The Committee noted that as per cluster letter issued by Asst. Director o f Mines & Geology, Chittoor, vide Lr. dated: 22.11.2022, there are six ex isting quarry lease within the radius of 500 mts area. The total cluster ar ea is > 5.0 Ha and **life of the mine is 20 years** 

And whereas, pursuant to the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated the 27th February, 2012 in I.A. No.12-13 of 2011 in Special Leave Petiti on (Civil) No.19628-19629 of 2009, in the matter of Deepak Kumar etc. Vs. State of Haryana and Others etc., prior environmental clearance has now become mandatory for mining of minor minerals and the Central Go vernment has published notification number S.O.141(E), dated the 15th January, 2016 making prior environment clearance mandatory for all min erals (major as well as minor) irrespective of size of the mine lease; And whereas, all mine lease holders are required to obtain prior environment clearance.

This is a second renewal lease quarry.

The committee noted that the proponent operated mine after 2016 witho ut obtaining environmental clearance as required under EIA notification 2 006 after promulgation of S.O. 141 (E) dt 15.01.2016 and hence to be treated as identified violation case as per OM 07.07.2021.

NGT order in OA No 136 of 2017 (SZ) : So under these circumstances, t he application can be disposed of, giving the following directions: (i)The applications which are pending as on 31.3.2016 for Environment Clearan ce have to be treated as normal applications and not violation applicatio ns and the authorities are directed to dispose of those applications in ac cordance with law. 81 (ii) The persons who have not filed applications on or before 31.3.2016 and filed thereafter, can be treated as violation appli cations and the MoEF& CC /SEIAA is directed to dispose of those applic ations as violation cases in accordance with law. (iii) It is also made clea r that all mining leases, either major or minor, even less than 5 hectares area, has to apply and get Environment Clearance as per the amended EIA Notification dated 15.1.2016. This will apply to the existing mining le ases as well. The points are answered accordingly.

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, Mo EF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended to issue specific (Violation) Terms of Reference with Public Hearing and following conditions:

- 1. The project proponent shall prepare cluster EIA& EMP.
- 2. The project proponent shall prepare a plan for surface runoff preve ntion measures.
- The project proponent shall prepare a plantation plan including no. of species and type of species and area of land allocated for green belt.
- 4. The Project proponent shall obtain Barrier removal permission from Mines & Geology Department.
- 5. The project proponent shall submit plan for Restoration of benches and buffer zone in remediation plan and the cost of restoration of b enches and buffer zone should be included in Bank guarantee.
- 6. The proponent is liable to pay the penalties as levied by the concer ned competent authority, as per the OM No.28.1.2022 and clause No 12 of SOP dated07-07-2021, duly incorporating the total produ ction during the violation period and submit the calculation of penal ties based on the project cost and the total turnover during the viol ation period.
- 7. Credible action to be initiated through concerned Regional office, APPCB under section 15 read with section 19 of E(P) Act 1986.
- 8. The project proponent shall carry assessment of ecological damag e, remediation plan and natural and community resource augment ation plan and it shall be prepared as an independent chapter in th e environment impact assessment report by the accredited consult ants. The collection and analysis of data for assessment of ecologi cal damage, preparation of remediation plan and natural and com munity resource augmentation plan shall be done by an environme ntal laboratory duly notified under Environment (Protection) Act, 19 86, or an environmental laboratory accredited by National Accredit ation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories, or a laborator y of a Council of Scientific and Industrial Research institution worki ng in the field of environment.

Vasantha Rao representative of the mining project: While respond ing to the issues, he informed that they have developed lot of green belt and increasing the development of green belt every year; providing cove rs to the loaded trucks during transportation; providing water tankers for drinking in the villages; providing personal protection equipment, water p lant & conducting health checkups periodically to the workers working in the mine. He added that employment opportunities would be increased i n the proposed enhancement. He assured that the management would s ort out the issues and adopt necessary measures to carry out mining op erations per the Government norms.

The base line data was collected from March, 2022 to May 2022.
