erstwhile agency under FCA-1980, which were required to be complied before handing over the forest land to such agency, shall be transferred as liabilities to the new allocattee, and in such case, complete compliance of such conditions shall be made prior to handing over of forest land to the new allocattee. For the remaining conditions, the new allocattee will make an undertaking to comply with, before handing over of the forest land. It is clarified that in case of violation of any of the conditions which was done during the period of previous allocattee and which constitutes an offence under the FCA-1980, the penal clauses will be invoked against the previous allocattee only and not against the new allocattee.

Approval under FCA-1980 was valid on the date of expiry of previous lease.

iii. Mining operations will be restricted to the forest area for which approval under Section 2 (ii) of the FC Act, 1980 has been obtained by the erstwhile user agency. No non-forest use of such forest lands falling within the lease shall be allowed, for which approval under Section 2(ii) has not been obtained by the State Government. Mining in such areas may be allowed only after obtaining prior approval of the Central Government under Section 2 (ii) of the FCA-1980.

iv. The State Government shall ensure that the amount of Net Present Value, Safety Zone Plantation and Compensatory Afforestation(CA), if not deposited earlier, has been deposited prior to handing over of the forest land to the new allocattee. Also, in case the CA land has not been made available previously, the forest land shall be handed over to the new allocattee only after the corresponding CA land has been accepted by the competent authority as per the extant procedures for acceptance of CA lands for a new proposal.

v. Mining operations and other activities shall be carried out as per the land-use allowed in the approval under the FCA-1980. Any change in the land use on account of any valid reason shall be effected with the prior approval of the

Central Government.

vi.Reclamation of the mined out forest area in the whole lease area as per the approved Mining Plan shall be an obligatory condition for the new allocattee.

vii. Transfer fee, as prescribed in the relevant guidelines incorporated in the Handbook of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 shall be realized from the new allocattee and deposited into the account of CAMPA of the State concerned.

viii. Transfer of approvals to new agency may be accorded by the concerned State Government/UT Administration subject to fulfilment of conditions/provisions

stipulated in the relevant guidelines of the Ministry.



Attention is invited to the above memo of Govt. of Odisha, FE & CC Department endorsing copy of the Govt, of India, MoEF & CC Letter F.No.FC- 11/112/2021-FC (Pt) dated 07.07.2021 on the transfer of approvals under FC Act by the State Government. The procedure outlined below may be followed for processing of cases for transfer of approval granted under Forest (Conservation) Act to the new lessee.

- The new allottee shall apply in a plain paper (offline mode) along with the item-wise compliance report to Stage-II stipulations to concerned DFO. In case any stipulation is not yet complied with, the new ailottee shall submit an undertaking to the effect that the complete compliance shall be submitted before handing over of the forest land to the new lessee.
- ii. The DFO will provide the records available regarding the diversion of the forest land to the new allottes, if sought for:
- the new allottee shall do the demarcation of the forest land diverted and pust the permanent pillars in the field if not done earlier. The DGPS map should be submitted subsequently before handing over of the land, if not done previously. The DGPS survey map shall be final with reference to extent of area diverted and fand use pattern.

- iv. DFO will conduct the field verification, preferably along with Mining Officer and Revenue Authorities to assess the current land use pattern and violation, if any. Mining operation shall be restricted to diverted forest land only.
- V. DFO shall verify and report on the status of the Compensatory Afforestation (CA) including PF notification. All cases where CA land has been made available and money deposited should be recommended, even if plantation has not been carried out due to any reasons. In case where CA land has not been made available previously, the case should be recommended with appropriate CA Scheme as per extant guidelines. If part CA is complied, the case may be recommended with an undertaking for full compliance subsequently.
- vi. DFO shall raise demand for the compensatory levies. (NPV, CA, ACA, Penal CA, etc.) if not paid earlier, and ensure deposition of the same in CAMPA account. The NPV amount should be calculated at current rate deducting the NPV amount paid previously by the old lessee and the new allottee. No fresh CA should be demanded if CA has been paid earlier. A certificate to this effect mentioning item-wise deposition of compensatory levies should be furnished by the DFO.
- vii. If there is any violation by the previous allocattee, show cause notice for penal clauses are to be invoked against the old lessee before processing the new FC transfer.
- viii. DFO to complete the entire process of field verification of the Stage II compliance and forward his/ her report to RCCF within a fortnight from the date of submission of application by the new Allottee.





 User Agency shall deposit the Net Present Value (NPV) of the diverted forest land of 227.00 ha., with the State Forest Department as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 30-10-2002 & 1-8-2003 in LA No.566 in WP (C) No.202/1995 and the guidelines issued by this Ministry vide letter No.5-1/98-FC(Pt-II) dated 18-9-2003 and 22-9-2003 in this regard.

 The State Government shall deposit all the above-mentioned fund in form of Fixed Deposits in the name of concerned DFO/ Nodal Officer of the State, till such time the CAMPA intimates the Head of Accounts for deposition of fund.

 The non-forest land for compensatory afforestation, shall be notified by the State Government as RF under section - 4 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 prior to Stage-II clearance.

CARRYING CAPACITY OF THE EXISTING ROAD FOR CARRYING ITS ORE TO THE FINAL PROCESSING SITE

The lease area is approachable from Koira - Barasuan road through a metal road of 8 Km. This road is being utilized for transportation of ore from the lease area. This road is 20m wide two lane single lane road. The carrying capacity of the road will be 1500 PCU/hr.

The Koida road connect to NH 215 which is four lane two way road of 60m wide, This road is of carrying capacity of 3600 PCU/ hr.

The ore excavated from the lease area will be transported through this road to the processing unit which is located at Koida. Details of transportation requirement form the mines has been given in the table below:

Maximum transportation from the lease area per hour will be 14 trucks per hour which is equivalent to 51 PCU/hr. This additional load of traffic can be handled by the existing road. Further the lessee with the district administration will undertake the responsibility of maintenance of the Koira - Barasuan metalled road. As per the traffic study carried out for the road considering the additional traffic load due to the proposed mining operation the LOS will be remain as B. Level of Traffic Service

From the study it can be observed that the level of service on the Road connecting OMC mines and Barsuan railway siding will remain unchanged due to the proposed movement of trucks used for transportation of Iron ore from the lease area. The lessee will contribute towards the maintenance of the road.

Proposed Mitigation Measures for transportation from the mines

The following preventive measures shall be taken to control the air pollution at different sites present inside the lease area due to transportation of ore from the lease area.

- a. Regular water sprinkling on haul roads, waste dumps and maintaining approach roads, to suppress the dust by two nos of 20 KL water sprinklers and one 10 KL water sprinklers thrice daily.
- b. The volume of dust rising from waste dump areas, quarry site, roads, etc. by action of wind shall be checked by planting grasses and broad leaf trees and regular water sprinkling.
- c. Ensuring transporting vehicles not to cross the stipulated speed (30 Km/hr). A strict instruction should also given in the entrance board it shall be displayed that no vehicle should run greater than a speed of 30 Km/hour. Valid PUC certified vehicle will only allow to entry within the lease premises. A well-trained security organization will be engaged for the purpose.
- d. Over loading on transport vehicles to be prevented in order to stop spillage.
- e. Strengthening further the green belt plantation around ML area, quarry and over burden dump as well as crushing plant site.
- f. Water sprinkling on the ore stack yard will be done to check air borne dust.
- g. Exhaust fumes in the internal combustion engines used in excavators, ensuring vigorous maintenance and stringent overhaul schedules shall minimize dumpers, dozers and other machinery.
- h. Wet drilling method shall be adopted.
- i. Water injection system in drill and wearing of PPE by driller to be proposed to control air pollution and minimization of its effect.
- j. Regular monitoring of air is being conducted quarterly to know the quality of air in core as well as buffer zone and followed up by Environment department with immediate action.
