- 3. The terms of reference (ToRs) of the above Committee shall be as follows:
  - i. To scrutinize the proposals for determining Terms of Reference (ToR) for undertaking detailed EIA/EMP study and undertake site inspection (if required).

To scrutinize the environmental impacts and examine the environmental ii. management plans prepared and submitted by the project authorities as per the ToRs.

To recommend clearance or reject of the project from environmental angle with iii.

reasons stated at scoping as well as appraisal stages.

To suggest specific environmental safeguards and conditions to mitigate the iv. adverse environmental impacts in respect of projects recommended for approval.

The committee shall adopt the following procedure for appraisal: 4.

The committee shall meet twice a month on fixed dates. i.

The agenda for the meeting shall be circulated to all the members at least 15 ii. days prior to the scheduled meeting by the Member Secretary.

The proponent will undergo a preliminary scrutiny (Screening) by the iii. concerned Impact Assessment Division and if found conforming to the statutory requirement will be placed before the Committee for appraisal on the first scheduled date of its meeting.

The appraisal of the proposal should be completed ordinarily in single meeting iv. and a specific recommendation to be made. In case the committee finds that additional information required for considering the proposal cannot be furnished by the project proponent in the meeting, then the proposal may be differed for the next meeting and shall be reconsidered based on submission of information on merits. Expert Appraisal Committee may recommend the project under the following four mutually exclusive categories:

a. Recommended;

b. Deferred (for consideration in the next or future meeting as may be specified in the committee's deliberations, after submission of required additional information to be further reviewed/examined by the Expert Appraisal Committee).

Rejected (along with reasons for rejection).

- d. Returned to Project proponent in the present form.
- Site visit as part of the appraisal may be undertaken where it is considered as necessary for reasons to be recorded by the committee, by a sub-group of the Committee consisting of not more than 3 members including one representative from MoEF&CC with the prior approval of the Ministry.

Minutes of the meeting recorded shall be prepared and the recommendations vi. finalized and approved by the Chairman before taking further necessary

- The chairperson may co-opt an expert as a Member for a particular meeting vii. of the Committee.
- Meeting of the Committee shall be held normally at Delhi but in exceptional cases, with the prior concurrence of the Ministry, these may be held elsewhere in the country.
- Payment of TA/DA to the Chairman/members of the Committee for attending 6. its meetings or site visits shall be governed as under:-
  - Chairman may be entitled for reimbursement of the cost of Air travel by Executive Class by shortest route. All other members are entitled to travel by



Air in the Economy class by shortest route subject to production of boarding passes for actual use of the facility.

- ii. Payment of sitting fee of Rs.6,000/- per day with a ceiling of 10 days in a month for attending the aforesaid meeting by non-official members will be as per instructions issued by DoE on the subject. It is further clarified that sitting fee to salaried persons employed in Central Universities/ UGC/ Central Institutes/Institutions and autonomous bodies wholly or substantially funded by the Central Government shall not be paid.
- iii. TA/DA to non-official members will be regulated as per SR 190 and shall be paid as per rules.
- iv. Entitlement shall be restricted to actuals.
- v. Relaxation for air journey, if any, will be as per instructions issued from time to time by the Ministry.
- vi. Air tickets shall be purchased directly from Airlines (websites/booking counters/office or authorises travel agents viz. M/s Balmer Lawrie & Company Limited, M/s Ashok Travels & Tours and M/s IRCTC.
- vii. No duplication in payment, and
- viii. Payment shall be made through e-transfer only.
- 7. The tenure of the Committee shall be for a period of three years.
- 8 This is issued with the concurrence of IFD vide dy. no. E69599 dated 14.02.2021 and with the approval of the Competent Authority.
