Be it known to that Sri G. Guru Prasad Reddy, S/o. Late G. Baya Reddy, residence At. Narendrapur, Ps. Chamakhandi Dist. Ganjam is hereby authorised by the undersigned, Collector, Ganjam to work a still at Bada Kusasthali in Plot No 2954 of Khata No. 690 in Mouza Bada Kusasthali under Tahsil Kanishi Dist- Ganjam for the manufacture of country spirit liquor and also to open a shop at the same place, or at such other place as may be sanctioned by the Collector, for the sell of country spirit which he may manufacture from the 01-04-2019 to 31-07-2019.

It is required of the holder of this license, as a condition of this license remaining in force, that he duly and faithfully performs and abide by the following articles and the general conditions applicable to all Excise License hereto annexed:

- I. That he pays to Government in advance, directly into the treasury, through Chalan/E-Chalan or by such method as the Govt. may order, a monthly consideration money of Rs. 421195/- in the following installments.
  - a) He has deposited Three months advance monthly consideration money of the shop amounting to Rs. 1263585/- (Rupees Twelve lakh sixty three thousand five hundred eighty five) only vide challans Reference ID No. 2019042004 dt 25/3/2019
  - b) He has deposited security deposit for the year 2019-20 in terms of one month's C. money of the shop of Rs. 421195/- (Rupees four lakh twenty one thousand one hundred ninety five) only vide challans Reference ID No. 2019042004 dt 25/03/2019
- II. That he works only one still or more of a liquid capacity not exceeding 2532 litres and that he does not work his still before sunrise or after sunset; except for limited periods on special occasions, when by special licence / permit from the Collector, he may be allowed to work more than one still, or to work his still or stills between sunset and sunrise.
- III. That, still shall be of Brass on condition of keeping it clean and that the capacity must be cut or engraved on every still. (Stills, and the worts shall be regularly fire-heated to remove injurious deposits in them.
- IV. That he sells no spirits but the produce of his still, except as specially licensed / permitted.
- V. That he does not remove the produce of his still to any place, except to his shop therewith attached without a pass from the Collector and that he enters in the pass the quantity so removed.
- VI. That he does not sell spirit to any person at one time, in quantity exceeding the limit of retail sale fixed under section 4 of the Act.
- VII. That he does not use in distilling or mix with the spirit kept or sold in the shop any noxious substance such as *Kuchila*, aconite or *dhatura* or any objectionable article such as tobacco, pepper or kerosene oil intended to increase the intoxicating power of the liquor or to increase thirst.
- VIII. That he shall put materials under fermentation in vessels of uniform size and load them with



the same quantity in each. The vessels shall be serially numbered. Date of loading shall be noted on a signboard attached to a pole fixed in front of each vessel.

- IX. That he does not sell liquor on credit.
- X. That he does not sell or deliver any country spirit to any person apparently under the age of eighteen years, whether for consumption by such person or by any other person, and whether for consumption on or off the premises.
- XI. That he does not, during the hours in which his licensed premises are kept open for business, employ or permit to be employed, in any part of such premises where liquor is consumed, either with or without remuneration, any person under the age of eighteen years.
- XII. That premises licensed for the retail vend of out still liquor may be kept open from 10:30 AM to 10:30 PM throughout the year or this timing of the shop as the Govt. decides.
- XIII. The licensee shall maintain an account of materials placed under fermentation and the country spirit distilled from day to day and also keep an account of daily receipt and sale in such forms as prescribed.
- XIV. That he must keep the vicinity of the outstill and drains perfectly neat and clean.
- XV. That he shall utilize Mahua flowers as per MGQ fixed by the Government.
- XVI. That he must use clean and hygienic water in manufacturing outstill liquor and take sufficient care for proper disposal of spent-wash, keeping in view the health aspects of cattle and other animals and protection to the environment .
- XVII. That he, as far as practicable, sell liquor in pouches/ poly packs of 200 ml capacity each with relevant declaration thereon and transport the same to the attached branch shops in the manner laid down in letter No. 5257/Ex. dt. 6.8.2009 of Excise Commissioner Odisha, Cuttack.
- XVIII. That he must ensure periodical examination of poly packs/ pouches/wash/liquor by the competent authority to ensure their genuineness.
- XIX. That he must abide by the rules made under The Orissa Excise Rules 2017 and the orders, notifications made under the Odisha Excise Act 2008 from time to time and also the provision contained in the Excise Policy of the Govt. for the year 2019-20.
- XX. That the licensed premises of the E.P. holder for retail sale of Outstill liquor shall remain closed on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October on account of Mahamta Gandhi's birth day and during Election/ Bye-election to Assembly or Parliament / Municipal Elections / Zilla Parisad /Panchayat Sammittee/ Gram Panchayat Elections etc. for the period as would be ordered by the Election Commission of India or State Election Commission. Such days have been specially declared as "Dry Days" and no compensation shall be payable on account of such closure.
- XXI. That the State Government will not be responsible for providing the place / site for location of the shop. It will be the responsibility of the privilege holder to arrange suitable place and carry on the privilege granted to him. The place so arranged shall be free from objections from the public.
- XXII. That he must hang a signboard just in front of the shop showing the nature of shop, licence No with validity, name of the licensee etc . He shall affix/ hang a board containing the statutory warning "**consumption of liquor is injurious to health**".
- XXIII. All OS product i.e OS liquor should through Out Still Unit and branch shops should be of 70 degree UP
- XXIV. The MGQ of mahua flowers in all areas is fixed at 1 (one) quintals per Rs. 1000/- C. money.

N.B:- The violation of any of the above conditions or of the general conditions applicable to Excise Vend License will render this license liable to be cancelled and the Holder thereof liable to the penalties prescribed by the relevant law.

**Sub: Excise Fee, Duty and Margin Structure along with Regulatory Guidelines for the year-2019-20.**

Sir,

I am directed to invite a reference to your Letter No. 07/(confidential) dated 18.02.2019 and to say that Government, after careful consideration, have been pleased to approve the Excise Fee, Excise Duty and Margin Structure for the first four months of the year 2019-20 (1.4.2019 to 31.7.2019).

The license of FL 'OFF', CL and OS shops shall be renewed for a period of four months only i.e. till 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2019. The licenses of production units, wholesale and other retail shops may be renewed for one year as their license fees are prescribed on annual basis.

State Government shall review the excise fee, excise duty, margin structure and regulatory guidelines as enclosed to this letter **before 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2019.**

The regulatory guidelines issued during the year 2018-19 shall continue with such modifications and additions as indicated.

You are, therefore, requested to take necessary action accordingly.

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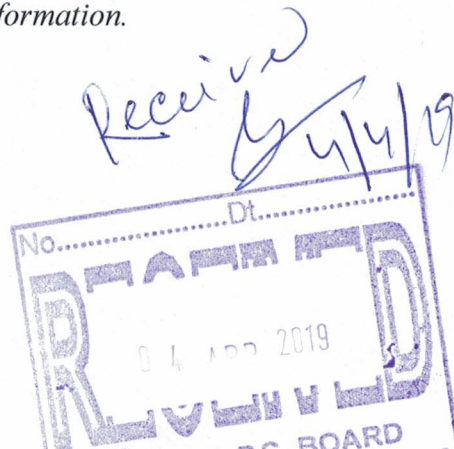

1	This environmental clearance shall be coterminous with the period of validity of the existing Excise License.	The clearance is valid up to the validity of the existing excise license i.e. up to 31.03.2019. Existing license of excise department is attached as Annexure – 1.
2	The proponent shall obtain permission from concerned authorities for drawal of ground water.	The proponent has already obtained NOC from CGWA, New Delhi. Attached as Annexure – 2.
3	Raw materials such as Mahua flower, rice husk/coal shall be stored in concrete platform under covered shed.	All precautions adopted to avoid contaminated/leaching of toxic materials into ground water.
4	Water used for the process should be of potable quality.	Fresh ground water of portable quality is being used for the process. Water analysis report is attached as Annexure – 3.
5	Good house-keeping practices shall be followed to improve the work environment. All roads and shop floors shall be cleaned regularly.	Good housekeeping is being practiced. Road and shop floors is being cleaned regularly.
6	Domestic effluent shall be discharged to soak pit via septic tank constructed as per BIS standards.	Domestic effluent is being discharged to soak pit.
7	The country liquor unit shall provide a sand bed after the screen to filter out the spent liquor from the mahua flower residue. The filtered spent liquor shall be chemically treated with lime and suitable flocculent for correction of pH and effective coagulation and then passed through a bed of husk ash for removal of colour and odour. So, treated water shall be used for cooling purpose and/or gardening/agriculture farm / water sprinkling for dust suppression.	Effluent treatment plant has been installed accordingly.



8	The proponent shall adopt Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD) practice and shall not discharge any effluent to outside the premises.	Agreed, will be taken care off. We propose to provide adequate storage of treated wastewater for re-use.
9	Water logging in the work area and outside the premises shall be prevented with proper drainage and cleaning of the work area.	Well-designed storm water management system shall be adopted to ensure proper flow of runoff during rains. Rainwater harvesting system has been proposed to recharge the ground water aquifers during rains.
10	The solid Mahua flower residue from the screen, sludge from the sand bed, lime sludge and carbon sludge shall be mixed together to use as organic manure. Mahua flower residue left after distillation shall not be disposed off outside the premises haphazardly.	The solid waste and sludge generated shall be properly collected and mixed to use as manure.
11	Water sprinkling shall be provided at ash disposal /storage area to control fugitive emission.	Is being taken care off.
12	Work zone area including the internal roads surrounding the plant shall be asphalted or concreted. Water spraying system shall be installed for regular spraying of water on roads and work zone to minimize fugitive dust emission.	Noted. is being and will be complied.
13	Adequate height of chimney shall be attached to coal / rice husk fired bhatti.	Chimney of adequate height is being attached to bhattis.
14	The proponent shall take adequate measures to prevent fire hazards during distillation process.	Noted and will be complied with all preventive measures.
