	<p><b>Recommendations of the SEAC on 09.09.2022</b> <b>Category: B2.</b></p> <p>The proposed project is for mining of <b>Road metal &amp; Building stone</b> in an area of <b>2.50 Ha.</b> with a proposed production quantity of <b>Road metal &amp; Building stone – 35,000m3/annum</b> with a condition that the total production during a scheme should be limited to the approved quantity as per Mining scheme/ plan.</p> <p>The proposed project falls under Item No. 1(a) of the schedule of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments thereof - (i). Mining of minerals (<math>\leq 250</math> ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).</p> <p>The representative of proponent and their consultant M/s. Coastal Mining Consultancy have attended the meeting.</p> <p>The Committee noted that as per cluster letter issued by Asst. Director of Mines &amp; Geology, Vizianagaram, vide Lr. dated: 01.07.2022 there are 07 existing quarries within the radius of 500mtsareaAnd whereas, pursuant to the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated the 27th February, 2012 in I.A. No.12-13 of 2011 in Special Leave Petition (Civil) No.19628-19629 of 2009, in the matter of Deepak Kumar etc. Vs. State of Haryana and Others etc., prior environmental clearance has now become mandatory for mining of minor minerals and the Central Government has published notification number S.O.141(E), dated the 15th January, 2016 making prior environment clearance mandatory for all minerals (major as well as minor) irrespective of size of the mine lease; And whereas, all mine lease holders are required to obtain prior environment clearance</p> <p>This is a 3rd renewal quarry lease. Initially the proponent has obtained quarry lease in the year 1995 for a period of 10years and 1<sup>st</sup> renewal in 2005 for a period of 15 years.</p> <p>The committee noted that the proponent operated mine from 2016 to 31.03.2022 without obtaining environmental clearance as required under EIA notification 2006 after promulgation of S.O. 141 (E) dt.15.01.2016 and hence to be treated as identified violation case as per OM 07.07.2021.</p> <p>The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, <b>MoEF&amp;CC Notifications &amp; OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended to reject the Environmental Clearance application with a direction to apply for violation TOR.</b></p> <p><b>Decision of SEIAA:-Agreed with the recommendation of the SEAC to reject the</b></p>

	<p><b>Recommendations of the SEAC on 09.09.2022</b> <b>Category: B2.</b></p> <p>The proposed project is for mining of <b>Colour Granite (Variety of Srikakulam Blue)</b> in an area of <b>3.796 Ha.</b>with a proposed production quantity of <b>Colour Granite (Variety of Srikakulam Blue) – 12505 m<sup>3</sup>/annum</b> with a condition that the total production during a scheme should be limited to the approved quantity as per Mining scheme/ plan.</p> <p>The proposed project falls under Item No. 1(a) of the schedule of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments thereof - (i). Mining of minerals (<math>\leq 250</math> ha of mining lease area in respect of non-coal mine lease).</p> <p>The representative of proponent and their consultant SV Enviro Labs &amp; Consultants have attended the meeting.</p> <p>The Committee noted that as per cluster letter issued by Asst. Director of Mines &amp; Geology, Tekkali, vide Lr. dated: 01.01.2021. there are 03 <b>existing quarry leases</b> were present and within the radius of 500 mtrs area. Savarakilli tribal village is located nearby.</p> <p>Earlier TOR issued with public hearing on 08.10.2021. Public hearing was conducted on 12.07.2022.the proponent obtained Forest NOC dt 24.02.19.</p> <p>The reply furnished by the proponent is as follows: Shri Pushpendrasinghyadav , owner and General manager :</p> <p>They thanked all the participants and surrounding villagers for expressing their views and supporting the establishment of mine. They have given clarification on issues raised by the public as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. They said that savarakilli village is at distance of 600mts away from the quarry and assured that they would fulfill all issues raised by villagers .they would provide the RO plant at savarakilli as requested .</li> <li>2. They assured that employment would be given to locals depending oon their skills and development activities taken up as per the request.</li> <li>3. Further said that they would follow all the guidelines issued by the government while operating the quarry.</li> </ol> <p>The pre dominant wind direction is from north east to south west. Average PM10 value is observed to be 67 <math>\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3</math> and 0.077 <math>\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3</math> is the incremental concentration is to be added upon implementation of project with GLC at 1km away in west direction which is within NAAQ limits. ( 100 <math>\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3</math>).</p> <p>The proponent volunteered to provide Water treatment plant to saravakalli as a part of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) activity and shall maintain till the life of the mine.</p>

	<p><b>Recommendations of the SEAC on 09.09.2022</b> <b>Category: B1</b></p> <p>The representative of proponent and their consultant have attended the meeting and presented the case.</p> <p>This is an application for extension of validity of Environmental Clearance for Muddavaram Iron Ore Mine Sy. No. 41/31(P), over an extent of 23.074 Ha. situated in Muddavaram Village, Bethamcherla Mandal, Kurnool Dist., Andhra Pradesh State .</p> <p>The following is submitted by the project proponent to the committee :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The mining lease was granted on 07.02.2009 for a period of 20 years, valid upto 06.02.2029. However, as per sub-section 8A (3) of “The Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Act. 2015”, enacted on 27.03.2015, the lease period shall be valid up to 06.02.2059. As submitted at the time of presentation, Extension of lease period upto 06.02.2059, as per the Amended Act is under process by the State DMG, Andhra Pradesh.</li> <li>2. The Environmental Clearance was granted by SEIAA, Andhra Pradesh vide order No. SEIAA/AP/KNL-12/08-2279 dated 31.01.2008 for 6 years based on the life of the mine which was calculated for a total reserves estimated at 2,17,806 tons at the rate of 50,000 tons per year.</li> <li>3. Mineable Limestone reserves of 7,07,176 tons are available as per the latest</li> </ol>

approved Modifications in the approved Mining Plan approved by IBM, Hyderabad vide letter no. AP/KNL/MP/Fe-20/Hyd dated 18.08.2021. Accordingly, the life of the mine shall be 15 Years (i.e 7,07,176 tons / 50,000 TPA = 14.14 Years Say 15 Years).

4. Consent for Establishment has been granted by APPCB vide order No.KNL166/PCB/ZOK/CEstt/2008-774, dated 20.11.2008, for maximum production of 50,000 tons per annum of Iron Ore.
5. Consent for operation has been granted by APPCB vide order No.KNL166/APPCB/ZO-KNL/CFO/2013-14, dated 18.05.2013, for maximum production of 50,000 tons per annum of Iron Ore, which is valid upto 31.03.2016. Further, Consent Order was renewed for 5 years i.e. upto 31.03.2021, by APPCB vide order dated 14.03.2016.
6. The proponent made an application (off line ) to SEEIA , AP on 20.04.2014 for extension / modification in the EC.
7. Then ,MoEF&CC , Regional office , Chennai conducted mine inspection on 12.11.2014 and requested SEEIA to take appropriate action against the project proponent for the violation continuing mining operation beyond 31.01.2014 and for excess production during years 2011 to 2014.
8. The proponent requested SEEIA vide letter dt 09.03.2015 for extension /modification in the EC with same or increased production capacity.
9. The proposal was examined and considered by the then SEAC in its 74<sup>th</sup> meeting on 18.03.2015 and recommended to initiate further action against this project as per the Moef instructions on violation cases.
10. The proposal was examined and considered by the then SEEIA in its 64<sup>th</sup> meeting on 25.03.2015 and agreed to the recommendations made by the SEAC.
11. Accordingly, the SEEIA wrote a letter to the special chief secretary to govt , EFS&T department , govt of AP to initiate credible action.
12. Further, EFS&T department ,govt of AP requested the District collector , Kurnool to take stringent action against the proponent under section 15 and section 19 of E (P) act 2006.
13. The District collector, Kurnool directed the AsstDirector , mines and geology , Kurnool to file a case in the first class magistrate court , Kurnool against the proponent.
14. Accordingly, the Asst Director, mines and geology , Kurnool filed a case before the first class magistrate court , Kurnool vide CC No 1356/2016.
15. The judicial magistrate of first class court , Kurnool pronounced the judgment and imposed a fine / compensation of Rs50000/- and the same was paid to the Hon'ble court on 18.06.2022.
16. The proponent conducted resurvey for reserves and found that reserves available in the mine is 707176 tonnes as on 31.07.21. so the life of mine is works out to be 14.14 years .
17. In continuation to the application 20.04.2014 and as per the present procedure , an application for extension of validity of EC ( for the same quantity of 50000tonnes/annum ) submitted on 19.07.22 again after completion of credible action by stopping the operations since 01.04.2015.
18. The applicant requested the committee for extension of the mine lease without increase in production for the same capacity of EC dt. 31.01.2008 for which the application made in the 2014 which was considered by then SEIAA.

	<p>The committee noted that</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The then SEAC and SEEIA have considered and processed the proponent's EC extension / modification by requesting the Govt for credible action against the proponent.</li> <li>2. As per the Asst Director of mines and geology department, Kurnool letter dt 29.07.22 , the department has not issued any dispatch permits to the proponent from 2015 and as such it is construed that the mine stopped its operations all these years.</li> <li>3. IBM approved modifications in the approved mining plan vide letter dt 18.08.21 which is valid up to 31.03.2024 for the reserves in the mine 707176 tonnes and so lifeworks out to be 14.14 years @ 50000 tonnes/ annum.</li> <li>4. As per S.O. 1807 (E) dt 12.04.22 , the prior Environmental Clearance granted for mining projects shall be valid for the project life as laid down in the mining plan approved and renewed by competent authority, from time to time, subject to a maximum of thirty years, whichever is earlier: Provided that the period of validity of Environmental Clearance with respect to projects or activities included in this sub-paragraph may be extended by another twenty years, beyond thirty years, subject to the condition that the adequacy of the existing environmental safeguards laid down in the existing Environmental Clearance shall be examined by concerned Expert Appraisal Committee every five years beyond thirty years, on receipt of such application in the laid down proforma from the Project Proponent within the maximum validity period of Environmental Clearance of thirty years, and subsequently on receipt of such application in the laid down proforma from the Project Proponent within the validity period of the extended Environment Clearance, every five years for incorporating such additional environment safeguards in the Environmental Management Plan , as may be deemed necessary, till the validity of the mining lease or end of life of mine or fifty years, whichever is earlier.</li> <li>5. The Committee noted that the extent of proposed mine lease area is **3.0 Ha**. The project falls under B2category.

The Committee after examining the project proposals, presentations, MoEF&CC Notifications & OMs and detailed deliberations, recommended to issue specific **(Violation) Terms of Reference without Public Hearing and following conditions:**

1. The proponent shall prepare cluster EIA &EMP.
2. The proponent shall submit Plantation Plan.
3. The project proponent shall submit plan for Restoration of benches and buffer zone.
4. The proponent is liable to pay the penalties as levied by the concerned competent authority, as per the OM No.28.1.2022 and clause No 12 of SOP dated 07-07-2021, duly incorporating the total production during the violation period and submit the calculation of penalties based on the project cost and the total turnover during the violation period.
5. Credible action to be initiated through concerned Regional office, APPCB under section 15 read with section 19 of E(P) Act 1986.
6. The project proponent shall carry assessment of ecological damage, remediation plan and natural and community resource augmentation plan and it shall be prepared as an independent chapter in the environment impact assessment report by the accredited consultants. The collection and analysis of data for assessment of ecological damage, preparation of remediation plan and natural and community resource augmentation plan shall be done by an environmental laboratory duly notified under Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, or an environmental laboratory accredited by National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories, or a laboratory of a Council of Scientific and Industrial Research institution working in the field of environment.
