Ve are thankful to the Expert Appraisal Committee, to have considered our case for EC n meeting in the month of Nov 11.Based on the EAC minutes uploaded on the MoEF reb site, we would like to present our response on the clarifications sought in the same;

The Committee also noted that a Writ Petition No. 3876 of 2011 has been filed in the Hon ble High Court of Chhattisgarh at Bilaspur against the proposed mining in Dharmajaigarh Nagar Panchayat Area. The Committee sought the response of the proponent on the matter.

Response: On being advised by the Expert Appraisal Committee, regarding the writ petition No.3876/2011 pending against us in the Hon'ble High Court at Bilaspur, enquiries were made by us. We were informed that the court had issued an ex-parte interim order on 09.12.2011, since we (respondent's number 6 & 7) had not been served till then. Copy of the interim order of the Hon'ble High Court in the matter, annexed at Annexure- A for ready reference.

Subsequently we along with our counsel appeared before the court and filed reply along with an application praying for vacation of stay on the EC



8) The Committee also desired that proponent should expedite the process of establishing railway siding ensuring that the minimum fragmentation forest and safety of elephants present in the area should be ensured.

Response: We are expediting the process of establishing railway siding. All efforts shall be made to ensure that there is minimum fragmentation of the forest and safety of elephants present in the area taken care of. We have already entered into an MOU with four other companies for establishment of rail corridor, MoU signed on 01-06-2011 in the name of Fathepur Logistics Pvt. Ltd (FLPL)-Copy of MoU enclosed as Annexure-D



9) The Committee desired that the feasibility of coal transportation by conveyorcum-rail mode requires being studied using common facilities/infrastructure such
as Railway siding and railway track for neighbouring coal mine projects, which
may come up in the area and details furnished and also shown on a toposheet.
The Committee desired that the rail corridor should not fragment forests.

Response: In March 2011, a study was done by M/S L&T Bulk Material Handling Business Division, for installing a conveyor system from Durgapur II/ Sariya, to our plant site at Badadarha. On doing a detailed site survey and inspection, L&T was of the opinion that technically, it would not be a feasible option as explained in their response vide their letter no nil dtd 11.05.11 Enclosed in Annexure-F (FROM L&T)



PLAN FOR THE 21 TRIBAL PAFS WITH REFERENCE TO PROVISIONS OF PESA

1.1 Introduction

The Sariya Coal Block (wherein M/s D. B. Power Ltd. envisages the establishment of a captive opencast coal mine in Durgapur II/ Sariya Coal Block) is spread over villages Dharamjaigarh, Dharam Colony, Medarmar, Bayasi & Medarmar Colony and Taraimar in District Raigarh, Chhattisgarh. These villages fall within the declared Schedule V area of the Government of India¹. Appendix 1.1 shows the letter from collector office stating the inclusion of these villages in Schedule V area

Due to the proposed project, of the total affected population, 21 households belonging to the Scheduled Tribes are impacted Considering that the villages fall under the notified Schedule V Area, compliance to the Panchayats Extension to Scheduled Areas (PESA) Act has been done. The following sections detail out the specific provisions within the R&R plan taken to ensure compliance to the PESA Act.

1.2 Salient Features of the Panchayats extension to scheduled areas (PESA) Act

The Constitution provides for special provisions for administration and control of Scheduled Areas. While the overall objective of the PESA Act is to enable tribal communities to safeguard their traditional rights over natural resources, in the context of Land Acquisition, the Act requires that it would be possible to acquire land in the Schedule V area only with prior consultation and consent of the Gram Sabha of the respective affected villages

1.3 Consent of Gram Sabha

As per the requirements of the PESA Act, the consent of Gram Sabhas is to be obtained by the respective agencies securing the permission for Land Acquisition. The initial consent letter from the Gram Panchayat of the village (Taraimar) where STs are found (partially/fully or habitation/uninhabited agricultural area) is given in Appendix 1.2. Gram Sabhas will be held in due course, requisite consultations made and consents taken, as required.

1.4 Profile of Scheduled Tribe Households

There are 119 Scheduled Tribe persons (21 households) who are likely to be displaced due to the project. Of these, there are 60 females and 59 males. All of

The R&R Plan envisages provision of all facilities including drinking water, housing, roads, and other social and community facilities in the relocation site. The R&R budget for the tribal families also provides for training and skill development component
