LTD., have attended the meeting.</p> <p>The project proponent has obtained TOR with public hearing on 18.12.2020 and subsequently the proponent has obtained TOR Amendment on 26.04.2022 and public hearing was held on 16.08.2022.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Public hearing details</b> <b>There are no specific issues raised in the public hearing.</b></p> <p>The reply by the proponent for the issues raised in the PH is as follows:</p> <p><b>Response of the Management:</b> <b>Sri G.Chinna Pulla Reddy, Representative of the Mine:</b> He assured the public gathered at the venue that they will develop greenbelt all along the boundary of the mine lease area and along the approach road to control dust emissions. He also assured that they will adopt controlled sequential blasting to control Noise pollution. He assured that the employment opportunities from the proposed mining activity will be provide only to the local villagers. He also assured that they will provide RO plant and also will conduct regular health camps in the village under CSR activities. He informed that they will coordinate with managements of the other surrounding mine lease areas in the area for arranging an ambulance facility to attend to any emergency in the surrounding villages.</p> <p>The base line data was collected from Oct,2021to Dec,2021.</p> <p>The predominant wind direction is observed to be East to West.</p> <p>The maximum concentration of SPM is observed to be 51<math>\mu</math>g/m<sup>3</sup>. Issues raised in the Public Hearing:

Employment, controlled blasting, skill development programs, Water sprinkling on approach roads, impact on surrounding agriculture, loss of cattle grazing, pattas issued in the area surrounding mines are the main issues raised in the public hearing.

The reply by the proponent for the issues raised in the PH is as follows:

Sri SK Habeeb Basha: While responding to the issues, he has given assurance that the mining will be carried out without any harm to the cattle and surrounding area; mining will be done duly following all the measures as per the Government norms; steps will be taken for providing cattle graze & water; water tanker will be provided for sprinkling on the roads to control dust pollution during vehicular movement; mining will be carried out within the permitted depth only; and the management will be carried out within the permitted depth only; and the management will mingle with the villager and extend their support for the development of surrounding villages such as providing basic infrastructures in schools, mineral plants etc.,

The base line data was collected from March, 2022 to May, 2022.

The predominant wind direction is observed to be South - East to North - west. The maximum concentration of SPM is observed to be  $56.5 \mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$ . The incremental concentration is  $2.47 \mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$ . The GLC of SPM will fall at 301 m in Western direction of the mine

The decision of 203<sup>rd</sup> SEAC meeting is follows:

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, MoEF&CC' Notifications & Oms, EIA reports, PH minutes and detailed deliberations, recommended to raise ADS to submit proposals for grazing lands and fodder development area and surface runoff prevention measures.

State of Haryana and Others etc., prior environmental clearance has now become mandatory for mining of minor minerals and the Central Government has published notification number S.O.141(E), dated the 15th January, 2016 making prior environment clearance mandatory for all minerals (major as well as minor) irrespective of size of the mine lease; And whereas, all mine lease holders are required to obtain prior environment clearance.

The committee noted that the proponent operated mine after 2016 without obtaining environmental clearance as required under EIA notification 2006 after promulgation of S.O. 141 (E) dt 15.01.2016 and hence to be treated as identified violation case as per OM 07.07.2021.

NGT order in OA No 136 of 2017 (SZ) : So under these circumstances, the application can be disposed of, giving the following directions: (i)The applications which are pending as on 31.3.2016 for Environment Clearance have to be treated as normal applications and not violation applications and the authorities are directed to dispose of those applications in accordance with law. 81 (ii) The persons who have not filed applications on or before 31.3.2016 and filed thereafter, can be treated as violation applications and the MoEF& CC /SEIAA is directed to dispose of those applications as violation cases in accordance with law.
