At the outset, the Chairman, State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA), (hereinafter refer to as, The Authority), welcomed the Members and requested the Member Secretary to give a brief background of the Items, listed in the Agenda Note of 158th meeting, being held today i.e. on 02.06.2023 & later on 03.06.2023.

"Minutes of the 157th Meeting of SEIAA held on 10.05.2023 & 11.05.2023 are "CONFIRMED" as part of the proceedings of 158th Meeting".

Agenda Items as listed in 158th Meeting of SEIAA were discussed and the following decisions were taken:

Proposal for the said Project was submitted to the SEIAA vide online Proposal No.

<u>SIA/HR/INFRA2/413174/2023 dated 04.01.2023</u> for Grant of Environmental Clearance (EC) under Category 7(da) of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006. The Project Proponent has deposited Scrutiny fee of ₹ 50,000/- vide DD No. 111876 dated 20.04.2022 (in compliance of Haryana Government, Environment & Climate Change Department Notification No. DE&CCH/3060 dated 14.10.2021).

Appraisal & Recommendations of SEAC:

The said case was taken up during 259th meetings of SEAC held on 19.01.2023 and the Appraisal Committee (SEAC), recommended the Project to SEIAA for Grant of Environment Clearance.

Findings and Decision of THE AUTHORITY (SEIAA):

Earlier, the case was considered during 153rd meeting of SEIAA held on 15.02.2023; wherein, it was decided that Member Secretary, SEIAA shall request the Member Secretary, Haryana State Pollution Control Board (HSPCB) to constitute a Subcommittee having a representative from HSPCB, Head quarter and the Concerned Regional Officer, HSPCB of the area to carry out the Site Inspection and submit a detailed report.

Now, the Report from the Haryana State Pollution Control Board has been received & presented before the Authority. As per the report,

"That the above said unit was earlier operating its CBWTF at village Kandela, Jind which has been permanently closed and has vacated the site by dismantled its building, plant and Machinery. The unit has submitted application to SEIAA for Environment Clearance for shifting of their CBWTF Plant to its new site at Village Shahpur, Jind. The above said unit have constructed boundary wall for demarcation at its new site at Village Shahpur, Jind and no other activity was noticed at its new site".

The instant case was taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA, Haryana held on 02.06.2023, upon perusal of documents, discussions alongwith recommendations made by the Appraisal Committee (SEAC), the Authority observed as under:

1. That Project Proponent, who was one of the Appellant before the Hon'ble NGT in Appeal No. 63 of 2012, (in the case of Haat Supreme Wastech Pvt. Ltd. & Ors Versus State of Haryana & Others), got directions vide Order dated 28.11.2013 in the said case as under:

XXXXXXXXX.....

35. For the reasons afore-stated, we sustain the objection taken by the respondents concerned and hold that the bio-medical waste treatment plants are required to obtain environmental clearance in terms of Entry 7(d) of the Notification of 2006, Having recorded the above finding, while keeping these petitions pending, we direct all the appellants and the respondents (project proponents) to obtain environment clearance in terms of site location, potential environmental impacts and proposed environmental safeguards from MoEF in accordance with law. If such applications are filed before MoEF, the same shall be dealt with and disposed of expeditiously.

...... XXXXXXXXXX.

2. Subsequently, MOEF & CC, GOI, vide Notification No. 1142 (E) dated 17th April, 2015, necessitated the requirement of obtaining Environment Clearance for the activities categorized under Category 7(da), for Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facilities.

Whereas, the Project Proponent was required to obtain Environment Clearance for the Project under category 7(da) within the meaning & scope of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006.

Whereas, upon perusal of documents and hearing the pleadings of the Project Proponents, the Authority arrived at a conclusion that inordinate delay has occurred in compliance of the orders of Hon'ble NGT dated 28.11.2013 and subsequent compliance of Notification dated 17.04.2015.

Whereas, the Project Proponent has later applied for Grant of Environment Clearance for the said project after a long gap, which otherwise amounts to non-compliance of the required provisions of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006.

The Authority after due deliberations, decided to consider the proposal & recommendations of the Appraisal Committee (SEAC) i.e. to Grant of Environment Clearance for the said Project. This is despite the fact that Project Proponent has failed to explain the inordinate delays to comply with the orders dated 28.11.2013, of the Hon'ble NGT (in Appeal No. 63 of 2012) and later Notification dated 17.04.2015, to which he although opted to follow, later, by filing an Application for seeking Environment Clearance.

After having considered all relevant aspects in the said case, the <u>Authority</u> deemed it appropriate to "GRANT ENVIRONMENT CLEARANCE" for the <u>Project.</u> However, the act of non-compliance & delay in responding to the relevant provisions, cannot be compromised and put under the carpet, therefore, <u>the Authority also decided to impose a Penalty of Rs. 5,00,000/- under EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006</u>
/ within the scope & meaning of Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

The Authority further directs the Project Proponent to deposit the said

Penalty within 30 days, in accordance with the directions issued by MOEF & CC,

GOI vide Office Memorandum No. F.No. IA3-22/30/2022-IA.III(182415) dated

28.07.2022.

Failing which, proceedings under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act 1986, may be initiated for withdrawal of Environment Clearance, so Granted for the Project.

Accordingly, the case is disposed of.

Proposal for the said Project was submitted to the SEIAA vide online Proposal No. SIA/HR/INFRA2/412187/2022 dated 27.12.2022 for Grant of Environmental Clearance (EC) under Category 7(da) of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006. The Project Proponent has deposited Scrutiny fee of ₹ 50,000/- vide DD No.185258 dated 28.10.2022 (in compliance of Haryana Government, Environment & Climate Change Department Notification No. DE&CCH/3060 dated 14.10.2021).

Appraisal & Recommendations of SEAC:

The said case was taken up during 259th meetings of SEAC held on 19.01.2023 and SEAC recommended the Project to SEIAA for Grant of Environment Clearance.

Findings and Decision of THE AUTHORITY (SEIAA):

Earlier, the case was considered during 153rd meeting of SEIAA held on 15.02.2023; wherein, it was decided that Member Secretary, SEIAA shall request the Member Secretary, Haryana State Pollution Control Board (HSPCB) to constitute a Subcommittee having a representative from HSPCB, Head quarter and the Concerned Regional Officer, HSPCB to carry out the Site Inspection and submit a detailed report.

Vide letter dated 30.05.2023, Haryana State Pollution Control Board has intimated that:

"Unit has applied for Grant of Environment Clearance (EC) for carrying out modernization in the existing Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility (CBWTF) at Khasra No. 43/114-15/1672 Village & Post Hetampura, District Bhiwani, Haryana".

The instant case was taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA, Haryana held on 02.06.2023, upon perusal of documents, discussions alongwith recommendations made by the Appraisal Committee (SEAC), the Authority observed as under:

1. That Project Proponent, who was one of the Appellant before the Hon'ble NGT in Appeal No. 63 of 2012, (in the case of Haat Supreme Wastech Pvt. Ltd. & Ors Versus State of Haryana & Others), got directions vide Order dated 28.11.2013 in the said case as under:

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35. For the reasons afore-stated, we sustain the objection taken by the respondents concerned and hold that the bio-medical waste treatment plants are required to obtain environmental clearance in terms of Entry 7(d) of the Notification of 2006, Having recorded the above finding, while keeping these petitions pending, we direct all the appellants and the respondents (project proponents) to obtain environment clearance in terms of site location, potential environmental impacts and proposed environmental safeguards from MoEF in accordance with law. If such applications are filed before MoEF, the same shall be dealt with and disposed of expeditiously.

...... XXXXXXXXX.

2. Subsequently, MOEF & CC, GOI, vide Notification No. 1142 (E) dated 17th April, 2015, necessitated the requirement of obtaining Environment Clearance for the activities categorized under Category 7(da), for Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facilities.

Whereas, the Project Proponent was required to obtain Environment Clearance for the Project under category 7(da) within the meaning & scope of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006.

Whereas, upon perusal of documents and hearing the pleadings of the Project Proponents, the Authority arrived at a conclusion that inordinate delay has occurred in compliance of the orders of Hon'ble NGT dated 28.11.2013 and subsequent compliance of Notification dated 17.04.2015.

Whereas, the Project Proponent has later applied for Grant of Environment Clearance for the said project after a long gap, which otherwise amounts to non-compliance of the required provisions of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006.

The Authority after due deliberations, decided to consider the proposal & recommendations of the Appraisal Committee (SEAC) i.e. to Grant of Environment Clearance for the said Project. This is despite the fact that Project Proponent has failed to explain the inordinate delays to comply with the orders dated 28.11.2013, of the Hon'ble NGT (in Appeal No. 63 of 2012) and later Notification dated 17.04.2015, to which he although opted to follow, later, by filing an Application for seeking Environment Clearance.

After having considered all relevant aspects in the said case, the <u>Authority</u> <u>deemed it appropriate to "GRANT ENVIRONMENT CLEARANCE" for the Project.</u> However, the act of non-compliance & delay in responding to the relevant provisions, cannot be compromised and put under the carpet, therefore, <u>the Authority also decided to impose a Penalty of Rs. 5,00,000/- under EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006</u> / within the scope & meaning of Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

The Authority further directs the Project Proponent to deposit the said

Penalty within 30 days, in accordance with the directions issued by MOEF & CC,

GOI vide Office Memorandum No. F.No. IA3-22/30/2022-IA.III(182415) dated

28.07.2022.

Failing which, proceedings under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act 1986, may be initiated for withdrawal of Environment Clearance, so Granted for the Project.

Accordingly, the case is disposed of.

Proposal for the said Project was submitted to the SEIAA vide online Proposal No. SIA/HR/INFRA2/410414/2022 dated 14.12.2022 for Grant of Environmental Clearance (EC) under Category 8 (a) of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006. The Project Proponent has deposited Scrutiny fee of ₹ 2,00,000/- vide DD No. 023382 dated 28.11.2022 (in compliance of Haryana Government, Environment & Climate Change Department Notification No. DE&CCH/3060 dated 14.10.2021).

Appraisal & Recommendations of SEAC:

The said case was taken up during 258th meetings of SEAC held on 03.01.2023 and SEAC recommended the Project to SEIAA for Grant of Environment Clearance.

Findings and Decision of THE AUTHORITY (SEIAA):

Earlier, the case was considered during 152nd meeting of SEIAA held on 25.01.2023; wherein, a sub-committee was constituted to verify the actual status on Ground level (activity, utilization of Water, Availability of the same, besides verification of the site plans.

The sub-committee visited the project site and submitted its report stating that there is no construction activity at the project site. HSVP has assured for supply of Water as demanded by the Project Proponent.

Now, the matter was again taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA held on 02.06.2023.

After perusing the details placed on file alongwith considering the recommendations of the Appraisal committee as well as Site Inspection Report of the Subcommittee, the Authority decided to "GRANT ENVIRONMENT CLEARANCE" to the Project Under category 8 (a) within the scope and Meaning of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006 with the following conditions:

1. PP shall develop & maintain 25% of the Plot area as Green Area i.e. 11605 Sqms as offered in the Proposal and the same shall not be reduced/ modified or put to any other use / purpose at any stage.

Further, the Green Area should be provided on the Earth, not on the Tarrace or in Vertical format.

- 2. To encourage & promote Environmental solutions for ambient clear air quality, the PP is advised to install and provide Electric Charging Stations to facilitate electric vehicle commuters to the extent possible.
- 3. PP shall obtain Structural Stability Certificate from reputed organization like IIT or NIIT / Regional Engineering College, Kurukshetra.
- 4. PP shall ensure adequate space and slots all around the complex, for the smooth & free movements of fire tenders / ambulances etc in case of emergent situations.

Accordingly, the case is disposed of.

Proposal for the said Project was submitted to the SEIAA vide online Proposal No. SIA/HR/MIS/81570/2022 dated 02.08.2022 for Approval of ToR (under violation) within the scope & meaning of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006. The Project Proponent has deposited Scrutiny fee of ₹ 1,00,000/- vide DD No. 501304 dated 10.08.2022 (in compliance of Haryana Government, Environment & Climate Change Department Notification No. DE&CCH/3060 dated 14.10.2021).

Appraisal & Recommendations of SEAC:

The case was taken up during 248th meeting of SEAC held on 06.09.2022. The PP along with consultant appeared before the committee and presented the case and submitted following information: The Committee discussed the case under violation category and after detailed deliberations on the information presented by the project proponent, unanimously decided to recommend the case to SEIAA for Grant of Terms of Reference (under violation) for undertaking EIA and preparation of Environment Management Plan (EMP).

Findings and Decision of THE AUTHORITY (SEIAA):

Earlier, the matter was again taken up during 152nd meeting of SEIAA held on 24.01.2023.

The Authority after having gone through the relevant records, perusal of <u>Site Inspection Reports dated 05.07.2014 and 10.01.2023 of the Sub-Committees</u> along-with <u>communication dated 28.06.2022/29.06.2022 on behalf of Project Proponent</u> and further, upon considering the recommendations of the Appraisal Committee, observed as under:

- 1. That Project Proponent initially applied for grant of EC vide application dated **25.11.2010** and **20.11.2012**. **During 104**th **Meeting of SEAC held on 13.05.2014**, certain observations were communicated to PP as part of the proceedings. PP failed to respond and comply with the observations. Thereafter, SEAC decided to constitute a Sub-committee to inspect the project site to verify the status of Construction. Accordingly, the Sub-committee visited the **project site on 05.07.2014** and submitted its Report.
- 2. That, the Site Inspection Report of the Sub-committee was considered during 112th meeting of SEAC held on 19.09.2014; wherein it was revealed that this is a case of Proven Violation; hence, the case was recommended to SEIAA to initiate Prosecution on account of violations.
- 3. That, the recommendation of SEAC was considered during 76th meeting of SEIAA held on 14.10.2014 and the case was recommended to Principal Secretary, Environment Department, Haryana to issue directions under section 5 of EP Act, 1986 against the Project Proponent in respect of violations.
- 4. That, thereafter, the case remained pending for long period of time with the Appraisal Committee as the Project Proponent had failed to comply/respond to the observations raised by SEAC. Thereafter, a Sub-committee was constituted comprising of Sh. S. N. Mishra and Shri Hitender Singh, Member SEAC; but Sub-committee could not visited the project site due to expiry of the Terms of the Authority. Case was again taken up during 139th meeting of SEIAA held on 18.04.2022; wherein it was decided to de-list the proposal in view of OM dated 18.11.2020 being an old and dormant case, as no response/replies were coming forward from the Project Proponent.
- 5. That Project Proponent all of a sudden on 02.08.2022, came out of hibernation (almost after 12 years) and again applied for TOR under Violation Category for the said project for Built up area of 38,218.65 Sqmtrs (Page No. 9 and 10). The case was considered during 248th meeting of SEAC held on 06.09.2022 and recommended to SEIAA for Approval of **Terms of Reference (ToR) under Violation Category.**
- 6. That the recommendations of SEAC were considered in 145th meeting of SEIAA held on 09.09.2022; wherein a Sub-committee was constituted to verify the actual

status/position of Construction at the project site. The sub-committee visited the project site and submitted its report with the following remarks:

- "No construction activity is going at the project site at present. It seems that work in abandoned since long. Now, PP applied under violation category as till date EC has not been obtained, although, part construction has been done at site out of total approved built up area of 38218.65 Sqmts".
- 7. That the Authority observed that obdurate/unyielding attempt have been made by the PP to mislead the Authority by concealing the factual status of the Project. Whereas, upon perusal of details/record placed on the file clearly indicates that PP has voluntary admitted the scope of violations and made to represent the case on the basis of incorrect details. The Authority, further, observed that the application dated 02.08.2022 and the Reports of the Two Sub-committees along-with communication of PP with DTCP vide letter dated 10.01.2014 clearly establishes that Project has been started without obtaining EC and completed 11 floors and basements. This amounts to clear violation under the scope and meaning of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006 and calls for action under the scope and meaning of SoPs dated 07.07.2021 (to workout penalty and Environmental Compensation).

In view of the discussions made above, the Authority decided to proceed to take further necessary action regarding Penalty and Environmental Compensation within the scope & meaning of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006 & SOPs dated 07.07.2021 (by exercising powers under the scope and meaning of Section 5 of Environment (Protection), Act 1986 i.e. to make, directions) along with the observations made by the Hon'ble Courts in the below mentioned Cases:

- 1. Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Civil Appeal No. 2435 of 2019 titled as Keystone Realtors Pvt. Ltd Versus Shri Anil V Tharthare & Ors.
- 2. <u>Hon'ble NGT in Appeal No. 122/2018 titled as Anil Tharthare Versus The Secretary, Envt. Dept. Govt. of Maharasthra & Ors.</u>
- 3. <u>Original Application No. 1017/2018 titled as Shashikat Vithal Kamble Versus</u> Union of India & Ors.

The Project Proponent to pay:

(a) Penalty : ₹ 221.07 Lakh (b) Environmental Compensation Cost : ₹ 442.14 Lakh

It is relevant to mention that Hon'ble NGT vide Order dated 21.10.2022 in OA No. 976/2019 & M.A. No. 74/2022 (Gurinder Singh & Ors Versus Union of India & Ors.) and Order dated 11.11.2022 in O.A. No. 10 of 2021 & I.A. No. 282 of 2022 (Sanjay Kumar Versus Union of India & Ors.), made directions that PENALTY & ENVIRONMENTAL COMPENSATION COST recovered from Project Proponent on account of Violations / Non- compliances "is to be utilized for RESTORATION, PROTECTION & CONSERVATION of Environment through State/ District Environment Plans".

In view of the above, the Authority may direct the Project Proponent to deposit the <u>PENALTY & ENVIRONMENTAL COMPENSATION COST</u>, so assessed in the said case i.e. ₹ 663.21 Lakh within 30 days from the date of Order <u>in accordance with</u> the directions issued by MOEF & CC, GOI vide Office Memorandum No. F.No. IA3-22/30/2022-IA.III(182415) dated 28.07.2022.

On receipt of <u>PENALTY & ENVIRONMENTAL COMPENSATION COST</u>, so assessed in the said case i.e. ₹ **663.21 Lakh**, the Proposal for Approval of Terms of Reference (ToR) shall be taken up for further consideration by the Authority.

In case of failure to comply with the above, action under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 will be initiated, (including demolition of the structure as may be required at the risk and cost of the Project Proponent) without any further notice along with considering to de-list the Project.

Thereafter, the Project Proponent made a re-presentation before the Authority and submitted that the Actual Construction at the Project site is less than the requisite permission i.e. 20,000 Sqm.

Accordingly, a Sub-committee was constituted to verify the actual status of construction at the project site. The submitted committee visited the project site and submitted its report to the Authority.

Now, the matter was again taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA held on 02.06.2023. After due deliberations, the Authority decided to defer the case due to the followings:

- **1.** Why did Project Proponent applied under Violation Category, when there was no violation / non-compliance?
- **2.** Reports of all the Sub-committee's right from the beginning i.e. from 2014 to 2023 are not at harmony and unanimous.
- 3. The latest report of the Sub-committee emphasized/ suggested that the actual dimensions & size of the structure may be got measured from the Expert Agency / Department i.e. Town & Country Planning Department, Haryana as the Sub-committee holds no expertise in this regard.

4. M.A. (Miscellaneous Application) No. 28 of 2023 in OA No. 215 of 2022 is pending before the Hon'ble NGT and likely to be listed on 01.08.2023. Therefore, the Authority deemed it appropriate to wait for the outcome of the proceedings underway / subjudice in this case.

<u>In view of the above, the proceedings in this case are deferred, accordingly.</u>



Item No. 158.05: Notice in Original Application No. 68/2022 titled as Raman Sharma Applicant versus State of Haryana & Ors in the matter of M/s Malibu Town.

The Present Application has been filed before the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal with Grievances in the application are regarding running of 10 DG sets Integrated Residential the green belt of Colony Gurugram, Haryana, in dumping of construction waste in violation of environmental norms and raising of constructions by M/S Malibu Estate Pvt. Ltd. in Malibu Sohna Road, Gurgaon (North), Haryana despite refusal of consent operate by the Haryana state Pollution Control Board (HSPCB).

So far as the questions of raising unauthorized construction by Proponent is concerned, it is evident from the replies Project and produced in the case that the Project Proponent documents not Environment Clearance CTE/CTO obtain (EC) and required the as EIA Notification 2006 and provisions of the Water (Prevention the and Control of Pollution) Act. 1974 and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981.

The Hon'ble NGT vide Order dated 28.03.2023, pleased to pass the following directions:

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- 4. That project proponent had obtained revised layout 204.796 acres on 31.01.2008 from DTCP, Haryana and was completion certificate as mentioned above in table obtained 27.09.2016 in reference to license No. *15* of 2008 for 24.681 from DTCP, Haryana Occupation Certificate acres and issued DTCP, Haryana for 31061.622 Sam. (Built-up was by area) on 10.03.2017 in respect of other licenses mentioned therein in addition to occupation certificate obtained for community buildings described above from 2009 to *2019*. as The revised layout plan for an area of 204.796 acres comprised Plotted of licenses in respect of Residential Colony including group housing component being developed by Malibu Estate Pvt. Ltd., in Sector-47 & *50*, Gurugram was approved by Town vide No.DTCP-5626 & Country **Planning** drawing dated 28.09.2016.
- 5. **That** project proponent have not obtained Environmental carried Clearance for expansion out by wav of constructing other building construction and revised plans, zonings expansion after cut of dated EIA notification 07.07.2004/14.09.2006 or modernization of Malibu Town (204.796 Acres) under the provision of EIA notification 07.07.2004/14.09.2006 till date as construction was carried out after EIA Notification 07.07.2004/14.09.2006 which is evident from building plans,

- revised building plans, layout plans, revised layout plans and occupation/completion certificates obtained time to time after 14.09.2006.
- 6. That project proponent was also required to obtain Environmental Clearance under the provisions of EIA Notification dated 07.07.2004/14.09.2006, even last License No. 15 of 2008 dated 01.02.2008 for 24.681 acres was granted after 14.09.2006, cut off date of requiring EC & carried out construction /development activity without obtaining prior Environmental Clearance & Consent to Establish (CTE). Thus, violated the provisions of EIA Notification, Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 & Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981.

In view of the facts and circumstances of the case, we consider the presence of SEIAA, Haryana to be essential for just and proper adjudication of the questions involved in the case. Accordingly SEIAA, Haryana is impleaded as respondent no. 9.

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The matter was taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA held on 02.06.2023.

The Authority after having gone through the Order dated 28.03.2023, passed by Hon'ble NGT in OA No. 68 of 2022 titled as Raman Sharma Versus State of Haryana; decided to issue Notice to the M/s Malibu Estate Pvt. Ltd for carrying out unauthorized construction i.e. without obtaining valid Environment Clearance for the Project, within the scope & meaning of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006.

Further proceedings will be taken up accordingly.

The committee considered the document and found it in order. After deliberation, the committee was of the unanimous view that this case be sent to SEIAA and further reiterated the recommendations conveyed vide 237th MoM.

The recommendations of SEAC were taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA held on 03.06.2023.

Proposal for the said Project was submitted to the SEIAA vide online Proposal No. SIA/HR/MIS/246115/2021 for Grant of Environmental Clearance (EC) under Category 8 (a) within the scope and meaning of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006. The Project Proponent has deposited Scrutiny fee of ₹ 1,50,000/- vide DD. No. 508025 dated 14.12.2021 and ₹ 50,000/- vide DD. No. 508559 dated 15.12.2022 (in compliance of Haryana Government, Environment & Climate Change Department Notification No. DE&CCH/3060 dated 14.10.2021).

Appraisal & Recommendations of SEAC:

The case was taken up during 233rd meeting of SEAC, Haryana held on 18.01.2022 and case recommended to SEIAA for grant of EC.

The case was considered during 135th meeting of SEIAA held on 25.01.2022, the Authority observed some glaring mismatch of details with regard to the "Green Area" as mentioned in the EC letter & the office record, which created some doubts and foul play & mishandling of the record.

After detailed deliberations, Authority decided to constitute a Sub-committee headed by M.S SEIAA, Joint Director (Tech.), SEIAA and ADA to ascertain the factual position. The said Sub-committee submitted a detailed report on this issue on 22.11.2022.

The case was again taken up during 150th Meeting of SEIAA held on 25.11.2022 and the Authority after having gone through the details placed on the file, taking into the account the recommendations of Appraisal Committee & further Report dated 22.11.2022 of the Sub-Committee, arrived at the following conclusions:

- 1. The Project Proponent has not deposited "Scrutiny fee" as per Haryana Government, Environment & Climate Change Department Notification No. DE&CCH/3060 dated 14.10.2021). PP has deposited Rs. 1,50,000/- instead of due & applicable Scrutiny Fee i.e. Rs. 2,00,000/- (less by Rs. 50,000/-)
- 2. Upon perusal of relevant record pertaining to the Case, the Authority observed that as per the Condition No. [g] of the Operational Phase stipulated in the original EC dated 20.02.2015 "PP was required to maintain Green Area @30% of the Project Area"

The Authority further observed that Green Area of 30% (as per the Original EC dated 20.02.2015) got reduced to 25% Green Area, when proposal for Expansion of the said project was appraised & finalized in the year 2018. This error might have struck, inadvertently or due to a typographical error, since, no reason have been recorded / placed on the file in regard to reduction of Green Area from the Original 30% Green Area to 25% Green Area. As per the Minutes of 115th Meeting of SEIAA held on 25.07.2018, details reproduced below:-

- 1. In view of the Govt. Notification No. 08/04/2021-ICI dated 01.06.2021 issued by Department of Urban Local Bodies, Haryana and subsequently Notification No. 391-ARIC-I-2021/6273 dated 25.11.2021 issued by Revenue & Disaster Management Department, Haryana; Right of Way (RoW) for use of Revenue Rasta, is required to be obtained by the PP from the Competent Authority.
- 2. Since, the present Proposal has been applied for "Revision and Expansion"; before proceeding further, Certified Compliance Report from the Regional Officer, Action Taken Report by the PP and the detailed commentary of the SEAC on both is required.
- 3. Clarification regarding Status of Sewerage Permission for the disposal of treated water is required.

After detailed discussions and deliberations, the Authority decided to refer back this case to SEAC with the directions to re-look into the above made observations, carefully along with any other deficiency / lapses come into their notice.

Thereafter, the case was taken up during 257th meeting of SEAC, Haryana held on 21.12.2022. PP submitted the reply of the observations raised in 150th meeting of SEIAA. The reply filed by the PP was discussed thoroughly by the committee and observed that the reply was incomplete. The PP was directed to submit the complete/revised reply as per the observations raised by SEIAA. The committee deferred the case and shall be taken up on receipt of complete reply. The case was taken up during 262nd meeting held on 14.03.2023 but the case was deferred on request of PP.



Appraisal & Recommendations of SEAC:

The project was submitted to the SEIAA, Harvana on 15.06.2018. The project proponent has submitted the Form-1, Form-1A and Conceptual Plan to the SEIAA with reference to the Notification No. S.O.804 (E) dated the 14th March, 2017 and subsequent Notification No. S.O.1030 (E) dated 08th March, 2018, issued by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change. The MoEF& CC has prescribed the process for appraisal of projects for grant of Terms of Reference and Environmental Clearance, which have started the work on site, expanded the production beyond the limit of environmental clearance or changed the product mix without obtaining prior environmental clearance as mandated under the Environment Impact Assessment Notification, 2006 [S.O.1533 (E), dated the 14th September, 2006; The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change in the Notification dated 08.03.2018 inter alia, directed vide subparagraph (2) of paragraph 13, that in case the projects or activities requiring prior environmental clearance under Environment Impact Assessment Notification, 2006 from the concerned Regulatory Authority, are brought for environmental clearance after starting the construction work, or have undertaken expansion, modernization, and change in product-mix without prior environmental clearance, these projects shall be treated as cases of violations and in such cases, even Category B projects which are granted Environmental Clearance by the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority constituted under sub-section (3) section 3 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 shall be appraised for grant of environmental clearance only by the State Expert Appraisal Committee and Environmental Clearance will be granted at the State level by State Environment Impact Assessment Authority constituted under sub-section (3) section 3 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Thereafter the proposal was considered by the State Expert Appraisal Committee, Harvana during 172nd meeting held on 03.07.2018 for approval of Terms of Reference under violation Notification dated 14.03.2017 and 08.03.2018 respectively.

The PP neither attended the meeting nor requested for adjournment. The Committee was of the view that 30 days notice be issued to the project proponent.

Thereafter, the case was taken up during 192nd meeting of SEAC held on 03.12.2019. The PP neither attended the meeting but submitted that the project area is less than 20,000 sqm and also submitted the Occupation Certificate that covered area of the project is 19995.522 sqm which is less than 20,000 sqm. However, the CLU was granted for 40364.51 sqm and the committee decided that the PP shall give evidence in support of his claim that the construction has not been carried out beyond the 20,000 sqm. The PP had not submitted the reply after lapse of six months, Thereafter; the case was taken up during 201th meeting of SEAC Haryana held on 11.08.2020. The PP neither submitted the reply nor attended the meeting. The committee deliberated on the issue of construction and decided to constitute a committee consisting of Dr. S. N. Mishra and Sh. Vivek Saxena both members SEAC to visit the project and submit a report on the status of construction to the committee for further decision/appraisal

The members inspected the site on 04.03.2021 and enquired about the project details.

Observations of committee as given below:

- 1. The PP was able to furnish only Occupation certificate issued by DTCP dated 14-7-2014. Mentioning covered area of 19,995.522 sq. mtr for warehouse building shed no. A, C and D. (Annexure A). The size of each shed was not provided by PP and also could not provide copy of the CLU as well. There was more than ten rooms constructed within the premises
- 2. The PP representative was not able to provide any of details of the project.
- 3. The PP did not provide the any approved construction plan copy/ map to the committee.
- 4. Rainwater harvesting (RWH) pits neither dug proper nor in desired number nor working.
- 5. Septic tank constructed to manage sewage generated due to workers/employees/visitors staying in the premises.
- 6. Fresh water supply is being managed by bore well & any permission/ approval in this regards was not furnished.
- 7. Greenery/ Plants / tree/ shrubs or any kind of vegetation around premises which may help in abatement of air pollution was absolutely absent.

Thereafter, the case was taken up during 216th meeting of SEAC held on 29.06.2021. The PP presented the case before the committee. The discussion was held on Occupation certificate, Building plans, self contained note and report of sub-committee etc. and certain observations were raised.

Thereafter, the case was taken up during 222nd meeting of SEAC held on 11.10.2021. The PP attended the meeting and requested for the deferment of the case for the last time and committee after deliberation gave the last chance and defer the case and again conveyed that the next time decision will be taken according to MoEF&CC notification dated 18.11.2020.

Then, the case was again taken up during 231st meeting of SEAC held on 28.12.2021. The PP submitted undertaking vide letter dated 28.12.2021 that the project has temporary structure which will be removed. The committee deliberated that in order to ascertain the status of construction at the site a sub-committee consisting of following 2 members is constituted:

- 1. Sh. Hitender, Member SEAC
- 2. Sh. Vivek Saxena, Member SEAC

Thereafter, the case was taken up during 235th meeting of SEAC held on 25.03.2022. The committee deliberated in view of the request of PP and consultant that new committee may be constituted as the term of earlier nominated member i.e. Sh. Hitender, Ex-Member SEAC is expired on 29.01.2022. The Committee decided to constitute new subcommittee consisting of Dr Vivek Saxena, Member SEAC and Sh. Prabhakar Verma, Member SEAC for site visit.

The case was taken up during 242nd meeting of SEAC, Haryana held on 24.06.2022. The site visit report was to be submitted in this case, however, one of the committee member Sh. Prabhakar Verma, who was present in the meeting had stated that he is overburdened in various other official works and also been nominated as member in several other committees. Therefore, he has shown unavailability to visit the site for inspection. Hence, the name of Sh. Prabhakar Verma is replaced with Dr. Rajbir Singh Bondwal, IFS (Retd.), Member SEAC. The new committee will inspect the site and submit its report at the earliest.

The case was taken up during 254th meeting held on 31.10.2022. The site inspection report of the sub-committee was received and circulated among the members for comments. The case was deferred for the next meeting.

The case was taken up during 256th meeting held on 30.11.2022. Comments of PP were not received. Report be circulated again to PP for their comments with direction to submit comments within 15 days from the date of issue of minutes. **The PP shall submit scrutiny fee as**

prescribed. The case was deferred and shall be taken up as and when the comments of PP received.

The case was taken up during 259th meeting held on 19.01.2023. However, PP did not appear before the committee. The committee decided that a direction be issued to PP to appear before the committee in next meeting and relevant part of minutes shall also be conveyed to PP via speed post and email. The case was deferred for next meeting.

The case was taken up during 262nd meeting held on 14.03.2023. However, a letter dated 07.03.2023 received from PP stating that they have removed the temporary existing structure from the project site. The built-up area is less than 20,000 sq. mtr and the project is not covered under EIA Notification 14th September 2006. The PP further informed that they have already obtained OC vide Memo No. G-2593/SD(Bs)/2014/25778 Dated 07.11.2014. It is also stated by PP that as per OM of MOEF&CC dated 04.10.2022, warehouse having built-up area of 1,50,000 sq. mtr is exempted from obtaining EC. The PP has requested that their case may be closed as they have already obtained OC from DTCP.

A detailed discussion was held on the submission made by the PP through Email dated 07.03.2023. The committee decided that the PP (either themselves or their authorized representative) as well as their consultant be directed to attend the forthcoming meeting of SEAC and to make their submission alongwith relevant documents regarding their project. The PP is further directed to submit information of the case having chronological history as site visit of the project has already been conducted by the sub-committee. **The PP shall also submit scrutiny fee as prescribed.**

The committee further decided to communicate the decision of committee to PP on their official email as well as speed post and deferred the case for next meeting.

The case was taken up during 267th meeting held on 17.05.2023. The consultant on behalf of PP has appeared before the committee. A letter written by PP has been submitted by consultant during the meeting. PP also attached an affidavit dated 16.05.2023 alongwith the letter stating therein as under:

- 1. That the sub-committee was constituted in 242nd SEAC Meeting held on dated 24.06.2022 to inspect of status of project. Accordingly report of sub-committee is submitted to SEAC.
- 2. That we have removed the temporary existing structures from our project site.
- 3. That our project built up area is less than 20,000 m² and it is not covered under EIA notification 14th September, 2006. We have

- already obtained OC vide Memo No. G-2593/SD(BS)/2014/25778 dated 07.11.2014.
- 4. That further as per OM of MOEF&CC dated 04.10.2022 warehouse building up to the built up area of 1,50,000 sqm is exempted from obtaining EC.

Further, PP has requested that their case may be closed as they have already obtained OC from DTCP.

The committee considered the submission from the PP and unanimously decided that this case be sent to SEIAA with the recommendation to delist the case keeping in view report of sub-committee and MoEF&CC notification dated 04.10.2022.

Findings and Decision of THE AUTHORITY (SEIAA):

The recommendations of SEAC were taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA held on 03.06.2023.

The Authority after due deliberations; decided to agree with the recommendations of SEAC to de-list this proposal with the directions to the Project Proponent for strict compliance of the guidelines issued by MoEF & CC, GoI vide OM dated 09.06.2015.

Accordingly, case is disposed off.

Proposal for the said Project was submitted to the SEIAA vide online Proposal No. SIA/HR/INFRA2/428798/2023 dated 11.05.2023 for approval of Terms of Reference (ToR) (under Violation) of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006. The Project Proponent has deposited Scrutiny fee of ₹ 1,50,000/- vide DD No. 568809 dated 09.05.2023 (in compliance of Haryana Government, Environment & Climate Change Department Notification No. DE&CCH/3060 dated 14.10.2021).

Appraisal & Recommendations of SEAC:

The said case was taken up during 268th meetings of SEAC held on 31.05.2023 and SEAC recommended the Project to SEIAA for Grant of Terms of Reference and additional Terms of Reference (under violation) for undertaking EIA and preparation of Environment Management Plan (EMP).

Findings and Decision of THE AUTHORITY (SEIAA):

The recommendations of SEAC were taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA held on 03.06.2023.

The Authority after having gone through the details & record placed on the file alongwith considering the recommendations of the Appraisal Committee (SEAC), decided to approve the <u>Terms of Reference (TOR)</u> in the instant case <u>under Violation</u> <u>Category</u>.

Accordingly, TOR Granted & case is disposed of.



Item No. 158.23: Expansion of Amravati Enclave NH-22, Shopping Mall+1080 No. of Flats + Plots at Village Bhagwanpur, Islampur and Chandi Mandir, Ambala- Kalka National Highway near Panchkula. (Extension of Environment Clearance Granted by memo no. SEIAA/HR/2021/31 dated 05.01.2021) by M/s Amarnath Agarwal Investments (P) Limited.

SEIAA during the MoM 157th dated 11.05.2023 has stated as follows:

"In compliance of the spirit of directions passed by Hon'ble NGT in Original Application No. 78/2021 and Execution Application No. 09/2021 titled as Ramesh Malik Versus Union of India & others as well as in view of the violations committed by the project proponent as observed in the preceding Paras' and powers delegated specifically by MoEF& CC vide Notification No S.O. 637 (E) dated 28.02.2014 to the SEIAA for keeping environment Clearance in abeyance for violation of the EC conditions or withdrawing the respective EC, Authority hereby consider that the present case is fit to withdraw the Environmental Clearance issued vide letter dated 25.03.2010 and subsequent, Extension granted thereto vide letter dated 05.01.2021 issued to the M/s Amarnath Aggarwal Investment P Ltd for construction project namely Amravati Enclave-NH-22, shopping mall + 1080 flats + plots at Village Bhagwanpur, Islamnagar Chandimandir- Kalka National Highway near Panchkula.

Accordingly, the Authority vide order dated 01.04.2022, directed the Project Proponent that the EC dated 25.03.2010 granted and subsequent extension dated 05.01.2021 hereby stands withdrawn with immediate effect. Henceforth, PP shall not carry out any new activity/construction/expansion relating to the project.

Now, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide order dated 26.04.2023, modified its directions contained in paragraph 56.5 of the order dated 03.06.2022. Accordingly, the project proponent is requested to reinstate their Extension of Environment Clearance letter

The matter was taken up during 157th Meeting of SEIAA held on 11.05.2023 and the Authority, after having seen the representation dated 02.05.2023 made by the PP and further holding discussion, decided to refer the proposal to Appraisal Committee (SEAC) to put up the case before the Authority, in view of the Judgement passed by the HON'BLE SUPREME COURT OF INDIA;

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Accordingly, the case was sent to SEAC and the case was taken up during 268th meeting of SEAC held on 31.05.2023. The PP alongwith consultant appeared before the committee. The reply dated 25.05.2023 submitted by the PP was deliberated and discussed thoroughly in the meeting. In its reply, the PP also requested to reinstate their extension of environmental clearance and the time lost in litigation be also granted to them. The PP further submitted chronology as well as key details of the project in the form of affidavit dated 31.05.2023 stating therein as under:

- 1. It is to submit that we were executing this project as per EC granted by SEIAA Haryana renewed for 3 years on 05.01.2021, when it was withdrawn by SEIAA vide its order dated 01.04.2022 (Annexure-I) due to a case filed in Hon'ble NGT appeal of M/s Ramesh Malik & Ors. application No. 78/2021.
- 2. It is to submit that construction over only 2.6 Acres of area is pending.
- 3. That we have therefore presented/appeared before NGT and the Hon'ble NGT in its judgment given on 19.05.2022 on original application no 78/2021 and execution application No. 09/2021 has disposed of the appeal of M/s Ramesh Malik & Ors. and accepted prayer of M/s Amarnath Aggarwal Investment Pvt. Ltd. (annexure-II) clarifying that no violation of wildlife clearance is done by the project proponent and held the EC issued by SEIAA as valid and stayed the SEIAA order dated 01.04.22 as well as clarified that 'GENERAL CONDITIONS' are not applicable to CONSTRUCTION / AREA development projects.
- 4. That we have therefore requested SEIAA to revoke its decision and SEIAA has made a committee for the purpose which also visited our site and after the site visit of this committee we have submitted reply to all the queries of this Committee sent in form of tabular form and as well as given an undertaking that any pending works e.g construction of two pending rain water harvesting pits out of nine etc. shall be completed once the EC is reinstated as they are related to work to be done for the remaining project. This is also in line with directions by Hon'ble NGT "that as the project is incomplete pending works will be taken up"
- 5. That during this time after the formation of the committee by SEIAA Hon'ble SC has issued another order dated 03.06.2022 that no construction shall be undertaken within **1.0 KM** of any project from wild life sanctuaries to which we have duly provided all facts to the committee that the distance of 880m from one corner of land in which STP of the project is located granted permission vide license No.33/96 dated 15.3.1996 which was completed in 2001 (The completion letter from TCP was submitted with our reply) whereby Khol Hai Rattan sanctuary was notified on 10.12.2004 and 07.09.2007 well after the completion of said. Also we have prepared and submitted the conservation plan of schedule-I species to Chief Wildlife Warden, Panchkula vide letter no.- ANAI/22/469 dated 16.12.2022.
- 6. That meanwhile Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has modified it order dated 03 June 2022 regarding the limit of wildlife sanctuary in the judgement of 26 April 2023 and no such restriction is now imposed. However, we further assure that in

this regard we will follow the direction of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in letter & spirit.

7. That we commit ourselves to comply with all the EC conditions including three specific conditions of the Hon'ble NGT in its order dated 19.05.2022 which are reproduced below:-

That we have submitted all documents to SEAC for its 268th Meeting held on 31.05.23 vide our letter dated ANAI/23/45 dated 25.5.23 and also submit this affidavit with a request to reinstate extension of environmental clearance granted on 5.1.2021 including extending our EC by the period for which it was revoked that is from 01.04.2022-30.5.23 (One year and 2 Months) further so that we can complete our pending project as we have complied with various EC conditions laid down to the best of our knowledge.

In this regard, PP submitted as follows:

"In compliance of Hon'ble NGT order dated 19.05.222 passed in E.A. No.09 of 2021 0.A. No.78 of 2021 with Appeal No.. 15/2022 (I.A. No. 84/2022 and I.A No. 85/2022), the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority, Haryana vide order dated 28.07.2022 to conduct the site inspection, constituted a joint committee of followings:

- 1. Shri Vijay Kumar Gupta, Chairman, SEAC
- 2. Shri Bhupender Singh Rinwa, Member Secretary, SEAC
- 3. Regional Officer concerned to be nominated by Member Secretary, HSPCB
- 4. Concerned Wildlife Warden of the area (to be nominated by Chief Wildlife Warden, (Haryana)

The sub-committee finally visited the site on 24.08.2022 as project proponent sought postponement on various days fixed for site visit and some observations were conveyed to the project proponent and consultant present during site visit. The PP submitted the report dated 04.10.2022 alognwith supporting documents Annexure-I to Annexure-Viii which are attached in original. In his report, project proponent gave the status to construction of all the conditions of Environment Clearance already accorded. However, the reply of three observations of NGT in his order dated 19.05.2022 are reproduced again below:

- 1. Latest reports on Noise Monitoring in 2020, 2021 and 2022 (attached with reply Annexure I)
- 2. PP has planted more than 5000 trees in the enclave to provide a green area (Pictures of green area are attached at Annexure II)
- 3. A copy of all submission letters till 31.03.2022 (attached at Annexure III and IV)
- 4. Regarding construction in green area the PP has submitted that:
 "SEIAA Haryana has renewed the validity of EC for 3 years on 5.1.2021. At the time of applying renewal of validity of EIA, the SEIAA was duly provided with latest layout (Annexure VII) plan as due to change in demarcation done by Town and planning Department Haryana, the location of booths and EWS Flats was shifted. However, as there was no change in total project area, FAR, even the green area remains as per norms i. e. 15%, the same (Annexure VIII) was considered and validity was extended."
- 5. The PP has submitted that:

"We have not done any construction further since 2021 as the matter was sub judice. Now in view of NGT orders decision to revoke the EC granted be kindly withdrawn and we be allowed to start the construction."

6. On dated 18.10.2022, PP has submitted application regarding NBWL as follows:

"The distance of Khol hi-Ratan was 1.87 km as per report of 2.60 acre area under development. As per notification of 24.10.2016 our project site is outside the ESZ Area of Khol hi-Rattan and balance area where the construction is to be done is at a distance of 1.6 km from Khol hi-Rattan Wild life sanctuary. Also we have withdrawn our application with NBWL and written to the Chief Wildlife Warden, Panchkula, vide our letter no. ANAI-22/427 dated 18.10.2022 in this respect (Copy attached)."

7. The PP has submitted that:

"At the time of extension of Environments Clearance, pending work is in 2.6 Acre area and within the area of 24378 sqmtr.

1. The PP has submitted that:

"Rain Water Harvesting Well will be completed within 1 Year when construction work starts."

PP was further asked to submit the details of the area which has been developed and possession/occupation has been allotted to the allottees alongwith copy of OC by Town & Control Planning Department and CTO by Haryana State Pollution Control Board. In compliance the Project Proponent submitted, Annexure-IX and Annexure-X wherein it has been shown that out of total area of 118.68 Acre only 2.6 acre area has been left which is under development for which OC/CTO is yet to be obtained. The location of the area yet to be developed is marked on the layout plan attached in red color.

On dated 31.10.2022, PP submitted the detail of distance of three wild life sanctuary from balance 2.6 acre area under development alongwith google image and stated that two pending RWH will be constructed within one year from start of construction in pending area alongwith any pending requirement in EC conditions

(Copy attached). The PP submitted that the distance of three wildlife sanctuaries for the area yet to be developed (2.6 acres) is as follows:

In addition PP submitted reply on dated 30.11.2022 to the clarification asked by the Deputy Chief Wildlife Warden, Panchkula which is as follows:

- 1. The matter regarding wildlife Clearance w.r.t Sukhna lake is already decided by the Hon'ble NGT in its order dated 19.5.22 as well it is clarified that 'General Conditions are not applicable to construction/area development projects.
- 2. With respect to judgement of Hon'ble SC dated 3.6.22 brought to our notice, regarding no construction activity to be done within 1 Km from boundary of wild life sanctuary, it is submitted that the expansion area of 16.15 acres (For which licence was given License No.186/2008 dated 29.10.2008 for which EC is granted vide letter dated 25.3.2010 and validity extended for 3 years vide letter dated 5.1.2021 in which construction over only 2.6 acres is left is outside 1 Km for which documents already submitted.
- 3. The distance of 880 m from one corner of land in which STP is located as pointed out is for the project granted permission vide license No.33/96 dated 15.3.1996 which was completed in 2001 as per TCP letter attached at (Annexure-1 Copy of license and TCP letter). It is also submitted that STP here was constructed at that time only and Consent to operate was obtained (Annexure-II- Copy of consent to operate from Haryana pollution Control Board dated 25.5.04 is attached) whereby Khol Hai Rattan sanctuary was notified on 10.12.2004 and 7.9.2007 well after the completion of said project.

The Committee is of the view that PP shall ensure compliance of judgment dated 03.06.2022 of Hon'ble Supreme Court in case IA No.1000 of 2003 in WP(C) No.202 of 1995 titled as TN Godavaram Vs. Union of India and Ors. because as per submission of PP the STP is within 1 km from the boundary of nearest Wildlife Sanctuary Khol Hai Raitan.

The Committee is also of the view that PP to prepare and submit the conservation plan of Schedule-1 species to Chief Wild Life Warden, Panchkula as there are number of Schedule-1 species in the surrounding area.

From the above, it is observed that PP has either complied the conditions of EC or given consent to complete balance requirements of EC within one year of the start of construction in balance under development 2.6 acre area as remaining area of (116.08 acre) is already

developed and for that OC/CTO has been obtained from competent authorities. During site visit, it was observed that no construction activities were going on at site, at present."

Keeping in view the above facts and affidavit submitted by the PP as referred above, the committee is of the view that keeping in view the latest order passed by Hon'ble Supreme Court in I.A. Nos. 131377, 147102, 195467, 195468, 205092 of 2022, I.A. Nos. 162283 and 162284 of 2022 in I.A. D. NO. 125746 of 2022 WITH I.A. Nos. 118604, 118606, 119400, 119401, 119404, 137132, 137138, 137140 and 137143 of 2022 I.A. Nos. 5764, 6804 and 10911 of 2023 in the matter of Writ Petition (Civil) No. 202 of 1995 in RE: T. N. Godavarman Thirumul pad Petitioner(s) Versus Union of India and Others ...Respondent(s) dated 26.04.2023 vide which the Hon'ble Supreme Court has modified its order dated 03.06.2023 regarding Wildlife Sanctuary in the judgement of 26.04.2023 that there is no condition regarding restriction of construction activity within 1km of Wildlife Sanctuary.

The PP also submitted conservation plan of Schedule-I species to Chief Wildlife Warden, Haryana as per the submission made at Sr. No.05 of above referred affidavit dated 31.05.2023.

Therefore, keeping in view the above discussion, the committee is of the view and recommend that Environment Clearance may be reinstated keeping in view Hon'ble NGT order dated 19.05.2022 and also keeping in view the latest Supreme Court order dated 26.04.2023.

Regarding request of PP for extension in time limit for the period 01.04.2022 to till the Environment Clearance reinstated i.e. period of time lost in litigation, it is submitted that there is no instruction of MoEF&CC through which the request of extension of litigation period can be granted for extension of EC.

Findings and Decision of THE AUTHORITY (SEIAA):

The recommendations of SEAC were taken up during 158th Meeting of SEIAA held on 03.06.2023.

The Authority after having gone through the details placed on the file, perusal of recommendations made by Expert Committee (SEAC) and further the order dated 19.05.2022, passed by the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal & Order dated 26.04.2023 passed by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India; in Writ Petition (Civil)

No. 202 of 1995, decided to reinstate the Environment Clearance dated 25.03.2010 & subsequent Extension letter dated 05.01.2010, Granted for the Project in the name of M/s Amarnath Aggarwal Investments Pvt. Ltd. with the following Terms & Conditions:

- 1. That Project Proponent shall strictly adhere to all provisions of EIA Notification dated 14.09.2006.
- 2. That Project Proponent shall maintain Green cover of the Project as per the original EC dated 25.03.2010. Green area shall not be modified, reduced or put to use for any other purpose at any stage.
- 3. That Project Proponent shall ensure strict compliance of the conditions as stipulated in the EC dated 25.03.2010 without any deviation / exception.
- 4. That Project Proponent shall furnish Six Monthly Compliance Report with all details and indicator as were to be complied in the observations conveyed to him earlier.
- 5. That Project Proponent shall encourage & develop infrastructure for installation of Solar Power at least 5% of the total consumption of power.
- 6. That Project Proponent shall encourage to install infrastructure for the charging of Electrical vehicles to the extent, possible.
