Mining of minerals (≤ 250 ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).</p> <p>The proponent of the project and their RQP Sri K Santhosh Kumar, have attended the meeting and presented the case. The SEAC committee noted that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">The Department of Mines and Geology submitted DSR of erstwhile SPSR Nellore District. The same is reviewed in the SEAC meeting and the present mine lease details are mentioned at page No 127 in the DSR.As per the approved mining plan dt. 05.01.2022, the total provided mineral reserves are 22420 m³. The proponent proposed to excavate Road Metal: 11,513 m³/annum, Gravel : 4,883 m³/annum and Life of the mine is 4.59 years.This is an existing quarry lease and the project proponent has obtained LOI on 21.10.2021 and also obtained LOI Extension on 11.10.2022, which is valid for a period of 1 year i.e., up to 20.10.2023.The Vedicherla Reserve Forest is about 20M and the Amili Reserve Forest is about 223m from the mine lease area. The project proponent has submitted Forest NOC vide letter dt. 29.08.2023.During the course of meeting the committee examined KML file and observed that there are some workings on Southern side. Hence, committee recommended to raise ADS for submission of following to ascertain the violation and cluster situation.<ol style="list-style-type: none">The project proponent shall submit latest cluster letter from the Mines & Geology dept as the submitted cluster letter is 2 years old.The project proponent shall submit production and Dispatch details from the Mines & Geology dept from 15.01.2016 onwards. |

Mining of minerals (< 250 ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).</p> |


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The project proponent and their consultant M/s. SV Enviro Labs & Consultants., have attended the meeting and presented their proposal. The SEAC committee noted that:

- a) The Department of Mines and Geology submitted DSR of erstwhile Kadapa District. The same is reviewed in the SEAC meeting and observed that the mineral content is available in the nearby village /cluster to the subject mine.
- b) As per the approved modified mining plan dt.04.05.2023, the total provided mineral reserves are 59,99,962 Tonnes. The proponent proposed to excavate 4,95,000 TPA and Life of the mine is 12.12 years.
- c) The project proponent has submitted Modified mining plan by leaving 11.0 Ha as non-mining zone on Southern side and proposes to utilize this area for Grazing and plantation. Also, it was in the modified mining plan it was mentioned that boulders for M-Sand.
- d) The project proponent obtained TOR with public hearing on 07.01.2020 and public hearing was held on 22.09.2022.
- e) Public hearing details: Damage to wild Animals, Ancient rock painting, crop damages and fodder for cattle are the specific issues raised in the public hearing.
- f) The reply by the proponent for the issues raised in the PH is as follows:
Sri.Mamilla Vijaya Baskhar Reddy, Jammalamadugu, Project Proponent informed that he has obtained qualifications of Diploma in Mining, AMIE Mining and Lateral Mining and B.Tech, at the age of 50 years, due to interest in the field Mining. He informed that, the area he applied for mine lease is devoid of any vegetation or grass and located at a distance of about 2 Km from the ancient pre-historic rock paintings of Chintakunta, moreover the Chintakunta pond mentioned is 500 mtrs downwards from the proposed mine area. He further informed that they will conduct mining activities without obstructing the flow of water stream and controlling dust by providing dust collectors, sprinkling water on tipper movement roads every 2 hours, deploying a competent mine manager. He stated that they will operate the mine with the cooperation of the villagers as their family member following their suggestions. He informed that the management of the proposed mine will remit the Royalties and contribute to the income of the State. He further Stated that the management of proposed mine will spend part of the income generated from the mine, to provide water plant, ambulance, school books and other facilities for the villagers. He informed that, use of advanced nano technology blasting, series blasting, delay detonators, water sprinkling on rocks & ramp every 2 hours through water tankers will be undertaken, to control dust emissions. In response to the query raised on the ownership of the proposed mine, he informed that he along with his spouse are the Board of Directors of M/s JAP Natural stones mine and stated that any concerns on the project may be addressed directly to him considering him as their family member so as to find solution amicably in the interest of the surrounding villagers and the environment.
- g) The Base line data was collected from Dec, 2020 to Feb, 2020. The predominant wind direction is observed to be East to West.
- h) The maximum concentration of SPM is observed to be 67 µg/m³. The incremental concentration is 3.43 µg/m³. The GLC of SPM will fall at 0.94 Km in West direction of the mine.
- i) The proponent volunteered to provide Ambulance to Muddanur and Digital class rooms to primary school in Chintakunta Village as a part of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) activity and shall maintain till the life of the mine.
- j) This proposal was appraised in the 212th SEAC meeting and the recommended to raise ADS for following:
 1. Modified mining plan after demarcating 11.0 Ha as non-mining area and


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- shall be used for Grazing and plantation.
2. Convert Mining of mineral from M-sand to Boulders for M- sand.
 3. Accordingly, the project proponent has submitted modified mining dt. 04.05.2023 through ADS reply on 10.05.2023.
- f) The project has furnished the ADS reply and the proposal was earlier appraised in the 224th SEAC meeting. The committee noted that the project proponent has proposed to leave 11.0 Ha as non-mining zone towards southern side to facilitate for cattle grazing and for development of green belt. The project proponent has submitted the approved modified mining plan dated: 04.05.2023 incorporating the above.
- g) The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, Modified mining plan, ADS reply MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs, EIA report, PH minutes and detailed deliberations, **recommended to issue Environmental clearance** with following additional conditions:
1. The proponent shall comply with the proposals furnished in the Environmental management plan and EIA report.
 2. The project proponent shall develop greenbelt of 1000 plants along approach roads & village Roadsides.
 3. The project proponent shall maintain 7.5mt greenbelt in buffer zone and existing buffer zone plantation should not be disturbed.
 4. The project proponent shall carryout the mining with proper benches.
 5. The proponent shall take dust suppression measures to meet the CPCB stipulated ambient air quality standards at any point of time.
 6. The proponent shall carryout suppression of dust generated due to transport vehicles by continuous water spraying using tankers.
 7. The vehicles carrying the mines material shall be covered with tarpaulin during vehicular movement.
 8. The project proponent shall not use village road/ Canal bund roads for mineral transportation purpose.
 9. The project proponent shall carryout mining with proper benches.
 10. The project proponent shall restrict vehicles movement during the peak hours to avoid accidents.
 11. The project proponent shall comply assurance/ promises given in the public hearing.
 12. The project proponent shall leave 11.0 Ha towards southern side as the non-mining zone and shall utilize the non-mining zone for cattle grazing and development for greenbelt.
 13. The project proponent shall provide 700m trench with rocky bund on southern side to prevent surface runoff and shall strengthen the southern side water pond.
 14. The project proponent shall not dump any waste in the water pond.
 15. The project proponent shall adopt for controlled blasting and shall take all measures for protecting ancient rocks paintings if any in the area.
- h) This proposal was placed in the 221st SEIAA, A.P meeting and the decision of SEIAA is as follows:
- "Refer to SEAC to constitute a subcommittee to examine the objections raised in the public hearing, protection of prehistoric rock paintings in the hillock, water body, wildlife and other objections and recommendations may be forwarded to SEIAA within 30 days".
- i) Accordingly, this proposal along with the SEIAA recommendation is appraised in 228th SEAC meeting and agreed with recommendations of SEIAA, A.P to constitute a subcommittee to examine the objections raised in the public hearing, protection of


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prehistoric rock paintings in the hillock, water body, wildlife and other objections with the following members;
 1. Prof. K. Thyaga Raju
 2. Prof. C.Sashidhar
 3. Dr. M. Sunandana Reddy

SIA/AP/1 NFRA2/4 14730/2 023 The Proposal of AVAASA Realtors Private Limited., is for construction of Residential Tower Project with Built Up area -38,518 Sq.m. The project falls under Item No. 8(a)- Building and Construction Projects (>20,000 Sq.mtrs and <1,50,000 sq. m. of built up area).

The proponent and their consultant, B S Enviro Tech have attended the meeting and presented their proposal. The SEAC committee noted that:

a) The project proponent proposes to construct a Residential Tower project titled "AVAASONE" at Sy.No. 98(part), Sarpavaram Village, Kakinada Rural Mandal, Kakinada District, Andhra Pradesh with Built Up area -38,518 Sq.m and total plot area is 6131 Sq.m. The details are as follows:

- b) About 317 Kgs/day of garbage is expected to be generated for which the proponent proposed to provide garbage chute to ensure the disposal as per solid management rules 2016.
 c) The project proponent submitted land documents for an area of 1.515 Acres
 d) The committee appraised the application from the Environmental point of view only with respect to liquid, solid and air pollution managements.
 e) The water balance report submitted is not clear and around 78 KLD is proposed to be discharged into Nalla.
 f) The committee noted that there is no proper sewerage infrastructure in the proposed area. Proper lined sloped Public municipal drains without leading to canal are also not located.
 g) This proposal was earlier placed in 218th SEAC meeting and the committee


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recommended **to raise ADS** for uploading of:

1. The EMP with corrected water balance, solid waste management proposals.
2. The project proponent shall obtain Bore log/ soil profile log reports.
3. Detailed Procedure for cellar/ basement and foundation excavation as the ground water table is just 1m below the surface.
4. The proponent shall submit Geo-technical report and grouting activity for cellars/basements to prevent the damages to the adjacent Structures during the foundation stage.
5. The proponent shall submit the latest site photographs with Geo coordinates and date to ascertain status of construction.
The project proponent shall upload NOC from Airport Authority of India.
6. The project proponent shall upload fire NOC.
7. The project proponent shall obtain Wastewater discharge permission.
8. The project proponent shall upload SBC report along with Foundation Recommendations.
9. Details of STP Designs.
10. DPR covering the above said points.

h) Accordingly, proponent has submitted ADS reply in the parivesh Portal expect wastewater discharge permission from Concern Department.

i) Again, this proposal was placed in 225th SEAC meeting. The committee noted that the project proponent has not submitted reply to all the issues raised in the ADS and also noted that Railway Track is passing at distance of 50Mts from the Proposed site. Hence, the committee recommended **to raise ADS** for submission of the following :

- i. The project proponent shall upload file foundation map.
- ii. The project proponent shall upload wastewater discharge permission for Concern Department.
- iii. The project proponent shall upload grouting plan/ water proofing plan.
- iv. The project proponent shall submit auger/hammer pile foundation plan.
- v. The project proponent shall submit foundation activity plan all along the railway line.
- vi. DPR covering the above said points.

j) The project proponent has furnished ADS reply and again this proposal was placed in 228th SEAC meeting. The committee noted that:

- i. The project proponent has furnished Drainage division NOC dt.17.08.202.
- ii. The project proponent has furnished grouting plan/ water proofing plan.
- iii. The project proponent has furnished aguer/ hammer pile foundation plan and also furnished foundation activity plan all along the railway line

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, MoEF&CC' Notifications & OMs, detailed deliberations, and recommended **to issue Environmental Clearance** with the following additional conditions.

1. The proponent shall construct and commission STP along with commissioning of project, treat the effluents to meet irrigation standards at any point of time before using for gardening purpose or disposal.
2. The proponent shall implement the solid waste management as per the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 applicable for constructions projects.
3. The proponent shall construct rainwater harvesting pit and storm water drains to recharge the groundwater and utilize the same within the premises.


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4. The proponent shall comply with the proposals furnished in the Environmental management plan.
5. The project proponent shall obtain all statutory permissions as required before starting the construction.
6. The project proponent shall install organic waste converter for the treatment and disposal of wet garbage in a scientific manner.
7. The parking area shall be in compliance with NBC/ MoEF&CC, GoI/ Local Government regulations as applicable, whichever is higher.
8. The project proponent shall comply with the Environmental conditions specified for construction and building projects in the appendix of MoEF&CC, GoI, S.O No (E) 5703 dt. 14.11.2018.
9. The project proponent should discharge treated water only and shall comply with the conditions stipulated in the Drainage division NOC dt.17.08.2023.
10. The project proponent shall construct retaining wall along the periphery of the project site.
11. The project proponent shall provide underground de-watering system as the ground water is about 3m from the Below Ground Level.
12. The project proponent shall design the structural drawing by considering the lateral loads as the railway track is about 50m.
13. The project proponent shall use shear wall technology.

M/S. H R R Construction Pvt. Ltd. & Others Is Proposing To Construct Commercial Cum Residential Building At T.S.No. 75 Part, Waltair Ward, Block No. 09, Zone-III, Division No. 19, G.V.M.C Limits, Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh - Environmental Clearance - Reg.

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Category: B2 (Building and Construction Projects).
The Proposal of **M/S. H R R Construction Pvt. Ltd. & others** is **Commercial Cum Residential Building** Project with Built Up Area - 1,24,444.46 Sq.Min Total Plot Area of 13237.65 Sq.M.

The Project falls under Item No. 8(A) of the Schedule of the EIA Notification 2006 And Its Amendments Thereof - Building And Construction Projects (<20,000 Sq.Mtrs And >1,50,000 Sq. M. of Built Up Area).

The Proponent and their Consultant Sri. Chandra Sekhar, M/s. Space Enviro Have Attended the meeting and presented the case. The SEAC committee observed that:

- a) The Project Proponent Has Proposed to Construct Commercial Cum Residential Building (3 Cellars+ Ground Floor+ 23 Upper Floors) in Site Area of about 13237.65 Sq.M.at T.S.No. 75 Part, Waltair Ward, Block No. 09, Zone-III, Division No. 19, G.V.M.C Limits, and the details are as follows:

- b) The Project Proponent has obtained following statutory permissions from concerned departments.
- c) The Project Proponent has obtained NOC from Airport Authority of India on 11.11.2020.
- d) The project proponent has obtained Fire NOC on 15.12. 2022.
- e) The project proponent has obtained SBC report from Andhra University, Visakhapatnam Dt.19.01.2023.
- f) The water source for the project is Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal corporation (GVMC), Visakhapatnam, 242.35 KLD water required for the proposal and total wastewater generation - 203.68 KLD. The proponent proposed to provide 230 KLD sewage treatment plant and after treatment 87.71 KLD is used for flushing, gardening and remaining 89.29 KLD of water is proposed to be discharged into municipal sewer.
- g) About 935.45 kgs/day of garbage is expected to be generated for which the proponent proposed to provide garbage chute to ensure the disposal as per solid management rules 2016.
- h) The issue was appraised in the 214th SEAC meeting and the committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, MoEF&CC notifications & oms, detailed deliberations, recommended **to raise ADS** for submission of :
- The proponent shall carryout traffic density study.
 - The proponent shall submit proper land documents and submit court disposal order on land litigations.
 - The proponent shall submit modified cellar plan (for two cellars only) to avoid damages/collapse of adjacent apartments while excavating the cellar and foundations.
 - Detailed procedure for cellar and foundation excavation.
 - The proponent shall submit geo-technical report and grouting activity for cellars to prevent the damages to the adjacent apartments during the excavation for the cellars.
 - The proponent shall submit the latest site photographs with geo coordinates and date."
- i) Accordingly, the proponent submitted ADS reply on 08.05.2023 and again this proposal was placed in 221st SEAC meeting.
- j) During the appraisal, the SEAC committee examined the latest site photographs with geo- coordinates, and the committee observed that the excavation works of the project has been started without taking prior environmental clearance. Hence, the committee treated this proposal as a violation case and directed the project proponent to apply for violation TOR.
- k) The SEAC **recommended to reject** the proposal as the proposed project falls under violation category and directed the project proponent to apply for violation TOR.
- l) This proposal was placed before of 218th SEIAA meeting and the decision of the SEIAA is as follows:
"Refer to SEAC to examine w.r.t representation of proponent (M/S. H R R Construction Pvt. Ltd. & Others) received on 17.07.2023".


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- m) Again, this proposal was placed in 225th SEAC meeting as per the recommendation of the SEIAA in 218th meeting. The SEAC committee examined representation dt 17.07.2023 of the project proponent and the project proponent informed that they were unable to produce the GVMC building permit order during the 221st SEAC meeting though they were possessing the same and submitted building permit from GVMC issued vide permit no 1086/3302/B/Z3/KTA/2021 dt. 07.08.2021
- n) The SEAC noted that the project proponent obtained building permit order for total built up area of 18,110 Sq.m (Ground Floor 3960.41 Sq.m, Upper Floors - 3960.41 Sq.m, and Parking floors- 10190.55 Sq.m,) from GVMC vide permit order dt. 07.08.2021.
- o) The SEAC noted that the construction projects having built up area < 20,000 Sq. does not require prior Environmental clearance as per the EIA notification, 2006. The project proponent informed that they have carried out excavation works after obtaining the building permit from GVMC as no prior EC required for the built up area of 18,110 Sq.m
- p) Subsequently they have modified the project proposal by increasing the built up area from 18,110 Sq.m to 1,24,444.46 Sq.m and applied for prior Environmental clearance as per the EIA notification.
- q) During the course of meeting, the committee questioned about the land disputes in the proposed project and for that proponent has produced Hon'ble High Court order in W.P.No.19418 of 2021 dt. 08.11.2021 and informed that the cases are disposed.
- r) The committee examined the above matter and recommended to raise ADS for uploading of following:
- Representation dated 17.07.2023 along with attested copies of the building permit order dt. 07.08.2021 issued by the GVMC.
 - The project proponent shall obtain Wastewater discharge (UGD) permission from Concerned Department.
 - Buffer Zone plan for Adjacent buildings to avoid damages to Adjacent high raised buildings.
 - The project proponent shall submit the Grouting plan for cellars/basements to prevent the damages to the adjacent Structures during the foundation stage.
 - The Proponent Shall Submit Proper Land Documents and status of recent Hon'ble High Court cases on Land related issues.
- s) The project proponent has furnished ADS reply on 02.09.2023 by producing the building permit order dt. 07.08.2021 issued by the GVMC duly attested by notary instead of GVMC officials and also not furnished UGD permission from Concerned Department. However, the project proponent submitted acknowledge copy of the request letter dt.30.08.2023 for discharging waste water and also submitted buffer zone plan and grouting plan. Again, this proposal was placed in 228th SEAC meeting. The committee noted that:
- t) Meanwhile a compliant was received to the Chairman, SEIAA on 16.08.2023 from General Secretary, Convention of Baptist Churches of the Northern Circars (C.B.C.N.C) raising concerns over the ownership of the land for the proposed project and stated that " Few land grabbers colluding with few groups are claiming themselves as self- styled association of C.B.C.N.C without proper authority and fulfilment of necessary compliances, and dare trying to grab the property of C.B.C.N.C".

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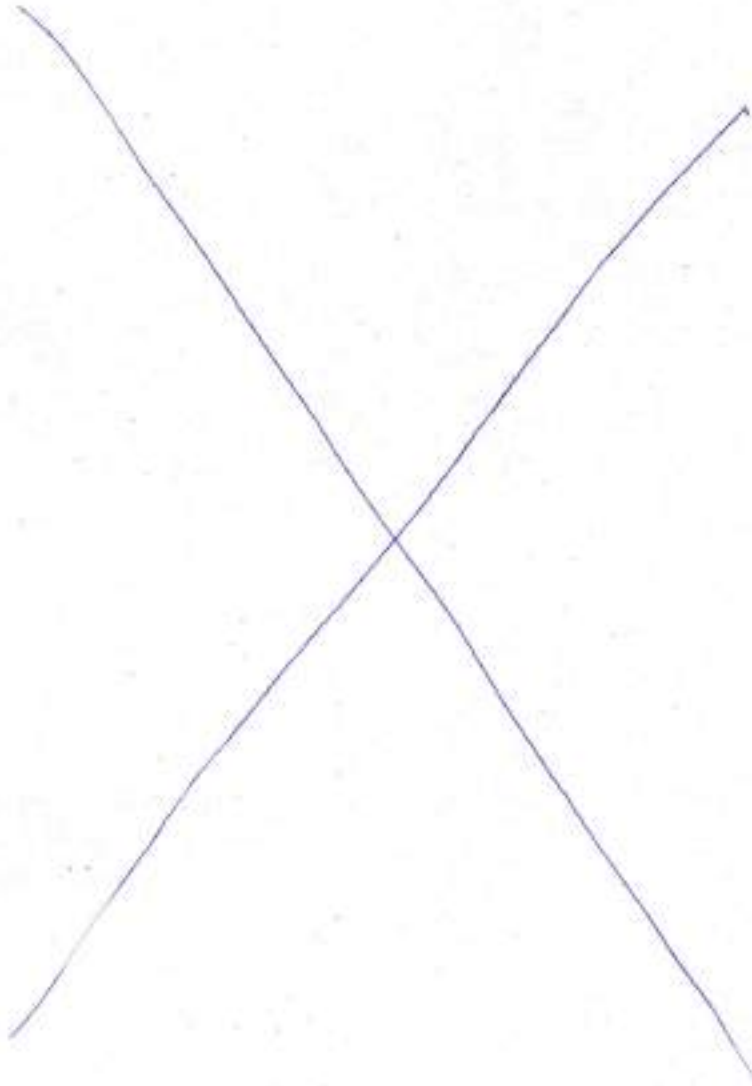

SRC Infra Developers was awarded work for execution of 4-laning of NH 544D from existing km 346.300 of NH 44 (Design Chainage km 0.00) to Km 39.380 (Design Chainage km 37.00) of Anathapuramu - Muchukota on Hybrid Annuity mode under NH(o) in the State of A.P of National Highways Authority of India work.As per the approved mining plan dt17.06.2023 the total provided mineral reserves are 3,21,448 m³. The proponent proposed to excavate 50,000 m³/Annum and Life of the mine is 1 year. The Project proponent has obtained grant of temporary permit from mining Department vide order dt.20.04.2023.The Committee noted that as per the cluster letter issued by the Asst., Director of Mines & Geology, Thadipathrive Letter dated: 04.07.2023 there are no existing quarry lease within the radius of 500 mtrs area. The total cluster area is < 5.0 Ha.The proponent volunteered to provide water treatment plant to the Munnurpalli village as a part of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) activity and shall maintain till the life of the mine.This proposal was earlier placed in the 224th SEAC meeting held on 27.07.2023 and the Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, mining plan, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended to issue Environmental clearance with following conditions:<ol style="list-style-type: none">The proponent shall comply with the proposals furnished in the Environmental Management plan.The project proponent shall develop greenbelt of 1km along approach roads & village Roadsides.The project proponent shall maintain 7.5mt greenbelt in buffer zone and existing buffer zone plantation should not be disturbed.The proponent shall take dust suppression measures to meet the CPCB stipulated ambient air quality standards at any point of time.The proponent shall carryout suppression of dust generated due to transport vehicles by continuous water spraying using tankers.The vehicles carrying the mines material shall be covered with tarpaulin during vehicular movement.The project proponent shall not use village road for mineral transportation purpose.The project proponent shall restrict vehicles movement during the peak hours to avoid accidents.The proponent shall maintain additional 7.5m buffer zone in addition to the existing 7.5m buffer zone towards road side.The project proponent shall provide 420m trench with rocky bund on Road side to prevent surface runoff entering into the nearby agricultural lands. |


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- g) This proposal was placed before 221st SEIAA meeting held on 24.08.2023 and decision of SEIAA is as follows: "Refer to SEAC to recommend the validity of the EC as it is a temporary permit as per the letter dated:17.06.2023 of Mines & Geology Dept.,"
- h) Again, this proposal was placed in 228th SEAC meeting and the committee observed that this is Temporary permit mine and obtained temporary permit permission from Mines Department for a period of 1 year vide order dt. 17.06.2023. Hence, committee recommended to **issue Environmental clearance** for period of 1 year inline with temporary permit of mining Department with above mentioned conditions.




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
